TRIBE HOSTS UNC GREENSBORD TO OPEN 2008 CAMPAIGN

For the second straight season, the William and Mary men's soccer team will open the season at the friendly confines of Albert-Daly Field. The College will welcome UNC Greensboro to Williamsburg on Saturday, Aug. 30, at 7 p.m. Live stats and audio will be available at TribeAthletics.com.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- Senior Doug McBride and sophomore Andrew McAdams were named captains for the 2008 season.

- The Tribe is 16-9-9 all-time at Albert-Daly Field, including a 6-2-1 mark last season.

- The College is 8-2-2 all-time in non-conference games at Albert-Daly Field.

- W&M is 30-6-2 all-time in home openers and a perfect 4-0 under head coach Chris Norris.

- In the Tribe's final 17 games of the 2007 season, W&M started five or more freshmen, including a school-record six in wins over Hofstra and Northeastern.

- The Tribe has sent 30 players into the professional ranks and currently has a quartet of guys playing professionally in the U.S. and abroad. Wade Barrett has started 17 matches for the Houston Dynamo of the MLS. The Dynamo are currently leading the Western Division. Ralph Bean appeared in 11 matches and had an assist for the Bermuda Hogges of the USL Second Division. Adin Brown missed most of the season with Aalesunds FK in the Norwegian Eliteserien due to injury, while Carlos Garcia helped the Baltimore Blast to its second straight Major Indoor Soccer League Championship.

SCOUTING UNC GREENSBORD

The Spartans will open the 2008 season in Williamsburg after racking up a 2-0 exhibition record. UNCG tallied wins over Duke (1-0) and Gardner-Webb (3-2). Last season, the Spartans finished the year at 11-8-2 overall and fell in the Southern Conference title match to then-No. 22 Furman, 1-0, in overtime.

Against the Blue Devils, who are receiving votes in the preseason NSCAA poll, sophomore Matt Strine scored in the 88th minute to give the Spartans a 1-0 win. Goalkeepers Chad Janda and Nate Berry came up big in goal for UNCG, making six and five saves, respectively, as Duke outshot the Spartans, 14-7, on the night. In the Spartans' 3-2 win over Gardner-Webb, Corey Maret and Tim Masters tallied goals to give UNCG a 2-0 lead at the intermission, before Matt Foxx added the game-winner in the 67th minute.

UNCG returns it top seven scorers from a season ago to go along with both its starting goalkeepers. Senior Thomas Campbell topped the squad in points (29) and goals (13) a season ago. Jokull Elisabetarson ranked second on the team with 16 points on six goals and four assists. Both Janda and Berry started in goal for the Spartans. Janda had a GAA of 1.06 to go along with 37 saves and three shutouts, while Berry finished with a GAA of 1.89, 38 saves and three clean sheets.

2008 TRIBE MEN'S SOCCER

The Tribe holds a 5-2-1 advantage in the all-time series with UNCG, including a 2-1 mark in Williamsburg. The last time the two squads met was during the 2006 campaign when the Tribe tallied a 5-1 win over the Spartans in the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic. The last time UNCG traveled to Williamsburg, the College notched a 2-1 overtime win in 2001.

RETURNING STARTERS

The Tribe will welcome back eight starters from last season's squad that finished with the program's best league ledger since 2002. In the back, the College returns three starters including junior Roger Bothe and sophomores Nick Orozco and Michael DiNuzzo. Both senior Doug McBride and sophomore Nathaniel Baako are back in the midfield for the College, while last season's starting forward duo of junior Price Thomas and sophomore Alan Koger return. The College will also have the services of starting goalkeeper Andrew McAdams, who returns for his second season between the pipes.

McBride, Baako, Orozco and DiNuzzo started all 21 games for the Tribe last season. Along with the returning starters, the Tribe returns four other players with starting experience. Junior midfielder Jeremy Harris started 10 games last season, while sophomores Ian Stowe and Derek Buckley both saw action in the starting XI in their rookie seasons. W&M will also get a boost from the return of junior forward Andrew Hoxie, who redshirted last season after earning All-CAA honors in 2006.

THOMAS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

Junior forward Price Thomas was named to the Preseason All-CAA Team. Thomas is one of six players in the league who returns in 2008 after earning first-team all-conference laurels last season.

In 2007, Thomas enjoyed a breakout season and became the first Tribe player since 2004 to earn First-Team All-CAA honors. The Charlottesville, Va., native led the Tribe and ranked among the CAA leaders in shots (40), points (17), goals (7), assists (3) and game-winning goals (4). He topped the conference in game-winning goals, while also ranking seventh in goals and ninth in points. Earlier in the season, Thomas registered a point in seven straight games from Sept. 22-Oct. 14. Included over that stretch, he scored a goal in each of the first four CAA games of the season.

MCADAMS NAMED TO CSN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH IN 2008.

Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams was named as one of College Soccer News Players to Watch in 2008. McAdams was one of nine goalkeepers nationally to be named to the list, developed by CSN talent analyst Joe Mauceri as part of the Web sites College Soccer Coast to Coast preseason coverage.

In his analysis of the goalkeeper position, Mauceri said, "I look for players with good hands; who are decisive, fearless when needed, and who understand good positioning." The second-year Tribe backstop demonstrated his mettle as one of the top up-and-coming goalkeepers in the country last season. The Palm Harbor, Fla., native turned in one of the best statistical seasons for a Tribe goalkeeper on his way to earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors.

McAdams garnered his first collegiate start in the Tribe's fourth game of the regular season in 2007 and never relinquished the slot. He finished his rookie campaign among the Tribe's single-season leaders in save percentage (fourth at .850), shutouts (sixth with seven), saves (fifth with 96) and goals against average (seventh at 0.87). McAdams was instrumental in organizing a young Tribe defense, which started three freshmen and a sophomore in the defensive third. The W&M defense posted a school-record six shutouts during the CAA portion of the schedule. McAdams finished as the CAA leader in save percentage, while also finishing ranked 10th nationally in the category. He also ranked third in the CAA in both goals against average and saves, while ranking 23rd nationally in saves per game and 42nd in goals against average.

EXHIBITION RECAP

W&M turned in a dominating performance in its lone exhibition of the 2008 campaign, downing the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Olympic Team, 3-0, on Aug. 20. W&M owned the statistical advantage and tallied one goal in the opening half, before breaking the game open with a pair in the second period.

The Tribe found the scoring column first, converting a penalty kick. Freshman Nicolas Abrigo sent a long service from the right flank intended for junior Jeremy Harris on the backside of the penalty area. The ball deflect off Harris, before hitting the hand of a SVG defender, resulting in a Tribe penalty kick opportunity. Despite the SVG goalkeeper choosing the correct side on the chance, junior Roger Bothe converted the PK to give the Tribe a 1-0 lead.

After a slow first half, the Tribe broke open the game with its second goal of the contest in the opening minutes of the second stanza. Less than two minutes into the second 45 minutes, sophomore forward Ryan Snyder set up fellow classmate and striker Alan Koger for a goal. A pass from Snyder set Koger free on the left side of the penalty area, the CAA All-Rookie team selection from a season ago cut back to beat a rushing defender. SVG goalkeeper Dwayne Sandy blocked Koger's initial shot to the left, but the Tribe forward pounced on the rebound and finished to the center of the frame from eight yards out to push the margin to 2-0.

W&M found its third tally of the contest at the 72:32 mark. Abrigo found the back from the net from the top of the penalty area off a corner kick. Price Thomas served the corner kick to the top of the area. Senior forward Nathan Belcher got a touch on the ball with his chest, before Abrigo hammered a shot to the upper left side of the frame and provided the final cushion of 3-0.

The Tribe held a 22-8 advantage in shots, including a 10-3 cushion in attempts on goal. Koger led the way for the Tribe in shots with five, while Belcher had four and Thomas and Snyder finished with three each. Sophomore goalkeeper Andrew McAdams recorded three saves in notching the shutout.
