#### TRIBE HOSTS WINTHROP IN NCAA FIRST ROUND

For the 13th time in school history and the first time since the 2002 season, the William and Mary men's soccer team earned a berth in the NCAA Championship. W&M welcomes Big South Champion Winthrop to Williamsburg for a first-round tilt on Friday, Nov. 21, at 7 p.m. The College will host the first-ever NCAA Tournament match in the history of Albert-Daly Field and the first in Williamsburg since the 1992 campaign.

The College is 7-12-1 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, including a 5-4 ledger in first round matches. The Tribe and Eagles will meet for the first time in the programs' history. Winthrop is making its third NCAA appearance since 2002 and in its most showing played CAA foe Old Dominion to a 0-0 tie before the Monarchs advanced on PKs during the first round of the 2006 tournament.

Live stats will be available via GameTracker at TribeAthletics.com. The contest will be broadcast over the Internet and can be heard at the home for W&M sports. Tickets for the event are available at the W&M Ticket Office in William and Mary Hall or at the gate on the day of the game. Tickets prices for the Friday contest will be \$7 for adults, \$3 for seniors and \$1 for students (college and high school) and youth. Tickets can also be purchased online at TribeAthletics.com. The ticket office phone number is 757-221-3340. For W&M students, there will be a Tribe Soccer Shuttle leaving from Yates Hall parking lot to transport students to and from Albert-Daly Field. The shuttle service will begin at 6 p.m.

# AGAINST THE TOURNAMENT FIELD

W&M is 2-2-2 against the NCAA Tournament field, having played five participants in the 2008 bracket. The College owns victories over George Mason and UNC Greensboro, while also forging ties with No. 9-seeded Loyola (Md.) and UMass. The Tribe setbacks in the tournament field came at the hands of No. 13-seeded North Carolina and to George Mason in the CAA semifinals.



#### SCOUTING WINTHROP

The Eagles earned their third NCAA Tournament trip by claiming the Big South Championship with a come-from-behind 4-3, double-overtime victory over Coastal Carolina. Winthrop jumped out to a 2-0 lead, but Coastal scored three unanswered goals, including a penalty kick with 3:39 left to take a 3-2 lead. The Eagles scored on a rebound with 21 seconds remaining to send the game to overtime, before Big South Player of the Year Daniel Revivo found the back of the net, giving Winthrop the title. The Eagles are 15-5-1 on the season and were the regular season Big South Champions as well.

Revivo is the Eagles top offensive threat at 37 points on 14 goals and nine assists. He ranks 12th nationally in points per game at 1.76 per contest, while also coming in 19th in goals per game (0.67). Matt Skonicki is second on the squad with 29 points on 13 goals and three assists. He also ranks among the top 25 nationally in points per game (24th at 1.53) and goals per game (17th at 0.68). The Eagles enter the NCAA Tournament as one of the top offensive teams in the country. Winthrop averages 2.24 goals per game, which ranks fourth in the country. The Eagles also have the nation's 15th best winning percentage. Skonicki was named the Big South Player of the Championship after helping the Eagles to the league crown.

The Eagles and Tribe have one common opponent on the season in UNC Greensboro. Both teams tallied wins over the Spartans with W&M notching a 2-1 victory to open the season at home and Winthrop downing UNCG, 3-2, at the UNCG/adidas Kickoff Classic in September.

### AS THE HOST ...

The Tribe will host an NCAA Tournament game in Williamsburg for only the third time and the first in 16 years. W&M last hosted an NCAA Tournament contest in Williamsburg during the 1992 season when it downed West Virginia, 2-0, in the opening round at Busch Field. The Tribe also hosted an NCAA Quarterfinal game against Alabama A&M during the 1980 campaign. The Tribe will host its first-ever NCAA Tournament game at Albert-Daly Field against Winthrop on Friday.

W&M has served as the host of NCAA Tournament games since 1992, but those contests were played in Norfolk, Va. Due to an NCAA rule that prohibited championship competition on artificial turf, the College could not host a home game in Williamsburg until the completion of Albert-Daly Field in 2004. Prior to 2004, W&M played its home games at Busch Field, which is an artificial turf facility on campus. The 1996 NCAA Tournament matches against Army and St. John's were played at the ODU Soccer Stadium in Norfolk, Va.

# MEETING FOR THE FIRST TIME

Winthrop will be the sixth team the Tribe will face for the first time in the NCAA Tournament. W&M's first meetings with Alabama A&M in 1980, N.C. State in 1992, Creighton in 1995, Wisconsin in 1995 and Maryland in 1996 were the Tribe's first-ever meetings with those schools. It is also the only times W&M has faced Creighton and Wisconsin. When facing an opponent for the first-time ever in the NCAA Tournament, W&M is 2-3.

#### PLAYING IT CLOSE

Of the Tribe's 20 NCAA Tournament games, 17 have been decided by a goal or gone to a shoot-out. W&M has never been defeated in the NCAA Tournament by more than a goal. Each of the Tribe's last nine NCAA Tournament matches have been decided by a goal.

# CAA SUCCESS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

For the 12th time in the past 14 years, the CAA has placed at least two teams in the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship field. W&M received an at-large bid to the event, while George Mason claimed the CAA Tournament crown to earn the league's at-large bid. The conference has had a great deal of success in recent years, with at least one team advancing to the third round in five of the past six seasons.

### CONNECTIONS BETWEEN THEN AND NOW

An interesting connection between the Tribe's last NCAA Tournament game in Williamsburg and W&M's upcoming home NCAA contest is head coach Chris Norris. Norris was a sophomore starter for the Tribe during the 1992 season and started the home NCAA victory over West Virginia. He is entering his fifth season as the W&M head coach. In total, Norris has been a part of all seven W&M wins in the NCAA Tournament either as a player, assistant coach or head coach.

A connection that exists between the Tribe and Winthrop are their assistant coaches. W&M assistant coach Chuck Connelly and Winthrop associate head coach Daniel Ridenhour played together at Old Dominion University for four seasons. The duo led the Monarchs to the 1999 CAA regular season championship with a 15-4 record.

Winthrop head coach Rich Posipanko spent 10 years at Longwood prior to taking the job with the Eagles. He has coached against W&M on two occasions during the 1982 and 1983 seasons. The College tallied wins in both those contests.

## IN THE REGIONAL RANKINGS

The Tribe spent the entire 208 season ranked among the top five in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America South Atlantic Region poll. In the final regular season poll, W&M was ranked No. 5 behind ACC programs Maryland, Virginia and Boston College as well as CAA Champion George Mason. The Green and Gold was ranked among the top three in six of the 12 polls this season.

## ON THE WINNING TRACK

With its 3-0 win over Drexel on Senior Night, the Tribe notched its 10th victory of the season. The 10-win season marked the College's first since the 2002 campaign, which was also the last time the Tribe advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The six CAA victories also gave the Tribe back-to-back league ledgers of 6-4-1. It marks the first time since the 1995 and 1996 campaigns that the College has won six or more conference games in back-to-back seasons.

## LEADING THE WAY WITH FIVE ALL-CAA PLAYERS

W&M topped the CAA and tied a school record with five players named to the three all-league teams. Sophomore midfielder Nat Baako topped the list as a First-Team All-CAA selection, while junior forward Andrew Hoxie garnered second team accolades. It marks the second time Hoxie has earned second team all-league honors. Senior Doug McBride and juniors Price Thomas and Roger Bothe were named to the All-CAA third team. The All-CAA honor was the second of Thomas' Tribe career as well. It marked the sixth time the Tribe has had five All-CAA selections as it also pulled the trick in 1990, 1991, 1993, 1994 and 1996.

#### ON THE OFFENSIVE

The Tribe has ranked among the top scoring teams in the Colonial Athletic Association throughout the 2008 season. Currently, W&M is ranked No. 2 in every offensive category. W&M is second in the league in assists per game (1.63), assists (31), goals (33), goals per game (1.67) and points (97). W&M also ranks 46th nationally in scoring offense.

The Green and Gold is the only team in the league with three players among the top 10 in points and the top 10 in goals. Junior Andrew Hoxie leads the group in second in the CAA with 21 points and third in goals with eight. Sophomore Nat Baako ranks fifth in points (17) and 10th in goals (6), while fellow classmate Alan Koger is 10th in points (15) and fourth in goals (7). Junior forward Price Thomas leads the CAA with six assists on the season.

# FIRST CAREER GAME-WINNERS

A quintet of Tribe players scored their first career game-winning goals in 2008, accounting for half of the College's wins this season. Both Tribe seniors Nathan Belcher and Doug McBride tallied the first clinchers of their careers, while junior Roger Bothe and sophomores Michael DiNuzzo and Nick Orozco also accomplished the feat this season.

Orozco opened the season with his first career goal, scoring the game-winner on a volley off a rebound with under three minutes remaining to knock off UNC Greensboro. Belcher was next scoring the game-winning goal in the Tribe's 2-1 overtime win at Elon. DiNuzzo, like Orozco, had his first career goal count for the game-winner on a toe poke from in close in the College's 2-0 win at Old Dominion. In each of the Tribe's last two home wins, Mc-Bride and Bothe accounted for the game-winners. McBride found the back of the net on a breakaway against Georgia State off a counter, while Bothe found the far side netting from 12 yards out with just four second left in the half to propel the Tribe to a 3-0 win over Drexel to close out the regular season.

# ROAD WARRIORS

The Tribe has put up a remarkable 5-2-3 ledger away from Williamsburg this season, going 4-1-2 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites. Included in that 5-2-3 mark is a tie with No. 6-ranked Loyola (Md.), 0-0, in September. The tie snapped a 13-match home winning streak for the Greyhounds.

### BATTLING THE BEST

The Tribe has faced seven regular season conference champions during the 2008 season. W&M was 4-2-2 against the group with its setbacks coming to UNC Wilmington and George Mason, who won the CAA regular season and postseason crowns, respectively. The Tribe also faced Atlantic Sun regular season champion Campbell, Atlantic 10 regular season winner UMass, MAAC regular season champion Loyola (Md.) and Southern Conference regular season titlist Elon and postseason champion UNC Greensboro. The College opened the season with a 2-1 win over UNCG and also notched wins over Campbell, 3-2, in double overtime and Elon, 2-1, on the road. The Tribe also downed George Mason, 1-0, in overtime during the team's regular season affair. W&M played to a 2-2 draw with UMass at the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic. The College also tied Loyola (Md.), who is ranked No. 10 nationally, 0-0, on the road and snapped the Greyhounds 13-match home winning streak.

# WINNING TOUCH

Senior Doug McBride has been an unsung hero for the Tribe throughout his career. The 5-8 holding midfielder is a tireless worker that does a number of things that go unnoticed but in the end provide his team with a chance to be successful. The Mechanicsville, Va., native was finally recognized for his attributes, being named to the All-CAA third team as a senior. While McBride's numbers are not eye-catching at five points on a goal and three assists, one thing that rings true is the production of his points. Every one of McBride's points this season have come on game-winning goals. His lone marker of the year was the game-winner against Georgia State at home on Oct. 29, while his trio of assists against Central Florida, Elon and Delaware all came on game-winning goals.

#### DISHING IT OUT

The Tribe ranks second in the CAA in assists per game and for good reason. W&M has six players with three or more assists on the season, including the CAA assist leader in junior forward Price Thomas. The six players with three or more assists are the most for the College since it had seven in 2001. In total, 10 different Tribe players have tallied an assist on the season. Behind Thomas, sophomore Nat Baako and junior Andrew Hoxie have five assists each on the year. Senior Doug McBride and juniors Roger Bothe and Jeremy Harris each have three helpers on the year for the Green and Gold.

#### BAAKO TURNING INTO AN OFFENSIVE FORCE

Sophomore Nat Baako has long been a key fixture in the Tribe offense, starting every match for W&M since stepping on the Williamsburg campus from Accra, Ghana in 2007. During his sophomore season, the heady spark plug has been an offensive force for the Green and Gold. Baako currently ranks among the CAA leads in points (17), goals (6), assists (5). He is

second on the Tribe in all three statistical categories.

The 5-5 dynamo enjoyed a breakout start to the 2008 season at the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic, earning MVP honors after finishing with three goals and an assist. Baako was also named CAA co-Player of the Week following his performance at the event. He scored his first collegiate goal in the win over UCF and then exploded for both W&M tallies in the program's 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass. In the Tribe's comeback 3-2 double overtime win over Campbell earlier this season, Baako assisted on each of the Tribe's final two goals, including the game-winner two minutes into the second extra session.

## HOXIE A VALUED COMMODITY

Junior Andrew Hoxie has been a valuable asset to the Tribe in 2008 and the numbers back it up. Despite playing in only 13 of the Tribe's 19 matches and only making seven starts due to various injuries, Hoxie leads the Tribe and ranks among the CAA leaders with 21 points on eight goals and five assists. He has also tallied a pair of game-winning goals and two more game-winning assists. With Hoxie in the lineup, the College is 8-3-2 on the season and only 2-3-1 without the 6-4 striker. He has erupted for a pair of two-goal game this season, scoring two tallies in the win over Georgia State, before registering five points on two goals and an assist in the CAA Semifinal against George Mason.

#### PERFECT FROM THE SPOT

Junior Andrew Hoxie has been clutch for the Tribe from the penalty mark over his three-year career. The 6-4 striker is a perfect 8-of-8 on penalty kicks over his career, including an unblemished 5-of-5 from the spot this season. He converted a pair of chances in the Tribe's CAA semifinal loss to George Mason.

## THE PRICE IS RIGHT

After enjoying a breakout sophomore season in 2007, junior forward Price Thomas has been a marked man. Last season, he earned First-Team All-CAA honors, while leading the Tribe with 16 points on six goals and four assists. Thomas followed that up with another solid performance this season for the Green and Gold on his way to Third-Team All-CAA honors. He has 14 points on four goals and a CAA-leading six assists. The Charlottesville, Va., native was recently named CAA Player of the Week after factoring in on all three Tribe goals against Drexel. He tallied a goal and two assists in the win. Earlier this season, Thomas scored the gamewinner just 29 seconds into overtime as the College notched a 1-0 win at George Mason.

#### HATS OFF

Sophomore forward Alan Koger did something that had never been accomplished by a men's player in the five-year history of Albert-Daly Field earlier this season. He scored a hat trick in leading the Tribe to a 3-1 win over Delaware on Oct. 18. He was named CAA and ECAC Player of the Week for his efforts.

Koger tallied the 14th fastest three-consecutive goal hat trick in NCAA history during the Tribe's victory over the Fighting Blue Hens. He scored the three goals over a 15:32 stretch. The hat trick was also the first for a Tribe player since Brannon Thomas tallied a three-goal game against High Point on Sept. 18, 2001. Koger ranks second on the team and fourth in the CAA in goals with seven, while also ranking among the league's best in points (15).

#### CLEAN SHEETS

Sophomore Andrew McAdams currently ranks third in the CAA with six shutouts on the season, coming up just one shy of his rookie total in 2007. For his career, McAdams has 13 shutouts, which ties him for fifth on the Green and Gold's all-time list. The second-year Tribe backstop also ranks sixth in three different statistical categories: career saves (171), career save percentage (.792) and career goals against average (1.14).

# BAAKO NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Sophomore midfielder Nathaniel Baako was named to the ESPN The Magazinel Academic All-District III Second Team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). It marks the eighth time in the last six years that a Tribe men's soccer player has been named to the academic all-district team by CoSIDA. Baako was one of five CAA players named to the academic all-district teams this season.

## DOWN BUT NOT OUT

The Green and Gold has proven in 2008 that it is never out of game no matter how much time is remaining. During the 2008 campaign, the College has fallen behind by a goal and rallied to earn results on three occasions. On two occasions, W&M trailed with less than 10 minutes remaining before coming back.

In W&M season opener, the Tribe rallied from a 1-0 deficit to pull out a come-from-behind 2-1 win over UNC Greensboro. After an Andrew Hoxie penalty kick tied the game at one, sophomore Nick Orozco scored on a volley with less than three minutes remaining in the contest to help the Tribe pull out the victory. At the ODU Stihl Soccer Classic, UMass took a 2-1 lead in the 84th minute, but W&M tied the game less than three minutes later as sophomore Nat Baako found the back of the net. The game ended in a 2-2 tie. On Sept. 23, Campbell scored on a breakaway with six minutes remaining to take a 2-1 lead, but W&M did not quit as senior Nathan Belcher scored the equalizer in the 88th minute. Junior striker Price Thomas added the game-winner two minutes into the second overtime period. During head coach Chris Norris' tenure, W&M has six comeback victories.

#### IMPRESSIVE START

W&M jumped out to its best start since the 1994, going unbeaten through its first six matches at 4-0-2. The Tribe started the 1994 campaign on a school-record 12-match winning streak. The six-game unbeaten streak to start the season marks the sixth time in school history a W&M team has accomplished the feat. W&M also opened the 1970 (11 games), 1985 (10), 1987 (6) and 1991 (6) seasons with unbeaten streaks of six or more matches.

# ODY/STIHL SOCCER CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP

For the second time in the last three seasons and the fifth time overall, the College won the ODU/Stihl Soccer Classic as a result of its 1-0-1 record at the event. The Tribe opened with a 3-1 win over Central Florida on Sept. 12, before forging a 2-2 tie with 2007 NCAA College Cup Semifinalist UMass on Sept. 14. The College improved to 26-13-5 (.648) all-time at the Stihl Soccer Classic, having competed in the event on 22 occasions. W&M also claimed the event title in 1987, 1992, 1998 and 2006.


