Head Coach McGee Moody



McGee Moody Director of Swimming

In his first season as the Director of Swimming for William and Mary, McGee Moody led the swimming and diving teams to breakout seasons, highlighted by seven Colonial Athletic Association champions, including individual champions Meredith David (100 back), Kelly Reitz (200 breast), and Eric Druker (100 fly). As he enters his second season expectations are running high on the deck as Moody's program seems poised for even greater accomplishments.

Moody has already coached his athletes to 102 lifetime best swims, 40 all-time Tribe top 10 times, 14 U. S. Open cuts, seven school records, six top 50 national times, four Senior Nationals cuts and three CAA Performers of the Week.

Moody led the Tribe women to the top of the CAA, breaking away from the main pack to claim a spot among the elite programs. Finishing fourth at the conference championships, the Green and Gold solidified its position 160.5 points clear of fifth place and only finished 81 behind champion George Mason. Moody led the women to a strong 5-3 record in CAA dual meets and an overall mark of 6-5 as the Tribe

tested some of the premier programs on the east coast. Moody also guided the men to a solid sixth-place finish at CAAs and guided his team to key conference victories over Delaware, the College of Charleston, and a one-point, come-from-behind thriller over rival James Madison. In addition to the successes in the pool, Moody has encouraged and pushed his athletes in the classroom as well, with the women's team earning Academic All-America status (overall GPA of 2.85 or greater) in both the fall and spring semesters.

A hallmark of Moody's coaching has been the ability to attract top talent to the College, and then immediately turn that potential into championship winners and finalists. Last season, freshmen set seven W&M individual top 10 times and contributed to four relay school records, led by Meredith David, the CAA 100 Backstroke Champion. Making an immediate impact in the Tribe record book under Moody's careful guidance, David clocked a school-record 57.29 in the 100 back during the fall and followed that performance by winning two CAA titles (100 back and 400 medley relay) and combining for school records in four relays at the conference meet (200 free, 400 free, 200 medley, 400 medley). Emma Zuidema also kicked off her career strongly thanks to Moody's leadership, finishing one spot shy of medaling at CAAs in both breaststroke events, setting school top-10 times in each. Fellow rookie Christina Monsees progressed under Moody, setting the second-best time in Tribe history in the 200 free along with a top-10 time in the 100 free and combing for the 200 and 400 free relay records. On the men's side, Moody guided Alex Jendzejec to two finals qualifications in the IM events at CAAs as the freshman jumped to sixth in the school's 400 IM record book. Tony Wareck, a transfer from Fitchburg State, also benefited from Moody's coaching as the junior raced into the Tribe all-time top 10 in the 100 and 200 fly in his only season wearing the Green and Gold. For 2005-06 Moody has again assembled an elite and proven recruiting class as the eleven women and ten men carry a wealth of high school All-American and all-state credentials from stellar prep careers.




Moody came to the College after spending four seasons as an assistant men's swimming coach at the

United States Naval Academy. During his tenure, Moody coached the Midshipmen's first NCAA automatic qualifier since 1996 in addition to guiding numerous NCAA, Senior National and Olympic Trial qualifiers. His 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams finished the season ranked in the top 25 of the world, and Moody also made an impact in the Navy record book, with his athletes setting all of the top 10 fastest times in school history in both the 50 and 100 freestyles. Building his athletes into academic success stories as well, Navy's men's swimming team was awarded Academic All-America honors all three seasons from 2001-2004 under Moody's direction.

A 1997 graduate of East Carolina, Moody swam on the Pirates' varsity squad for four seasons, setting several freshman records and captaining the team his junior and senior years. Moody was also an Olympic Trial qualifier in the 200 freestyle in 1992.

Moody, who earned both a bachelor's degree in psychology and masters in sports administration from East Carolina, is an active professional in the swimming community. A member of both the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America, he has served as the chair of the latter's Media Relations Committee since 2001. He and his wife Monica have two daughters: Sydney, 5, and Olivia, 2.

Coaching Staff



Jason Memont Assistant Coach

Jason Memont enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Tribe after helping guide the teams to a standard-setting season in 2004-05, helping to produce seven Colonial Athletic Association Champions, 40 school top 10 times, seven school records and 102 lifetime-best swims. Several athletes swam to personal bests under his direct guidance, including Christina Monsees, who placed fourth in the 200 free on the strength of the school's second-fastest time at that distance, 1:53.93, and Alex Jendzejec who swam 4:11.35 in the consolation finals of the 400 IM at CAAs, good for sixth place in the Tribe record books. This year promises to continue the ascension of William and Mary to the top ranks of the CAA, as Memont assisted Moody in attracting a 21-athlete recruiting class that enters as one of the most heralded in school history.

Memont joined the Tribe after spending the last two-and-a-half years as head coach of the YMCA North Shore swim team in Ipswich, Massachusetts. Overseeing all swimmers age 5 to 18, 20 of his swimmers went on to Division I programs under his guidance. He also coached five YMCA qualifiers during his tenure.

An accomplished collegiate swimmer at Rochester Institute of Technology from 1996-2001, Memont won the Empire 8 conference title in the 200 breast-stroke his senior season. He also counted two third-place finishes at conferences among his accomplishments, in the 200 IM as a junior and in the 100 breast as a senior. He raced to NCAA provisional marks in the 200 IM and 400 IM and holds five school records (200 IM and all four relays). Named varsity captain in 1999 and 2001, Memont also served as an assistant coach in his final two seasons, helping three national qualifiers. He was also a five-year member and assistant coach of RIT's nationally ranked club water polo team and made the Dean's List four times during his collegiate career.

Memont, who holds a B. S. in information technology from RIT, spent four years as a high school technology teacher at Haverill High School in Haverill, Massachusetts. While there he also served as the men's varsity tennis coach for two seasons.



Dr. Robert McNamee Diving Coach

After making an immediate impact on the Tribe diving squad on his arrival in 2000, Dr. Robert McNamee has continued to lead W&M to success from the boards. In 2003-04, he led three of his divers to top-eight finishes at the CAA Championships, while last season saw him lead Carrie Gerloff to a school record from three meters as part of a strong CAA performance. Gerloff captured the bronze medal at CAAs in the 3-meter after a school-record dive of 419.75 in prelims. She also notched two top-eight finishes against the strong field at the Terrapin Invitational and claimed nine first-place finishes in dual meets. McNamee also led Laura Hodulik, who was studying abroad during CAAs, to an impressive fifth-place performance from the 3-meter board at the Terrapin Invitational.

A diving coach since 1975, Dr. McNamee has held various other positions in the world of competitive swimming and diving, including volunteer positions with the United States Synchronized Swimming Team and the Amateur Athletic Union.

With a professional career that spans from his early years as a Dental Officer in the United States Navy through years of private practice, Dr. McNamee has amassed an impressive resume. He earned his undergraduate and dental degrees from the State University of Iowa. In 1996 Dr. McNamee was a Medical Logistics Officer for the Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia. Also a member of several professional organizations, Dr. McNamee is a member of the American Dental Association and the Professional Diving Coaches Association.

In addition to coaching the Tribe diving squad, Dr. McNamee works at the Old Towne Dental Clinic.

Women's 2005-06 Outlook

William and Mary enjoyed a breakout season under first-year head coach **McGee Moody**, establishing itself as one of the top teams in the Colonial Athletic Association. Serving notice that it must be considered a contender for the CAA crown, the Tribe was among a pack of four schools that broke from the field at last year's Championships. With little turnover and another strong recruiting class, the College has set its sight on its first CAA Championship. Moody has already set the bar high as his athletes captured three CAA titles and 10 medals and set seven school records and 18 additional all-time top tens in his first season. With the continued maturation of a young squad, and the influx of elite national performers, the Tribe can exceed those lofty standards this season.

Freestyle

For the second consecutive year, the sprint freestylers will be led by Tribe record-holder senior Kristi Borkowski and junior Marnie Rognlien, with a solid crop of returning swimmers and newcomers all looking to add gold medals to their collections. Borkowski is a former silver medalist in the 100 free at the CAA meet, and set the 50 free school record (23.88) at the 2005 Championships. She will be aiming for the top of the conference this season as well as for invitations to the U.S. Open and Senior Nationals. Rognlien was one of four Tribe women to earn all-conference honors as part of the 400 medley relay, and also threatened for medals in her individual events, finishing in the top six in three events. The fastest returning 100 free swimmer in the lineup, Rognlien will be called upon to be a consistent scoring threat in every meet. Sophomore Kerry Urso will look to continue her improvement after joining the team last year with high school All-America credentials, and will be counted on to be a solid contributor in the relay events. Two freshmen will be immediate-impact type recruits in helping provide points. Multiple-time All-America honoree Megan Sculley comes into the season with times that would already rank in the top three on the team, and Moody looks for her to be a threat to make the CAA Championship finals in her first season. Kara Bolles, a 2004 All-American, joins the program following a season that saw her help break the national prep school record time in the 200 free relay and should also make an immediate impact.



Senior Kristi Borkowski

Youth will be served in the middle distance freestyle, with a line-up that should be the tops in the conference. Leading the hit parade is sophomore Christina Monsees, fresh off a breakout season that saw her just miss medaling in the 200 at CAAs and advancing to the finals of the 100 and 200 free at the prestigious Terrapin Invitational. Junior Erin Hammersley will look to break through and compete at the top of the line-up, as well as earn more relay wins for the Tribe. Three freshmen round out the complement, including Marina Falcone, a standout athlete who will be contributing at the top of the line up in both the middle and distance events as an immediate threat to medal at the conference meet. Classmate Sara Fitzsimmons also brings an impressive set of times into the fall, and will challenge for points when she races. Caitlin Block will provide depth to the 500 line up with prep times that place her second overall on the team.

In the long distances, the Green and Gold will look to continue the great strides they made last season, led by seniors **Alexis Skelos** and **Lindsay Young**. Skelos is the fastest return-

ing Tribe swimmer in the 1650, and Young will provide depth in the 1000 free. Junior **Callie Hopkins** will try and regain her top-10 form from 2003-04 that saw her etch her name on the record book in the 500, 1000, and 1650 free, and sophomore **Megan Shrader** will look to improve on a 2004-05 season that saw her just miss qualifying for the 1650 free finals at the Terrapin Invitational. Freshmen Block and Falcone will be counted on to provide immediate points in the longer distances as well.

Breast Stroke

The breaststroke events were a strong discipline for W&M last season, as the Tribe placed four swimmers in the championship finals of the 200 at CAAs, and the team will only add to that strength this season. For the second consecutive season, the trio of seniors Bryanne Matthews and Erin Clark and junior CAA Champion Kelly Reitz, will lead the charge for the Tribe. Reitz carries the most momentum into the season, after winning the 200 breast in 2:18.55 and placing second in the 100 breast at CAAs in 2005. She also was undefeated in the 200 breast in the spring, and was a member of the 400 medley relay team that beat the field at CAAs by three seconds. Matthews made her third consecutive trip to the championship finals in both breast events, and also advanced to the "B" finals in both events at the Terrapin Invitational. Clark made the championship finals in three events as well, and will continue to be a top competitor in her final season for the

Sophomore sensation **Emma Zuidema** will look to medal at CAAs after capping her rookie season with fourth place finishes in the 100 and 200 breast with times that rank her sixth on the school's all-time list. Junior **Alyson Fletcher** will aim to return to the CAA Finals and will also see time in the IM events. Sophomore **Laura Babcock** had a strong CAA performance, placing 16th in the 200 and 17th in the 100. She'll challenge for spots in the top eight this season with a year of collegiate experience behind her. Rounding out the breaststroke complement is freshman **Rebecca Brofft**, a Junior Nationals qualifier who will provide depth in the fall as she adjusts to collegiate competition, and will look to place at CAAs. Bolles will also add depth to the breaststroke events.

Butterfly

Senior **Michelle Calanog** will again look to lead the fly contingent after making a big move in the consolation finals of the 100, finishing 10th after qualifying in 16th. Calanog also set school records in the 200 and 400 medley relays at the conference meet, earning all-conference honors by winning the 400. Reitz will continue to see action in the fly, and aims to medal in the 100 after qualifying for the championship finals with the team's fastest time for the season and fifth fastest in school history (57.94). Junior **Morgan Adams** will also carry momentum from the CAAs, as she clocked personal records in the preliminaries of the fly events.

While at her best in the individual medleys, senior Paige Capro will continue to provide valuable depth to the fly corps, especially in the 200, where she set the school's tenth best time (2:11.45) in the season finale against Richmond. Joining her will be junior Jen Tan, who will continue to develop the potential she showcased in 2003-04 by making the CAA squad, and advancing out of preliminaries at the Terrapin Invitational. Two freshmen will provide immediate points for the Tribe. Whitney Pezza enters the fall with the team's best times in both events, and Amanda Higuchi brings national experience to the squad after making the YMCA consolation finals in the 200.

Backstroke

Any discussion of the College's backstroke prowess has to begin with standout sophomore **Meredith David**, a CAA Champion as a rookie. After starting her career with four straight wins in the 200, she set the school record in the 100 back (57.29) in only her third collegiate race to claim fourth at the Terrapin Invite. She will be counted on to defend her title

in the 100 at CAAs, and is considered a top competitor to win the 200 this year as well. David will also be an integral part of the relay teams, after helping set four school records at the CAA meet and winning the 400 medley relay. Borkowski will continue her transition into the backstroke events, which was punctuated by a CAA Finals appearance in 2005, where she set the tenth best time in school history in the 100 back. Freshman **Allison Poehler** will concentrate in the back events as well, and aim to continue the strong Tribe backstroke legacy.

Individual Medley

The individual medleys will once again be one of the pillars of strength for the squad, with a wealth of experience returning and a solid crop of freshmen coming in to learn from their examples. Capro will be counted on to continue her string of success at the CAA Meet after making the championship finals in both the 200 and 400 each of the past two years. She will also try and replicate her success at last year's Terrapin Invitational after qualifying out of the preliminaries in four events. Clark will mount an attack on the gold medal at CAAs in the 200 and 400 after placing sixth in both events at the 2005 meet. The third senior in the IM group, Matthews, will continue concentrating in the 200 and will look to make the championship cut after finishing in the consolation race at CAAs in two of the past three seasons. Hopkins has also advanced to the CAA Finals in each of the past two years and will look to step up to make the championship cut. Fletcher will be another contender at CAAs, after just missing the finals as a sophomore. The top IM freshman is Pezza, who has the speed to be a conference finalist in her first season of competition.

Diving

The diving contingent will continue to provide valuable points for the Tribe in competition, led by senior diving captain

Laura Hodulik. She claimed ten podium finishes in the fall in the 1-meter and 3-meter disciplines, including a win in the 3-meter at the ODU Pod Meet and also claiming fifth at the Terrapin Invitational in the 3-meter. Hodulik spent the spring semester abroad and returns primed to place in the top eight of both events at the CAAs. She will be joined in the hunt by two freshmen, Samantha Greenwood, a district finalist in high school, and Elizabeth Saari, who claimed thirteenth at the Florida State Championships her senior

Men's 2005-06 Outlook

With second-year Director of Swimming McGee Moody at the helm, the Tribe men's swimming and diving program should make strides and threaten at the Colonial Athletic Association Championships. Moody brings in a proven track record of success in maximizing his athletes' potential and has already elevated the performance of this team, as witnessed by last season's squad combining to set 13 top 10 school times—12 at the conference meet—and win six medals at the CAAs, led by 2005 graduate Eric Druker's repeat as the 100 fly champion. With a wealth of CAA finalists returning and perhaps the best recruiting class ever at W&M, the team should have all the tools to score well in dual meets and ascend to the top of the CAA.

Freestyle

The sprint freestyle will be anchored by seniors Jake Albright and Bob Jacobsen, two of the top returning performers from last season. Albright will be aiming to make the championship finals after earning the No. 10 seed in the 50 free in 2005. Jacobsen, a CAA consolation finals qualifier in the 50 free last year, will look to repeat a strong showing from last year's Terrapin Invitational, where he advanced out of preliminaries in two events and was just shy of qualifying in two others. Also returning is junior Nick Duda, who swam into the Tribe record book at the conference championships, setting personal records in the 50, 100, and 200 free preliminaries, and besting his 200 free mark in the finals to claim sixth. He also claimed seventh in the 50 and 12th in the 100 free, and scored as a member of three relay teams. A huge addition to the line-up is freshman Nader Amer, who will be counted on to score points at the CAAs in his rookie season by dint of topping the team's time charts in the 50 and 100. Also looking to make his mark in the 100 and 200 is freshman John Savage, who was a five-time league champion in high school in California.

The middle distance races should be an area of strength this year and in the future for the Tribe, which boasts three returning sophomores with conference experience and a wealth of talented The 2005-06 Men's Swimming and Diving Team newcomers. Alex Jendzejec placed in the

top sixteen at CAAs in all three events he swam, and will be looking to hold that form this year as well. Matt Shoulders is perhaps the team's top returnee in the middle distance, qualifying into the consolation finals last year in the 500 free with a PR, and winning the "C" Finals of the 200 at the Terrapin Invitational with a time of 1:44.67. Moody will be looking for Shoulders to continue to improve, and crack into the championship finals this year at the conference meet. Jesse Moore rounds out the returnees after a solid freshman season that saw him make the CAA squad and reach four finals at the Terrapin Invite. The freshmen will be paced by Shane Kelsey, a multiple-time All-America honoree who brings leadership experience at the national level along with the team's top 200 time, after leading his high school to the National Catholic Championship and placing second in the most-points scored competition his senior year. Amer will also participate in the 200, in addition to the sprint freestyles. Shawn Matthews will provide competitive depth as he adjusts to collegiate competition, as will Jeff Collier, who will occasionally be used in the middle races but will concentrate more on the longer dis-

In the distance freestyles, leadership will once again be

expected from Jendzejec and Shoulders, both of whom posted top sixteen finishes in the 1650 at the conference meet, as Shoulders bettered his previous personal record by almost 11 seconds. Sophomore Brandon Paster will see more action in the freestyles after being called on to be the team's diver last fall. He is also an experienced relay competitor, and will look for continued success in those races. Fellow sophomore Nick Widmyer will look to provide depth to the team after bettering his previous PR in the 1650 by over 18 seconds (to 17:32.19) at CAAs. Collier will be counted on to challenge immediately for the role of the team's top distance swimmer as he enters with top three times in both the 1000 and 1650.



Breast Stroke

Historically a strong discipline for the Green and Gold, this season's athletes will aim to continue that tradition of excellence, led by senior Jeff Clark. Clark claimed bronze at CAAs in the 100 breast in 2005, swimming the school's thirdbest time (58.07) in the championship finals. He also set the school's fourth-fastest time in the 200 in the consolation finals to claim 11th. Junior Andrew Carberry will provide depth to the team after making the consolation finals of the 100 and being only one slot shy of the finals in the 200. He was also a consolation finalist at the 2004 championships in the 200, posting the then-fourth-fastest time in school history in the prelims. They will be joined by a trio of freshmen who should immediately challenge for scoring positions. Jason Brisson is a multiple-event qualifier at Junior Nationals and also qualified into the U.S. Open in the 200 breast, and has been named a scholastic All-American by USA Swimming. TJ Storm will also look to contribute after being a medalist at the Pennsylvania state championships in the 100 breast all four years of high school, including a win in 2003. Dan Byler will likely see some action in the breaststroke as well as concentrating in the individual medleys.

Despite the departure of two-time CAA 100 fly champion Eric Druker, the Tribe will have another solid season in the butterfly discipline. Senior **Evan Elsaesser** will lead the fly contingent after making the finals cut at CAAs in the past two seasons. He just missed the "A" finals at last year's Terrapin Invitational in the 100 and will be looking to continue being a steady contributor. Junior Joey Peterson will be counted on to provide another scoring option for W&M after finishing 15th in the 200 fly at the conference championships last year. They will be joined by Amer and fellow newcomer Brisson who will be a part-time competitor in the 200.

Backstroke

Last year's backstroke leaders return again this season, in seniors Albright, Elsaesser, and Matt Wolff. All three advanced to the CAA finals in 2005, and will look to further improve their individual finishes this year. Albright made the "A" Finals at both the conference meet and the Terrapin Invitational in the 100, while Elsaesser made the top 16 in both the 100 and 200 at the Terrapin. Wolff swam to 12th in the 100 at CAAs on the strength of the seventh-fastest swim in Tribe history (53.20), and will look forward to bigger gains in 2006 and crack the championship finals. Collier will also compete in the backstroke as well as the freestyle and IM events, and enters the season with the top 200 back time on the team. Freshman David Mangini will concentrate on the backstroke, after being named a high school All-American his senior year, and will provide depth to the line-up as he adjusts to college, as will Savage, who will split time between the freestyle and backstroke.

Individual Medley

The individual medley events carry an even split between returnees and freshmen, a balance that will no doubt translate into strong performances as competition for scoring places heats up. Jendzejec is the top returning swimmer, after posting the sixth-best time in Tribe history in the 400 IM at CAAs (4:11.35), placing 13th. He won the 400 IM "B" Finals at

the Terrapin Invitational, and also placed 22nd in the 200. Wolff and Peterson both made finals cuts at the Terrapin, and will look to advance to the CAA finals as former qualifiers. They will be joined by Brisson, Collier, and Byler. Brisson will likely contend for the top spot on the team, with Collier not far off. Byler will again provide depth and solid competition to the squad.

Divina

Freshman Joe Cin will be the top diver for the Tribe this season, and the two-time Pennsylvania state finalist will be counted on from the beginning to provide point support for the team as he chases the podium at CAAs. Paster, while concentrating on the freestyle events, will also contribute some in the diving disciplines as he did last season.

Academics and Athletics

A blend of high-caliber academics and strong Division I athletics at William and Mary has long been a factor for high school student-athletes as they consider where to continue their education. For many swimmers, the fact that William and Mary is academically on par with schools such as Harvard, Yale and Princeton, but much more laid back in atmosphere, is one of the biggest draws. The swimming and diving teams not only exemplify that healthy balance between academics and athletics, but take it to the next level.

The squad has traditionally boasted one of the highest average GPAs among the College's 23 varsity sports teams. Recently, a Tribe butterflyer was honored as a Rhodes scholar, one of the most prestigious academic awards in the country.

Paul Larsen was named a Rhodes Scholar in December of 1999 following his graduation in June. Larsen graduated with highest honors in physics and held a minor in mathematics. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, the national honor society, and Omicron Delta Kappa, the national collegiate society for student leaders. In addition, Larsen was one of an elite group of James Monroe Scholars at W&M, a program which

grants such honorees \$2,000 for independent study. Larsen is currently a visiting researcher at Oxford Universityin the Mathematics Group.

As a member of the Tribe swimming and diving program, Larsen was a key contributor in the butterfly events and was the top butterflyer on the squad as a freshman. His fastest time in the 100 butterfly, 52.75, stands among the top-15 times in school history.

Reflecting on his undergraduate experience, Larsen said, "Through-

out my time at William and Mary, I got a strong sense that education was to be holistic, incorporating community service, activism, and, for many, athletics. One of the great things about William and Mary is that I could pursue an intense academic course while competing in a Division I sport."

The squad continues to carry on the tradition of strong academics into the 2005-06 school year. The teams boast nearly a dozen athletes who have been selected to the Dean's List and many more have earned the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award, for which athletes must have at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. Several athletes on each team are also Monroe Scholars, a unique program at the College which recognizes the most academically distinguished undergraduates and affords them grants to conduct summer research. Aside from these distinctions, the team's

student-athletes accrue many other unique honors. Morgan Adams, Laura Hodulik, Brandon Paster and Lindsay Young were honored with SAAC's Academic and Athletic Provost Award while 2005 graduate Robyn Kondrad, recipient of the Howard Hughes Medical Institute Research Grant, had research published in prominent journals as an undergraduate and was selected to Phi Beta Kappa. The Tribe freshmen always join

the squad accomplished both in the pool and in the classroom and this year's crop is no different, with Academic All-Americans, National Honor Society members and National Merit Commended scholars joining the team. After accruing a wealth of individual accolades for their outstanding scholastic achievements the newcomers are primed for succeed not only athletically but also academically at W&M.

With several individuals receiving credit for high academic achievements, a testament to the team's academic success lies in the team's GPA. Both the men's and women's squad have earned Academic All-America team honors in recent years, including the women's team claiming the distinction in both the fall and spring semesters last year.

As the swimming and diving teams continue to reach greater heights in their athletic achievements, they seek new levels of academic accomplishments. The success of the team's student-athletes demonstrates the effective balance of top-notch academics with Division I athletics. The swimming and diving team is a model of the William and Mary athletics department's commitment to excellence not only in athletics, but in academics as well.

Athletic Administration



Terry Driscoll Director of Athletics

With an extensive resumé that includes four years as a student-athlete, a professional playing career and numerous jobs in the athletic business world, Edward C. "Terry" Driscoll is entering his eighth year as the athletics director at the College of William and Mary.

Driscoll's tenure has seen a wealth of improvements across the board in the W&M athletics department, from new facilities to increased fundraising for the Tribe. In addition, the Tribe has reached all-time highs in the annual Director's Cup rankings that summarize excellence in all sports.

Upon the death of legendary Tribe athletics director John Randolph, W&M president Timothy J. Sullivan chose Driscoll to be the new leader of the department, saying "Terry brings outstanding management and leadership skills to the position."

Since Driscoll took over as athletics director, he has overseen the construction of more than \$6 million in facilities, including the new Plumeri Park (baseball), Albert-Daly Field (soccer, lacrosse) and the Busch Courts (tennis). Driscoll has also increased the annual fundraising totals for noncapital projects from \$1.36 million in 1995 to around \$2.7 million currently. He also has served on numerous conference and NCAA committees, including a stint as president of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference.

The Tribe has also had outstanding success across the board since Driscoll came to Williamsburg. In 2002-03, W&M had a school-record 10 teams compete in the NCAA Tournament. Four teams won conference titles, while six were in the top 25 at the end of their respective seasons. One of the department's goals each year is to finish in the top 100 in the annual Director's Cup rankings, and that has happened in all but one of the years that Driscoll has been the AD, with a high ranking of 42 occurring in 1997. In addition, W&M had captured 81 CAA Championships coming into the 2005-06 school year, by far the highest total among all conference schools.

Driscoll's leadership skills were developed in his collegiate years. As a student-athlete at Boston College, Driscoll captained the basketball team to the National Invitation Tournament championship game as a senior, and was named the tournament MVP. In addition to being named an All-American, his success in the classroom with a major in biology garnered him an Academic All-America honor.

After graduating from BC, he was the fourth pick of the NBA Draft, selected by the Detroit Pistons, just three picks after the Milwaukee Bucks chose UCLA's Lew Alcindor, later to be known as

Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. Driscoll chose to play a year in Italy first, but then returned to the U.S. to play for the Pistons, Washington Bullets and Milwaukee Bucks before going back to Italy as a player and coach until 1980.

Driscoll then entered the corporate world in 1980, working for Kazmaier Associates, Inc., an international sporting goods sales and sports marketing firm. After Kazmaier purchased Bike Athletic in 1986, KSG Inc. was formed with the objective of becoming the first, and only, national sales agency in the sporting goods industry. By 1987, Driscoll was president of the company and had expanded the agency to all 50 states just two years later. In early 1990, Driscoll's contribution to a marketing research project for the NCAA was the initial step moving him from product marketing and sales to sports marketing and management. The result of the project was a joint venture between Kazmaier Associates and Host Communication - with Driscoll being named managing director and chief operating officer of NCAA International.

In 1993, Driscoll diversified his experience in the athletic world by working as the executive director of the 1994 World Cup site in Boston. In September of that year, Driscoll was again enlisted to launch a new business, Eagle International Group, an event management and services company. As vice president, Driscoll worked with Hawaii Pacific Sports as well as organizing the Women's World Volleyball Grand Prix, a five-week competition in Honolulu.

Driscoll resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Susan. The couple has two children - Keith, 30, a 1997 graduate of Holy Cross and Leslie, 26, a 2001 graduate of William and Mary.



Barbara Blosser Senior Executive Associate AD

After serving 12 years as the College's associate athletics director, Barbara Blosser was promoted to her current position of senior executive associate athletic director in April of 2004. Blosser started her career at William and Mary as the head women's basketball coach in 1978 and guided the Tribe

to a VAIAW crown in her first season with a school-record 16 wins (16-13). Her 1980 Tribe team (11-14) placed third, while the 1981 squad (16-16) was VAIAW runner-up. She was also at the helm during the 1984-85 season when William and Mary made the jump to NCAA Division I. Overall, she finished her coaching career with 115 wins, 84 of which came at William and Mary.


When the College's men's and women's athletic programs merged in May of 1986, she moved to administration, first serving as the Assistant to the Associate Athletics Director. Over the past 16 years, her administrative responsibilities at W&M have included the monitoring of financial aid matters, coordinating the scheduling of athletic facilities, supervision of coaches and staff and, currently, serving as the person primarily responsible for administering the day-to-day operations of the department.

From October 1992 to June 1993 and August 1995 to July 1996, Blosser also served as acting athletics director in an interim capacity. For her efforts, she was named the first recipient of the John Randolph Inspiration Award. Blosser has served on

various committees such as the NCAA Strategic Planning Committee and the Colonial Athletic Association Competition Committee.

Blosser began her coaching career at the helm of the women's basketball program at Ashland College in Ohio. During two seasons there, she led the Eagles to successive 15-7 and 16-8 ledgers. Her 1977 squad won the AIAW Region V Championship, while her 1978 team took the OAISW Small College title.

A former three-sport standout at Ohio State, Blosser graduated Cum Laude in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. At OSU, she was selected to both Phi Beta Kappa and Mortar Board. She competed in basketball, field hockey and tennis and captained both the basketball and field hockey squads her senior year. She went on to earn her master's degree from the University of North Carolina Greensboro in 1978. In 1993, she was selected as a member of the first class of women inducted to the Ohio State University Athletic Hall of Fame.



Few colleges in America can boast of the combination of athletic and academic excellence that is found at the College of William and Mary. Each year, more than 500 Tribe student-athletes, competing on 23 Division I teams, prove that it is possible to simultaneously excel at the highest levels of athletics and academics.

Athletic Excellence

The 2004-05 season was another outstanding year for W&M athletics, as the Tribe added five CAA titles to push its conference-leading total to 81, 30 more than the next closest competitor. Seven teams competed in their respective NCAA Championships, highlighted by the football team's appearance in the I-AA semifinals. It has become typical for W&M to win at least five conference championships and send seven or more teams to the NCAA Championship each season.

Each year the goal of the athletics department is to finish in the top-100 nationally in the NACDA Directors' Cup standings and in recent years W&M has far exceeded that standard. In 2004-2005, the College finished 76th, and was the highest-ranked team in the CAA and was third among all schools in the state of Virginia, making this the ninth time in the 12-year history of the Directors' Cup that the College has finished both in the top four in the state of Virginia and first or second in the CAA.

William and Mary fields Division I teams for both men and women in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field. There are also field hockey, lacrosse and volleyball squads for women of the College, while there are two additional sports (baseball and football) for men.

Academic Success

The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its students' academic responsibilities, as W&M has produced 36 Academic All-Americans since 1992.

In the NCAA's inaugural Academic Progress Rate scores for all Division I institutions, William and Mary once again excelled in its mission of fostering true student-athletes. The College boasted the fourth-best APR score (992) among 328 active and provisional institutions, and W&M leads all programs that offer performance-based grants and financial aid to scholar-athletes.

Additionally, W&M had four student-athletes recognized as CAA Scholar-Athletes of the Year in 2004-2005: Pat Comstock (Men's Cross Country), Megan Bishop (Women's Cross Country), Keith Bechtol (Men's Track and Field) and Lena Sherbakov (Women's Tennis).

STUDENT-ATHLETE SUPPORT

Goals

We take pride in the many achievements of William and Mary athletes, both in the classroom and on the playing field. These support services and many others are in place to help each student-athlete achieve their goals. It is our hope that at the completion of their undergraduate career they can reflect upon:

- An academic experience that prepared them for a successful career.
- 2. An athletic challenge that brought many rewards.
- 3. A feeling of loyalty and pride in identifying themselves as a varsity athlete with a degree from The College of William and Mary.

Compliance and Academic Support

As members of the Colonial Athletic Association and NCAA Division I, the College is committed to full compliance with all NCAA and conference regulations. The department has a fulltime Director of Compliance committed to assisting students, staff and coaches through education and monitoring of compliance issues.

All entering students are assigned to a faculty academic advisor assigned by the director of Academic Advising. Students remain with this advisor until their sophomore year at which time they select a faculty advisor in their chosen major.

Within the athletic department, the Academic Support Coordinator is a valuable resource for student-athletes serving in a liaison role with the various student service offices throughout the campus community. The College has offices for Volunteer Services, Career Services, a Writing Resource Center and Oral Communication Studio, to name a few.

The department offers a variety of study, life and career building skills programs, but holds firm to the concept of self-determination—each student must take responsibility for his or her collegiate experience. Our goal is to assure that there is a support system in place to assist students to make positive and informed decisions.



Sports Psychology

The athletic department has on staff a sports psychologist, who holds a Ph.D. in sports psychology. All consultations are confidential and all student-athletes, teams or coaches are welcome regardless of the issues they wish to discuss. Consultation is available for sport psychology education, performance enhancement skills training, strategies for dealing with stress or injury, or for personal issues that may affect performance. The sports psychology consultant is considered a member of the Counseling Center and refers individuals to the Center when appropriate.

Strength, Speed and Conditioning

Tribe athletics is very proud of the Joseph W. Montgomery Strength Training Center, a 5,000 square foot weight training facility. Under the guidance of the Head and Assistant Strength Coach each sport is provided with a program designed to enhance individual strength and

flexibility development specific to the skills and movements required for their sport. Individuals are educated on proper lifting techniques and workouts are monitored to assure safety at all times.



Sports Medicine

The Division of Sports Medicine provides a comprehensive health care program for the department of intercollegiate athletics. The staff consists of a team physician, seven full time certified athletic trainers, two graduate assistant athletic trainers and medical specialists from the local community. The team physician has overall responsibility for supervision of the sports medicine program. Tribe athletes have the luxury of rehabilitating and treating injuries in a state-of-the-art athletic training facility.

The priority for the athletic training staff is to enhance and assure lines of communication and cooperation among its staff, student-athletes, parents, coaches, the Student Health Center and involved medical specialists. Through a team approach to health care the sports medicine program can offer comprehensive health care services to the student-athletes in a caring and cooperative manner.


WILLIAM AND MARY AT A GLANCE

The Best Small Public University in the United States

For more than 300 years, William and Mary has been a symbol of academic distinction in America. Now, in its fourth century, the College is prepared to educate the leaders of the 21st century.

The College of William and Mary was founded in 1693 by King William III and Queen Mary II of England. Four Presidents of the United States received their education at the College - George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler.

William and Mary was the first college to institute an honor code of conduct. The premier academic society, Phi Beta Kappa, was founded by William and Mary students in 1776. The Society of the Alumni, founded in 1842, is the sixth oldest alumni group in the nation. Now the College is designated as a "Public Ivy", and ranks 15th among the best regional business schools.



Lake Matoaka provides an on-campus field laboratory and recreational activities, and includes an ampitheatre to host concerts.



The Wren Building is the oldest one in the United States in which classes are still taught.
