1921: Jefferson Pool (women only) opens.

1924: Blow Gym Pool opens.

1927-28: First men's team goes 3-1.

1928-29: First women's team.

1934-35: Doris Campbell wins 100 back in the National Telegraphic Meet.

1936-37: Tribe joins Southern Conference, takes fourth at conference championships.

1937-38: Leonard Goldberg and Moe Brill each advance to the second round of the National Intercollegiate Championships.

1940-41: Margaret Richards wins three events in the National Telegraphic Meet.

1941-42: Anne Monihan sets two National Telegraphic meet records.

1951-52: Dudley Jensen takes over men's team, starting a 33-year career.

1960-61: 400 free relay of David Kurland, Chris Herr, Turk Despard, and Mort Aulls wins Junior National Title.

1964-65: Adair Pool opens, hosts Southern Conference Championships. Pete McIntosh is named the conference's Most Valuable Swimmer. Marion Reeder coaches first women's team since 1951 to 3-0 record.

1965-66: Women win first of six-straight State Championships.

1978-79: Women place sixth at AIAW Division II National Championships.

1981-82: Erin Sheehy wins national title in the 100 breast-stroke.

1985: Tribe places 32nd at NCAA Men's Championship as diver Shawn McLane finishes 13th in both 1-Meter and 3-Meter.

1986: McLane takes 16th in both diving events to place W&M in a tie for 41st at the NCAA Championships. The CAA holds its inaugural championship meet.

1987-88: Men's and women's teams combined.

1989-90: Recreation Center Pool opens.

1998-99: The men's team goes 15-1 in the regular season and takes second at the CAA Championships. Paul Larsen named Rhodes Scholar.

2006-07: The women's swim team ties the conference record with 12 event titles and wins the CAA Championship. Freshman Katie Radloff swims three events at the NCAA Championship and is named CAA Swimmer of the Year. Courtney Alles wins Rookie of the Year.

2007-08: Matt Crispino '02 named Director of Swimming and Diving. Radloff earns pair of Olympic Trials berths at Junior Nationals.

Directions to William and Mary

From the North/West: Take I-64 East to Lightfoot Exit 234A (Route 199 East). At top of exit ramp, take a right onto Route 199 East. Stay on 199 East until the Monticello Avenue exit. Exit at Monticello Avenue, and bear left on exit ramp. At bottom of ramp, turn left at light onto Monticello (pass under 199). Go straight through three stoplights, and continue straight for about half a mile and take the first right onto Compton Drive (before light at hospital and shopping centers). There may not be a street sign! The road is heavily wooded on both sides. Continue on Compton Drive and turn right at the first stop sign onto Brooks Road. The Rec Center will be on your right.

From the South/East: Take I-64 West to Exit 242A (Route 199 West). Follow 199 to fourth light. At the fourth light, take a right onto Jamestown Road. Follow Jamestown Road 1.1 miles (past Lake Matoaka on left), then take a left onto Ukrop Way. Take a left at the next stop sign and continue to follow Ukrop Way while bearing right until you reach William and Mary Hall up the hill on your left. Turn left onto Brooks Road right before William and Mary Hall, and follow around to the right. The Rec Center will be on your left after the tennis courts.

Coaches



Head Coach Matt Crispino

Matt Crispino was named the Director of Swimming and Diving at his alma mater in September of 2007 after five successful years spent in the assistant ranks at several schools. Crispino is the school's sixth director since the men's and women's teams were combined in the 1989-90 season, and is also the first W&M alumnus to head either swim team since Keith Havens '76 from 1981 to 1984.

"We're very excited to have Matt join our coaching staff," Athletics Director Terry Driscoll said.

"His swimming career here at the College, and his coaching experience around the country, clearly makes him a great fit for this program. Everyone here at William and Mary expects Matt to take the men's and women's swimming and diving teams to new heights as we move forward."

Crispino is returning to his alma mater after five years in the assistant coaching ranks. His most recent stop was at Colgate University for the 2006-07 season, where he served as the assistant coach for both men's and women's teams. Directly responsible for the sprint corps, Crispino saw his athletes race to 49 lifetime-best performances, including four school-records and one freshman record. Hitting the recruiting trails hard, Crispino helped the Red Raiders piece together a class of 17 that included two national-caliber swimmers.

Prior to Colgate, he spent three years on the deck at West Point as the assistant coach for both men and women, helping the Corp of Cadets to a 23-12 record and a pair of second-place showings at the Patriot League Championships. In addition to his direct responsibilities for the sprint corps, Crispino also helped develop the dry-land and in-pool training regimens for the middle-distance and distance swimmers, leading the team to break 12 Academy and 13 plebe (freshman) records and producing four U.S. National qualifiers and two NCAA "B" cuts. His 27 sprinters alone achieved 109 lifetime-bests.

Crispino got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Florida State University, where he worked with several athletes who counted NCAA, U.S. National, and Olympic Trials bids among their accomplishments. Working with all training groups and swimmers on both the group and individual basis, he helped guide the Seminole men to a runner-up finish at the 2003 ACC Championships, while the women came in third. The teams combined to send seven athletes to the NCAA Championships that year.

Crispino has also worked at several of the nation's best-regarded swimming camps, including Skip Kenney's Stanford Swim Camp and the Navy Swimming Camp. While at West Point, he was the primary organizer for the Army Swimming Camp, and served as lead camp instructor for the 12-18 age group.

"I feel like I've come home," said Crispino upon his hiring. "This has always been a dream job of mine. It is an incredible honor and privilege to be able to coach here at William and Mary, and I hope we can continue to build on the team's success and establish a tradition of continuous accomplishment."

The captain and Most Valuable Swimmer of the 2001-02 Tribe men's swimming team, Crispino helped set the school record in the 800 free relay as a freshman at the CAA Championships, 6:47.85. In his rookie season, the team placed a program-best second at the conference meet after going 15-1 (6-0 CAA) during the regular season. Crispino still ranks among the all-time top-10 in the 100, 200, and 500 free, and is fifth all-time at the College in the 200 IM.

Crispino is a member of the College Swimming Coaches Association of America, and is certified to coach by both USA Swimming and the American Swimming Coaches Association (Level II). He received his bachelor's of arts in government from the College in 2002, and his master's in physical education from Florida State in 2003. Crispino resides in Williamsburg.



Dr. Robert McNamee

After making an immediate impact on the Tribe diving squad on his arrival in 2000, Dr. Robert McNamee has continued to lead W&M to success from the boards. In 2003-04, he led three of his divers to top-eight finishes at the CAA Championships, while 2004-05 saw Carrie Gerloff achieve school records from three meters as part of a strong CAA performance. Gerloff captured the bronze medal at CAAs after a school-record dive of 419.75 in prelims. In 2005-06, he coached Joe Cin to all-time top-10 marks in both 3-Meter categories, and last season he tutored Meg O'Connor to the fourth-best all-time performance at the College in the 1-Meter event.

A diving coach since 1975, Dr. McNamee has held various other positions in the world of competitive swimming and diving, including volunteer positions with the United States Synchronized Swimming Team and the Amateur Athletic Union.

With a professional career that spans from his early years as a Dental Officer in the United States Navy through years of private practice, Dr. McNamee has amassed an impressive resume. He earned his undergraduate and dental degrees from the State University of Iowa. In 1996 Dr. McNamee was a Medical Logistics Officer for the Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia. Also a member of several professional organizations, Dr. McNamee is a member of the American Dental Association and the Professional Diving Coaches Association.

In addition to coaching the Tribe diving squad, Dr. McNamee works at the Old Towne Dental Clinic.



Lee Hutchens

A former ECU standout, Lee Hutchens enters his second year with the Tribe program, assisting with recruiting and administrative duties.

Most recently, Hutchens served as the assistant coach and site coordinator for New Wave Swim Team in Raleigh, North Carolina, for three years. During his time there, he coached numerous athletes to individual and relay National Top-16 performances, and multiple Junior Nationals qualifications, sectional championships, and state championships. Prior to his time with New Wave, Hutchens was the head age-group coach for the Greenville Swim Club in Greenville, North Carolina, from 2000 to 2003.

Hutchens began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater, East Carolina, from 1998-99. While with the Pirates, he had primary responsibility for the freestyle athletes. His career as a coach has been marked with distinction, with three selections to the North Carolina Zone coaching staff, and three invitations to join the staff at the USA Swimming Select Camp.

Hutchens was captain of the swimming team as a senior at East Carolina, and graduated with a BA in psychology in 1998. He holds a Level 3 coaching certification from the American Swimming Coaches Association. He was married in the summer of 2006 to former University of North Carolina swimmer Megan Chenier, and resides with his wife in Williamsburg.



Joey Peterson

William and Mary will have the expert services of another alumnus during the 2007-08 season, as former captain Joey Peterson rejoins the team as an assistant coach.

Peterson was a butterfly and individual medley specialist, advancing to the consolation finals at the CAA Championships four times during his career. His best finish came in 2004, when he placed 11th in the 200 fly as a freshman.

While captain in 2006-07, Peterson helped to lead the Tribe to its first winning season in eight years, 6-3-1 (4-2-1 CAA), and post a fourth-place finish at the CAA Championships. Individually, Peterson claimed nine top-five individual finishes during the dual meet season and was part of five top-three relay teams, including the 200 medley relay that was victorious against Georgetown.

A native of Williamsburg and a graduate of Lafayette High School, Peterson earned his bachelor's of science in neuroscience in May of 2007, and is enrolled in the full-time MBA program at the Mason School of Business.

Women's Outlook

The last time the women's swimming and diving team won an end-of-year meet, it was 1966. In only the second year of varsity competition, the Tribe captured the Virginia State Championship, beginning a string of six consecutive state titles. The 2007-08 swimming and diving team enters this season looking to emulate that feat after cruising to the 2007 Colonial Athletic Association Championship, the first conference title in swimming in school history. The road won't be easy, however, after losing two conference champions to graduation.

Sprint Freestyle

Resuming her position at the forefront of the conference is sophomore **Katie Radloff**. The Swimmer of the Year and the Swimmer of the Meet at the CAA Championships as a freshman, Radloff will look to challenge for All-American honors at the NCAA Championships after competing there last year. Challenging her for the top spot on the depth chart will be sophomore transfer **Lindsay Guers**, who joins the team from Florida State with marks that would rank in the W&M all-time top-three.

Junior **Sara Fitzsimmons** will look to step up to the elite level in the CAA this year and qualify for the championship finals in the 200 free, as well as reclaim a spot on the Tribe's top relay teams. Last fall, she helped set the then-school record of 3:28.22 in the 400 free relay, and was a bronze medalist in the 800 free relay at the 2006 conference championships. Senior captain **Kerry Urso** will be looking for a signature season to end her career on, with big times at the Terrapin Invitational and championship qualifications at the CAA Championships.

Providing depth to the sprint corps this year will be a trio of heralded freshmen. **Stevi Anderson** was an eight-time prep All-American and a nine-time New Jersey State Champion in the 50 and 100 freestyles. **Emily Burns** won six Georgia state titles in her final two years at Atlanta Girl's School, and was a Junior National qualifier in the 50 and 100 free. **Haley Smith** was an eight-time YMCA Nationals qualifier, advancing to the championship finals of the 50 free in 2006.

Distance Freestyle

Leading the distance group and also figuring heavily in the middle-distances is junior **Marina Falcone**, the school record holder at 500 and 1000 yards and still the only woman to ever swim under 5 minutes in the 500 free at W&M. Falcone just missed medaling in the 500 free last year, finishing fourth, and was part of the gold-medal winning 800 free relay and NCAA-qualifying 400 free relay. She set school records at both 500 and 1000 free last fall, swimming 4:56.39 at the Terrapin Invitational 500 and 10:15.84 in the dual meet with East Carolina, respectively.

Sophomore **Jill Hamilton** made a major statement at the CAA Championships in the 1650 free, taking third in 17:09.83 to break a 17-year old school record. She will look to continue her progress in the 1650 and achieve an NCAA-qualifying mark, as well as push Falcone for the school records in the 500 and 1000, where she ranks fourth and second all-time, respectively. Senior **Christina Monsees** is poised to have a breakout-year for the Tribe in the middle-distances, after swimming on two school-record 800 free relay teams, including the 7:24.05 effort at the CAA Championships that won gold in a conference-record time. Also a consolation finalist in the 200 free, Monsees will look to advance from the preliminaries in both the 200 and 500 this year.

Tage Waite had an outstanding 1650 swim at the CAA Championships as a freshman, taking 10th in 17:28.07, fifth-best all-time at W&M. Her 1000-yard split also ranks in the W&M all-time top-five. Junior **Caitlin Block** will look to return to her freshman season form after seeing only limited action last year. In 2005-06, Block was 13th in the CAA 1650 free in 17:43.11, still the 10th-best time in school history, and just missed advancing to the consolation finals of the 500 free. This year, Coach Crispino will be looking to Block for top-10 showings in both events. Freshman **Clare LeGuyader** will look to hone her already considerable skills under the leadership of the upperclassmen. While swimming for East Islip High in New York, LeGuyader was an all-state freestyler with times of 5:06.45 for 500 yards and 17:33.41 for 1650 yards. Freshman **Kristin Fimian** will also be counted on to contribute in the middle distances after a prep career that saw her swim 5:05.20 and earn prep All-American honors at Bishop O'Connell High.

Butterfly

Junior **Whitney Pezza** won the 200-fly title in school-record time as a freshman, and set the 100 fly school record of 56.46 seconds at last year's CAA Championship while taking second. This year, Pezza's goal will be to unify the two titles and to claim gold in the two medley relays as well, a task that is well within her reach. Pezza's main competition will come not from another school, but from her own teammate, sopho-

more **Erin Welshofer**. Welshofer won the CAA 200-fly title last season in a school-record 2:03.36 and took fourth in the 100 fly, while also earning gold on the 200 and 400 medley relays. Providing depth behind the pair of champions will be Fimian, who has timed 57.89 in the 100 fly.

Backstroke

Senior captain **Meredith David** enters her final season as the woman to beat in the CAA after capturing silver in both the 100 and 200 back last year. She turned in school-record performances of 56.90 and 2:02.92 in capturing those silver medals, and also earned gold in the medley relays. **Suzanne Figuers** will look to qualify for the championship finals in the 200 back this season, after taking 10th as a freshman in 2:07 flat, the fifth-best time in school history. Sophomore **Laura Herrmann** will also be looking for championship finals berths, after being a consolation finalist in both the 100 and 200 back last year. Providing depth will be the freestyle trio of Radloff, Fitzsimmons, and Burns.

Breaststroke

While the graduation of seven-time CAA Champion Kelly Reitz will be sorely felt, Coach Crispino is confident this year's breaststroke corps will prove to be just as deep and dominant. Sophomore **Courtney Alles** was a surprising fifth in last year's 200 breaststroke and will be looking to improve her times this year in that event. Junior **Rebecca Brofft** advanced to the 200 breast consolation finals last year and just missed doing the same in the 100 breast, and she will be counted on to challenge for championship-final spots this season. Senior **Laura Babcock** was a consolation finalist in the 200 breast as a freshman and will look to regain that form this season. Freshman **Carolyn Royce** was a Junior Nationals qualifier in both breaststrokes and earned all-state honors in each of her four years at Trinity Episcopal School in Richmond.

Individual Medley

After sweeping both IM titles and winning Rookie of the Year honors in 2007, Courtney Alles returns as the top-ranked swimmer in the CAA in the 200 IM and 400 IM. Last year, she won both conference titles with times that rank second in school history behind only all-time great Ruth Anne Miller, and this year, those school records and accompanying NCAA qualifications will be the goals for Alles. Pezza was the CAA's bronze-medalist in the 200 IM, and will look to improve her time of 2:07.45, currently ranked fifth in school history. Figuers was a championship qualifier in the 400 IM, and will look for all-conference honors this year by finishing in the top three of the event.

Senior **Meghan Shrader** will provide depth in the IM events for the Tribe and look to make the CAA Championship team. Also providing depth will be Welshofer, who was 18th in the 200 IM at the CAA meet last year, as well as Royce, who also earned Junior National qualifications in both IM events in addition to the breaststrokes.

Diving

Senior **Meg O'Connor** was a revelation for the Tribe last year after transferring from the College of Charleston. She was able to contribute immediately by winning 10 of 16 1-Meter competitions during the regular season. She will look to improve the point-value of her dives this year and make the finals session at the CAA Championships at both 1-Meter and 3-Meters, as well as chase the regional qualifying marks in both events. Also aiming for the regional standard is junior **Samantha Greenwood**, the team's top diver at 3-Meters. Greenwood set personal-best mark in both disciplines last year, and won three-consecutive victories at 3-Meters during November, culminating in a victory over Georgetown with a score of 216.75. Fifth-year senior **Jen Tan** is converting to the diving corps this season after redshirting last year with a shoulder injury.

Joining the diving corps this year is a pair of freshman in **Sarah Cannon** and **Jean Rodini**. Cannon was a two-time prep All-American at Oconee County and never placed lower than fifth in four trips to the Georgia State Championships. The 2004 Metro Atlanta Champion, Cannon counts an 11-dive, 1-Meter score of 413.75 among her personal bests. Rodini won five consecutive Richmond Metro League and two Greater Richmond Area diving titles from 1-Meter before enrolling at the College this fall. Her personal-best scores include 294.75 for 1-Meter and 292.30 for 3-Meters (both nine-dive programs).

Men's Outlook

The men's swimming and diving team has a tall order in front of it for the 2007-08 season. The Tribe men will be attempting to post back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1997-99. An additional goal will be to equal, or better, the program's best-ever finish at the conference championships of second. But, the mix of seasoned veterans and promising newcomers has gelled into what new head coach **Matt Crispino '02** has deemed the hardest-working team he's ever seen at William and Mary, opening the door to almost limitless possibilities.

Sprint Freestyle

Fifth-year senior **Nick Duda** will take his shot at the three sprint freestyle titles at the CAA Championships, as he ranks among the top eight returning swimmers in the conference at all three distances, including second in the 100 free. He will also attempt to lead the freestyle and medley relays to gold medals, as W&M is the only school to return its entire freestyle relay team, and only loses one person off of both medley relays.

Junior **Nader Amer** was also a championship finalist in the 100 free last season, as well as swimming on all three free relays. While also contributing to the butterfly events, Amer will be counted on to provide a powerful example to the underclassmen and improve his times to challenge for all-conference honors. Sophomores **Kevin Gallagher** and **Kevin Lynch** will compete to rank in the top-tier of the team depth chart after each ended their rookie seasons just outside the all-time top-10 in several events. Gallagher swam on all three of the College's free relays at the CAA Championships in addition to placing 12th in the 200 free. Lynch also swam on the 400 free relay that timed 3:05.31, the second-best performance in school history.

Bolstering the sprint corps will be the addition of three freshmen, **Michael Naccarelli**, **Andrew Quesenberry**, and **Austin Baraki**. Naccarelli was a Junior Nationals finalist for the Suburban Swim Center and won the Pennsylvania AAA state title in the 200 free relay in 2006. He has swum 21.48 and 47.53 in the 50 and 100 free, respectively. Quesenberry captured a pair of national titles for Loyola Blakefield Academy, winning the 50 free at the National Catholic Championships in both 2006 and 2007. Baraki swam for Princess Anne High in Virginia Beach, earning the school's Male Athlete of the Year in 2006-07.

Distance Freestyle

Junior **Jeff Collier** enters the season as the favorite to claim the 1650 free title at the CAA Championships as the top returning finisher from last year. He will look to regain, and improve upon, the speed he exhibited as a freshman in taking the silver medal in 15:49.04, and will take aim at Chris Robinson's school records in the 1000 and 1650 free. Classmate **Shawn Matthews** was the surprise bronze medalist in the 500 free last year, dropping nearly 15 seconds off his lifetime-best entering the meet to swim 4:35.85. This season, he will enter the meet as a known commodity and as the favorite in the event.

Senior captain **Alex Jendzejec** has been a consolation finalist in the 500 free every season for the Tribe, and will look to step up into the championship finals this year. He is also an integral swimmer on the 800 free relay, appearing on three of the College's top-five all-time teams. **Shane Kelsey** didn't compete for the Tribe last year, but will be counted upon to return to his freshman-year form. In 2005-06, Kelsey placed 16th in the CAA 1650 free, and swam all-time top-10 races in both long-distance freestyle events, including 16:21.87 in the 1650 at the Maryland Terrapin Invitational.

Sophomore **Joe DeBiase** narrowly missed advancing to the consolation finals of the 500 free last year at the CAA Championships, but contributed on three of the Tribe's freestyle relays that set all-time top-five marks. He will be looking to improve his pace in the 100, 200, and 500 freestyles this season and be a finals qualifier in all three events at the conference meet.

Providing depth in the distance events will be senior captain **Matthew Shoulders** and classmate **Jesse Moore**. Shoulders has narrowly missed scoring for the Tribe at the CAA Championships the last two years after earning a pair of top-16 performances as a freshman. As a senior leader, he will be counted upon to swim for team points at CAAs. Moore will also be looking to regain a spot on the CAA travel team this team after showing flashes of brilliance as a junior.

Butterfly

Amer will also provide leadership in the butterfly events, after placing 10th in the 100 fly last year at the conference meet. His time of 51.49 ranks ninth all-time at W&M. Also returning after a consolation finals appearance is Lynch, who was 13th in the 100 fly

with a time of 51.83. Freshman **Geoff Ramsdell** joins the team after a stellar career that saw Junior Nationals qualifications in both the 100 fly and 200 IM. Ramsdell has timed 51.74 for the 100 fly and 1:54.18 for the 200 IM.

Backstroke

Matthews, in addition to his lofty ranking in the 500 free, will also be counted among the favorites in both backstrokes this season. Last year, he won bronze in the 200 back and was eighth in the 100 back, in addition to swimming on both medley relays. His finals time of 1:50.68 in the 200 back is third-best all-time for the Tribe, and his 100 back qualifying mark of 52.31 is fifth-best in school history. Classmate **David Mangini** has a pair of championship finals appearances in the 200 back already in his career, and will look to continue that streak this season. Sophomore **Marshall Raiskin** finished eighth in the 200 back and 13th in the 100 back last year, with a pair of William and Mary all-time top-seven performances.

Breaststroke

Junior **Jason Brisson** gives the Tribe a third swimmer projected to win gold at the CAA Championships, and he is favored in both breaststroke events. Last year, he won a pair of silver medals in those races, including a narrow, 57.10-57.12 decision in the 100 breast. This season, he will look to challenge Dan Gowetski's school records in both events, as well as lead the Tribe for the third consecutive year in dual-meet victories. Sophomore **Drew de Michaelis** was a pleasant surprise as a walk-on freshman, making the consolation finals and placing 14th in the 200 breast and just barely missing the consolation finals in the 100 breast, placing 17th (top 16 advance). He will look to move into the all-time top-10 this year and challenge for championship finals berths. Freshman **Jim Fenningham** is also expected to push for finals qualifications, after earning eight All-Catholic citations at the National Catholic Championships. Having timed 1:00.12 in the 100 breast, Fenningham won a trio of Pennsylvania Catholic League titles as a senior and was named a prep All-American.

Individual Medley

Brisson has won the consolation heat of the 200 IM in each of the last two years, and also finished ninth in the 400 IM as a freshman in 2006. With times that rank in the top-four all-time in both events, he will be shooting for all-conference honors this season. Senior captain Alex Jendzejec has three consecutive 13th-place showings in the 400 IM at the conference championships, and will look to raise the bar this year and post a top-eight performance. Mangini has advanced out of preliminaries in both IM events in both his freshman and sophomore years, and enters this season looking to continue his progression with a pair of championship finals berths. Raiskin and Ramsdell will provide depth for the Tribe, as well as opportunistically grab chances to earn points for the team both in dual meets and at the conference championships.

While only one diver is listed on this year's roster for the College, that one has the potential to create a lot of noise (but little splash) at the CAA Championships. Freshman **Mike Newcomb** decided to stick around Williamsburg after earning a pair of state titles for Jamestown High and leading the Eagles to consecutive state championships in 2006 and 2007. Also a four-time district champion, Newcomb has a personal-best effort of 383.7 points on the 1-Meter springboard.

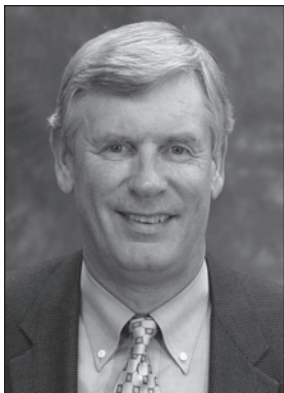

TERRY DRISCOLL
ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

Under the steady guidance and watchful eye of Terry Driscoll, the William and Mary Athletics Department has solidified its standing as one of the nation's preeminent broad-based programs. As Driscoll enters his 12th year as athletics director, he has overseen an unprecedented era of improvement in terms of funding and facilities while also maintaining the College's rich history of producing well-rounded student-athletes.

Driscoll oversees a program that William and Mary President Gene Nichol proclaimed "The nation's gold standard" when it came to balancing academic demands with athletic success. One of the department's stated goals each year is to finish among the top 100 in the annual Director's Cup rankings, which has happened in all but one of the years that Driscoll has been the director.

In the last four years alone, the Tribe's program has combined for a total of 19 Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles. This past season, W&M claimed four CAA titles (Men's and Women's Cross Country, Women's Swimming and Women's Tennis). In 2004-05, the Tribe captured five CAA championships and an Atlantic 10 Football title. As recently as 2002-03, W&M had a school-record 10 teams compete in the NCAA Tournament, with four teams winning conference titles and six that finished in the top 25 at the end of their respective seasons. Overall, no team in the CAA can claim more all-time league championships than the 88 William and Mary has earned.

As impressive as the athletic accomplishments have been during Driscoll's tenure, the program's academic successes have been even greater. In the NCAA's inaugural (2004) APR rankings, a measurement of academic progress based on academic eligibility, retention, and graduation of student-athletes, W&M was fourth in the nation overall and first among institutions offering athletic performance-based scholarships. Additionally, the Tribe football team has twice posted a 100 percent graduation rate, while the majority of the program's squads have consistently ranked among the nation's finest in terms of graduation. In 2002, the CAA started recognizing Scholar-Athletes of the Year for each of the 22 sports it sponsors, and the College has had a conference-high 22 individuals receive the honor.

Despite the many academic and athletic successes, Driscoll's impact on the program has been equally impressive in terms of physical and financial improvements. Since taking over as athletics director, Driscoll has overseen the construction of more than \$20 million in new facilities, including Plumeri Park (baseball), Albert-Daly Field (soccer, lacrosse) and the Busch Courts (tennis). The total increased significantly when Driscoll announced plans to build the \$11 million, 30,000-square foot Jimmie Laycock Football Center at Zable Stadium, which is scheduled to open in time for the 2008 season. This impressive structure follows closely on the heels of the installation of a \$650,000 permanent lighting system (2006) and an \$840,000 state-of-the-art Field Turf Pro artificial playing surface (2006) inside the stadium. Yet another significant upgrade will be unveiled inside the venerable structure for 2007, as the department will install an \$800,000-plus brand new video scoreboard by the season opener.

In addition to the physical structures, Driscoll has also worked with the Associate Athletics Director for Development, Bobby Dwyer, to increase the annual fundraising totals for non-capital projects from \$1.36 million in 1995 to the current annual total of approximately \$2.7 million.

A true student-athlete himself, Driscoll's leadership skills were developed during his collegiate years. As a student-athlete at Boston College, Driscoll captained the basketball team to the National Invitation Tournament Finals as a senior, and was named the tournament MVP. In addition to being named an All-American, his success in the classroom as a biology major garnered him an Academic All-America honor.

After graduating from BC, he was the fourth overall pick of the 1969 NBA Draft, selected by the Detroit Pistons, just three spots after the Milwaukee Bucks chose UCLA's Lew Alcindor, later to be known as Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. Driscoll chose to play a year in Italy first, but then returned to the U.S. to play for the Pistons, Washington Bullets and Milwaukee Bucks before going back to Italy as a player and then coach until 1980.

Driscoll then entered the corporate world in 1980, working for Kazmaier Associates, Inc., an international sporting goods sales and sports marketing firm. After Kazmaier purchased Bike Athletic in 1986, KSG Inc. was formed with the objective of becoming the first, and only, national sales agency in the sporting goods industry. By 1987, Driscoll was president of the company and had expanded the agency to all 50 states just two years later. In early 1990, Driscoll's contribution to a marketing research project for the NCAA was the initial step moving him from product marketing and sales to sports marketing and management. The result of the project was a joint venture between Kazmaier Associates and Host Communications - with Driscoll being named managing director and chief operating officer of NCAA International.

In 1993, Driscoll diversified his experience in the athletic world by working as the executive director of the 1994 World Cup site in Boston. In September of that year, Driscoll was again enlisted to launch a new business, Eagle International Group, an event management and services company. As vice president, Driscoll worked with Hawaii Pacific Sports to organizing the Women's World Volleyball Grand Prix competition in Honolulu.

Driscoll resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Susan. The couple has two children - Keith, a 1997 graduate of Holy Cross, and Leslie, a 2001 graduate of William and Mary.



BARB BLOSSER
SENIOR EXECUTIVE
ASSOCIATE AD/SWA

Few names in the William and Mary Athletics Department are as familiar, or respected, as that of Senior Associate Athletics Director Barbara Blosser. Since first arriving on campus in 1978, Blosser has touched the lives of thousands of Tribe student-athletes.

She has held her current title since April of 2004, after spending the previous 12 years as the associate athletics director. In each role, Blosser has served as an integral part of nearly every facet of the department's daily operations.

Blosser started her career at William and Mary as the head women's basketball coach in 1978 and guided the Tribe to a VAIAW crown in her first season with a then school-record 16 wins (16-13). Her 1980 Tribe team (11-14) placed third, while the 1981 squad (16-16) was VAIAW runner-up. She was also at the helm during the 1984-85 season when William and Mary made the jump to NCAA Division I. Overall, she finished her coaching career with 115 wins, 84 of which came at William and Mary.

When the College's men's and women's athletic programs merged in May of 1986, she moved to administration, first serving as the assistant to the associate athletics director. Over the past 17 years, her administrative responsibilities at W&M have included the monitoring of financial aid matters, coordinating the scheduling of athletic facilities, supervision of coaches and staff and, currently, serving as the person primarily responsible for administering the day-to-day operations of the department.

From October 1992 to June 1993 and August 1995 to July 1996, Blosser also served as acting athletics director in an interim capacity. For her efforts, she was named the first recipient of the John Randolph Inspiration Award. Blosser has served on various committees such as the NCAA Strategic Planning Committee and the Colonial Athletic Association Competition Committee.

Blosser began her coaching career at the helm of the women's basketball program at Ashland College in Ohio. During two seasons there, she led the Eagles to successive 15-7 and 16-8 ledgers. Her 1977 squad won the AIAW Region V Championship, while her 1978 team took the OASW Small College title.

A former three-sport standout at Ohio State, Blosser graduated Cum Laude in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education. At OSU, she was selected to both Phi Beta Kappa and Mortar Board. She competed in basketball, field hockey and tennis and captained both the basketball and field hockey squads her senior year. She went on to earn her master's degree from the University of North Carolina Greensboro in 1978.

TRIBE ATHLETICS



ATHLETIC SUCCESS

The 2006-07 season was another strong year for the College, as Tribe teams added four more CAA titles to bring the school's all-time league-leading total to 88.

The men's cross country squad won its seventh consecutive CAA crown in the fall, while the women's cross country team won its fourth straight. The women's swimming team won its first CAA Championship, while the women's tennis team added its 19th all-time CAA crown in the spring.

Individually, the women's tennis doubles team of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic reached the title match of the NCAA Doubles Championship, earning All-America honors. Katie Radloff became the first female swimmer to advance to the NCAA's since 1983. Additionally, Keith Bechtol raced to a 14th-place finish in the 10,000m, while Bonnie Meekins placed 16th in the heptathlon at the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student-athlete's academic responsibilities.

This year, the NCAA honored 13 W&M teams as recipients of its public recognition award. The Tribe teams recognized are baseball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's gymnastics, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field and volleyball.

Additionally, in the latest NCAA graduation rate reports, three Tribe teams posted 100% graduation rates, including football, women's basketball and women's cross country/track.

Since 1992, 39 student-athletes have been designated Academic All-Americans, including three in the past academic year. Keith Bechtol (men's track) was a First-Team selection, Ryan Overdevest (men's soccer) was a Second-Team selection and Anna Young (women's soccer) was a Third-Team selection.

In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its sports, and not surprisingly, W&M has set the pace with 22 winners. Bechtol was the CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year in both cross country and track and field, bringing his career award total to five. Meghan Bishop (women's cross country) earned her fourth CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in the fall in cross country.

In addition, four of W&M's five Rhodes scholars participated in varsity sports.

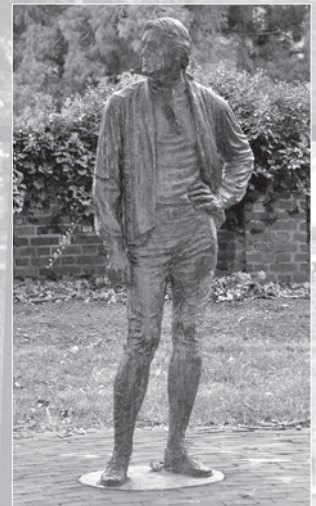
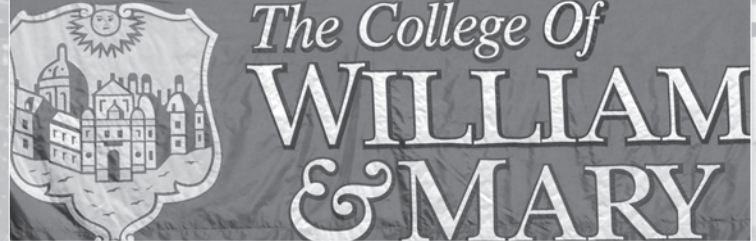
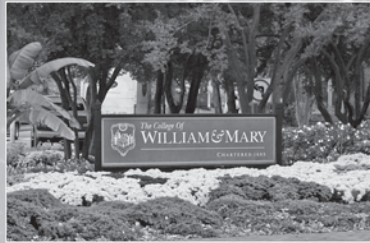
For more than 300 years, William and Mary has been a symbol of academic distinction in America. Now, in its fourth century, the College is prepared to educate the leaders of the 21st century.

The College of William and Mary was founded in 1693 by King William III and Queen Mary II of England. Four Presidents of the United States received their education at the College - George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler.

William and Mary was the first college to institute an honor code of conduct. The premier academic society, Phi Beta Kappa, was founded by William and Mary students in 1776. The Society of the Alumni, founded in 1842, is the sixth oldest alumni group in the nation. Now the College is designated as a "Public Ivy", and ranks sixth among all public universities (U.S. News and World Report).

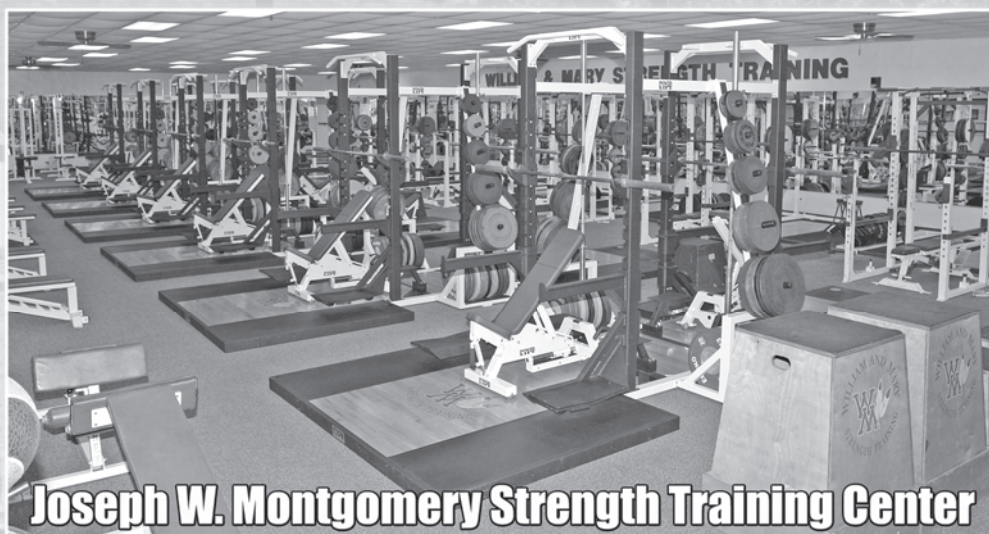

Sports Psychology

Consultation is available for sport psychology education, performance enhancement skills training, strategies for dealing with stress or injury, or for personal issues that may affect performance.

Compliance, Academic Support

As members of the Colonial Athletic Association and the NCAA, the College is committed to full compliance with all NCAA and conference regulations. The department has a full-time Director of Compliance, Pamela Mason, who is committed to assisting students, staff and coaches through education and monitoring of compliance issues.

The department offers a variety of study, life and career building skills programs, but holds firm to the concept of self-determination—each student must take responsibility for his or her collegiate experience. Our goal is to ensure that there is a support system in place to assist students to make positive and informed decisions.

Speed, Strength, Conditioning

Tribe Athletics is very proud of the Joseph W. Montgomery Strength Training Center, a 5,000 square foot weight training facility. Under the guidance of the Head Speed, Strength and Conditioning Coach John Sauer, each sport is provided with a program designed to enhance individual strength and flexibility development specific to the skills and movements required for their sport. Individuals are educated on proper lifting techniques and workouts are monitored to ensure safety at all times.

Sports Medicine

The Division of Sports Medicine provides a comprehensive health care program for the department of intercollegiate athletics. The staff consists of Assistant Athletics Director for Health Services, Steve Cole, a team physician, seven full-time certified athletic trainers, two graduate assistant athletic trainers and medical specialists from the local community. The team physician has overall responsibility for supervision of the sports medicine program. Tribe athletes have the luxury of rehabilitating and treating injuries in a state-of-the-art athletic training facility.

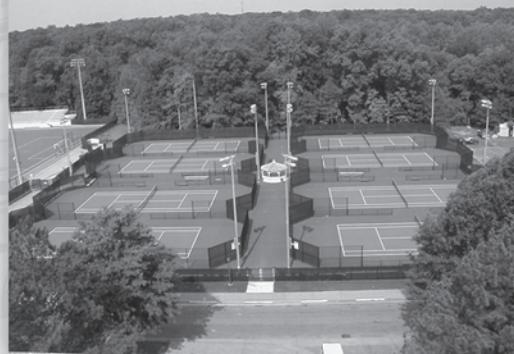
