### W&M's Jeff Kader to Compete for NCAA Singles Title

William and Mary junior men's tennis player **Jeff Kader (Geneva, OH)** will compete at the 2004 NCAA Singles Tournament, to be held May 26-31 at the University of Tulsa ... Currently ranked 58th in the nation with a record of 21-19, Kader is the first Tribe men's player to make the individual tournament since **Patrick Brown** and **Trevor Spracklin** advanced to the third round of the 2001 doubles championship ... A first team All-Colonial Athletic Association selection in singles for the second straight year, he was named to the league's second team as a freshman ... In the fall he advanced to the finals of the ITA Mideast Regional Tournament, upsetting the top seed, No. 22 Mat Cloer (Florida State) in the quarterfinals, 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 ... He earned an automatic berth into the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships, the first W&M men's player ever to compete in the event ... There he became just the fourth player in the history of the tournament to knock off the top seed in the first round, as he defeated No. 4 Alex Vlaski (Washington), 7-6 (3), 6-3 ... Kader has defeated a total of seven nationally-ranked opponents this season.

### About the Tribe

W&M's men's tennis team posted a number of big wins in 2004, ending the season in the semifinals of the CAA Tournament with a record of 12-12 ... The Tribe recorded its first win over an SEC team under head coach **Peter Daub**, with a 4-3 victory on the road against Tennessee ... W&M also ended Virginia Commonwealth's 60-match winning streak against CAA opponents, defeating the Rams, 4-3, in Richmond ... VCU had never lost to a CAA school since joining the league for the 1996 season ... The College's doubles team of senior **Geoff Russell (Phoenix, AZ)** and freshman **Steven Kane (Nokomis, FL)** is ranked 46th in the nation ... They defeated four ranked opponents on the year, including victories over No. 3 Zoltan Csanadi/Izak van der Merwe (Old Dominion) and No. 10 Antonio Ruiz/Jose Zarzi (Texas) ... In March, W&M was selected as the recipient of the ITA National Team Sportsmanship Award.

### Head Coach Peter Daub

Tribe head coach **Peter Daub** is in his 11th season at W&M, and his 16th overall as a head coach ... He has a 169-127 record with the Tribe, and a career coaching record of 377-254, including five years as the men's and women's coach at Temple (1985-89) ... He also was an assistant coach for the Georgia men's team ... Daub was named the CAA Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2001 and was the first tennis player to be inducted into the Findlay College Athletic Hall of Fame ... He led the Tribe to the 1999 NCAA Tournament, W&M's first appearance since 1973.

## Good Sports

In March, the ITA announced that W&M's men's tennis team was the recipient of the ITA National Team Sportsmanship Award for that month ... The Tribe was nominated by Greg Patton, the head coach at Boise State for the honor ... Each month during the spring season, more than 1,200 ITA member institutions (NCAA Divisions I, II and III, NAIA and Junior College) are eligible for the award.

## W&M's Gardner Larned Inducted into ITA Hall of Fame

On May 26, W&M graduate **Gardner Larned** (1950) will be inducted into the ITA Men's Tennis Hall of Fame ... Larned helped lead the Tribe to the NCAA Men's Tennis Championship in 1947 ... He also won the national singles championship and the Southern Conference singles and doubles (with **Bernard "Tut" Bartzen**) titles that year ... Bartzen was previously inducted into the ITA Hall of Fame in 1985.

## Upset City

The Tribe has posted arguably the biggest individual and team upsets of the 2003-04 season ... In the first round of the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships, W&M junior **Jeff Kader**, ranked 96th in the nation at the time defeated fourth-ranked Alex Vlaski (Washington) in straight sets, 7-6 (3), 6-3 ... It was the first appearance for a W&M men's player at the event and was just the fourth time in the history of the championship that the tournament's No. 1 seed

was defeated in the first round ... It was the first loss of the season for Vlaski, who was one of the most successful players in national college tournaments over the previous 18 months ... He had won 16 matches in his previous four national tournaments, advancing to at least the quarterfinals in each of them ... In the Green and Gold's final match of the regular season, W&M, ranked 48th in the nation at the time, defeated No. 7 Virginia Commonwealth, 4-3, on the road ... The loss was the Rams' first against a CAA opponent since joining the league for the 1996 season, ending VCU's 60-match CAA winning streak ... It was the Tribe's first win over a top 10 team since the current ITA ranking system was in place ... Also noteworthy was the doubles win by W&M senior **Geoff Russell** and rookie **Steven Kane** over then No. 3 (and current No. 15) Zoltan Csanadi/Izak van der Merwe (Old Dominion) ... The Tribe duo, unranked at the time, posted the 9-8 (3) victory in the finals of the 2003 Virginia Invitational in Charlottesville.

## W&M's NCAA Championships

William and Mary's men's tennis team won the NCAA team championship in 1947 and 1948 ... The College is one of just five schools to have won more than one NCAA Division I men's tennis team title, joining Stanford (17), Southern California (16), UCLA (15) and Georgia (4) ... The Tribe finished second in 1946, behind Southern

California ... In 1947, W&M's **Gardner Larned** won the national singles championship, while **Bernard Bartzen** and **Frank Kovaleski** teamed up for the national doubles title in 1948 ... No other W&M sport has ever won an NCAA team championship ... The only other individual NCAA champions in school history have been in men's gymnastics, (with **Scott McCall** winning on the rings in 1996, and **Ramon Jackson** winning this season's parallel bar title in April) and men's indoor track and field (**Howell Michael**, mile, 1970 and **Reggie Clark**, 800-meter, 1974).

Junior • Geneva, OH • New Braunfels (TX) High School  
Ranked No. 58 in singles

**Career:** Tied for 10th place in school history with 61 career doubles wins ... Three wins away from a tie for 10th on W&M's career singles victory list.

**2003-04:** First team All-Colonial Athletic Association in singles ... Named CAA Singles Player of the Week on March 23 ... Ranked as high as 26th in the nation in singles ... Currently third on the team with 21 singles wins, playing at the No. 1 position in every dual match ... Had an outstanding fall, with a record of 11-5 ... Advanced to the finals of the ITA Mideast Region Singles Championship, upsetting the No. 1 seed, Matt Cloer (Florida State), who was ranked 22nd in the nation, 4-6, 6-3, 6-3, in the quarterfinals ... Was the first W&M men's player ever to advance to the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships ... In that event, he became the fourth player in the history of the tournament to upset the No. 1 seed in the first round, as he defeated No. 4 Alex Vlaski (Washington), 7-6 (3), 6-3 ... Defeated No. 6 Bo Hodge (Georgia) on the road in a spring dual match, 6-3, 5-7, 6-2 ... Totaled seven singles victories over ranked opponents during the year ... Earned his 50th career singles victory with a win on October 24 over Braen Aneiros (Liberty), 6-3, 6-0, in the first round of the main draw at the ITA Region Championship.

**2002-03:** First team All-CAA in singles and ended the year ranked 22nd in the Mideast Region ... Upset 51st-ranked Saber Kadiri in the Tribe's 4-2 win at Virginia Tech ... Also defeated 98th-ranked Justin Hunter (Colorado), 6-4, 6-4 ... Lost a three-set tiebreaker match to 60th-ranked Pedro Nieto (Virginia Commonwealth).

**2001-02:** Won 27 singles matches, the sixth-best season mark and the second-most by a rookie in school history ... Named second team All-CAA in singles ... Won the first singles match of his career on Sept. 8, defeating Dan Scrafford (Richmond), 6-4, 6-1 at the Tribe Invitational ... Won three matches to make the main draw of the ITA Regionals and also advanced to the quarterfinals of the Virginia Tech Invitational in singles ... Won 11 of his first 14 singles matches in the spring ... Earned singles wins in W&M's one-point victories over Iowa and Rice ... His 25th career singles win was also his first over a ranked opponent, as he upset No. 113 Lovre Brajkovic (Indiana State), 6-0, 6-3 on March 14.

**Juniors/High School:** Four years of tennis ... Placed second in the state and fourth in the national indoors ... 67-4 high school record ... Played in AAU Junior Olympics and didn't lose a match ... Midwest and NEO Sportsmanship Award ... Second in Columbus Indoor Junior Tournament ... Also played one year of soccer.
