W&M Senior Jeff Kader to Compete for NCAA Championship

For the second straight season William and Mary senior **Jeff Kader** has been selected to compete in the 64-player NCAA Men's Tennis Singles Tournament ... The tournament will begin Wednesday May 25 at Texas A&M's George P. Mitchell Tennis Center, with the final to be played on Monday May 30 ... Kader is ranked 52nd in the nation and has a 20-16 (.556) record this season ... Last season Kader lost in the first round to then No. 10 Alex Vlaski.

About the Tribe

W&M ended the season in the first round of the NCAA Tournament with a record of 11-15 ... The Tribe is currently ranked 62nd in the nation ... W&M earned an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament by winning the school's first Colonial Athletic Association Men's Tennis Championship since 1990 ... The Tribe upset nine-time defending champion Virginia Commonwealth, 4-2, to win the title ... VCU had won every CAA title since joining the league in 1996 ... It was the Tribe's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since earning an at-large berth in 1999.

Kader W&M's First NCAA Singles Participant Since 1947

Jeff Kader is just the second W&M player in school history, and the first since 1947, to be selected to compete in the NCAA Singles Tournament ... This is Kader's second consecutive season in the event, after becoming the first Tribe player to compete at the tournament since

Gardner Larned won the NCAA singles title in 1947 ... Larned was inducted into the ITA Men's Tennis Hall of Fame in 2004 ... The Tribe has had two doubles teams compete in the NCAA Tournament ... **Fred Kovaleski** and **Bernard "Tut" Bartzen** won the national championship in 1948 and **Patrick Brown** and **Trevor Spracklin** advanced to the second round in 2001.

Kader Winning When it Matters Most

Senior **Jeff Kader**, currently ranked 52nd in the nation, was named the Most Outstanding Performer of 2005 CAA Tournament after going 3-0 in both singles and doubles at the event ... After an easy singles win in the quarterfinal round, he continued to impress in the last two matches, defeating both of the CAA's Co-Play-

ers of the Year in straight sets ... In the semifinal, Kader defeated No. 33 Izak van der Merwe (Old Dominion), 6-3, 6-4 ... The next day he beat No. 20 Arnaud Leclouerc (Virginia Commonwealth), 6-3, 7-5 ... Kader teamed with freshman **Alex Cojanu** for a 3-0 record at No. 2 doubles, helping the Tribe clinch the doubles point in all three league tournament matches.

Good Sport

Senior **Jeff Kader** was named as the recipient of the 2005 Blue-Gray Tennis Classic Sportsmanship Award ... The only player in the 16-team event to receive the award, Kader was selected ahead of more than 100 other players ... It was the second sportsmanship award in less than a year for the Tribe, as the team received the ITA National Team Sportsmanship Award for March of 2003, given to one of the over 1,200 ITA member institutions each month.

Jeff Kader in National Singles Tournaments

In his career **Jeff Kader** has a 2-6 record in national singles tournaments ... In the fall of 2003 he became the first W&M player ever to compete in the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships, where he became just the fourth player in the history of the tournament to upset the No. 1 seed in the first round, defeating then No. 4 Alex Vlaski (Washington), 7-6 (3), 6-3 ... Kader's complete national tournament results are on the following page of this release.

Kader Named CAA Player of the Week Three Times

Senior **Jeff Kader** was named the CAA Singles Player of the Week a league-high three times in 2005, earning the award on March 16, March 30 and April 13 ... Kader is ranked 52nd in the nation in singles and has defeated nine nationally ranked opponents this season ... The 2005 CAA Tournament MVP was also named the CAA Singles Player of the Week on March 23, 2004.

W&M's NCAA Championships

William and Mary's men's tennis team won the NCAA team championship in 1947 and 1948, still the only NCAA team championships in school history ... The College is one of just five schools to have won more than one NCAA Division I men's tennis team title, joining Stanford (17), Southern California (16), UCLA (15) and Georgia (4) ... The

Tribe finished second in 1946, behind Southern California ... In 1947, W&M's **Gardner Larned** won the national singles championship, while **Bernard "Tut" Bartzen** and **Frank Kovaleski** teamed up for the national doubles title in 1948 ... The only other individual NCAA champions in school history have been in men's gymnastics (with **Scott McCall** winning on the rings in 1996 and **Ramon Jackson** winning the parallel bar title in 2004) and men's indoor track and field (**Hal Michael**, mile, 1970 and **Reggie Clark**, 880 yards, 1974) ... This season, W&M's women's tennis team could have as many as three players competing in the NCAA Individual Tournament ... Sophomore **Megan Moulton-Levy** was selected to compete in the singles championship and was picked in doubles with partner senior **Candice Fuchs** ... Junior **Megan Muth** is the fourth alternate in the singles field.

Five Tribe Players Earn All-CAA Honors

Five W&M individuals earned All-CAA honors this season ... Freshman **Alex Cojanu** was named the league's Co-Rookie of the Year, joining current senior **Sean Kelleher** as the only Tribe players ever to earn that honor ... Senior **Jeff Kader** was named first team all-conference in singles for the third straight season and was voted to the second team in doubles with partner Cojanu ... The doubles team of Kelleher and junior **Stephen Ward** were named to the conference's first team for the second time ... Kelleher was joined by sophomore **Colin O'Brien** on the second team in singles.

Peter Daub Honored by Temple

Temple University announced this spring that W&M head coach **Peter Daub** was named one of 20 "Outstanding Graduates of the Sport and Recreation Administration Program" at the school ... Daub received his graduate degree from Temple in 1987.

Kader Finalist for W&M Senior Male Athlete of the Year

Jeff Kader was one of three finalists for the 2005 William and Mary Tribe Club Senior Male Athlete of the Year ... The award was won by **Lang Campbell**, the starting quarterback for W&M's football team, which advanced to the NCAA Semifinals in 2004 ... Earlier this season, Campbell won the Walter Payton award, given to the nation's most outstanding offensive Division I-AA football player and was a consensus first team All-American.

2004-05: Selected for the second straight season to the NCAA Singles Tournament ... Named Most Outstanding Performer of the 2005 Colonial Athletic Association Tournament, leading W&M to its first conference title since 1990 with a 4-2 win over nine-time defending champion Virginia Commonwealth ... Went 3-0 in both singles and doubles at the event, posting straight-set singles wins over both of the 2005 CAA Co-Players of the Year (#33 Izak van der Merwe, Old Dominion and #20 Arnaud Leclouerc, Virginia Commonwealth) ... First team All-CAA in singles for the third straight year ... Second team All-CAA in doubles with freshman Alex Cojanu ... The only one of more than 100 players to win the Blue-Gray Classic Sportsmanship Award ... Named CAA Singles Player of the Week a league-high three times (3/16, 3/30, 4/13) ... Defeated nine nationally-ranked singles players ... Opened the fall season ranked 26th in the nation ... Defeated No. 28 Matic Omerzel (Georgia) on Jan. 24, the third straight season that he had won a singles match at Georgia in a dual match ... Upset No. 17 Pedro Rico (Pepperdine), 6-4, 4-6, 6-3 on March 6 ... Nearly gave No. 27 Franticek Babej (South Alabama) his first dual match singles loss of the season, before falling 2-6, 7-6 (4), 6-7 (4) on April 9 ... Teamed up with Cojanu for a 17-4 singles record, winning their last nine matches, including three in the CAA Tournament and one in the NCAA Tournament ... They defeated No. 10 Jeff Groslimond/Chris Westerhof (Florida State), 9-7, to advance to the quarterfinals of the ITA Mideast Regionals.

2003-04: Had one of the best seasons in school history, becoming the first W&M player to advance to the NCAA singles tournament in more than 50 years ... Ranked as high as 26th in the nation in singles, ending the year at No. 60 nationally and ninth in the Mideast Region ... First team All-CAA and picked as the CAA Singles Player of the Week on March 23 ... Led team with 21 doubles victories ... Outstanding fall season, posting an 11-5 record, with four wins and four losses coming against nationally-ranked opponents ... Won his first two matches at the Southern Intercollegiate Classic, before falling to No. 2 Bo Hodge (Georgia) in the quarterfinals ... Ran off five straight wins to advance to the finals of the ITA Mideast Regionals, including a 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 win in the quarterfinals over No. 22 Mat Cloer (Florida State), the tournament's top seed ... His finals appearance earned him an automatic berth to the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships, the first appearance for a W&M men's player at the event ... There he became the fourth player

in the history of the event to defeat the No. 1 seed in the first round, defeating fourth-ranked Alex Vlaski (Washington), 7-6 (3), 6-3 ... Went on to defeat three nationally ranked players in the spring, including a win on the road over four-time All-American, No. 6 Bo Hodge (Georgia), 6-3, 5-7, 6-2, on Jan. 31 ... Also defeated No. 56 Felix Hardt (San Diego State), 6-2, 3-6, 6-1 on Jan. 13 and No. 75 Conor Taylor (North Carolina State), 7-5, 6-2, on April 6 ... Lost in rematch with Vlaski, ranked No. 10 in the nation, 5-7, 6-7 (5) in the first round of the NCAA Singles Tournament.

2002-03: First team All-CAA in singles and ended the year ranked 22nd in the Mideast Region ... Upset No. 51 Saber Kadiri in the Tribe's 4-2 win at Virginia Tech ... Also defeated No. 98 Justin Hunter (Colorado), 6-4, 6-4.

2001-02: Won 27 singles matches, the sixth-best season mark and the second-most by a rookie in school history ... Second team All-CAA in singles ... Won three matches to make the main singles draw of the ITA Regionals ... His 25th career singles win was also his first over a ranked opponent, as he upset No. 113 Lovre Brajkovic (Indiana State), 6-0, 6-3 on March 14.

Juniors/High School: Placed second in the state and fourth in the national indoors ... 67-4 high school record ... Played in AAU Junior Olympics and didn't lose a match ... Midwest and NEO Sportsmanship Award ... Second in Columbus Indoor Junior Tournament ... Also played one year of soccer.
