Junior Season (2006-07)

Concluded the season needing just six points to become the program's 12th 1,000-point scorer ... Ranks ninth on W&M's career steals list with 167 ... Started all 31 games for the Tribe in 2006-07 ... Ranked second on the team and 18th in the conference with 12.7 ppg ... Also ranked second on the team and 16th in the CAA with 6.7 rpg ... Was the league's 11th most-accurate free throw shooter, connecting on 76.4 percent of her attempts ... Averaged 35.35 minutes per game, the seventh most in the CAA ... Finished the season with eight double-doubles ... Recorded six double-doubles in the first 10 games of the season ... Scored 20 or more points five times, while posting double-digit efforts on 21 occasions ... Registered a career-high 27 points, going 4-of-4 from beyond the arc, in the win at Georgia State ... Previous career high was a 26-point effort in the triumph at Virginia Tech on Nov. 28 ... Averaged 20 ppg in the CAA Tournament, scoring 19 points in the win versus George Mason and 21 points against Hofstra ... Her other 20-point efforts came against James Madison and VCU ... Nearly recorded the program's first triple-double in the win against Drexel in Williamsburg, totaling 12 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high eight assists ... Closed out the season by averaging 2.0 spg during the final eight contests ... Swiped two or more steals in 15 games ... Connected on 20 consecutive free throw attempts from Nov. 28 - Dec. 21 ... Played all 40 minutes a team-leading nine times ... Selected to the Preseason Fans' Choice All-CAA Team.

Sophomore Season (2005-06)

Saw action in all 28 games, earning 27 starts ... Led the team with 52 steals and ranked fifth in the CAA in steals per contest (1.86) ... Averaged 11.3 points per game, ranking second on the team ... Totaled 5.2 rebounds per contest, the squad's third-best mark ... Equaled a then-career high with 22 points, going 8-of-8 from the charity stripe, in the win against Hofstra ... Also tallied nine boards in the victory, just missing out on a double-double ... Came one rebound shy of totaling double-doubles against Hampton and Delaware ... Totaled 15 points and nine rebounds against the Pirates and 11 points and nine rebounds against the Blue Hens ... Followed up the Hofstra performance by scoring 18 points versus George Mason ... Posted a 21-point showing in the triumph over High Point, playing all 40 minutes ... Junior Season (2006-07)

Selected to the All-CAA First Team for the second consecutive season ... Named to the *Richmond Times-Dispatch* All-State First Team ... An all-state second-team honoree by the Virginia Sports Information Directors (VaSID) ... Ranks third on the program's career scoring list with 1,411 points ... Also ranks third on W&M's all-time rebounding list with 854 boards ... One of just three players in Tribe history to record 1,000 points and 800 rebounds ... Became the College's 11th 1,000-point scorer when she made a layin with five seconds remaining in the first half in the victory against Longwood ... Her 85 career blocks stands as the second-best mark at the College ... Led the team and ranked eighth in the CAA with 14.8 ppg ... Finished the regular season with 21 double-doubles, which tied for second-best nationally ... Scored in double figures in 27 of 28 games ... Totaled 20 or more points on 14 occasions ... 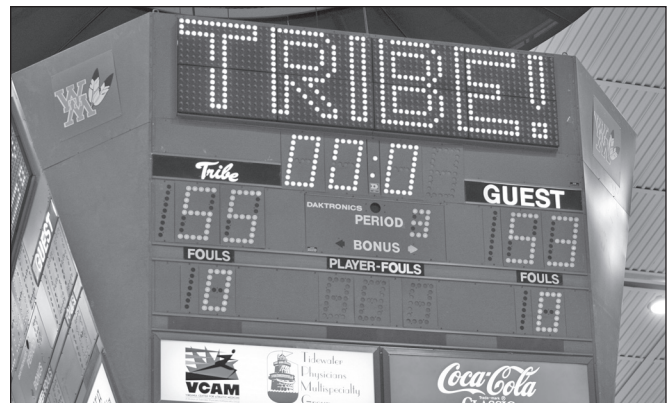
