Tribe Earns Second-Most Wins in School History

The 2006-07 season proved to be one of the most successful in the program's history, as the Tribe compiled a 19-12 record. It was the second-most wins in school history, nearly equaling the record of 20 that was established during the 1993-94 campaign.

W&M Posts Second Consecutive Winning Season

Having recorded an impressive 19-12 mark last year, the Tribe earned its second straight winning season. In doing so, it marked the first time since 1977-78 and 1978-79 that W&M has posted back-to-back winning seasons. Additionally, it marked the initial time the College has accomplished the feat as a Division-I program.

CAA Success

In addition to its overall success last season, the Tribe registered 10 wins in conference play. In doing so, W&M earned a double-digit win total in league play for the second consecutive season, marking the initial time the program has accomplished the feat. The Green and Gold posted a 10-8 mark in CAA play last season, while they earned an 11-7 record in 2005-06. Both seasons, the team finished fifth in the final regular-season conference standings.

Three W&M Players Earn All-CAA Honors

For the second consecutive season, William and Mary had three players selected to all-conference teams. After being honored as the CAA Player of the Year as a sophomore, Kyra Kaylor was once again chosen to the all-conference first team in 2006-07. Tiffany Benson also established herself as one of the league's top players and garnered a spot on the All-Rookie Team. In doing so, she became the eighth W&M player in the last

eight years to earn a spot on the all-rookie squad. In addition to excelling on the hardwood, Sarah Stroh also distinguished herself in the classroom and was named to the All-Academic First Team. The honor marked the second straight season she earned the award.

Tribe Ranks Among the Nation's Best

In addition to leading the conference in field goal percentage defense and three-point shooting, the team ranked among the nation's very best in those categories. By limiting its opposition to just 35.5 percent shooting, W&M ranked 13th in the country. Additionally, the College ranked 23rd nationally in three-pointers made per game (6.3) and 26th in three-point shooting percentage (.360).

Kaylor Joins Elite Company

One of the most productive players in the program's history, Kyra Kaylor continued her ascent up a number of the Tribe's all-time record lists last season. She finished the year ranked third in career points (1,411) and rebounds (854). She also ranks second in career blocks (86) and made free throws (395), while she is among the all-time top 10 in nine other categories.

W&M Enjoys Seven-Game Winning Streak

The Tribe went more than a month without losing during the 2006-07 campaign, rattling off seven consecutive victories from Dec. 10 - Jan. 11. The streak was the program's longest since the 1980-81 season when it rattled off a school-record eight consecutive triumphs. During the streak, the College outscored the opposition by 9.7 ppg.

Tribe Defeats Virginia Tech

The College earned one of the most impressive victories in the program's history when it defeated Virginia Tech, 64-41, on Nov. 28 in Blacksburg, Va. The triumph marked the first time W&M had defeated an ACC opponent since the 1973-74 season when it defeated Virginia. Additionally, it snapped a 10-game losing streak versus Tech.

Great Start ... Great Finish

The Tribe got off to a great start during the 2006-07 season, as it opened the campaign with an 11-4 mark. The impressive record marked the program's best start since the 1993-94 season when it began 12-3 through the first 15 games. The College also closed the season playing well, earning victories in four of its last five contests.

Home Court Advantage

While the Tribe played well on the road last season, it played particularly well in its home games. The team compiled a 10-3 mark at Kaplan Arena, earning three more home victories than it did the previous season. Additionally, it marked the most home wins by W&M since the 1993-94 season when it won 11 games. Kyra Kaylor played an important role in the squad's success in Williamsburg, averaging a double-double with 15.5 ppg and 10.5 rpg.

Tribe is Nearly Unbeatable When Leading at the Half

W&M was nearly unbeatable when it led at the half last season, as it posted an impressive 15-2 record. The team's success came as no surprise, however, as it racked up a perfect 14-0 mark the previous season in games that it led at the intermission.

Benson Shatters Blocks Record

In just one season at the College, Tiffany Benson established herself as one of William and Mary's greatest shot-blockers. She finished the season with a school-record 67 blocks, shattering the previous mark of 42 established by Rebecca Dayvault in 1990-91. Additionally, Benson's block total already ranks fourth on W&M's career list. Her finest performance of the season came in the win against North Texas when she recorded five rejections in the first half. Despite not totaling any blocks in the second half, the total still ranked tied for second on W&M's single-game list.

Stroh Etches Her Name in the W&M Record Book

An important part of the Tribe's success throughout her career, Sarah Stroh had a terrific senior season and etched her name into the Tribe record book. In addition to setting a single-season school record with 1,131 minutes played, she also finished her career as the Green and Gold's all-time leader for games played with 115. A tremendous distributor of the basketball, she dished out 325 assists during her four years at the College, which ranks third all-time at W&M.

Big Comeback

Despite trailing by 20 points in the second half versus George Mason, the Tribe refused to give up and utilized a 23-2 run to rally back and defeat the Patriots on Jan. 7. Freshman Robyn Barton sealed the win for W&M, as she connected on a three-pointer from the left wing with 2.6 seconds remaining to lift the College to a 47-46 victory.

So Close

While the Tribe's last win against Old Dominion came during the 1974-75 season, it nearly upended the in-state foe on Feb. 18 in Williamsburg. The College led by as many as 13 points and for all but the final 1:14 of play, but ODU escaped with a 56-52 win. The defensive effort was the Tribe's best versus the Lady Monarchs since the 1972-73 season when W&M prevailed, 56-46.

Kaylor Sets Single-Season Free Throw Mark

Throughout her career, Kyra Kaylor has demonstrated the ability to get to the free throw line with regularity. Last season was no different, as she sank a single-season school record 152 attempts from the charity stripe. Her best effort came in the win at George Mason when she went 15-of-16 at the line, coming just one make shy of the single-game school record.
