2006-07 Season Highlights

- With 19 victories, the Tribe earned the second-most wins in school history
- W&M registered its second consecutive winning season, marking the initial time the College has accomplished the feat as a Division-I program
- The Tribe recorded 10 wins in CAA action, marking the second straight season the squad earned double-digit victory totals in conference play
- Led by first-team All-CAA honoree Kyra Kaylor, three Tribe players garnered all-conference accolades
- W&M led the CAA in field goal percentage defense (35.5%) and three-point shooting accuracy (36.0%) - the field goal percentage defense ranked 13th nationally
- The Tribe went more than a month without losing, rattling off seven consecutive triumphs from Dec. 10 - Jan. 11
- W&M earned an impressive 64-41 victory at Virginia Tech on Nov. 28, registering the program's first win versus an ACC team since the 1973-74 season when it defeated Virginia
- With an 11-4 mark in its first 15 games, the Tribe recorded the program's best start to a season since 1993-94
- The Tribe posted an impressive 10-3 mark at Kaplan Arena, claiming the most home wins by W&M since the 1993-94 season
- Kyra Kaylor finished the season ranked third at the College in career points (1,411) and rebounds (854)
- Tiffany Benson established a school record with 67 blocks, shattering the previous mark of 42 set by Rebecca Dayvault in 1990-91
