W&M Opens 2005 Season With Home Games vs. Ball State and Penn State

William and Mary's field hockey team opens the 2005 season with back-to-back home games this weekend ... The Tribe will host Ball State at noon on Saturday, Aug. 27, followed by another noon game the next day against Penn State ... Both games will be played at the College's Busch Field.

About the Tribe

Last season, W&M finished with a record of 13-7 and ranked 15th in the nation ... The Tribe won the regular season Colonial Athletic Association championship with a perfect 7-0 regular season record against league opponents ... It was the first outright regular season conference title in school history, although W&M tied Old Dominion for first place in the CAA in 2003 with a 6-1 conference record ... Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was named the CAA Player of the Year and was selected as the state's player of the year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors (VaSID) ... She is the first field hockey player in school history to be voted as the best player in the CAA or in the state ... Head coach **Peel Hawthorne** was also named the CAA and VaSID Coach of the Year ... It was her third conference award (1995, 2001) but her first selection as state coach of the year.

Seven Straight Winning Seasons

Head coach **Peel Hawthorne** has led the Tribe to a winning record in each of the last seven seasons, every year starting with 1998 ... A winning record this year would tie the school record of eight consecutive winning seasons, set from 1986 through 1993 ... Over the last seven seasons, W&M has a record of 84-54 (.609) overall and is 31-9 (.775) in CAA regular season play ... The Tribe has won at least 65 percent of its games in three of the last four seasons.

Strong Play in the CAA

Including last season's regular season title with a perfect 7-0 record against the CAA, the Tribe has finished in third place or better in the league in each of the last seven seasons ... The CAA has finished third in the nation in the NCAA RPI report the last three years ... W&M enters this season on a 13-game winning streak against league opponents in the regular season, a run that began on Oct. 3, 2003 with a 2-1 win over Drexel ... W&M hasn't lost a home game to a conference opponent in the regular season since falling to then No. 2 Old Dominion on Sept. 22, 2002.

Season Openers

W&M has won its last two season-opening games, defeating Vermont (6-0) on Aug. 30, 2003 and winning at Ohio (3-1) on Aug. 28 last season ... The Green and Gold is 23-6-3 (.766) in the first game of the season since 1973.

Home Openers

The Tribe has won seven straight home openers, including last season's 2-0 win over Penn on Sept. 3 ... The last time W&M lost its first home game of the year was Sept. 12, 1997 with a 3-0 loss to Northeastern ... The last time that the College opened the season at home was 2003 with a 6-0 win over Vermont on Aug. 30 ... This will be just the third time that the Tribe has opened at home since 1997.

Kelly Giles Attempts to Repeat as CAA Player of the Year

Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was voted the CAA Player of the Year last season, the first player in school history to earn that honor ... This season she will attempt to become just the third player in league history to earn the honor more than once

... The only other players to have repeated as CAA Player of the Year are James Madison's Carole Thate (1993, 1994, 1995) and Old Dominion's Marina DiGiacomo (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000).

The Ball State Series

This will be just the second game between W&M and Ball State ... The first meeting between the two teams came just last year, in the second game of the season ... W&M defeated the Cardinals, 2-1, on Aug. 29, with goals from senior **Shannon Karl** and junior **Maggie Long** ... It was the first career goal for Long and the first career game-winner for Karl.

The Penn State Series

Penn State has won both of the previous two meetings with W&M, although the teams have not played since 1997 ... The Nittany Lions' first win against the Tribe was a 1-0 decision on Nov. 29, 1979 in the second round of the AIAW National Tournament, hosted by Princeton ... In the most recent meeting between the two

Giles Earns All-America Honors in 2004

Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was named to the womensfieldhockey.com All-America second team and was a third team National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-American last season ... W&M has had four All-Americans in the last three years, including **Ann Ekberg** (2002), **Claire Miller** (2002) and **Kelli Duggan** (2003).

Anna Davis Closing in on Record

Senior defender **Anna Davis** currently ranks third in school history with 13 career defensive saves ... A first team All-CAA selection last year, she needs just one more to tie **Kim Stewart** (1981-84) for second in W&M history, but she is still 21 short of the school record of 34, set by **Amy Giello** (1993-96) ... Last season, Davis had seven defensive saves, tied with **Linda Schneider** (1992) for the seventh most in a single season ... The school record for defensive saves in one season is 13, set by Giello as a rookie in 1993.

Kelly Giles Climbing the Charts

With seven career game-winning goals, senior forward **Kelly Giles** is sixth in school history ... The 2004 CAA Player of the Year led the conference with five last season, tied with five others, including

current assistant coach **Kelly McQuade**, for third in W&M history ... Giles needs one more to tie **Joanie Quinn** (1987-90) for fifth all-time and is four away from tying **Lydia Donley** (1988-91) for fourth place.

Defenders Starting to Reach Top 10

Senior defenders **Anna Davis** and **Shannon Karl** are both likely to break into the Tribe's top 10 games started list this season ... After coming off the bench for the first two Tribe games of her career, Karl has started the last 57 W&M games and is three away from tying five others for 10th place in school history ... Davis has started every game the last two seasons and enters 2005 with 53 career starts ... Also likely to crack the top 10 this season is senior defender **Diana Esposito** who has 49 starts, including every game the last two seasons ... The W&M record for career starts is 80, held by another defender, **Amy Giello** (1993-96).

Tribe Picked Second in CAA

W&M was picked to finish second in the CAA, in the preseason coaches poll released by the conference in early August ... The Tribe received three of the nine first-place votes, one less than Old Dominion which finished first in the poll ... W&M finished first in the league last season, with a 7-0 regular-season record against CAA opponents.

Including current Tribe head coach **Peel Hawthorne** (1980) and assistants **Kelly McQuade** (2004) and **Heather Kibbee** (2005), nine former W&M field hockey players are currently coaching the sport at the college level ... Along with Kibbee, who is planning to graduate from W&M in December, the most recent addition to the list is 2005 graduate **Ginny Sutton**, who is an assistant at Davidson ... Also on the list are: **Joanie Quinn Milhous** (head coach, Villanova), **Christine Paradis** (assistant coach, Amherst College), **Jordan Steele** (assistant coach, Stanford), **Erika Vargas** (assistant coach, Sacred Heart) and **Julie Zoolkoski** (assistant coach, Washington & Jefferson College).

Northeastern Joins CAA

Northeastern will begin its first season of play as a member of the Colonial Athletic Association this year ... Located in Boston, the Huskies had been members of the America East conference since 1989 and had won 10 conference championships ... W&M has a 2-2-0 all-time record against Northeastern, with their most recent meeting resulting in a 1-0 Husky overtime win in Boston on Sept. 8, 2002 ... This season the two teams will play in Boston on Oct. 23.

2005 Tribe Player Profiles

Head Coach Peel Hawthorne

Now in her 19th season at W&M, Peel Hawthorne is the winningest field hockey coach in school history with a record of 212-145-2 (.593) at the College. Including four seasons as head coach at Division III Connecticut College, Hawthorne is 243-162-5 (.599) in her coaching career.

Last season she earned her third CAA Coach of the Year honor, after leading the Tribe to a 7-0 conference record and the regular season CAA title. The best conference record in school history, it is also the first time that W&M has ever won a regular season conference championship outright. In 2003, W&M and Old Dominion tied for first place with 6-1 conference records. Hawthorne also was named CAA Coach of the Year in 1995 and 2001.

Hawthorne has led the Tribe to its only two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002. During her career as a defender at W&M, the Tribe posted a record of 52-13-7 and made two trips to the AIAW Nationals, finishing fifth in the nation in 1979. The Green and Gold totaled 37 shutouts and allowed just 0.92 goals per game in her career.
