Tribe Field Hockey Heads North for First Road Games of Season

William and Mary's field hockey team will head north to Syracuse, New York this weekend for the Tribe's first road games of the 2005 season ... W&M will play Kent State Saturday at 2:00 PM and will take on Syracuse Sunday at 1:00 PM.

About the Tribe

W&M lost to North Carolina, 3-1, last weekend in the Tribe's only game ... The Tribe took a 1-0 lead in the first half on a goal by senior forward **Kelly Giles**, but the Tar Heels, who ended last season ranked No. 1 in the nation, came back with three goals in the second for the win ... The goal by Giles was the first allowed by UNC all season ... The Tar Heels' first goal ended a shutout streak of 149 minutes and 12 seconds for sophomore goal-keeper **Gwen Hunter** and the rest of the Tribe defense ... Sophomore midfielder **Jessica Kacerek** leads W&M in scoring with four points on a goal and two assists ... Four other W&M players—Giles, senior midfielder **JJ Kubicek**, junior forward **Gine Cimarelli** and sophomore defender **Laura Kastelic**—are tied for second on the team with two points on one goal ... Hunter has played every minute in goal for the Tribe, with a 1.17 goals against average, 20 saves and one shutout.

Seven Straight Winning Seasons

Head coach **Peel Hawthorne** has led the Tribe to a winning record in each of the last seven seasons, every year starting with 1998 ... A winning record this year would tie the school record of eight consecutive winning seasons, set from 1986 through 1993 ... Since the beginning of the 1998 campaign, W&M has a record of 85-55 (.607) overall and is 31-9 (.775) in CAA regular season play ... The Tribe has won at least 65 percent of its games in three of the last four seasons.

Anna Davis Closing in on Record

With a defensive save against Penn State senior defender **Anna Davis** moved into a tie for second place at W&M with 14 career defensive saves ... A first team All-CAA selection last year, she is tied with **Kim Stewart** (1981-84), but still 20 short of the school record of 34, set by **Amy Giello** (1993-96) ... Last season, Davis had seven defensive saves, tied with **Linda Schneider** (1992) for the seventh most in a single season ... The school record for defensive saves in one season is 13, set by Giello as a rookie in 1993.

Different Faces Providing Offense in 2005

Already this year, five different players have scored goals for the Tribe, including three who hadn't scored a goal before this season ... Junior **JJ Kubicek** and sophomores **Jessica Kacerek** and **Laura Kastic** all scored their first career goals in the season opener against Ball State ... Junior **Gina Cimarelli** also scored in that game, giving her nine goals in her career ... Four players have assists in 2005, with three of them—Kacerek, junior **Maggie Long** and freshman **Heather Winn**—earning their first career assists this season ... The Tribe has been known for its balanced scoring attack over the years, with at least 12 different players scoring a point in each of the last four seasons, including 14 in 2004.

Defenders Starting to Reach Top 10

Senior defender **Shannon Karl** moved into the Tribe's top 10 list with her 60th career start in the game against North Carolina ... After coming off the bench for the first two games of her career, Karl, has started every game since then ... Senior defender **Anna Davis** is also likely to

break into the Tribe's top 10 games started list this season ... She has started every game the last two seasons and now has 56 career starts ... Also likely to crack the top 10 this season is senior defender **Diana Esposito** who has 52 starts, including every game since 2003 ... The W&M record for career starts is 80, held by another defender, **Amy Giello** (1993-96).

About Kent State

Kent State heads into the weekend looking for its first win of the season after dropping three straight road games ... The Golden Flashes opened the year with a 3-0 loss at James Madison, and have also fallen to Dartmouth and Boston College ... KSU will take on Syracuse on Friday before playing W&M Saturday ... Three different Kent State players have each scored one goal this season ... Linz Markwart has played every minute in goal for the Golden Flashes, with a 2.67 GAA and 18 saves ... KSU had a record of 11-8 last season.

The Kent State Series

Kent State leads the all-time series with W&M, 2-1-0 ... The Tribe opened the series with a 2-1 victory in Williamsburg on Sept. 9, 1996 ... The two victories for the Golden Flashes have each been in neutral-site games, winning 3-2 at Wake Forest on Sept. 19, 1998 and taking a 3-2 overtime win on Aug. 31, 2002 at Old Dominion.

About Syracuse

Syracuse heads into its game on Friday against Kent State with a 1-2 record after opening the season with three games in California over the long weekend... The Orange sandwiched a 4-0 loss to Pacific and a 3-1 defeat against California around a 3-2 overtime win at Stanford ... Ashley Fry leads the team in scoring with four points on two goals ... Freshman Heather Hess has played all but the first half of the season opener in goal for Syracuse and has a 2.98 GAA with 20 saves and six goals allowed ... Last season the Orange finished with an 11-9 overall record.

The Syracuse Series

W&M and Syracuse have played each other just once before, with the Tribe winning, 3-1, on Nov. 1, 2002 in Williamsburg.

Strong Play in the CAA

Including last season's regular season title with a perfect 7-0 record against the CAA, the Tribe has finished in third place or better in the league in each of the last seven seasons ... The CAA has finished third in

the nation in the NCAA RPI report the last three years ... W&M enters this season on a 13-game winning streak against league opponents in the regular season, a run that began on Oct. 3, 2003 with a 2-1 win over Drexel ... W&M hasn't lost a home game to a conference opponent in the regular season since falling to then No. 2 Old Dominion on Sept. 22, 2002.

Kelly Giles Attempts to Repeat as CAA Player of the Year

Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was voted the CAA Player of the Year last season, the first player in school history to earn that honor ... This season she will attempt to become just the third player in league history to earn the honor more than once ... The only other players to have repeated as CAA Player of the Year are James Madison's Carole Thate (1993, 1994, 1995) and Old Dominion's Marina DiGiacomo (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000).

Giles Earns All-America Honors in 2004

Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was named to the womensfieldhockey.com All-America second team and was a third team National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-American last season ... W&M has had four All-Americans in the last three years, including **Ann Ekberg** (2002), **Claire Miller** (2002) and **Kelli Duggan** (2003).

Kelly Giles Climbing the Charts

With seven career game-winning goals, senior forward **Kelly Giles** is sixth in school history ... The 2004 CAA Player of the Year led the conference with five last season, tied with five others, including current assistant coach **Kelly McQuade**, for third in W&M history ... Giles needs one more to tie **Joanie Quinn** (1987-90) for fifth all-time and is four away from tying **Lydia Donley** (1988-91) for fourth place.

Tribe Picked Second in CAA

W&M was picked to finish second in the

CAA, in the preseason coaches poll released by the conference in early August ... The Tribe received three of the nine first-place votes, one less than Old Dominion which finished first in the poll ... W&M finished first in the league last season, with a 7-0 regular-season record against CAA opponents.

Also on the list are: **Joanie Quinn Milhous** (head coach, Villanova), **Christine Paradis** (assistant coach, Amherst College), **Jordan Steele** (assistant coach, Stanford), **Erika Vargas** (assistant coach, Sacred Heart) and **Julie Zoolkoski** (assistant coach, Washington & Jefferson College).

2005 Tribe Player Profiles

Head Coach Peel Hawthorne

Now in her 19th season at W&M, Peel Hawthorne is the winningest field hockey coach in school history with a record of 213-146-2 (.593) at the College. Including four seasons as head coach at Division III Connecticut College, Hawthorne is 244-164-5 (.597) in her coaching career.

Last season she earned her third CAA Coach of the Year honor, after leading the Tribe to a 7-0 conference record and the regular season CAA title. The best conference record in school history, it is also the first time that W&M has ever won a regular season conference championship outright. In 2003, W&M and Old Dominion tied for first place with 6-1 conference records. Hawthorne also was named CAA Coach of the Year in 1995 and 2001.

Hawthorne has led the Tribe to its only two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002. During her career as a defender at W&M, the Tribe posted a record of 52-13-7 and made two trips to the AIAW Nationals, finishing fifth in the nation in 1979. The Green and Gold totaled 37 shutouts and allowed just 0.92 goals per game in her career.
