TRIBE SET FOR DREXEL, UNC

The No. 12 William and Mary field hockey team will host Drexel in a Colonial Athletic Association tilt on Friday, Sept. 29, before traveling to No. 6 North Carolina on Sunday, Oct. 1. The home conference affair with the Dragons is slated for 7 p.m., while the UNC-W&M contest will take place at 1 p.m. The match at UNC can be followed live over the Internet via Gametracker by visiting www.tarheelblue.com.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe moved up to No. 12 in the [womensfieldhockey.com](http://www.womensfieldhockey.com) Top 20, while coming in at No. 18 in the STX/NFHCA poll, released on Sept. 26.

- With its perfect 3-0 record at home in 2006, the Tribe improved to 109-48-2 (.692) all-time at Busch Field.

- W&M did not allow a goal in its first two home games of the 2006 season vs. Davidson and Radford. With the pair of shutouts, it marked the first time since the 2000 season that the Tribe blanked back-to-back opponents at home. During that season, W&M shutout American, 3-0, on Sept. 1, before blanking Davidson, 7-0, on Sept. 3.

- Junior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter recorded eight saves in the Tribe's victory over Miami (Ohio). It marked the fifth time in her career she recorded eight or more saves in a contest. The last time she recorded eight or more saves in a game came against Northeastern on Oct. 23, 2005, when she stopped 10 shots.

- After battling injuries and missing each of the last two seasons, sophomore goalkeeper Kristen Gillis saw the first action of her W&M career on Sept. 1 against Davidson. Gillis played the entire second half in goal versus the Wildcats, but was not tested.

- In each of W&M's first three victories, one Tribe player recorded a career-high five-point game. Senior forward Maggie Long pulled the trick against Ball State, while junior Kim Hedley did the same against Miami (Ohio). Senior forward Gina Cimarelli notched two goals and an assist to give W&M three straight five-point performances against Davidson.

- Senior midfielder Becky Van Zee recorded her first career game-winner with a first-half goal at Rutgers on Sept. 8.

- Sophomore Lauren Giles registered her first career point in the Tribe's 5-3 win over then-No. 19 Richmond. She assisted on the College's final goal after Richmond had drawn within a single score, 4-3, in the 48th minute. She followed that up by scoring her first career goal in the second half against VCU on Sept. 24.

SCOUTING DREXEL

Drexel enters the contest with W&M at 6-3 on the season, but have dropped three of its last four on the campaign. After winning its first five matches of the season, the Dragons have hit a rough stretch that included a 5-0 loss to No. 3 Old Dominion to open the CAA schedule. W&M and Drexel have one common opponent on the season in Rutgers. The Tribe defeated the Scarlet Knight, 2-0, while the Dragons notched a 5-4 win over Rutgers to open the year.

Catherine Chiara leads the Dragons in scoring with 16 points on seven goals and two assists. She is one of three Drexel players with double-digit points followed by Emily Horvat with 11 (3g, 5a) and Casey Mouser with 10 (2g, 6a). Heather Bloemker and Jordan Freese have each scored three goals on the season, ranking second along with Horvat on the team. Colleen McAndrew has started all nine matches in goal for the Dragons. She has a goals against average of 1.88 with 55 saves and one shutout.

The Tribe is 6-0 all-time against Drexel, including a 4-0 ledger in Williamsburg. Last season, W&M notched a 1-0 win over the Dragons in Philadelphia, scoring on a penalty corner with less than two minutes remaining. Jessica Kacerek earned one of the two W&M assists on the play. In the six-game history of the series, the Tribe has outscored Drexel, 18-3.

SCOUTING No. 6 NORTH CAROLINA

No. 6 North Carolina is 8-3 on the year after snapping a three-match losing streak with back-to-back wins over Albany (4-0) and Appalachian State (11-0). The Tar Heels had dropped three straight to Old Dominion (3-1), Virginia (2-1) and Duke (2-1 in OT). All three teams are currently ranked in the top 10. UNC will host No. 2 Wake Forest on Saturday before playing the Tribe in Chapel Hill. The game will be available on Gametracker by visiting www.tarheelblue.com.

Along with Virginia, UNC and W&M have another common opponent in Davidson. The Tribe defeated the Wildcats in the College's home opener, 4-0, while North Carolina defeated Davidson, 2-0, in Chapel Hill.

Karen Mann tops the Tar Heels in goals (10) and points (20). Danielle Forword is second on the team with 16 points on seven goals and two assists, while Brooke Miller ranks third in points with 15 on five goals and five assists. Jesse Gey tops UNC in assists with six on the season. Britt van Beek led the route of Appalachian State with three goals and an assist to bring her season point total to 11 (4g, 3a). Alli Tanner rounds out the double-digit scorers for UNC with 10 points on five goals. Brianna O'Donnell has played every minute in net. She has a goal against average of 0.98 to go along with 43 saves and four shutouts.

The Tar Heels own a 21-3-2 all-time record against W&M, winning all 10 affairs in Chapel Hill. Last season, UNC defeated the College, 3-1, in Williamsburg.

TRIBE RANKED IN NATIONAL TOP 20s

For the fourth straight week, the Tribe is ranked in both the STX/National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) and the womensfieldhockey.com Top 20s. W&M jumped to 12th in the womensfieldhockey.com poll, while the College came in at No. 18 in the coaches poll.

The Tribe's No. 12 ranking in the womensfieldhockey.com standings is the highest for the College since the 2003 season. W&M was ranked No. 9 on Nov. 4, 2003. In 2004, the Tribe was ranked as high as No. 13 in the womensfieldhockey.com poll.

CAN I HELP YOU?

In the Tribe's 4-2 CAA-opening victory over VCU on Sept. 24, junior back Laura Kastelic assisted on the first three W&M goals to help propel the College to victory. Each of Kastelic's three assists came off penalty corners as she found sophomore Katie Broaddus in the 22nd minute, freshman Wesley Drew in the 32nd minute and senior Maggie Long in the 49th minute. All four Tribe goals came via penalty corners.

Kastelic's three helpers were not only a career high, but the second most in school history. The last time a Tribe player notched three assists in a contest, Katie Slivertorne set the school mark with four against the Rams on Oct. 7, 2001. The three assists tied six other players for second in the school's annals.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

The Tribe notched five goals in its first match against a ranked opponent on Sept. 16 versus then-No. 19 Richmond. In the 5-3 victory, all three W&M strikers scored as senior Gina Cimarelli and junior Kim Hedley added a pair apiece with senior Maggie Long adding the first W&M tally. It marked the first time W&M has scored five or more goals at home since downing then-No. 19 Hofstra, 5-1, in Williamsburg on Oct. 3, 2004.

W&M tallied four goals in each of its first three victories of 2006. It marked the first time since the 2004 season that W&M scored four or more goals in three consecutive games. The Tribe scored four or more goals in three straight wins at Virginia (5-4) on Sept. 29, vs. Drexel (4-2) on Oct. 1 and vs. Hofstra (5-1) on Oct. 3 during that season.

W&M opened the season with road wins over Ball State (4-1) and Miami (Ohio) (4-3 OT). The back-to-back four-goal performances on the road also were the first time since 1988 that the Tribe notched four or more goals in back-to-back road victories. During that season, W&M defeated Loyola (Md.), 4-3, on Oct. 1, before disposing of American, 4-0, on Oct. 2.

IN MULTIPLES

Through the opening nine games of the 2006 season, the Tribe has received two-goal games on six different occasions from three different players. Senior forward Gina Cimarelli has three multi-goal games, junior striker Kim Hedley has two and senior frontrunner Maggie Long has one. The two-goal games were the first of Hedley and Long's careers, while Cimarelli's three gives her four in her career.

The last time W&M had more than six multi-goal games came during the 2002 season when it had nine. During that season Ann Ekberg had seven multi-goal games to lead the way for the College. Ekberg's season marked the last time a single Tribe player had more than three multi-goal games in a season.

The Tribe has also produced four, five-point games from the trio of forwards. Cimarelli pulled the trick against then-No. 19 Richmond and Miami (Ohio), while Hedley did it against the Redhawks as well and Long accomplished the feat against Ball State. The 2000 season was the last time W&M had more than four five-plus point games in a season. During that campaign, the College had five games of five or more points. In 2002, Ekberg had four games of five-plus points, making her the last W&M player to have more than two games with five or more points.

STRIKER CAREER YEARS

Forwards Gina Cimarelli, Maggie Long and Kim Hedley have all recorded new career highs in only the first seven games of the 2006 season. All three have established new career bests for points in a season with Long and Hedley garnering new career best goal totals, while Cimarelli has equaled her best season in the Green and Gold.

Cimarelli leads not only the Tribe, but ranks second in the CAA in points (18) and goals (7). She also had seven goals on a sophomore in 2004. More impressive is the fact that Cimarelli's points (2.00) and goals per game (0.78) averages ranked 26th and 28th nationally. She also has a career and team-high four assists during her senior campaign.

Hedley ranks eighth in the CAA in goals (5) to go along with a career-best 11 points. Both total bettered her career-high totals from a season ago. On two occasions this season, Hedley has recorded a pair of goals, while helping the Tribe to overcome early deficits against Miami (Ohio) and then-No. 19 Richmond.

Long, like her fellow starting frontrunners, has established new career bests in goals and points. After notching six points on two goals and two assists as a junior in 2005, the Ocean City, N.J., native is tied for second on the team with Hedley in points. Long

also has 11 points on five goals and one assist during the 2006 campaign. Her goals total also ranks eighth in the CAA.

TWO-FERS

This season, the Tribe has had two players score two goals in the same game. Seniors Gina Cimarelli and Maggie Long each notched a pair in the College's 4-1 over Ball State to open the season. Cimarelli then joined forces with junior Kim Hedley to pull the trick against then-No. 19 Richmond.

When Cimarelli and Long each notched a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 win over Ball State, it marked the first time since the 2003 season that two W&M players recorded multi-goal games in the same contest. The last duo to do it was Kelli Dugan and Kelly McQuade, who each notched a hat trick in W&M's 8-3 win over James Madison on Oct. 26, 2003.

The last time W&M had two players score a pair of goals in two games in a season was during the 2000 campaign. The feat occurred on four occasions for the Tribe in 2000. Katie Uhran and Lianne Ligtoet tallied two and three goals, respectively against Columbia (10/13/00), while Uhran teamed with Jaime Bolen to each add a pair in a 5-2 win over Villanova (10/28/00). Bolen and Ann Ekberg each scored two goals in a pair of games in 2000 against Davidson (Sept. 3) and Yale (Sept. 10).

TOUGH LEDGER

The Tribe's 2006 schedule is peppered with difficult opponents. In total between both the NFHCA and womensfieldhockey.com polls, six teams are ranked among the top 20 with another four at least receiving votes. W&M split its first two games of the season against ranked foes. The College knocked off then-No. 19 Richmond, 5-3, on Sept. 16, before falling at No. 7 Virginia, 3-1, on Sept. 20. The Tribe will have its most difficult portion of the schedule upcoming. Along with the tough CAA conference ledger, the Tribe will face four more opponents ranked among the top 20 and another three currently receiving votes.

Four future W&M opponents are listed among the NFHCA top 20. The list of ranked foes include No. 3 ODU, No. 4 Duke, No. 6 North Carolina and No. 17 James Madison. Hofstra, Northeastern and Drexel are receiving votes for the STX/NFHCA national poll. W&M already owns a victory over Miami (Ohio), 4-3, and the Redhawks were in the also receiving votes category at the time of the contest. Four upcoming Tribe opponents are ranked in the womensfieldhockey.com poll with No. 2 ODU, No. 7 Duke, No. 8 UNC and No. 15 James Madison,

BEST START SINCE 2000

The Tribe started the season a perfect 5-0 before falling in its most recent affair with Princeton. The 5-0 start marked the first time since 2000 that W&M has won five straight to open the season. During the 2000 season, the College opened with seven-straight victories. The 5-0 start is only the fourth five-game winning streak to start a season in school history. Aside from 2000, the Tribe accomplished the feat in 1978 and 1979

CIMARELLI NAMED TO NATIONAL HONOR ROLL

Following her three-goal performance in the Tribe's season-opening victories over Ball State and Miami (Ohio), senior forward Gina Cimarelli was named to the womensfieldhockey.com National Honor Roll. Cimarelli was one of seven players on the list with Lauren Crandall of Wake Forest taking home the national player of the week accolade.

Cimarelli became the first Tribe player since 2004 to be named to the national honor roll. Kelly Giles (10/4) and Heather Kibbee (10/25) were on the weekly list during that campaign. Cimarelli scored a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 victory over Ball State, before notching the game-winner 21 seconds into overtime against Miami (Ohio).

FRESHMAN FIRSTS

In the Tribe's pair of home-opening victories over Davidson (4-0) and Radford (2-0), a trio of W&M freshmen notched the first points of their careers. Freshmen Courtney Farino and Wesley

Drew scored their first career goals, while fellow rookie, Sarah Louie registered her first career assist. Against Davidson, Farino pushed the ball inside the left post, following a cross-crease pass from senior Gina Cimarelli in the waning moments of the match. Louie found Drew to ice the Tribe's match against Radford in the 60th minute. Louie grabbed a rebound off a penalty corner and found Drew in front of the goal, giving the Tribe a 2-0 victory.
