W&M HOSTS PAIR OF CAA CONTESTS

The No. 19 William and Mary field hockey team will look to regain its winning form with a pair of CAA contests at the friendly confines of Busch Field, Oct. 20-22. The Tribe will face its fourth ranked foe in five matches when W&M hosts No. 18 Hofstra at 7 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 20. The College will face Northeastern on Sunday, Oct. 22, at 1 p.m.

The weekend slate will have an impact on the CAA race. Both Northeastern and W&M are tied for fifth in the standings at 2-2, while Hofstra sits behind conference leader ODU at 3-1. The top six teams in the CAA earn a berth in the conference tournament.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe is ranked No. 19 in the womensfieldhockey.com Top 20.W&M is also the top team in the receiving votes of the STX/NFHCA Top 20.

- With its perfect 4-0 record at home in 2006, the Tribe improved to 110-48-2 (.696) all-time at Busch Field.

- During the 2006 season, a total of 12 different Tribe players have scored at least one point on the season, while 10 different players have scored a goal.

- The Tribe's match against Hofstra marks the fourth ranked opponent W&M has faced in its last five matches. Overall, Hofstra, ranked No. 20 in the STX/NFHCA rankings and 18th in the womenfieldhockey.com poll, will be the sixth nationally ranked team the Tribe has faced this season.

- Senior back Julienne Palbusa notched her first career defensive save against then-No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14.

- Redshirt freshman Kaitlin Johnson recorded her second defensive save on the year against then-No. 4 Duke. Her total ranks third in the CAA.

- The Tribe's two defensive save performance against then-No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14, marked the first multi-defensive save game of the season for W&M. In 2006, the College had three matches with two or more defensive saves, including a season-high four against ODU on Oct. 30.

- W&M did not allow a goal in its first two home games of the 2006 season vs. Davidson and Radford. With the pair of shutouts, it marked the first time since the 2000 season that the Tribe blanked back-to-back opponents at home. During that season, W&M shutout American, 3-0, on Sept. 1, before blanking Davidson, 7-0, on Sept. 3.

- Sophomore Lauren Giles registered her first career point in the Tribe's 5-3 win over then-No. 19 Richmond. She assisted on the College's final goal after Richmond had drawn within a single score, 4-3, in the 48th minute. She followed that up by scoring her first career goal in the second half against VCU on Sept. 24.



- Junior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter recorded eight saves in the Tribe's victory over Miami (Ohio). It marked the fifth time in her career she recorded eight or more saves in a contest. The last time she recorded eight or more saves in a game came against Northeastern on Oct. 23, 2005, when she stopped 10 shots.

- Junior goalkeeper Kristen Gillis made the first saves of her W&M career against Drexel and then-No. 6 North Carolina. After battling injuries and missing each of the last two seasons, Gillis saw the first action of her W&M career on Sept. 1 against Davidson. She came on in the second half of both matches against Drexel and UNC. Against the Dragons, Gillis made two saves, while stopping one shot against the Tar Heels.

- In each of W&M's first three victories, one Tribe player recorded a career-high five-point game. Senior forward Maggie Long pulled the trick against Ball State, while junior Kim Hedley did the same against Miami (Ohio). Senior forward Gina Cimarelli notched two goals and an assist to give W&M three straight fivepoint performances against Davidson.

- Senior midfielder Becky Van Zee recorded her first career game-winner with a first-half goal at Rutgers on Sept. 8.

SCOUTING HOFSTRA

Hofstra enters the match up with W&M on a five-game winning streak. In its lone contest a week ago, the Pride won at Princeton, 3-2. Hofstra is 10-4 overall and 3-1 in the CAA. In conference, the Pride owns victories over Towson (3-0), Drexel (4-1) and Northeastern (2-1), while its lone loss came at Delaware (3-2) in overtime. Hofstra is ranked in both the STX/NFHCA and womensfieldhockey.com rankings. The Pride are No. 20 in the coaches poll, while coming in No. 18 in the Internet ranking.

Charlia Warner leads the Pride in points and goals. She has 32 points on 14 goals and four assists. The 14 goals are tied for the CAA lead, while four of her tallies were game-winners. Kara McEneaney ranks second on the team in points (19) and goals (8), while Pemba Ramdoo rounds out the double-digit scorers for Hofstra with 12 points on four goals and four assists. Doni-Melissa Jantzen tops the Pride in assist with six. Along with Ramdoo and Warner, Reyna Farnum, the reigning CAA Rookie of the Week, is second on the squad with four helpers. Jessica Cowperthwait has started every match in goal for the Pride. In 948 minutes, she has 74 saves with a goals against average of 1.33. Cowperthwait also has three shutouts to her credit.

The Tribe owns a 3-2 all-time record against the Pride, including a 2-1 mark in Williamsburg. Hofstra has won the last two contests in the series, including a 3-0 win last season.

SCOUTING NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern is 7-9 overall and 2-2 in the CAA. The Huskies are coming off a tough week that saw them drop a trio of matches all to ranked foes. NU fell, 4-1, to No. 9 Connecticut, before dropping an overtime affair to No. 11 Indiana, 2-1. The Huskies rounded out the week with a 3-1 defeat at No. 12 Louisville on Oct. 15. In conference, Northeastern owns victories over Drexel (7-0) and Delaware (5-0) with its losses coming at the hands of Hofstra (2-1) and Towson (1-0) in double overtime.

Five different Huskies have double-digit points led by 20 each from Stephanie Casper and Whitney Shean. Casper tops the team in goals with eight, while Casper is the CAA leader in assist with 12. Ashley Bascetta, Ashley Webber and Sarah Eckhoff have 16, 15 and 14 points, respectively. Bascetta ranks second on the team with seven goals. Webber has six goals and three assists, while Eckhoff has four goals and six assists. Ashley D'Ambra ranks second on the team with seven assists on the year. Liz Centofanti has started the last 10 matches in goal for the Huskies. In 845 minutes, she has a goals against average of 1.32 to go with 49 saves and three shutouts.

Northeastern owns a 3-2 record against the Tribe. The two teams have split the pair of meeting in Williamsburg. Last season, the Huskies tallied a 2-1 win over W&M. Gina Cimarelli scored the lone Tribe goal of the contest in the second half to draw the College within a goal.

TRIBE RANKED IN NATIONAL TOP 20

For the seventh straight week, the Tribe is ranked in the womensfieldhockey.com Top 20. W&M was 19th in the poll released on Oct. 17. The Tribe is also receiving votes in the STX/National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA). W&M is the top team listed in the also receiving votes category of the coaches poll with 30 votes.

W&M has either been ranked or receiving votes in all eight of the STX/NFHCA polls this season. The highest the Tribe has been ranked in the poll was No. 17. The College held the spot during four weeks including Sept. 5-19 and Oct. 3. On Sept. 26, the Tribe earned its highest ranking of the season in the womensfieldhockey.com poll at No. 12. The ranking was the highest for the College since the 2003 season. W&M was ranked No. 9 on Nov. 4, 2003. In 2004, the Tribe was ranked as high as No. 13 in the womensfieldhockey.com poll.

CONVERTING CORNERS

The Tribe has had success scoring off of penalty corners. In the Tribe's conference-opening victories over VCU and Drexel, all seven W&M goals have come via the penalty corner. For the year, the Tribe has scored 14 of its 31 goals off penalty corners.

VAN ZEE LEADING THE WAY

Head coach Peel Hawthorne has noted the play of senior midfielder Becky Van Zee throughout the season. The co-captain has been an integral part of the Tribe's defensive unit as well as it transition to offense. The Lehighton, Pa., native is also excelling on the offensive end having already notched a career-high nine points on three goals and three assists in 2006. Van Zee scored the Tribe's lone goal against then-No. 4 Duke to pull W&M even with the 2005 national runner up, early in the second half.

IMPRESSIVE AGAINST DUKE

The Tribe turned in an impressive performance, despite a 3-1 loss to then-No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14. Head coach Peel Hawthorne said she was pleased with the Tribe's performance both offensively and defensively.

After trailing 1-0 at the half, the Tribe scored five minutes into the second stanza to even the match. Although Duke went on to score twice in the final 30 minutes and claim the victory, the Tribe outshot the Blue Devils in the second half. Of the College's five attempts, four were on goal, while W&M also generated a pair of penalty corners.

Hawthorne also felt her defensive backline of seniors Jamie Fitzgerald and Julienne Palbusa along with junior Laura Kastelic and redshirt freshman Kaitlin Johnson turned in its best performance of the season. Johnson and Palbusa both notched defensive saves in the Tribe's effort.

STARTING OFF THE CAA SLATE IN STYLE

For the third straight season, the Tribe opened the CAA portion of the schedule with two victories. It marked the fifth time in school history that the Tribe has accomplished the feat, having done so in 1993 and 1998 along with the last three years.

This season, the Tribe opened with victories over VCU (4-2) on Sept. 24, before defeating Drexel (3-0) on Sept. 29. In 2005, the College won its first three matches in league action before falling in overtime to James Madison. In 2004, W&M finished the CAA ledger at 7-0 to claim the regular-season crown.

STRIKER CAREER YEARS

Forwards Gina Cimarelli, Maggie Long and Kim Hedley have all recorded new career highs during the 2006 season. All three have established new career bests for points in a season with Long and Hedley garnering new career-best goal totals, while Cimarelli has equaled her best season in the Green and Gold.



Hedley is tied for the team lead with Cimarelli in goals. Both players' total of seven ranks eighth in the CAA. For the season, she has a career-best 16 points. She also tallied her first two career assists this season. Both her goal and point totals bettered her career-high marks from a season ago. On two occasions this season, Hedley has recorded a pair of goals, while helping the Tribe to overcome early deficits against Miami (Ohio) and then-No. 19 Richmond.

Long, like her fellow starting frontrunners, has established new career bests in goals and points. After notching six points on two goals and two assists as a junior in 2005, the Ocean City, N.J., native has 11 points on five goals and one assist.

CAN I HELP YOU?

In the Tribe's 4-2 CAA-opening victory over VCU on Sept. 24, junior back Laura Kastelic assisted on the first three W&M goals to help propel the College to victory. Each of Kastelic's three assist came off penalty corners as she found sophomore Katie Broaddus in the 22nd minute, freshman Wesley Drew in the 32nd minute and senior Maggie Long in the 49th minute. All four Tribe goals came via penalty corners.

Kastelic's three helpers were not only a career high, but the second most in school history. The last time a Tribe player notched three assists in a contest, Katie Silverthorne set the school mark with four against the Rams on Oct. 7, 2001. The three assists tied six other players for second in the school's annals.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

The Tribe notched five goals in its first match against a ranked opponent on Sept. 16 versus then-No. 19 Richmond. In the 5-3 victory, all three W&M strikers scored as senior Gina Cimarelli and junior Kim Hedley added a pair apiece with senior Maggie Long adding the first W&M tally. It marked the first time W&M has scored five or more goals at home since downing then-No. 19 Hofstra, 5-1, in Williamsburg on Oct. 3, 2004.

W&M tallied four goals in each of its first three victories in 2006. It marked the first time since the 2004 season that W&M scored four or more goals in three consecutive games. The Tribe scored four or more goals in three straight wins at Virginia (5-4) on Sept. 29, vs. Drexel (4-2) on Oct. 1 and vs. Hofstra (5-1) on Oct. 3 during that season.

W&M opened the season with road wins over Ball State (4-1) and Miami (Ohio) (4-3 OT). The back-to-back four-goal performances on the road also were the first time since 1988 that the Tribe notched four or more goals in back-to-back road victories. During that season, W&M defeated Loyola (Md.), 4-3, on Oct. 1, before disposing of American, 4-0, on Oct. 2.

IN MULTIPLES

Through the opening nine games of the 2006 season, the Tribe has received two-goal games on six different occasions from three different players. Senior forward Gina Cimarelli has three multi-goal games, junior striker Kim Hedley has two and senior frontrunner Maggie Long has one. The two-goal games were the first of Hedley and Long's careers, while Cimarelli's three multigoal games gives her four in her career.

The last time W&M had more than six multi-goal games came during the 2002 season when it had nine. During that season Ann Ekberg had seven multi-goal games to lead the way for the College. Ekberg's season marked the last time a single Tribe player had more than three multi-goal games in a season.

The Tribe has also produced four, five-point games from the trio of forwards. Cimarelli pulled the trick against then-No. 19 Richmond and Miami (Ohio), while Hedley did it against the Redhawks as well and Long accomplished the feat against Ball State. The 2000 season was the last time W&M had more than four five-plus point games in a season. During that campaign, the College had five games of five or more points. In 2002, Ekberg had four games of five-plus points, making her the last W&M player to have more than two games with five or more points.

Two-FERS

This season, the Tribe has had two players score two goals in the same game. Seniors Gina Cimarelli and Maggie Long each notched a pair in the College's 4-1 over Ball State to open the season. Cimarelli then joined forces with junior Kim Hedley to pull the trick against then-No. 19 Richmond.

When Cimarelli and Long each notched a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 win over Ball State, it marked the first time since the 2003 season that two W&M players recorded multi-goal games in the same contest. The last duo to do it was Kelli Dugan and Kelly McQuade, who each notched a hat trick in W&M's 8-3 win over James Madison on Oct. 26, 2003.

The last time W&M had two players score a pair of goals in two games in a season was during the 2000 campaign. The feat occurred on four occasions for the Tribe in 2000. Katie Uhran and Lianne Ligtvoet tallied two and three goals, respectively against Columbia (10/13/00), while Uhran teamed with Jaime Bolen to each add a pair in a 5-2 win over Villanova (10/28/00). Bolen and Ann Ekberg each scored two goals in a pair of games in 2000 against Davidson (Sept. 3) and Yale (Sept. 10).

BEST START SINCE 2000

The Tribe started the season a perfect 5-0 before falling in its most recent affair with Princeton. The 5-0 start marked the first time since 2000 that W&M has won five straight to open the season. During the 2000 season, the College opened with seven-straight victories. The 5-0 start is only the fourth five-game winning streak to start a season in school history. Aside from 2000, the Tribe accomplished the feat in 1978 and 1979.

CIMARELLI NAMED TO NATIONAL HONOR ROLL

Following her three-goal performance in the Tribe's seasonopening victories over Ball State and Miami (Ohio), senior forward Gina Cimarelli was named to the womensfieldhocky.com National Honor Roll. Cimarelli was one of seven players on the list with Lauren Crandall of Wake Forest taking home the national player of the week accolade.

Cimarelli became the first Tribe player since 2004 to be named to the national honor roll. Kelly Giles (10/4) and Heather Kibbee (10/25) were on the weekly list during that campaign. Cimarelli scored a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 victory over Ball State, before notching the game-winner 21 seconds into overtime against Miami (Ohio).


