No. 17 W&M Hosts No. 19 RICHMOND

The No. 17 William and Mary field hockey team will look to rebound from its first defeat of the season when it hosts No. 19 Richmond on Saturday, Sept. 16. Game time is slated for 1 p.m. at Busch Field. The bout with the Spiders will be the Tribe's first against a ranked opponent this season. Richmond is ranked No. 19 in the NFHCA poll and No. 20 in the womesfieldhockey.com Top 20.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe is ranked 17th in both the STX/NFHCA and womensfield-hockey.com polls, released on Sept. 12.
- With its victories over Davidson and Radford, the Tribe improved to 108-48-2 (.690) all-time at Busch Field.
- -W&M did not allow a goal in its first two home games of the 2006 season vs. Davidson and Radford. With the pair of shutouts, it marked the first time since the 2000 season that the Tribe blanked back-to-back opponents at home. During that season, W&M shutout American, 3-0, on Sept. 1, before blanking Davidson, 7-0, on Sept. 3.
- Senior forwards Gina Cimarelli and Maggie Long each notched a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 win over Ball State. It marked the first time since the 2003 season that two W&M players recorded multi-goal games in the same contest. The last duo to do it was Kelli Dugan and Kelly McQuade, who each notched a hat trick, in W&M's 8-3 win over James Madison on Oct. 26, 2003.
- Junior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter recorded eight saves in the Tribe's victory over Miami (Ohio). It marked the fifth time in her career she recorded eight or more saves in a contest. The last time she recorded eight or more saves in a game came against Northeastern on Oct. 23, 2005, when she stopped 10 shots.
- After battling injuries and missing each of the last two seasons, sophomore goalkeeper Kristen Gillis saw the first action of her W&M career on Sept. 1 against Davidson. Gillis played the entire second half in goal versus the Wildcats, but was not tested.
- In each of W&M's first three victories, one Tribe player recorded a career-high five-point game. Senior forward Maggie Long pulled the trick against Ball State, while junior Kim Hedley did the same against Miami (Ohio). Senior forward Gina Cimarelli notched two goals and an assist to give W&M three straight five-point performances against Davidson.
- Senior midfielder Becky Van Zee recorded her first career game-winner in with a first-half goal at Rutgers on Sept. 8.



SCOUTING No. 19 RICHMOND

Richmond is 2-2 on the season, following a pair of losses to ranked foes over the weekend. The Spiders fell to No. 20 Michigan, 3-2, before falling, 3-0, to No. 3 Old Dominion. Richmond opened the season with wins over Towson, 2-1, and Princeton, 4-3. The Spiders will face James Madison on Wednesday, before traveling to Williamsburg to battle the Tribe.

Shannon Taylor leads the Spiders in goals (4) and points (9). Lindsey Conrad ranks second on the team in points with four and leads the squad in assist with two. Heather Wrublesky, Megan Thompson and Erin Arthur also have found the back of the cage for Richmond. Becca Weaver has started every game in goal for the Spiders. She has a goals against average of 2.70 with 13 saves.

The Tribe holds a 31-5-2 advantage in the all-time series with Richmond. W&M is 16-1-1 in Williamsburg. In the 38 meeting, the College owns a 109-29 scoring advantage. Last season, the Tribe dropped a 2-1, double-overtime affair with the then-No. 18 Spiders in Richmond. Katie Broaddus scored the Tribe's lone goal against Richmond a season ago off an assist from Maggie Long.

SHUTTING DOWN THE OPPOSITION

W&M notched its third straight shutout, 2-0, at Rutgers on Sept. 8. The third straight shutout for the Tribe marked the first time since 1999 that the College has notched three consecutive shutouts. During that campaign, it registered five straight clean sheets. In 1999, W&M blanked Providence (3-0) on Sept. 5, before shutting out Ohio (1-0) on Sept. 11, Miami (Ohio) (3-0) on Sept. 12, VCU (4-0) on Sept. 18 and Towson (2-0) on Sept. 19.

The Tribe started the shutout streak with back-to-back blankings of Davidson and Radford to open the home slate this season. Junior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter made a trio of saves in the Tribe's 2-0 victory over Rutgers after not having to make a save in the previous two contests. While the three saves may not sound like much, all three came in the opening 15 minutes when Rutgers came out of the locker room fired up. Head coach Peel Hawthorne credited Hunter for keeping the Tribe in the game early. With the shutouts against Radford and Rutgers, Hunter moved into a tie for sixth on the W&M career shutouts list.

Despite another solid defensive effort against Princeton, the Tribe could not keep the Tigers off the board. The Tribe's shutout streak came to a halt following a Princeton goal with 2:33 remaining. The shutout streak reached 277:27 before the Tiger goal. Hunter finished with seven saves versus Princeton.

BEST START SINCE 2000

The Tribe started the season a perfect 5-0 before falling in its most recent affair with Princeton. The 5-0 start marked the first time since 2000 that W&M has won five straight to open the season. During the 2000 season, the College opened with seven-straight victories. The 5-0 start is only the fourth five-game winning streak to start a season in school history. Aside from 2000, the Tribe accomplished the feat in 1978 and 1979

ensfieldhockey.com Top 20 on Sept. 5. Despite dropping its first contest of the season on Sept. 10, 1-0, to Princeton, the Tribe remained 17 in both rankings.

The Tribe received 44 votes in the preseason edition of the NFHCA poll, before garnering 96 in the first poll of the season on Sept. 5 to crack the top 20. W&M received 142 votes in the latest edition. The ranking is the highest in the coaches poll since finishing the College finished 2004 campaign ranked 15th. A season ago, the Tribe was ranked as high as No. 18 in the STX/NFHCA National poll. That ranking came on Sept. 13, 2005. It is the first ranking for the Tribe in the womensfieldhockey.com poll since garnering the No. 15 spot on Sept. 12, 2005.

CIMARELLI NAMED TO NATIONAL HONOR ROLL

Following her three-goal performance in the Tribe's seasonopening victories over Ball State and Miami (Ohio), senior forward Gina Cimarelli was named to the womensfieldhocky.com National Honor Roll. Cimarelli was one of seven players on the list with Lauren Crandall of Wake Forest taking home the national player of the week accolade.

Cimarelli became the first Tribe player since 2004 to be named to the national honor roll. Kelly Giles (10/4) and Heather Kibbee (10/25) were on the weekly list during that campaign. Cimarelli scored a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 victory over Ball State, before notching the game-winner 21 seconds into overtime against Miami (Ohio).

TOUGH LEDGER

The Tribe's 2006 schedule is peppered with difficult opponents. In total between both the NFHCA and womensfieldhockey. com polls, seven teams are ranked among the top 20 with another six at least receiving votes.

Seven future W&M opponents are listed among the NFHCA top 20, while another six teams on the schedule are currently receiving votes. The list of ranked foes include No. 3 ODU, No. 4 North Carolina, No. 5 Duke, No. 11 James Madison, No. 12 Virginia, No. 18 Hofstra and No. 19 Richmond. Northeastern, Delaware, Drexel, Princeton, Rutgers and Towson are receiving votes for the STX/NFHCA national poll. Seven Tribe opponents are ranked in the womensfieldhockey.com poll with No. 3 Duke, No. 4 UNC, No. 5 ODU, No. 11 James Madison, No. 12 Virginia, No. 13 Hofstra and No. 20 Richmond.

BETTER THAN BEFORE

Forwards Maggie Long and Kim Hedley have both surpassed their point and goal totals from a season ago in the opening six games of the 2006 campaign. Long already surpassed both her point and goal totals from a season ago with seven points on three goals and an assist. Hedley scored the Tribe's second goal in the 2-0 win over Rutgers. It brought her season goal total to three and her points tally to seven, both of which were new career highs.

HOT START

Senior forward Gina Cimarelli is off to quite the start in 2006. In the opening six games of the season, the Oak Hill, Va., native has 12 points on five goals and two assists. Her 12 points and five goals both rank second in the CAA, while her three gamewinning tallies, in the first three games of the season, lead the league. Cimarelli already has a pair of two-goal games in 2006, bringing her career total to four. Her five-point performance in the College's 4-0 victory over Davidson equaled a career high she set against Kent State in a 7-2 victory during the 2005 season.

FRESHMAN FIRSTS

In the Tribe's pair of home-opening victories over Davidson (4-0) and Radford (2-0), a trio of W&M freshmen notched the first points of their careers. Freshmen Courtney Farino and Wesley Drew scored their first career goals, while fellow rookie, Sarah Louie registered her first career assist. Against Davidson, Farino pushed the ball inside the left post, following a cross-crease pass from senior forward Gina Cimarelli in the waning moments of the match. Louie found Drew to ice the Tribe's match against Radford in the 60th minute. Louie grab a rebound off a penalty corner and found Drew in front of the goal, giving the Tribe a 2-0 victory.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

The Tribe tallied four goals in each of its first three victories of 2006. It marked the first time since the 2004 season that W&M scored four or more goals in three consecutive games. The Tribe scored four or more goals in three straight wins at Virginia (5-4) on Sept. 29, vs. Drexel (4-2) on Oct. 1 and vs. Hofstra (5-1) on Oct. 3 during that season.

W&M opened the season with road wins over Ball State (4-1) and MIami (Ohio) (4-3 OT). The back-to-back four-goal performances on the road also were the first time since 1988 that the Tribe notched four or more goals in back-to-back road victories.



During that season, W&M defeated Loyola (Md.), 4-3, on Oct. 1, before disposing of American, 4-0, on Oct. 2.

Two Goals Around

In the each of the Tribe's first three victories during the 2006 season, at least one player has notched a two-goal game. In the Tribe's season-opening victory over Ball State, senior forwards Gina Cimarelli and Maggie Long notched two-goal games. Junior Kim Hedley followed suite with her first career two-goal game in the victory over Miami (Ohio). Cimarelli then made it three-forthree with the opening two tallies in a 4-0 victory over Davidson at Busch Field. The total has already surpassed the Tribe's multigoal game total from 2005, when it had three. In 2003 and 2004, the Tribe had five and six multi-goal games, respectively. The multi-goal games were the second and third of Cimarelli's career, while Long and Hedley recorded the first two-goal contests of their careers.

DOMINATING THE SHOT CHARTS

In its first six games of the season, W&M outshot its opponents by an average of nearly 10 shots per contest. In total, the Tribe has averaged 16.3 shots per game of the first six contests. Even more impressive than the shot totals for the Tribe was the fact that it has averaged nearly 10 attempts on cage, compared to just five for its opponents. In fact, the Tribe's lowest shot total of the year was 11 against Radford on Sept. 3, but W&M held the Highlanders without a single shot in the contest.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Seniors Becky Van Zee and Maggie Long were voted team captains for the Tribe in 2006. Van Zee started the final 10 matches of the 2005 season and played in all 21 games. She finished her junior campaign with five points on two goals and one assist. Long started 12 matches and finished with two goals, two assists and six points a season ago.

PICKED FOURTH IN THE CAA

The Tribe was picked fourth in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Pre-season Coaches Poll. The Tribe garnered 42 total points to come in behind conference favorite Old Dominion, Northeastern and James Madison. The Tribe finished the 2005 season at 10-11 overall, including a 4-4 ledger in the CAA. The College advanced to the CAA tournament semifinals before falling to eventual champion and NCAA Semifinalist Old Dominion.

The voting system for the rankings consisted of each head coach submitting a ranked order of finish. The coaches were not allowed to vote for their own squad, and the points system started at eight for a first-place vote, down to one for an eighth-place vote. The CAA has traditionally been among the conferences in the nation, ranking third in the 2005 conference RPI rankings.


