### W&M HOSTS TOWSON ON SENIOR NIGHT

The William and Mary field hockey team will wrap up the regular season with a pair of matches over the weekend, including senior night on Friday, Oct. 27. W&M will host Towson at 5 p.m. on Friday. The match will be the final home contest in the careers of Tribe seniors Gina Ci-marelli, Jamie Fitzgerald, Maggie Long, Julianne Palbusa and Becky Van Zee. All five seniors will be recognized on Friday prior to the game. The Tribe will close out the weekend at No. 3 Old Dominion on Sunday, Oct. 29, at 1 p.m.

### TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- W&M can clinch a spot in the CAA Tournament with a victory over Towson. The Tribe is currently tied for third in the conference at 3-3.
- In the midseason NCAA RPI rankings released on Oct 7, the Tribe was No. 27. The CAA had the most teams of any conference among the top 30 with seven.
- The Tribe is receiving votes in the latest STX/NFHCA National Top 20, released on Oct. 24. W&M has been at least receiving votes in every coaches poll this season.
- With its 5-1 record at home in 2006, the Tribe improved to 111-49-2 (.691) all-time at Busch Field.
- During the 2006 season, a total of 12 different Tribe players have scored at least one point, while 10 different players have scored a goal.
- With its match against No. 3 Old Dominion on Oct. 29, the Tribe will have wrapped up the regular season with five of its final eight matches against teams ranked among the national top 20.
- Redshirt freshman Kaitlin Johnson recorded her third defensive save of the year against then-No. 18 Hofstra and ranks third in the CAA.
- Senior back Julianne Palbusa notched her first career defensive save against then-No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14.
- The Tribe's two defensive save performance against then-No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14, marked the first multi-defensive save game of the season for W&M. In 2006, the College had three matches with two or more defensive saves, including a season-high four against ODU on Oct. 30.
- Junior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter recorded eight saves against North-eastern to push her career total past the 200 mark. She now has 202 saves during her Tribe career.
- Hunter recorded her 10th career shutout against then-No. 18 Hofstra on Oct. 20. The clean sheet gave her sole possession of sixth on the W&M career list.

- Sophomore Lauren Giles registered her first career point in the Tribe's 5-3 win over then-No. 19 Richmond. She assisted on the College's final goal after Richmond had drawn within a single score, 4-3, in the 48th minute. She followed that up by scoring her first career goal in the second half against VCU on Sept. 24.

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kristen Gillis made the first saves of her W&M career against Drexel and then-No. 6 North Carolina. After battling injuries and missing each of the last two seasons, Gillis saw the first action of her W&M career on Sept. 1 against Davidson. She came on in the second half of both matches against Drexel and UNC. Against the Dragons, Gillis made two saves, while stopping one shot against the Tar Heels.

- In each of W&M's first three victories, one Tribe player recorded a career-high five-point game. Senior forward Maggie Long pulled the trick against Ball State, while junior Kim Hedley did the same against Miami (Ohio). Senior forward Gina Cimarelli notched two goals and an assist to give W&M three straight five-point performances against Davidson.

**SCOUTING TOWSON**

Towson had its two-match winning streak snapped at VCU on Oct. 21, falling 3-1. The loss dropped the Tigers to 9-8 overall and 2-4 in the CAA. The Tigers' two conference victories came at home against Northeastern (1-0 in double overtime) and Delaware (2-0). W&M and Towson have one other common opponent aside from the CAA slate. The Tribe defeated then-No. 19 Richmond, 5-3, in Williamsburg, while the Tigers dropped a 2-1 decision at then-No. 19 Richmond.

A trio of Tigers have double-digit points led by Christina Boardman, who has 16 on six goals and four assists. Kajee Murangi leads the way for Towson with seven goals, while Kim McEwen tops the squad in assists with five. Murnagi and McEwen are tied for second on the team in points with 15 apiece. Angie Brewer and Gabby Mink each have three goals for the Tigers. Christina Armer has started all 17 matches in goal for the Tigers. She has a goals against average of 1.95 with 127 saves and four shutouts.

W&M has never lost to Towson, holding a 13-0 all-time record. The Tribe is a perfect 7-0 against the Tigers in Williamsburg. In the 13-game series, W&M has outscored Towson, 51-3. Last season, the Tribe recorded a 4-0 win over the Tigers. Jessica Kacerek and Becky Van Zee each notched goals in the Tribe victory.

**SCOUTING OLD DOMINION**

The Monarchs top the CAA with a perfect 7-0 mark, while sporting an overall record of 16-2. Both of ODU's losses in 2006 have come at the hands of No. 1-ranked Maryland by matching 1-0 scores. The Monarchs are ranked No. 3 in the STX/NFHCA National Top 20, while coming in at No. 2 in the womensfieldhockey.com poll.

Dana Sensenig tops the Monarchs and the CAA in points with 41 and goals with 15. She also leads ODU with 11 assists on the season. In total, six Monarch players are in double-figure points. Denise Admiraal ranks second on the team with 23 points on 10 goals and three assists. Nicolien van Nispen and Darcy Pinchbech each have seven goals on the year to go along with 18 and 17 points, respectively. Caroline Nichols has 14 points and

six goals, while Jo Ann van Aswegen rounds out the double-digit scorers with 10 points. Kelly Driscoll has played every minute in the cage for the Monarchs. She has a goals against average of 0.65 to go along with 51 saves and a league-high 10 shutouts. Her GAA not only tops the CAA, but the nation as well.

ODU holds a 35-11 advantage in the all-time series with 17 of those victories coming in Norfolk, Va. W&M fell to the Monarchs are a pair of occasions in 2005. The Tribe dropped a 4-1 decision in Williamsburg before falling 3-1 in the CAA Tournament. Gina Cimarelli scored for W&M during the regular season affair, while Kim Hedley knocked in the tally during the CAA Tournament.

**SENIOR CAPSULES**

**Gina Cimarelli**

Cimarelli has played in 64 games, with 54 starts in her career, including every game in 2006. The Oak Hill, Va., native leads the Tribe in scoring this season with 20 points on seven goals and six assists. She also ranks among the top 10 in the CAA in points, goals, assists and game-winning goals. Over her career, Cimarelli has 52 points on 21 goals, including seven game-winners, and 10 assists.

**Jamie Fitzgerald**

Fitzgerald was recently named to the 2006 National Field Hockey Coaches Association Division I Senior All-Star Game. During her senior campaign, she has started all 16 matches at back for the Tribe, anchoring a defense that has five shutouts. For her career, the Jenkintown, Pa., native has appeared in 62 matches with 48 starts. Fitzgerald has six career points on one goal and four assists to go along with three defensive saves.

**Maggie Long**

The Ocean City, N.J., native has enjoyed her best season with the Tribe as a senior co-captain. Starting all 16 games at forward, she ranks third on a team with five goals to go along with an assist for 11 points. Long has played in 48 games, starting 28 over her career at W&M, boasting 21 points on nine goals and three assists.

**Julienne Palbusa**

Palbusa has started every match at back in 2006 for a Tribe defense that boasts five shutouts. Against No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14, the Virginia Beach, Va., native recorded her first career defensive save. During her career at W&M, Palbusa has appeared in 28 matches with 16 starts. Last season, she was named to team's

most improved player.

**Becky Van Zee**

As a senior co-captain, Van Zee ranks third on the Tribe in points with 11 on four goals and three assists. In 2006, she scored her first two career game-winners lifting the Tribe over Rutgers on Sept. 8 and No. 18 Hofstra on Oct. 20. Over her career, she has played in 61 career games with 29 starts, racking up 20 points on eight goals and four assists.

**FITZGERALD NAMED TO SENIOR ALL-STAR GAME**

Senior back Jamie Fitzgerald was named to the 2006 National Field Hockey Coaches Association Division I Senior All-Star Game. She is the 16th player from William and Mary to be named to the NFHCA All-Star Game. It marks the 10th year in which the Tribe will have a representative at the event. The game will be played on Saturday, Nov. 18, at Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, N.C., at 7:30 p.m.

During her senior campaign, Fitzgerald has started all 16 matches at back for the Tribe. Her lone assist on the year came in a 5-3 victory over then-No. 19 Richmond. She anchors a Tribe defense that has five shutouts and a goals against average of 1.69. For her career, the Jenkintown, Pa., native has appeared in 62 matches with 48 starts. She has six career points on one goal and four assists to go along with three defensive saves.

**TIGHT CAA RACE**

After Old Dominion (7-0) and James Madison (5-1), the CAA standings are quite clustered. W&M, Hofstra and Northeastern are all tied for third in the conference with 3-3 records, while Delaware sits at 3-4 in sixth place. Towson and VCU both have two wins, but are on the outside looking in for the spots in the CAA Tournament. With a victory over Towson, the Tribe can clinch a playoff spot.

**CONVERTING CORNERS**

The Tribe has had success scoring off of penalty corners. In the Tribe's conference-opening victories over VCU and Drexel, all seven W&M goals have come via the penalty corner. In the Tribe's 1-0 victory over then-No. 18 Hofstra, senior Becky Van Zee scored the lone Tribe goal off a penalty corner. For the year, the Tribe has scored 15 of its 33 goals off penalty corners.

**VAN ZEE LEADING THE WAY**

Head coach Peel Hawthorne has noted the play of senior midfielder Becky Van Zee throughout the season. The co-captain has been an integral part of the Tribe's defensive unit as well as it transition to offense. The Lehigh, Pa., native is also excelling on the offensive end having already notched a career-high 11 points on four goals and three assists in 2006. Van Zee scored the game-winner in the Tribe's 1-0 win over then-No. 18 Hofstra on Oct. 20.

**IMPRESSIVE AGAINST DUKE**

The Tribe turned in an impressive performance, despite a 3-1 loss to then-No. 4 Duke on Oct. 14. Head coach Peel Hawthorne said she was pleased with the Tribe's performance both offensively and defensively.

After trailing 1-0 at the half, the Tribe scored five minutes into the second stanza to even the match. Although Duke went on to score twice in the final 30 minutes and claim the victory, the Tribe outshot the Blue Devils in the second half. Of the College's five attempts, four were on goal, while W&M also generated a pair of penalty corners.

Hawthorne also felt her defensive backline of seniors Jamie Fitzgerald and Julianne Palbusa along with junior Laura Kastelic and redshirt freshman Kaitlin Johnson turned in its best performance of the season. Johnson and Palbusa both notched defensive saves in the Tribe's effort.

**STARTING OFF THE CAA SLATE IN STYLE**

For the third straight season, the Tribe opened the CAA portion of the schedule with two victories. It marked the fifth time in school history that the Tribe has accomplished the feat, having done so in 1993 and 1998 along with the last three years.

This season, the Tribe opened with victories over VCU (4-2) on Sept. 24, before defeating Drexel (3-0) on Sept. 29. In 2005, the College won its first three matches in league action before falling in overtime to James Madison. In 2004, W&M finished the CAA ledger at 7-0 to claim the regular-season crown.

**STRIKER CAREER YEARS**

Forwards Gina Cimarelli, Maggie Long and Kim Hedley have all recorded new career highs during the 2006 season. All three have established new career bests for points in a season with Long and Hedley garnering new career-best goal totals, while Cimarelli has equaled her best season in the Green and Gold.

Cimarelli leads the Tribe in scoring, while ranking fourth in the CAA in points (20). She also has seven goals, equaling her career high from 2004. The Oak Hill, Va., native also has a career and team-high six assists during her senior campaign.

Hedley is tied for the team lead with Cimarelli in goals. Both players' total of seven ranks eighth in the CAA. For the season, she has a career-best 16 points. She also tallied her first two career assists this season. Both her goal and point totals bettered her career-high marks from a season ago. On two occasions this season, Hedley has recorded a pair of goals, while helping the Tribe to overcome early deficits against Miami (Ohio) and then-No. 19 Richmond.

Long, like her fellow starting frontrunners, has established new career bests in goals and points. After notching six points on two goals and two assists as a junior in 2005, the Ocean City, N.J., native has 11 points on five goals and one assist.

**CAN I HELP YOU?**

In the Tribe's 4-2 CAA-opening victory over VCU on Sept. 24, junior back Laura Kastelic assisted on the first three W&M goals to help propel the College to victory. Each of Kastelic's three assists came off penalty corners as she found sophomore Katie Broaddus in the 22nd minute, freshman Wesley Drew in the 32nd minute and senior Maggie Long in the 49th minute. All four Tribe goals came via penalty corners.

Kastelic's three helpers were not only a career high, but the second most in school history. The last time a Tribe player notched three assists in a contest, Katie Silverthorne set the school mark with four against the Rams on Oct. 7, 2001. The three assists tied six other players for second in the school's annals.

**OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS**

The Tribe notched five goals in its first match against a ranked opponent on Sept. 16 versus then-No. 19 Richmond. In the 5-3 victory, all three W&M strikers scored as senior Gina Ci-

marelli and junior Kim Hedley added a pair apiece with senior Maggie Long adding the first W&M tally. It marked the first time W&M has scored five or more goals at home since downing then-No. 19 Hofstra, 5-1, in Williamsburg on Oct. 3, 2004.

W&M tallied four goals in each of its first three victories in 2006. It marked the first time since the 2004 season that W&M scored four or more goals in three consecutive games. The Tribe scored four or more goals in three straight wins at Virginia (5-4) on Sept. 29, vs. Drexel (4-2) on Oct. 1 and vs. Hofstra (5-1) on Oct. 3 during that season.

W&M opened the season with road wins over Ball State (4-1) and Miami (Ohio) (4-3 OT). The back-to-back four-goal performances on the road also were the first time since 1988 that the Tribe notched four or more goals in back-to-back road victories. During that season, W&M defeated Loyola (Md.), 4-3, on Oct. 1, before disposing of American, 4-0, on Oct. 2.

**IN MULTIPLES**

Through the opening nine games of the 2006 season, the Tribe has received two-goal games on six different occasions from three different players. Senior forward Gina Cimarelli has three multi-goal games, junior striker Kim Hedley has two and senior frontrunner Maggie Long has one. The two-goal games were the first of Hedley and Long's careers, while Cimarelli's three multigoal games gives her four in her career.

The last time W&M had more than six multi-goal games came during the 2002 season when it had nine. During that season Ann Ekberg had seven multi-goal games to lead the way for the College. Ekberg's season marked the last time a single Tribe player had more than three multi-goal games in a season.

The Tribe has also produced four, five-point games from the trio of forwards. Cimarelli pulled the trick against then-No. 19 Richmond and Miami (Ohio), while Hedley did it against the Redhawks as well and Long accomplished the feat against Ball State. The 2000 season was the last time W&M had more than four five-plus point games in a season. During that campaign, the College had five games of five or more points. In 2002, Ekberg had four games of five-plus points, making her the last W&M player to have more than two games with five or more points.

**TWO-FERS**

This season, the Tribe has had two players score two goals in the same game. Seniors Gina Cimarelli and Maggie Long each notched a pair in the College's 4-1 over Ball State to open the season. Cimarelli then joined forces with junior Kim Hedley to pull the trick against then-No. 19 Richmond.

When Cimarelli and Long each notched a pair of goals in the Tribe's 4-1 win over Ball State, it marked the first time since the 2003 season that two W&M players recorded multi-goal games in the same contest. The last duo to do it was Kelli Dugan and Kelly McQuade, who each notched a hat trick in W&M's 8-3 win over James Madison on Oct. 26, 2003.

The last time W&M had two players score a pair of goals in two games in a season was during the 2000 campaign. The feat occurred on four occasions for the Tribe in 2000. Katie Uhran and Lianne Ligtoet tallied two and three goals, respectively against Columbia (10/13/00), while Uhran teamed with Jaime Bolen to each add a pair in a 5-2 win over Villanova (10/28/00). Bolen and Ann Ekberg each scored two goals in a pair of games in 2000 against Davidson (Sept. 3) and Yale (Sept. 10).

**BEST START SINCE 2000**

The Tribe started the season a perfect 5-0 before falling in its most recent affair with Princeton. The 5-0 start marked the first time since 2000 that W&M has won five straight to open the season. During the 2000 season, the College opened with seven-straight victories. The 5-0 start is only the fourth five-game winning streak to start a season in school history. Aside from 2000, the Tribe accomplished the feat in 1978 and 1979.
