TRIBE OPENS CAA LEDGER AT HOME

The William and Mary field hockey team will host a pair of home matches against CAA counterpart Northeastern and NorPac foe Radford this weekend. The College will open the league portion of it slate against the Huskies at 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 21, before welcoming Radford to Busch Field on Sunday, Sept. 23, at 1 p.m. The Tribe is a perfect 4-0 on the turf of Busch Field this season.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe received seven votes in the STX/NFHCA Top 20 rankings released on Sept. 18. The 2007 slate will pit the Tribe against seven of the top 20 teams in the STX/NFHCA Rankings. The Tribe has remaining matches against No. 1 North Carolina, No. 8 James Madison, No. 14 Old Dominin and No. 17 Delaware. W&M will also face Drexel, which is receiving votes.
- W&M has won 10 or more matches in each of the last nine seasons after compiling a 10-9 ledger last season.
- W&M has a young roster as evident by 18 players who are freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores.
- After going 6-1 in home games last season, W&M jumped out to a 4-0 record at the friendly confines of Busch Field in 2007. The Tribe is 116-49-2 (.699) all-time at Busch Field.
- W&M has scored 11 of its 17 goals on the season in the second half of play.
- Ten of W&M's 17 goals on the year have been scored by underclassmen (freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores). In total, 24 of the Tribe's 45 points on the year have come from underclassmen.
- Four different W&M players (sophomore Kaitlin Johnson, redshirt freshman Alexis Gerber and freshmen Rebecca Wagner and Jenna Cinalli) registered their first collegiate goals in the Tribe's opening two games.
- Senior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter moved into sixth on the W&M career saves list with her 10-stop performance against Iowa. She ranks sixth on the career saves list, sixth on the career shutouts list and ninth on the career goals against average list.
- With her two-goal performance against Lock Haven, Rebecca Wagner became the first W&M freshman since Lianne Ligtvoet in 2000 to score two goals in one game. Ligtvoet accomplished the feat against Columbia on Oct. 13, 2000.
- W&M improved to 18-3 (.857) in home openers under head coach Peel Hawthorne with its win over Lock Haven. W&M improved to 26-6-3 (.786) in regular-season openers overall since 1973.
- Eight different Tribe players have earned their first collegiate starts in 2007. The group includes: junior Lauren Giles, sophomore Courtney Farino, redshirt freshmen Maura Checchio and Alexis Gerber and freshmen Erica Eng, Liz Loudy, Danielle Scissom and Rebecca Wagner.
- Senior forward Kim Hedley was named to the Preseason All-CAA team. After earning second-team honors last season, Hedley was one of 12 players named to the 2007 preseason list.



SCOUTING NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern enters the Friday tilt with the Tribe at 3-4, following a 1-0 victory over Providence on Sept. 19. Freshman Emma Boggio scored the game-winner midway through the first half as the Huskies snapped the Friars' five-match winning streak. Northeastern also owns victories over Ball State (4-1) and Quinnipiac (2-1). The Huskies have suffered defeats at the hands of Northwestern (2-1 in OT), No. 8 American (1-0), No. 2 Maryland (6-0) and No. 20 Boston University (3-2).

Harriet Hoyer leads the Huskies in scoring with three goals, while Ashley Bascetta and Pam Aldridge have two goals apiece. Ashley D'Ambra tops Northeastern with two assists on the year. Liz Centofanti has played every minute in goal for the Huskies, posting a goals against average of 2.00 to go along with 38 saves and a shutout.

Last season, Northeastern tallied a pair of wins over W&M, defeating the Tribe 1-0 in Williamsburg and 4-1 in the CAA Quarterfinals at Boston. The Huskies own a 5-2 advantage in the all-time series with the Tribe and have won the last four matches between the two schools.

SCOUTING RADFORD

Radford had its 14-match home winning streak snapped by Davidson on Sept. 19. The Highlanders fell to 2-7 overall and 0-3 in the NorPac Conference with the loss. The Highlanders own victories over Longwood, 3-1, on Sept. 1 and against Robert Morris, 1-0, on Sept. 2.

In total, W&M and Radford have two common opponents in Duke and Longwood. W&M is 1-1 against the pair, while the Highlanders are 1-2, having played Longwood twice this season. W&M defeated Longwood, 4-1, on Sept. 12 and lost a 3-0 decision at Duke on Sept. 1. Radford on the other hand defeated Longwood, 3-1, in its first clash of the season, while falling to the Lancers, 3-0, on the road. The Highlanders dropped a 4-0 decision at Duke earlier this season as well.

Erica Lawrence leads Radford in scoring with eight points on three goals and two assists. Kay Tufts, Emily Jones and Holly Lojacono each have three points on a goal and an assist this season. Jennifer Wisniewski has played every minute in goal for Radford. She owns a goals against average of 2.87 to go along with 54 saves and a shutout.

The Tribe is 22-2 all-time against Radford, including winning the last seven against the Highlanders. Last season, the Tribe defeated Radford, 2-0, on goals from Laura Kastelic and Wesley Drew. The College is 12-0 all-time against Radford at home and has outscored the Highlanders, 61-17, in their 24 meetings.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

With a roster that includes 18 players who are freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores, the Tribe have relied heavily on a quartet of seniors during the 2007 season. The senior group of Kim Hedley, Gwen Hunter, Jes Kacerek and Laura Kastelic have done their part to show the younger Tribe players the ropes in the early part of the 2007 season.

Hedley leads W&M in scoring with seven points on three goals and an assist. Two of her tallies have been game winners this season. She also was named to the Preseason All-CAA team. Kastelic has anchored the backline for the Tribe and been a dangerous component in the W&M attack as well. She ranks third on the team with six points on two goals and two assists. Over the last two matches, Kacerek has tallied four points on a goal and two assists. She is the Tribe most experience midfield player, and is the catalyst for the Tribe offense. Hunter has enjoyed a fine start to the season racking up a goals against average of 1.62 to go along with 24 saves. She has been a constant in the cage for W&M over the last four seasons.

CAA Openers

The Tribe will open the CAA portion of the 2007 schedule when it hosts Northeastern on Friday. It is the earliest the College has played a CAA

W&M is 11-5 all-time in CAA openers, including a 7-2 mark when those openers come at home. The Tribe has won its last three CAA openers dating back to the 2003 season. In each of the last two seasons, W&M has defeated VCU to open the league ledger. Last season, the College tallied a 4-2 win over VCU as Laura Kastelic established school record for assists in a game with three on Sept. 24, 2006.

Just the Way We Drew It Up

Sophomore Wesley Drew enjoyed success during her rookie season in 2006, earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors. The Virginia Beach, Va., native's impact has been felt even more in 2007. The midfielder has started every game for the Tribe this season and is tied for the team lead in scoring with seven points on two goals and three assists.

In the College's 3-2 come-from-behind win over Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 8, Drew scored the Tribe's opening two goals. It marked the first time in her W&M career that she has scored twice in a game. In the opening five minutes of a game, Drew scored on a counter and then added a rebound goal early in the second half to tie the game at two. Drew also assisted on a pair of W&M goals in its 4-1 win over Longwood.

Don't Call It A Comeback

The Tribe overcame a 2-1 halftime deficit to defeat Miami (Ohio) thanks to second-half tallies from sophomore Wesley Drew and freshman Jenna Cinalli. It marked the first time W&M has overcome a half-time deficit since it pulled the trick against the same RedHawks in Oxford, Ohio, on Aug. 27, 2006. The Tribe trailed 2-1 at the half in that contest, before rebounding for a 4-3 overtime victory. The last time W&M overcame a half-time deficit at home to tally the victory came during the 1998 season. The Tribe trailed No. 16 American, 1-0, at the half, before rallying for a 3-2 overtime win on Sept. 16, 1998.

WAGNER NAMED NATIONAL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward Rebecca Wagner wasted little time making an impact on the Tribe field hockey program, and reaped the rewards of both conference and national rookie of the week after the opening two game of the season. She garnered both the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Rookie of the Week and the womensfieldhockey.com National Rookie of the Week honors, following a weekend in which she scored a trio of goals in the Tribe's pair of season opening victories. Wagner became the first Tribe player since Shannon Karl in 2002 to take home the CAA weekly award, and the first ever to win the web site accolade for a rookie although Ann Ekberg was named the National Player of the Week by womensfieldhockey.com on Nov. 5, 2002.

In her first collegiate game against Lock Haven, Wagner scored twice in the second half, propelling the Tribe to a 4-2 victory over the defending Northeast Conference Champions and NCAA Play-in Game participants from last season. She notched her first career goal, redirecting a shot from senior Laura Kastelic into the back of the boards in the 40th minute. The Virginia Beach, Va., native scored the eventual game-winner on a rebound in the 61st minute for her second tally against Lock Haven.

She became the first W&M freshman since Lianne Ligtvoet in 2000 to score two goals in one game. Ligtvoet accomplished the feat against Columbia on Oct. 13, 2000. In the College's 5-0 win over Fairfield on Sunday, Wagner tallied the game-winner on a pass from redshirt freshman Alexis Gerber to start the scoring in the 24th minute.

YOUTH IS SERVED

A glance at the Tribe roster would easily explain how young W&M is in 2007. The roster features 24 players, 18 of which are listed as freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores. While the College will lean on its core of returning upperclassmen, it is inevitable that a lot will fall on the shoulders of younger players. In the early going, it appears that the Tribe's youth is not only up to the task, but promoting a bright future for the College as well.

In its victories over Lock Haven and Fairfield, the Tribe used lineups that featured 19 and 20 players, respectively. Underclassmen composed 14 of those players, including six who made their first collegiate starts. Freshmen Danielle Scissom and Erica Eng along with redshirt freshmen Alexis Gerber and Maura Checchio started the first games of their collegiate careers in the opener against Lock Haven, while sophomore Courtney Farino and freshman Liz Loudy made their first starts against Fairfield.

In total, 10 of the Tribe's 17 goals on the year have been scored by underclassmen, while 24 of the Tribe's 45 points have been registered by freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores. Freshmen Rebecca Wagner and Jenna Cinalli scored their first collegiate goals in the victory over Lock Haven, while Gerber and sophomore Kaitlin Johnson pulled the trick against Fairfield.
