TRIBE HITS THE ROAD FOR PAIR OF CAA BATTLES

The William and Mary field hockey team will hit the road for a pair of Colonial Athletic Association matches. The Tribe will travel to face its fourth ranked opponent of the season in No. 18 Delaware on Friday, Sept. 28. The match is slated for a 7 p.m. start time in Newark. The College will wrap up the brief two-match road trip at Towson on Sunday, Sept. 30. The contest between the Tribe and Tigers will begin at 1 p.m.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe received 22 votes in the STX/NFHCA Top 20 rankings released on Sept. 25. W&M has received votes in every STX/NFHCA poll this season. The 2007 slate will pit the Tribe against seven of the top 20 teams in the STX/NFHCA Rankings. The Tribe has remaining matches against No. 1 North Carolina, No. 7 James Madison, No. 13 Old Dominion and No. 18 Delaware.
- W&M has won 10 or more matches in each of the last nine seasons after compiling a 10-9 ledger last season.
- W&M has a young roster as evident by 18 players who are freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores.
- After going 6-1 in home games last season, W&M jumped out to a 6-0 record at the friendly confines of Busch Field in 2007. The Tribe is 118-49-2 (.704) all-time at Busch Field.
- With its victory over Northeastern, the Tribe improved to 12-5 in CAA openers, including an 8-2 mark at home.
- Twelve of W&M's 22 goals on the year have been scored by underclassmen (freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores). In total, 30 of the Tribe's 59 points on the year have come from underclassmen.
- Five different W&M players (sophomores Kelsey Jackson and Kaitlin Johnson, redshirt freshman Alexis Gerber and freshmen Rebecca Wagner and Jenna Cinalli) have registered their first collegiate goals this season.
- Senior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter moved into sixth on the W&M career saves list with her 10stop performance against Iowa. She also ranks eighth on the career goals against average list.
- Hunter moved into a tie for fifth on the W&M career shutout list with her 11th career clean sheet in the 1-0 win over Northeastern.
- With her two-goal performance against Lock Haven, Rebecca Wagner became the first W&M freshman since Lianne Ligtvoet in 2000 to score two goals in one game. Ligtvoet accomplished the feat against Columbia on Oct. 13, 2000.
- W&M improved to 18-3 (.857) in home openers under head coach Peel Hawthorne with its win over Lock Haven. W&M improved to 26-6-3 (.786) in regular-season openers overall since 1973.

- Nine different Tribe players have earned their first collegiate starts in 2007. The group includes: junior Lauren Giles, sophomore Courtney Farino, redshirt freshmen Maura Checchio and Alexis Gerber and freshmen Jenna Cinalli, Erica Eng, Liz Loudy, Danielle Scissom and Rebecca Wagner.
- Senior forward Kim Hedley was named to the Preseason All-CAA team. After earning second-team honors last season, Hedley was one of 12 players named to the 2007 preseason list.

SCOUTING DELAWARE

Delaware enters the match with W&M at 8-2 on the season. After opening the season with seven straight victories, the Blue Hens have dropped two of their last three matches. Last weekend, Delaware split its two CAA matches, falling to No. 8 James Madison, 1-0, before defeating VCU in double-overtime, 5-4. The Blue Hens are currently ranked No. 18 nationally in the STX/NFHCA Top 20.

W&M and Delaware have one common opponent on the schedule in Longwood. The Blue Hens disposed of the Lancers, 3-1, while the Tribe defeated Longwood, 4-1, in Williamsburg.

The Blue Hens rank among the national leaders in scoring at No. 8. Their 3.23 goals per game tops the CAA. Casey Howard leads UD in scoring with 18 points on eight goals and two assists. Her eight goals leads the CAA, while her 18 points is the second-best total in the league. Tori Karsten, Molly Burke and Amanda Warrington each of double digit points for the Blue Hens. Karsten has 13 points on five goals and three assists, while Burke (5g) and Warrington (3g, 4a) each of 10 points. Jackie Tait is tied with Warrington for the team lead in assists with four. Nikki Rhoades has started every game in goal for Delaware. She sports a 1.10 goals against average to go along with 17 saves and three shutouts.

W&M leads the series with Delaware at 6-3, including a 3-1 mark in Newark. Last season was the Tribe's first lost in Newark, as the Blue Hens tallied a 2-0 victory. Prior to last season's defeat, the Tribe had won five straight contests in the series.

SCOUTING TOWSON

Towson will play No. 13 Old Dominion on Sept. 28, before playing host to the Tribe. The Tigers enter the weekend at 4-5 after suffering back-to-back CAA loss to VCU and James Madison. Prior to the losses, Towson had garnered three straight victories over Georgetown (3-1), Richmond (5-2) and West Chester (3-2 in OT).

Christina Boarman leads Towson and the CAA in scoring at 19 points on eight goals and three assists. Her goal total also leads the conference. Kajee Murangi is third in the CAA in goals (6) and points (12). Laura Schnell and Maureen Meara are tied with Boarman for the team-lead in assists with three. Michelle Cheek has started all nine games in goal for Towson. She has a GAA of 2.69 to go along with 38 saves.

W&M has never lost to Towson, owning a 14-0 mark in the all-time series. The College is 6-0 at Towson, and has outscored the Tigers, 55-5 in all 14 meetings. Last season, W&M defeated the Tigers, 4-2, in Williamsburg. Kim Hedley and Katie Broaddus both tallied goals in the contest.

HUNTER NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior goalkeeper Gwen Hunter was named the Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week on Sept. 24. Hunter played over 120 minutes of shutout field hockey in guiding the Tribe to a 2-0 mark with victories over CAA foe Northeastern and NorPac opponent Radford during the week. The Seaville, N.J., native became the first W&M player since Kelly Giles in 2005 to win the conference's weekly honor.

In the Tribe's CAA opener against Northeastern at Busch Field, Hunter made six saves to record her first shutout of the season. She made a pair of

saves in the first half of play, before making the Tribe's 1-0 lead hold up in the second stanza with four stops. Hunter's biggest save of the evening came just over a minute into the second half. With W&M clinging to a slim lead, she made a diving stop to her right knocking away a dangerous shot lifted from the left side of the circle off a penalty corner.

Hunter made one save in the Tribe's 4-0 win over Radford while playing just over 52 minutes. The save against the Highlanders was the 250th of her W&M career, which ranks sixth on the College's all-time list.

Following the shutout of Northeastern, Hunter moved into a tie for fifth on the W&M career shutouts list with her 11th career clean sheet. For the season, Hunter has a goals against average of 1.28 to go along with 31 saves. Her GAA currently ranks 10th on the W&M single-season list. Hunter has also lowered her career goals against average to 1.77, which is the eighth-best average in W&M history.

GILES ON THE OFFENSIVE

W&M head coach Peel Hawthorne has noted the strong play of junior forward Lauren Giles throughout the 2007 season. The Williamsburg native leads the Tribe in goals (3) and points (8), while also dishing out a pair of assists. Giles led the Tribe to a 4-0 win over Radford with a pair of goals, including her first career game-winner. She has started every game this season for W&M at the forward position.

BALANCED ATTACK

The Tribe has used depth to its advantage and in the process established one of the most balanced scoring offenses in the CAA. As a team, the Tribe ranks among the CAA leaders in most offensive categories. W&M ranks third in scoring margin, fourth in scoring average and third in assists. To compliment those statistics, 11 different Tribe players have found the back of the cage in 2007, including seven players with two or more goals and four with three goals.

Freshmen Rebecca Wagner and Jenna Cinalli join senior Kim Hedley and junior Lauren Giles in the team lead with three goals on the season. W&M also has seven players with six or more points on the season. Senior Laura Kastelic, Giles and Wagner top the Tribe in scoring with eight points apiece, while sophomore Wesley Drew and Hedley have seven points apiece. Senior midfielder Jes Kacerek and Cinalli round out the group with six points apiece.

IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

The Tribe ranks among the national top-25 in four categories. The Tribe is 14th nationally in shutouts per game, blanking three of their first nine opponents. Also on the defensive side, W&M is 17th in the country in goals against average at 1.22. W&M is 25th in the nation in scoring average at 2.44 goals per game and 19th in scoring margin, outdistancing opponents by 1.22 goals per game.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

With a roster that includes 18 players who are freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores, the Tribe have relied heavily on a quartet of seniors during the 2007 season. The senior group of Kim Hedley, Gwen Hunter, Jes Kacerek and Laura Kastelic have done their part to show the younger Tribe players the ropes in the early part of the 2007 season.

Hedley leads W&M with three goals. She also has an assist for seven points on the year. Hedley was named to the Preseason All-CAA team. Kastelic has anchored the backline for the Tribe and been a dangerous component in the W&M attack as well. She leads the team in points (8) and assists (4), while adding a pair of goals. Over the last four matches, Kacerek has tallied six points on two goal and two assists. She is the Tribe's most experienced midfield player, and is the catalyst for the Tribe offense. Hunter has enjoyed a fine start to the season racking up a goals against average of 1.28 to go along with 31 saves. She has been a constant in the cage for W&M over the last four seasons.

Don'T CALL IT A COMEBACK

The Tribe overcame a 2-1 halftime deficit to defeat Miami (Ohio) thanks to second-half tallies from sophomore Wesley Drew and freshman Jenna Cinalli. It marked the first time W&M has overcome a half-time deficit since it pulled the trick against the same RedHawks in Oxford, Ohio, on Aug. 27, 2006. The Tribe trailed 2-1 at the half in that contest, before rebounding for a 4-3 overtime victory. The last time W&M overcame a half-time deficit at home to tally the victory came during the 1998 season. The Tribe trailed No. 16 American, 1-0, at the half, before rallying for a 3-2 overtime win on Sept. 16, 1998.



Just the Way We Drew It Up

Sophomore Wesley Drew enjoyed success during her rookie season in 2006, earning CAA All-Rookie Team honors. The Virginia Beach, Va., native's impact has been felt even more in 2007. The midfielder has started every game for the Tribe this season and is fourth on the team with seven points and ranks second on the squad with three assists. She also has scored a pair of goals for the Tribe this season.

In the College's 3-2 come-from-behind win over Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 8, Drew scored the Tribe's opening two goals. It marked the first time in her W&M career that she has scored twice in a game. In the opening five minutes of a game, Drew scored on a counter and then added a rebound goal early in the second half to tie the game at two. Drew also assisted on a pair of W&M goals in its 4-1 win over Longwood.

WAGNER NAMED NATIONAL ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward Rebecca Wagner wasted little time making an impact on the Tribe field hockey program, and reaped the rewards of both conference and national rookie of the week after the opening two game of the season. She garnered both the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Rookie of the Week and the womensfieldhockey.com National Rookie of the Week honors, following a weekend in which she scored a trio of goals in the Tribe's pair of season opening victories. Wagner became the first Tribe player since Shannon Karl in 2002 to take home the CAA weekly award, and the first ever to win the web site accolade for a rookie although Ann Ekberg was named the National Player of the Week by womensfieldhockey.com on Nov. 5, 2002.

In her first collegiate game against Lock Haven, Wagner scored twice in the second half, propelling the Tribe to a 4-2 victory over the defending Northeast Conference Champions and NCAA Play-in Game participants from last season. She notched her first career goal, redirecting a shot from senior Laura Kastelic into the back of the boards in the 40th minute. The Virginia Beach, Va., native scored the eventual game-winner on a rebound in the 61st minute for her second tally against Lock Haven.

She became the first W&M freshman since Lianne Ligtvoet in 2000 to score two goals in one game. Ligtvoet accomplished the feat against Columbia on Oct. 13, 2000. In the College's 5-0 win over Fairfield on Sunday, Wagner tallied the game-winner on a pass from redshirt freshman Alexis Gerber to start the scoring in the 24th minute.

YOUTH IS SERVED

A glance at the Tribe roster would easily explain how young W&M is in 2007. The roster features 24 players, 18 of which are listed as freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores. While the College will lean on its core of returning upperclassmen, it is inevitable that a lot will fall on the shoulders of younger players. In the early going, it appears that the Tribe's youth is not only up to the task, but promoting a bright future for the College as well.

In its victories over Lock Haven and Fairfield, the Tribe used lineups that featured 19 and 20 players, respectively. Underclassmen composed 14 of those players, including six who made their first collegiate starts. Freshmen Danielle Scissom and Erica Eng along with redshirt freshmen Alexis Gerber and Maura Checchio started the first games of their collegiate careers in the opener against Lock Haven, while sophomore Courtney Farino and freshman Liz Loudy made their first starts against Fairfield.

In total, 12 of the Tribe's 22 goals on the year have been scored by underclassmen, while 30 of the Tribe's 59 points have been registered by freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores. Freshmen Rebecca Wagner and Jenna Cinalli scored their first collegiate goals in the victory over Lock Haven, while Gerber and sophomore Kaitlin Johnson pulled the trick against Fairfield.


