

- 1967 - 1968 Squad wins 2 of 6 on Southern tour. Steve Isaacs playing #1 is co-medalist at State while Danny Rizzo is runner-up to medalist in Conference.
- 1968 - 1969 Isaacs and Rizzo continue to lead team to a winning season and 3rd place in State.
- 1969 - 1970 Team moves to Newport News Municipal Course for home matches. Isaac's leads scorers.
- 1970 - 1971 Winning season highlighted by 3rd place finish in State.

Blow Gym pool opens.
- 1926 - 1927  
Men's Swim Team proposed.
- 1927 - 1928  
Captain Ed Justis (diver and backstroke) lead first team to winning record. Les Phillips, Herb Leach and Jimmy Murphy star. Team has initial road trip to Catholic University and University of Delaware. Coach - Art Matsu.
- 1928 - 1929  
Most swimmers return under new coach "Cy" Young, Justis re-elected as captain. Justis also outstanding javelin hurler, earns olympic tryout. Phillips and Justis lead scoring.
- 1929 - 1930  
Les Phillips elected captain and appointed coach. Phillips and newcomer Bill Casey are leading scorers. Winning season capped by victories in 2nd road trip to Catholic and Delaware. Casey stars as diver, sprint freestyler and breastroker.
- 1930 - 1931  
Phillips re-elected captain, but not available due to hip injury. Casey chosen alternate captain as Meb Davis coaches squad. Casey undefeated in diving, joins with John Alexander to set breaststroke records. Christianson in backstroke and Fred Brodney in sprints also set team records. Phillips (50 free-record), Casey (2nd diving), Brodney (4th breast) place team 2nd in Southern Atlantic Swimming Championships - Baltimore.
- 1931 - 1932  
Bill Casey elected captain; holds New England and South Atlantic diving titles; undefeated in varsity career. Meb Davis' team has initial losing season despite record performance by mort Goldstein (breast) and Dick Herrick (440 free). Dining hall riot; two swimmers suspended (Bragan and Herrick).
- 1932 - 1933  
Casey re-elected captain as Davis coaches final season. Jimmy Bragan, distance and Brooks Flickenger in sprints leads scoring behind Casey who completes undefeated (dual meet) varsity career.
- 1933 - 1934  
Cameron Ogden (captain) as Joseph "Scrap" Chandler college track coach begins swimming coaching career. Bragan and Yerkes, diving; Ned LeGrande and Ogden, back; Lit Upshur, Fred Casagrande and Bill Grove, breast; with freestylers Bill Duncan and Wes Warnock set scoring pace. Warnock, LeGrande, Bill Bray and Duncan establish 160 yard free relay record.
- 1934 - 1935  
Wes Warnock and Ned LeGrande are co-captains. Team has winning record as Duncan sets pool record in 100 free. LeGrande and Flickenger

- lead divers with former honored as acting (All-State) football captain. George Bunch letters in swimming and basketball.
- 1935 - 1936  
Duncan (captain) as LeGrande is ineligible first semester due to post season football play. Duncan, George Bunch, Moe Brill and Al DeGutis lead freestylers to 400 free relay mark. Frosh stars and high school teammates Lenny Goldberg (breast) and Johnnie Adams (diver) lead newcomers.
- 1936 - 1937  
Duncan helps Scrap Chandler in coaching. Walt Hadtke and Walt Daniels are co-captains. Bunch has basketball conflict. Harvey Shuler is top 100 and 220 swimmer. Sophomores Goldberg, Southern Conference breast champion and Adams diving, along with Moe Brill, sprints and Jimmy Moore distance lead squad to 4th place in Southern Conference.
- 1937 - 1938  
Otis Douglas becomes head coach with Joe Flickenger (Diving Assistant). Brill returns as captain and leads squad to 3rd place in Conference. Harvey Shuler (56.5/100) with Brill leads sprinters and frosh Jack Purtill the distance swimmers. Goldberg sets new record winning 200 breast in Conference. Adams and John Tinsley lead divers. Goldberg and Brill in National Intercollegiate Championship meet (Advance to second round). Brill on All East Team for meet against West Team in Miami during Christmas holidays.
- 1938 - 1939  
Adams and Goldberg, co-captains. Complete eight years of swimming together competitively, as each wins Conference individual championship. Newcomers Sonny Almond and Tom Brennan with Goldberg set new 300 medley relay record (3:17.3). Adams and Tinsley in diving and Almond and Goldberg in breast sweep dual meet opponents; former are 1-2 in Conference.
- 1939 - 1940  
Chandler returns to coaching position. Distance ace Jack Purtill, 2nd in 440 in 1939 Conference meet, leads squad. Almond - breast, T. Brennan - back and Saul Rubin - diving, are leading scorers. Brennan sets W&M team and pool record in backstroke and joins with brother John and Sonny Almond to set new medley relay record.
- 1940 - 1941  
Captain Tom Brennan sets school and pool backstroke record in leading small squad (six men for Duke meet) to disappointing season. Roy Merritt, freestyle and Sonny Almond, breast, place team 4th in Conference.
- 1941 - 1942  
Pappy Gooch coaches wartime team with no returning varsity swimmers, including captain-elect Vince Wooley. Only victories are first and last meets of season as swimming is interrupted for five years (1942 - 1947). (Vince Wooley leaves college for war work. Donnelly joins Naval Air Corp.; Brown enters defense job; Merritt begins baseball).

- 1947 - 1948 Competition resumes, January 1948. Sprinter Ted Uhler 3rd in State Meet; high point man (scores 50 of 72 team points for season), and undefeated in dual meets.
- 1948 - 1949 Jake Stevens captain. Vic Janega - outstanding sprinter. Team wins first dual meet since 1942.
- 1949 - 1950 Jim Hall and Janega are high point men. Jake Stevens re-elected captain, as brother Tom Stevens swims breast. Swimming attains major sport status.
- 1950 - 1951 Ed Friedman captain. Janega has only one loss in season. Norfolk Division transfer Charlie Smith leads distance swimmers. Janega and backstroke Brian Kent place team 4th in State.
- 1951 - 1952 Jim Stone captain. Hall high point man. Jensen coaches first team.
- 1952 - 1953 Scott Petrequin captain. Stuart Sell and Winkie Wilde are high point men. Wilde sets 150 yd. individual medley record.
- 1953 - 1954 Freshman squad only as NCAA makes freshmen ineligible for varsity competition. Sell is frosh captain.
- 1954 - 1955 Sell and Dave Bannerman co-captains. Fritz Trinler is high point winner.
- 1955 - 1956 Sell is captain. The "Flying Dutchmen". Jan Heykoop and Trinler - Lead Sprinters.
- 1956 - 1957 Trinler is captain. Don Dew wins Big Six diving championship. Trinler and Maurice Tomlinson top scoring.
- 1957 - 1958 Dew and Sid Mook co-captains. Tomlinson again leading scorer. Mook swims all events, including diving, in four year career.
- 1958 - 1959 "Herk" Tomlinson, captain, establishes four school records - butterfly and individual medley. David Kurland top Southern Conference sprinter.
- 1959 - 1960 Phil Bullard and Gary Collier captain "Ten Iron Indians". New school records in all events. Kurland (50 free) and Chris Herr (220 free) win Southern Conference championships.
- 1960 - 1961 B. David Kurland and Dave Diehr co-captain team to 1st winning record in twenty years. 400 free relay sets Southern Conference record and wins Junior Nationals (Kurland, Herr, Victor "Turk" Despard, Mort Aulls). Conference championships held at Ft. Eustis.

- 1961 - 1962 Co-captains Herr (220 and 440 free) and Glenn Mann (200 breast) establish new W&M records. Wally Riley coaches freshman team.
- 1962 - 1963 Despard captain. Outstanding sophomores Pete McIntosh and Ron Good. Good wins Southern Conference (50 free) qualifies for NCAA's.
- 1963 - 1964 Dick Franklin and McIntosh lead team to 2nd in Conference and best dual meet record (7-4) in Tribe swimming history. Good (50 free/100 fly) and McIntosh (200 and 400 i.m.), set Southern Conference records and qualify for Easterns where Good places in 50 free finals.
- 1964 - 1965 Adair pool opens. Good, McIntosh and Pete Winfree tri-captains. Good undefeated in dual meets (50 and 100 free), team has 8-4 record. Southern Conference titles by Good (50 free) and McIntosh (200 and 400 i.m.). McIntosh voted Most Valuable Southern Conference Swimmer in meet held at Adair Pool.
- 1965 - 1966 Don Cave captain. Keith Maurer and George Bear lead scoring. Maurer wins 200 breast in Southern Conference. Team has overall 5th place finish.
- 1966 - 1967 Bob West and Alvin "Bill" Atkinson co-captains. Overall 5-7 record. Frosh are undefeated.
- 1967 - 1968 Bear and Maurer co-captains, with sophomore standouts George Collins, Bob Kennedy, Wayne Giberson and John Greene, lead team to 6-4 record, 3rd place in Southern Conference. Collins sets W&M records in 1000 free and 200 fly. Robert "Zoom" Henderson sets W&M 1 meter diving mark. New 400 medley relay time (Dave Dutrow, Collins, Maurer, Bear).
- 1968 - 1969 Henderson and Keith Hamack co-captains. Team has 8-2 dual meet record and ten new school records. George Collins sets state record in 100 and 200 fly, and 200 i.m., voted outstanding swimmer of meet. Other state records - Kennedy (50 free) and Wayne Giberson (200 free).
- 1969 - 1970 Undefeated in dual meets (10-0). Collins and Kennedy co-captains. State champions and 2nd in Southern Conference. Collins and sophomore Tom Gruver each take five state titles and are "co-swimmers of meet". Jeff Kohlhas sets W&M marks in backstroke and Chuck Alley in sprint freestyles, 50, 100 and 200.
- 1970 - 1971 Alley, Gruver, Klein tri-captains, lead team to 11-1 record. 21 meet winning streak halted by University of Virginia. Tribe takes State meet with 5 new records. Joe Ackerman wins 3 events with record in 200 i.m. Gruver wins 3 at State and 2 in Southern Conference. Alley and Mark

- Kelly have record setting state meets in 50 free (NCAA Qualifying) and 200 back. Team motto "BEAT IRVING".
- 1971 - 1972 Peter McIntosh coaches team to :500 season, and 2nd place in State championships under captain Tom Gruver.
- 1972 - 1973 McIntosh coach and Joe Ackerman captain, lead team to 6-3 record and 2nd place in State meet. Five State records set - Ackerman (2), Paul Vining and Rusty Bruni. McIntosh is state "Coach of the Year".
- 1973 - 1974 Jensen returns with Ackerman as assistant coach, and Bruni, John McIntyre and Kerry Dearfield as tri-captains. Backstroke record setting Vining lost to injury at mid-season.
- 1974 - 1975 Another "break-even" season lead by Captain Dodge Havens with outstanding individual performances, including Southern Conference records by Vining in both backstrokes and Bruce Hartzler in 100 breast. Dan Ozer sets W&M diving mark.
- 1975 - 1976 Keith Havens captain, leads team, breaking brother Dodges freestyle records, with Co-captain John Weiner. "Mother Ducks" slip below :500.
- 1976 - 1977 "Mother Ducks" continue to improve behind co-captains Hartzler and Dave Smith. While frosh Doug Slater i.m. and backstroke, Tom Holmberg, breaststroke set new marks. School leaves Southern Conference.
- 1977 - 1978 John "No Hope" Culhane, captain, heads winning squad as fellow seniors Jay Friedrich and Jack Phillips, juniors Joe Vaughan and Mike Hennessy, sophomores Dave Fratt and Holmberg, with freshman butterflyer Bill Weihs lead a balanced scoring; initial James River Swim for Cancer.
- 1978 - 1979 Co-captains Vaughn and Glen Anderson lead team to best record in 7 years (7-2). Record setting Slater returns after year at University of Iowa setting State records in backstroke and i.m. while Weihs and Holmberg set marks in fly and breaststroke.
- 1979 - 1980 Tri-captains Slater, Holmberg and Ed McLeod lead team to 8 new records, but sub :500 dual meet season. Slater sets 7 W&M and 2 State records (State meet is discontinued).
- 1980 - 1981 Record setting butterflyer Weihs leads young team, 20 freshman/sophomores, to sub-par season highlighted by his own performance and those of freestylers Jeb Juetter (junior) and John Lannen (freshman), and diver Tom Martin who places in Easterns.



1981 - 1982

Keith Havens becomes head coach with coach Jensen assisting. Jeb Jeutter, captain, leads sprinters while newcomers Greg Crump, breaststroke and Carl Browne, freestyle and backstroke set new school records and qualify for Easterns. Senior diver Martin breaks school 1 meter mark. Browne is Flat Hat's Male Athlete of the month (January).

1982 - 1983

Haven's second squad has sub :500 record, but sets over 2 dozen personal and school records. Seniors Andy Robins and Chris Kontos captain team while Browne, Crump and Peter Boehling, joined by sprinter Chris Hagin lead scoring. All-time W&M record holder and NCAA Qualifier, diver Shawn McLane makes initial Tribe appearance being voted outstanding male athlete in Sea Hawk Championship and leading Indians to 13th place in Easterns.

1983 - 1984

A year of highs and lows. Seniors Boehling and Scott Gehsman lead team featuring record setting duo Browne and McLane. McLane wins one and three meter diving events at Easterns, while Browne is finalist in 3 events and 2nd in 200 i.m. Team finished 12th at Easterns. In January, Athletic Directors announce men's swimming and 5 other sports to be cut from budget. After much controversy men's swim team allowed to continue and self-fund for three years.

1984 - 1985

Havens and Jensen share coaching duties with reduced numbers of swimmers as recruiting is prohibited. McLane continues to excel (Flat Hat athlete of the month-December), going undefeated in dual meets, winning Sea Hawks and placing 2nd on both boards in Easterns and 13th in NCAA's. Co-captains Crump and Bergen lead team to winning season.

1985 - 1986

Havens appointed Aquatics Director at Albion (Michigan) College, Jensen resumes coaching reins. Kent Schaum, Bill Sykes and McLane tri-captains, lead squad to break-even season. Newcomer Ted Coine, fly and free, joins record setting Chris Hagin and McLane in leading scoring. McLane wins both 1 and 3 meter events at Easterns and All-American recognition at Nationals.

1986 - 1987

Breaststrokes Drew Danielle and Scott Graham guide team to winning record topped by Grahams team record swims in breaststroke at Easterns. Coine leads team scoring setting distance free and butterfly records. Diving continues strong lead by seniors Bill Klunk and Dennis Whelan. Coine, Olympic Sports "Athlete of the Week" - February 13th.

1987 - 1988

Scott Reid and John Vahradian co-captain team to 8-3 dual meet record as swimming programs move to merge. Mens team continues to self-fund for 3 more years under new Athletic Director. Coine again breaks 500 free and 200 fly records, as freshman Louis Najera (i.m. and back) lead scoring.

1988 - 1989

Coine and sprinter Tom Torma co-captain team to sub :500 season despite outstanding performances by Coine, Najera and newcomers Jim Berry and Will Lappenbusch who sets new breaststroke marks.

#### Swimming Highlights - Programs Integrated

1989 - 1990

Programs integrated with Anne Howes (Anderson) as Aquatics Director and Head Coach with Rob Wimmer as Assistant Coach to both squads. Men's team lead by David Haworth and Brian Kemp ends with losing record despite scoring of Najera, Lappenbusch (2 W&M breaststroke records) and Berry. Women improve to 8-5 record under co-captains Sue Burke and Elise Hughes. Eight swimmers qualify for Easterns (17th place).

1990 - 1991

Both squads post winning records with Alison Wohlust and Helen Wilcox as womens co-captains, and Najera, Scott Holec and Mike Grill leading the men. February 12th, Athletic Director announces mens and womens program discontinued for financial reasons. February 22nd, President Verkuil announces programs have been reinstated contingent on their ability to fund in future. Parents agree to try and raise operating funds for 5 years and Alumni to establish a perpetual endowment.
