- 1964 - 1965 Women have first varsity meet since 1951. Laurie Roberts, Captain, undefeated (3-0) with Becki McColphin and Suzanne Bolton point leaders. Win Westhampton Invitational.
- 1965 - 1966 Undefeated (5-0) with Co-captains McColphin and Bolton both undefeated. End season with State Championship.

- 1966 - 1967 Undefeated (6-0) string continues with McColphin and Bolton co-captains and point leaders. State Champions.
- 1967 - 1968 Fourth straight undefeated (8-0) season as McColphin, Bolton and Roberts end careers.
- 1968 - 1969 Co-captains Nancy Bierly and Janice Savage. Eight and one dual meet record (first loss in 5 years). Third straight State Championship. Noelle Kehrburgh is leading scorer. Kehrburgh, Alice Hardin, Kathy Love, Kathy Gibson qualify for Nationals.
- 1969 - 1970 Another undefeated season and State Championship. Sophomore Kehrberg (captain) sets fly records. Three swimmers in NIAAW Nationals.
- 1970 - 1971 Continue undefeated seasons (10-0), six of seven, and win 7th straight State Championship; defeat East Caroline, only team to beat them in seven years. Lynn Adams (back), Jane Harlan (diving) individual state winners.
- 1971 - 1972 Hossie Gibson leads team to 6-1 record. New records set by Peg Lawlor (2), Mindy Wolff and Gibson. Jane Harland undefeated in diving. 5 swimmers to NIAAW Nationals.
- 1972 - 1973 Four swimmers qualify for Nationals (NIAAW)(21st) - Hossie Gibson, Peg Lawlor, Mindy Wolff and Kaggy Richter. Six new school records. (Lawlor [2] 100 fly, 200 free).
- 1973 - 1974 Victorious season lead by Lawlor, Richter, Wolff and Lynn Adams. Peg and Mo Lawlor, Mindy Wolff, and Kaggy Richter in Nationals.
- 1974 - 1975 Co-captains Richter and Lawlor set pace in break even year, culminating in Nationals at Arizona State. Same swimmers repeat for Nationals, Wolff sets 50 yd. breast record (state).
- 1975 - 1976 Richter, captain, and Kathie Kelly lead "stroking squaws" to modest dual meet record and to Nationals. Earl McClane - diving coach.
- 1976 - 1977 Karen Stephan, captain, leads team to winning record as Missy Farmer, Kelley and Diver Marta Namack qualify for Nationals. Kelley places in five events, 2nd in 200 breast.
- 1977 - 1978 Freshman Jenny Tatnall and Kristie Esbenson qualify for Nationals along with Kelley and divers Marta Namack and Carolyn Morse. Kelly, Tatnall, Esbenson, and 2 relays qualify as All Americans.

1978 - 1979

Kathie Kelly, captain, sets record pace in i.m. and breaststrokes to lead team to 2nd place in State Championships. 8 swimmers and 2 divers qualify for Nationals. Tatnall, Laura Schwarz, Esbenson and 4 relays make All American.

1979 - 1980

Mary Lee Bateman and Jenny Tatnall lead squad under interim coach Jane Crossman. Tatnall, distance freestyle, Patti Powis, breaststroke with backstroker, Laura Schwarz and divers Teresa Norman and Carolyn Morse top the scoring column. 8 swimmers and 3 divers in Division II Nationals - 24th place. Laura Schwarz (3 events) and 3 relays qualify as All American.

1980 - 1981

Chris Jackson returns as coach. Team has winning record and places 2nd in AIAW Division II Regionals at Adair. Erin Sheehey sets breast record, Teresa Norman and Carolyn Morse place 1st and 2nd in Regional diving. Tatnall becomes 3 time All-American as 8 swimmers qualify for Nationals.

1981 - 1982

Team rolls to 8-4 dual meet record. 3rd in Division II Regionals and National ranking. Sophomore Erin Sheehey again sets breaststroke record and places first in National Championships as does relay team of Schwarz, Sheehey, Heather Sell and Laura Jean Masters. Anne Sorenson, Flat Hats Athlete of the Month (January) and Erin Sheehey (February).

1982 - 1983

A 6-3 winning record and 10th place in EAIWA Championships hi-light season as women join the NCAA. Sheehey wins 50 breast at Easterns and qualifies for Nationals. 14 swimmer-divers at Easterns.

1983 - 1984

Six time "All-American" and Southland Olympia Award winner Erin Sheehey leads team to 7-3 record and 10th place in Easterns, under 2nd year coach Sarah Bingham. Kathy Welch sets team record in 200 free at Easterns.

1984 - 1985

Co-captains Meg Lanchantin and Heather Sell have outstanding senior years, and Kathy Welch continues on record pace in freestyle and butterfly. However, team suffers losing season due to lack of depth. Sarah Wilson Flat Hat Athlete of the Month (December). Tiffany Jeisel qualifies for NCAA Zone Diving Championship.

1985 - 1986

First year coach Anne Howes with co-captains Liddy Allee and Amy Flint guide team to 7-3 record and 7 new records. Welch (female swimmer of the meet) with best CAA Championship times in 100 fly and 200 i.m. is joined by freshman Amy Johnson (200 fly) and Diane Vallere (500 and 1650 free) in leading team to 14th in Easterns.

1986 - 1987

Diane and twin sister Lynne Alleva with Sara Wilson tri-captain team to sub par season. 4th place finish in CAA's is highlighted by sophomore Pat Olivo's victory in 200 fly.

1987 - 1988

Anne Howes appointed Director of Aquatics, as well as, womens coach with Debbie Cave as diving coach. Although suffering another losing dual meet season, Tribe rallied well for championships placing 4th in CAA's and 15th in Easterns. Freshman Helen Wilcox (fly) and most valuable swimmer. Allison Wohlist (free) set new records, while junior Amy Johnson wins 200 fly at Conference. Johnson recognized as Flat Hat "Athlete of the Month" (February).

1988 - 1989

An outstanding dual meet record under co-captains Johnson and Vallere. Freshman Karen Laslo wins 1650 in CAA's, as Wohlust takes 200 free title and team finishes in 2nd place. Coach Howes voted women's CAA Coach of the Year. 14th at Easterns.
