TRIBE HOSTS PAIR OF IVY LEAGUE FOES

After opening the season on the road, the William and Mary field hockey team will return to the friendly confines of Busch Turf Field to host a pair of Ivy League opponents, Sept. 6-7. W&M will welcome Columbia to Williamsburg on Saturday, Sept. 6, at noon, before hosting No. 16 Princeton on Sunday, Sept. 7, at 2 p.m. Live stats for both contests will be available at TribeAthletics.com.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe received two votes in the Preseason STX/NFHCA Top 20 rankings. The 2008 slate will pit W&M against nine teams that were either ranked or receiving votes in the poll.

- The College returns six starters and 15 letterwinners from last season.

- W&M continues to have a young roster as evident by 17 out of 24 players having freshman or sophomore athletic eligibility.

- The Tribe is 119-53-2 $\left(.690\right)$ all-time at Busch Field, including a 75-30 mark against non-conference opponents.

SCOUTING COLUMBIA

The Lions' contest with W&M will be their season opener. Last season, Columbia finished 11-6 on the year, including a 5-2 ledger in the Ivy League.

Senior goalkeeper Gena Miller became Columbia's first All-America honoree last season, finishing with some impressive numbers. Miller had 86 saves to go along with fives shutouts, while posting a goals against average of 0.95. Sophomore Julia Garrison was the Lions' top offensive threat on her way to earning Ivy League Rookie of the Year honors. She finished the year with 16 points on seven goals and two assists. Senior Jacqui Munro and junior Christine Buszczak also return for Columbia after double-digit point seasons. Buszcazak was third on the team with 11 points on five goals and an assist, while Munro had 10 points on four goals and two assists.

The two teams have met only one other time during the 2000 season. The College tallied a 6-2 win over the Lions in Williamsburg.

SCOUTING NO. 16 PRINCETON

The Tigers will open the regular season at Richmond on Saturday before traveling to face the Tribe in Williamsburg. Princeton is currently ranked No. 16 in the STX/NFHCA Top 20, following a 13-5 season in which the Tigers won the Ivy League Championship and advanced to the NCAA Play-in Game.

Princeton's top returning players are junior forward Christina Bortz and senior defender Holly McGarvie. Each player earned first-team All-Ivy League honors as well as second-team all-region distinction last season. Bortz topped the Tigers in scoring with 32 points on 12 goals and eight assists, while McGarvie added 19 points on nine goals and an assist. Sophomore Kaitlyn Perrelle was a member of the U.S. Under-21 team at the Junior Pan-American Cup over the summer after starting as a defender for the Tigers last season. Junior Cynthia Wray returns as the Tigers starting goalkeeper from a season ago. Wray started 17 contests in cage and finished with 47 saves, four shutouts and a goals against average of 1.48.

Princeton leads the all-time series at 4-2 and has won the only two meetings in Williamsburg. The last time the two teams met, the Tigers claimed a 1-0 win in Princeton, N.J. during the 2006 season. The last time the squads met in Williamsburg, Princeton notched a 2-1 overtime win in 2004.

WINNING AT HOME IN THE NON-CONFERENCE

The Tribe has always enjoyed a great deal of success at Busch Field Turf, but that sentiment rings even more true during the non-conference portion of the schedule. Since beginning play at Busch in 1989, the Tribe field hockey program is 119-53-2 which equates to a winning percentage of 69 percent. The more startling number jumps out in non-conference games as W&M wins at a 71.4 percent clip with a record of 75-30. In fact over the last two seasons, the College has lost only once against a non-conference foe at Busch Field and that setback was to then-No.1 and eventual national champion North Carolina a season ago. W&M will face seven non-conference foes at Busch Field this season, beginning this weekend with Columbia and Princeton.

FACING THE IVYS

William and Mary is often compared to Ivy League schools for its prestige and excellent academics. The field hockey program will get a chance to see how it stacks up against the some of the top teams in the Ivy League on the field. The Tribe will welcome three straight Ivy League foes to Busch Turf Field beginning this weekend with Columbia on Saturday, Sept. 6, and Princeton on Sunday, Sept. 7. The Tribe will wrap up the three-game stretch against Penn on Saturday, Sept. 13. All-time, the Tribe is 19-11-1 against the Ivy League schools.

STARTING OFF

Sophomore Carrie Thompson garnered the first two starts of her collegiate career last weekend. In her first start against No. 11 Virginia, Thompson finished with a career-high eight saves against a potent Cavalier attack. She followed that performance with a pair of stops in the College narrow setback to Providence. Thompson spent her first two seasons with the Green and Gold behind four-year starter Gwen Hunter. After redshirting in 2006, Thompson appeared in five contests as Hunter's back-up in 2007.

WAGNER FINDING THE TOUCH

Last season, Rebecca Wagner wasted little time making a name for herself as a scoring threat for the Tribe. The Virginia Beach, Va., native tallied three goals in the opening two games of the season. This season is no different for Wagner. After coming off the bench in the Tribe's season opener at Virginia, Wagner garnered her sixth collegiate start against Providence and promptly registered the Tribe's first goal of the 2008 season, scoring 10 minutes into the contest against Providence.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

A quartet of Tribe freshmen made their first appearances in the Green and Gold over the weekend. True freshman Leah Zamesnik and redshirt freshman Mikala Savaides started both games for the College against No. 11 Virginia and Providence. Redshirt freshman Kelsey Nawalinski started the opening contest of the season against the Cavaliers, before coming off the bench against Providence. True freshman Caitlyn Davies appeared in the first two games of her collegiate career to kick off the season for the Tribe.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior Katie Broaddus and junior Wesley Drew will serve as the Tribe's co-captains in 2008. Both players are returning starters with Broaddus heading up the College's backline and Drew leading the charge in the midfield.

Over her career, Broaddus has appeared in 59 matches with 42 starts. Over the last three seasons, the Clifton, Va., native has started all 40 matches for the College. Broaddus has scored six goals over her W&M career and owns 14 career points. In her first season as a defender in 2007, Broaddus topped the Tribe and ranked among the CAA leaders in defensive saves


