## TRIBE CONTINUES CAA SLATE ON THE ROAD

The William and Mary field hockey team will trek north for a pair of CAA matches over the weekend at Drexel and Hofstra. W&M will face the No. 17-ranked Dragons at 7 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 10, before traveling to Hempstead, N.Y., to face the Pride at noon on Sunday, Oct. 12. The Hofstra game was originally slated for Columbia University in New York, N.Y., but due to scheduling conflicts was moved back to Hofstra's campus.

## TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe is once again playing a difficult schedule in 2008. The Green and Gold has already faced a pair of ranked opponents and five foes receiving votes for the top 20. The Tribe's remaining schedule includes four nationally ranked opponents and three receiving votes. In total, 12 of W&M's 19 opponents for 2008 are either ranked or receiving votes in the NFHCA/STX Oct. 7 poll.

- For the second time this season, the Tribe was receiving votes in the NFHCA/STX National Top-20 released on Oct. 7.

- Senior Katie Broaddus and junior Wesley Drew were named the Tribe's co-captains for the 2008 season.

- Broaddus and sophomore Courtney Farino lead the Tribe and rank third in the CAA with two defensive saves each. W&M ranks second as a team behind Old Dominion with five defensive saves on the year.

- Drew registered her first collegiate defensive save in the Tribe's overtime win against Towson.

- W&M continues to have a young roster as evident by 17 out of 24 players owning freshman or sophomore athletic eligibility.

- Eight different W&M players have scored a goal for the College this season, while at least nine players have registered a point on the year.

- Sophomore Erica Eng, redshirt freshmen Kelsey Nawalinski and Mikala Savaides as well as true freshman Leah Zamesnik have each registered their first career goals for the Tribe in 2008. Zamesnik and Nawalinski join sophomore Jenna Cinalli in tallying their first collegiate assists this year.

## SCOUTING #17 DREXEL

The Dragons enter the tilt with the Tribe at 9-3 overall and 2-1 in the CAA, while maintaining the No. 17 national ranking. Last week, Drexel split a pair of matches on the road falling to No. 7 James Madison, 2-1, and knocking off VCU, 3-2. The Dragons are currently tied with Princeton for the most road wins in the country at seven. The Dragons three losses on the year have come to the No. 7, No. 9 and No. 16-ranked teams in the country.

W&M and Drexel have one common opponent on the year in St. Joseph's. The College fell to the Hawks, 3-2, in overtime, while Drexel recorded a 5-1 victory over SJU. Drexel leads the CAA in scoring average, tallying 3.2 goals per game. The Dragons rank second in the CAA in scoring differential and third in goals allowed.

Susan Ciuflo leads the Dragons in scoring with 27 points on 11 goals and five assists. Ciuflo's point and goal totals rank second in the CAA. Five other Dragons have registered double-digit points on the season. Christina Mastropaolo (5g,3a) and Jen Cairone (6g,1a) each have 13 points on the year followed by Jennifer Bolger (3g,5a) with 11 and Kim Tunell (3g,4a) and Amanda Kicera (4g,2a) with 10 each. Mastropaolo, Kicera and Cairone each have a pair of game-winning goals for the Dragons. Colleen McAndrew has started all 12 games in goal while registering a GAA of 1.52 to go along with 61 saves and a save percentage of 77.2.

W&M leads the all-time series with Drexel at 7-1, including a 3-0 mark in Philadelphia. The Dragons, however, won the last meeting between the two schools, 2-0, in Williamsburg last year.

## SCOUTING HOFSTRA

Hofstra enters the weekend at 7-3 overall and 1-2 in CAA play. The Pride will battle ODU on Friday, before hosting the Tribe. Hofstra owns a 4-1 ledger at home this season. Last week, the Pride split a pair of matches on the road, tallying a 3-2 overtime win over VCU and falling to No. 7 James Madison, 7-3.

Charlia Warner leads the Pride in scoring with 20 points on nine goals and two assists. Three of her markers have been game-winners. Kristin Thompson ranks second on the team with 14 points on four goals and a team-best six assists, while Brit Blankmeyer has 12 points on five goals and two assists. Both Krisha Giammarco and Amanda Heyde have started five games apiece in goal for the Pride. Giammarco has a GAA of 1.82 to go along with 12 saves, while Heyde has a GAA of 2.94 as well as 41 saves. Both players have won three matches in goal for the Pride.

W&M holds a slim 4-3 advantage in the all-time series with Hofstra. The two teams have split the only two meetings in Hempstead, N.Y. Last season, the Pride recorded a 2-0 win over W&M in Williamsburg. Hofstra won the last meeting in Hempstead as well, 3-0, during the 2005 season.

## NAWALINSKI NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman forward Kelsey Nawalinski was named the CAA Rookie of the Week on Oct. 6. Nawalinski tallied her first career points during the week, finishing with two goals, including the overtime game-winner against Towson, and an assist. It marks the second time this season a W&M rookie has garnered the weekly league honor as redshirt freshman Mikala Savvides received the accolade on Sept. 22.

In the Tribe's heartbreaking 3-2 penalty stroke setback to Delaware, Nawalinski factored into both Green and Gold goals. She tallied her first collegiate assist, finding sophomore Jenna Cinalli in the crease to give W&M a 1-0 lead in the 16th minute. Nawalinski increased the Tribe cushion to 2-0 with her first collegiate goal five minutes later. Off a penalty corner, senior Katie Broaddus sent a hard pass to right post, where Nawalinski beat the UD goalkeeper to the near post boards.

Nawalinski was the hero of the Tribe's 2-1 overtime win over Towson. With the College playing its fifth straight over-time affair at home, Nawalinski crashed the weak side and punched in a centering pass from sophomore Rebecca Wagner just 24 seconds in the overtime period, giving W&M the victory. She also topped the team in shots against Towson with three. For the season, Nawalinski has appeared in all 11 games, while making eight starts.

Nawalinski is the fourth Tribe player to earn CAA Rookie of the Week honors. She joins fellow teammates Mikala Savvides and Rebecca Wagner in receiving the distinction over the last two years. Savvides received the honor earlier this season after scoring her first collegiate goal in the Tribe's game against Richmond, while Wagner won award at the beginning of last season. The only other W&M player to win CAA Rookie of the Week honors was Shannon Karl in 2002.

## GOING THE DISTANCE AND MORE

Over the last seven games, the Tribe has played five overtime games, including one match that was decided in a stroke off. The College opened the stretch with a 3-2 win over Penn on Sept. 13. W&M followed with two straight home overtime games against St. Joseph's on Sept. 14 and Richmond on Sept. 21. After splitting games against Northeastern and Vermont, W&M has gone to extra time in each of its last two contests. W&M lost to Delaware, 3-2, in a stroke-off, before notching a 2-1 OT win over Towson.

It total, each of the Tribe's last five home matches have gone to overtime, and W&M has played a total of 48:28 of extra time this season. The five overtime games this season rank as the third most in school history behind the six OT contests of 2002 and the seven played during the 1983 campaign. W&M's three straight overtime games from Sept. 13-21 marked the second time in school history W&M played three consecutive overtime contests. The Tribe also accomplished the feat in 2002. W&M's 3-2 setback in penalty strokes on Oct. 3 was the first Tribe contest to be decided in strokes since 2005.

## SAVAIDES NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman forward Mikala Savaides was named the Colonial Athletic Association Field Hockey Rookie of the Week on Sept. 22. Savaides scored her first collegiate goal in the Tribe's heartbreaking 4-3 overtime loss to Richmond on Sept. 21.

Savaides, who has started all seven matches at the forward position for the Tribe, helped W&M overcome a two-goal second-half deficit and sent the match with Richmond to overtime with her goal. The Spiders took a 2-1 lead to half-time and scored three minutes out of the break, extending its advantage to 3-1, before W&M rallied to force overtime. With the Tribe trailing 3-2 and just over four minutes remaining, Savaides punched a shot turned pass from senior Lauren Giles into the left side boards to knot the match and force overtime.
