GREEN AND GOLD HOSTS NATIONALLY RANKED FOES

The William and Mary field hockey team will step outside of conference play to host a pair of nationally ranked foes over the weekend. The College will welcome No. 5 Duke to Williamsburg on Friday, Oct. 17, at 7 p.m., before hosting No. 19 Rutgers at noon on Sunday, Oct. 19. Live statistics will be available for both contests at TribeAthletics.com

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe is once again playing a difficult schedule in 2008. The Green and Gold has already faced a trio of ranked opponents and six foes receiving votes for the top 20. The Tribe's remaining schedule includes three nationally ranked opponents and one receiving votes. In total, 12 of W&M's 19 opponents for 2008 are either ranked or receiving votes in the NFHCA/STX Oct. 14 poll.
- Senior Katie Broaddus and junior Wesley Drew were named the Tribe's co-captains for the 2008 season.
- Junior Kelsey Jackson recorded her first collegiate assist, finding freshman Leah Zamesnik for the game-winner against Hofstra in overtime. It was Zamesnik's first collegiate game-winning goal as well.
- Sophomore Courtney Farino tallied her third defensive save of the season against No. 17 Drexel. She is tied for the CAA lead in defensive saves.
- As a team, W&M ranks second in the CAA with six defensive saves. Senior Katie Broaddus is fifth in the conference with two defensive saves, while Wesley Drew is sixth with one.
- W&M continues to have a young roster as evident by 17 out of 24 players owning freshman or sophomore athletic eligibility.
- Nine different W&M players have scored a goal for the College this season, while at least 10 players have registered a point on the year.
- Sophomore Erica Eng, redshirt freshmen Kelsey Nawalinski and Mikala Savaides as well as true freshman Leah Zamesnik have each registered their first career goals for the Tribe in 2008. Zamesnik and Nawalinski join junior Kelsey Jackson and sophomore Jenna Cinalli in tallying their first collegiate assists this year.

SCOUTING #5 DUKE

The Blue Devils shot up the national rankings this week after upsetting previous No. 1-ranked Maryland, 3-2, on Oct. 11. Duke moved up to No. 5 nationally and is currently 10-3 on the season after a 4-0 midweek win over Ohio. The Blue Devils have won four straight and seven of their last eight. Duke and W&M have two common opponents on the year in Delaware and Drexel. The Blue Devils defeated both squads, while W&M suffers losses to their CAA counterparts.

Amie Survilla is coming off a two-goal performance in the Blue Devils' victory over Maryland. She was named ACC Player of the Week and leads Duke with eight goals and 16 points on the year. Susan Feger (6g,1a) and Marian Dickinson (5g,3a) rank second on the team with 13 points apiece. Megan Deakins also owns five markers for the Blue Devils, while Lauren Miller tops the squad with six assists. Samantha Nelson has started 10 matches in goal and owns a GAA of 1.07 to go along with 19 saves and four shutouts.

2008 TRIBE FIELD HOCKEY

Dukes leads the all-time series with the Tribe at 17-8-1, while the College holds a 6-5 cushion in games in Williamsburg. The Blue Devils have won the last six meetings between the two schools, including a 3-0 victory last season in Durham, N.C. The last W&M victory in the series came in Williamsburg during the 2001 season when the Tribe notched a 2-1 win over the then-No. 8-ranked Blue Devils.

SCOUTING #19 RUTGERS

Rutgers enters the match with the Tribe at 12-3 on the year, following wins over Maine and Delaware. The Scarlet Knights downed CAA foe Delaware, 2-1, on Wednesday night. Rutgers is currently ranked No. 19 nationally with all three of its losses coming in Big East play to Villanova, No. 11 Louisville and No. 18 Providence. W&M and RU have five common opponents on the season in Penn, St. Joseph's, Drexel, Delaware and Providence. W&M went 2-3 against the quintet, while Rutgers was 4-1.

Rutgers' top offensive weapon is Amy Lewis, and she leads not only the Big East, but the country in goal with 23 on the year. She also ranks third nationally in points per game at 3.26. Lewis has 49 points on the year to go along with six game-winning goals and a trio of assists. Jenna Bull (3g,9a) and Melissa Bowman (4g,6a) both have double-digit points for the Scarlet Knight at 15 and 14, respectively. Bull leads RU in assists with nine followed by Bowman's six. Jessika Hoh is second on the team with five goals after scoring the game-winner against Delaware. Lauren Decerbo has seen the majority of the action in goal for Rutgers. She owns a GAA of 1.68 to go along with 48 saves and two shutouts.

Rutgers leads the all-time series with the Tribe at 3-1 and have won the only other meeting between the two schools in Williamsburg. The Tribe won the last meeting between the teams, 2-0, at Rutgers during the 2006 season. The only other meeting between the squads in Williamsburg was a 4-3 double overtime win by the Scarlet Knights in 2004.

SAVAIDES, NAWALINSKI RAKE IN ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONORS

In each of the last two weeks and three of the last four, a William and Mary field hockey player has been named the CAA Rookie of the Week. Redshirt Freshman Mikala Savaides nabbed the distinction for the second time this year on Oct. 13. Fellow classmate Kelsey Nawalinski received the rookie of the week honor on Oct. 6, while Savaides garnered her first accolade on Sept. 22. Savaides received the latest recognition after scoring a pair of goals in the Tribe's 6-5 overtime win over Hofstra as W&M improved to 3-2 in CAA play.

Savaides opened the scoring against the Pride with a goal 40 seconds in to the contest. She followed up her own rebounded to help the College off to the early lead. After Hofstra scored three-straight goals to take a 3-2 lead less than two minutes into the second half, Savaides quickly answered for the College to even things at three. Just 56 seconds after Hofstra had taken the lead, the redshirt freshman forward scored in traffic for her second tally of the game. The pair of goals brought Savaides' season total to three, which ranks second on the team.

Nawalinski earned the honor on Oct. 6 after tallying her first career points. She finished the week with two goals, including the overtime gamewinner against Towson on Oct. 5, and an assist. In the Tribe's heartbreaking 3-2 penalty stroke setback to Delaware, Nawalinski factored into both Green and Gold goals. She tallied her first collegiate assist, finding sophomore Jenna Cinalli in the crease to give W&M a 1-0 lead in the 16th minute, before increasing the Tribe cushion to 2-0 with her first collegiate goal five minutes later off a penalty corner pass from senior Katie Broaddus. With the College playing its fifth straight overtime affair at home against Towson, Nawalinski crashed the weak side and punched in a centering pass from sophomore Rebecca Wagner just 24 seconds in the overtime period, giving W&M the victory.

Savaides and Nawalinski are the third and fourth Tribe players to earn CAA Rookie of the Week honors. They join fellow teammate Rebecca Wag-

ner in receiving the distinction over the last two years. Wagner won award at the beginning of 2007 season. The only other W&M player to win CAA Rookie of the Week honors was Shannon Karl in 2002.

GOING THE DISTANCE AND MORE

Over the last nine games, the Tribe has played six overtime contests, including one match that was decided in a stroke off. The Green and Gold is closing in on the school record for overtime games in a season which is seven set during the 1983 campaign.

The latest overtime stretch started with a 3-2 win over Penn on Sept. 13. W&M followed with two straight home overtime games against St. Joseph's on Sept. 14 and Richmond on Sept. 21. After splitting games against Northeastern and Vermont, W&M went to extra time in each of its next two home contests. W&M lost to Delaware, 3-2, in a stroke-off, before notching a 2-1 OT win over Towson. The last contest was a 6-5 win over Hofstra in extra time.

It total, each of the Tribe's last five home matches have gone to overtime, and W&M has played a total of 52:20 of extra time this season. The six overtime games this season is tied for the second most in school history along with the six OT contests of 2002. The school record is seven during the 1983 season. W&M's three straight overtime games from Sept. 13-21 marked the second time in school history W&M played three consecutive overtime contests. The Tribe also accomplished the feat in 2002.

STREAKING

Sophomore Jenna Cinalli is on a point scoring streak for the Tribe. Over the last five matches, Cinalli has tallied a goal or an assist for the Tribe on her way to the team lead in both goals and points. During the current scoring streak, Cinalli scored goals against Vermont, Delaware, Towson and Drexel before adding an assist in the Tribe's 6-5 overtime win over Hofstra. Cinalli leads W&M with 12 points on five goals and two assists. The Fredericksburg, Va., native has 10 career goals over the last two seasons, including four game-winners.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

As the season has worn on, the Tribe's offensive production has increased dramatically, culminating in the program's first six-goal showing in three seasons against Hofstra on Oct. 12. The Green and Gold struggled out of the gates offensively only scoring one goal in the opening four games of the season. Over the last nine contests though, W&M is averaging over 2.5 goals per game and has not been shutout.

Over the last nine games, the Tribe has scored 23 goals and tallied 62 points. The College is average 2.56 goals per game and 6.89 points per contest. On the season, the Tribe is average just over 10 shots and nearly seven shots on goal per game. Over the last nine games, those numbers have been increasingly better. During the stretch, the Tribe has attempted 13.2 shots per game with nearly nine attempts going on frame.

THE DISH

In each of the last three contests, junior Wesley Drew has tallied an assist for the Tribe. The streak brings her season total to a team-high six. It is the second three-plus game point streak of the season for Drew. She had a four-game streak from Sept. 13-26, where she tallied eight points on two goals and three assists. After failing to register a point in the Green and Gold's opening four games, Drew has all 10 of her points (2g, 6a) in the Tribe's last nine contests. Drew currently ranks eighth in the CAA in both total assists and assists per game.
