TRIBE TRAVELS TO BOSTON FOR WEEKEND PAIR

The William and Mary field hockey team will trek north to play a pair of matches in the Boston area, Sept. 26-28. The Green and Gold will begin the trip on Friday, Sept. 26, with its CAA opener at Northeastern. Game time is slated for 2 p.m.

W&M will look to continue its winning ways in CAA openers. The College has won four straight league openers dating back to the 2003 season. Live video for the contest will be available at GoNU.tv at a cost of \$4.95.

The Tribe will wrap up the weekend trip against Vermont on Sunday, Sept. 28. The contest is schedule for a 1 p.m. start and will be played in Cambridge, Mass. at Harvard.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe will once again play a difficult schedule in 2008. The Green and Gold has already faced a pair of ranked opponents and two foes receiving votes for the top 20. The Tribe's remaining schedule includes three nationally ranked opponents and four receiving votes. In total, 12 of W&M's 19 opponents for 2008 are either ranked or receiving votes in the NFHCA/STX Sept. 23 poll.

- Senior Katie Broaddus and junior Wesley Drew were named the Tribe's co-captains for the 2008 season.

- Broaddus leads the Tribe and ranks second in the CAA in defensive saves with two.

- Sophomore Jenna Cinalli tallied her first collegiate assist against Richmond and scored her fourth collegiate game-winning goal against Penn.

- W&M continues to have a young roster as evident by 17 out of 24 players owning freshman or sophomore athletic eligibility.

- The Tribe is 120-57-2 (.680) all-time at Busch Field, including a 76-34 mark against non-conference opponents.

- Seven different W&M players have scored a goal for the College this season, while at least eight players have registered a point on the year.

SCOUTING NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern enters the CAA opener with the Tribe at 5-2 on the year and have won each of its last four contests. The Huskies will be playing their first game in nine days when W&M travels to Boston. In its most recent contest, the Huskies dominated Brown, 7-1, at home. NU also owns wins Northwestern, Dartmouth, Quinnipiac and Boston University. Both Northeastern's losses on the season came at home by 2-1 margins against Providence and UMass. The Huskies are currently receiving votes in the latest NFHCA/STX National Top 20.

In its victory over Brown, Meg Sweeney and Pam Aldridge each finished with two goals, while both Ashley Bascetta and Anne-Reike Stuhlmann had two assists. The Huskies outshot Brown, 24-5. Aldridge, Carolyn Malloy and Sweeney are tied for the team lead in scoring with 10 points on four goals and two assists. Bascetta is not far behind with nine points on three goals and three assists. Stuhlmann leads the Huskies in assists with four. Colleen Duffy has played every minute in goal for NU and owns a goals against average of 0.85 to go along with 31 saves, an 83.8 save percentage and three shutouts. Duffy leads the CAA in save percentage, while ranking second in GAA and third in shutouts.

2008 TRIBE FIELD HOCKEY

The Huskies lead the all-time series with the Tribe at 5-3, including a 3-1 mark in Boston. Last season, the Tribe tallied a 1-0 win over Northeastern to open the CAA portion of the schedule in Williamsburg. Jenna Cinalli scored the game-winner off an assist from Rebecca Wagner in the 31st minute.

SCOUTING VERMONT

Vermont will battle the Tribe in a neutral site contest at Harvard on Sunday, Sept. 28. The Catamounts enter the weekend at 4-4 on the season, following a 4-3 overtime win at Dartmouth on Wednesday, Sept. 24. Vermont and W&M have one common opponent in No. 8 Virginia. The Catamounts fell at UVA, 7-2, while the Tribe dropped a 5-0 decision to the Cavaliers. Vermont's most impressive win of the season came over current No. 16 Ohio State, 3-2, on Sept. 13.

In its most recent win over Dartmouth, Vermont jumped out to an early 2-0 advantage in the opening 18 minutes of the match. Dartmouth rallied to take the lead with three straight goals, before Vermont sent the game to overtime with a goal in the 67th minute. Maegan Luce gave the Catamounts the win with a goal 2:11 into the first overtime period.

Luce and Megan Maynard are tied for the team lead in points with nine each. Maynard and Lauren Burke top the Catamounts with four goals apiece while Luce has chipped in three goals and three assists. Maynard scored two of her tallies in the upset win over Ohio State, while Burke added the game-winner against the Buckeyes. Jen Angers leads the team in assists with four on the season. Despite their .500 record, the Catamounts have been outscored 23-14 on the year. Kristen Heavens has played every minute in goal for Vermont. She has a GAA of 2.84 to go along with 42 saves and a save percentage of 64.6.

The meeting will be only the second between the Tribe and Catamounts. W&M tallied a 6-0 win over Vermont to open the 2003 season in Williamsburg.

CAA OPENERS

The Tribe will open the CAA portion of the 2008 schedule when it travels to Northeastern on Friday. W&M is 12-5 all-time in CAA openers. The Tribe has won its last four CAA openers dating back to the 2003 season. Last season, the College opened the CAA slate with a 1-0 win over Northeastern in Williamsburg.

EXTRA TIME

In each of its last three matches, the Tribe has gone to overtime. The three straight overtime affairs marks only the second time since 1973 and the first time since the 2002 campaign that the Tribe has played three OT games in a row. The three-game overtime stretch is the seventh occasion since 1973 that W&M has played consecutive OT games. After tallying a 3-2 overtime win over Penn on Sept. 13, the College has dropped back-to-back OT decisions to St. Joseph's (3-2 on Sept. 14) and Richmond (4-3 on Sept. 21). During the 2002 season, the Tribe also went 1-2 in the three-straight overtime game stretch, tallying a 1-0 win over Boston University on Sept. 7, before falling at Northeastern, 1-0, on Sept. 8 and then-No. 9 Virginia, 2-1, on Sept. 13. In fact, the Tribe played four overtime games in the first five contests of the 2002 season.

SAVAIDES NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Redshirt freshman forward Mikala Savaides was named the Colonial Athletic Association Field Hockey Rookie of the Week on Sept. 22. Savaides scored her first collegiate goal in the Tribe's heartbreaking 4-3 overtime loss to Richmond on Sept. 21.

Savaides, who has started all seven matches at the forward position for the Tribe, helped W&M overcome a two-goal second-half deficit and sent the match with Richmond to overtime with her goal. The Spiders took a 2-

1 lead to half-time and scored three minutes out of the break, extending its advantage to 3-1, before W&M rallied to force overtime. With the Tribe trailing 3-2 and just over four minutes remaining, Savaides punched a shot turned pass from senior Lauren Giles into the left side boards to knot the match and force overtime.

It marks the first time this season a W&M player has been honored by the CAA and the first career accolade for Savaides. Its is the third time a W&M players has been named the league rookie of the week and the first since current sophomore Rebecca Wagner accomplished the feat on Aug. 27, 2007.

CAREER FIRSTS

Over the last two games, a trio of W&M players has registered their first career collegiate goals. Both sophomore Erica Eng and freshman Leah Zamesnik tallied the first goals of their collegiate careers in the College's overtime setback to St. Joseph's. Eng knotted the game for the Tribe in the 44th minute of play by punching in a pass from fellow classmate Rebecca Wagner, while Zamesnik scored on a breakaway, reversing a shot to the far post in the 46th minute to give the Tribe a 2-1 lead. In the college's most recent game, redshirt freshman Mikala Savaides tallied her first collegiate goal to tied the game against Richmond at three with four minutes remaining.

DREW WITH A HELPING HAND

Junior co-captain Wesley Drew tallied an assist in each of the Tribe's last three contests versus Penn, St. Joseph's and Richmond. In the Tribe's thrilling overtime win over Penn, Drew found sophomore Jenna Cinalli on the back post for the game-winner. It was the third game-winning assist of Drew's W&M career. She also assisted on the Tribe's second goal against St. Joseph's, setting freshman Leah Zamesnik up on a breakaway with a nice pass from the right side of the field. Drew found senior Lauren Giles for a goal in the second half against Richmond as the Tribe eliminated a two-goal deficit to force overtime. Drew currently ranks ninth in the CAA in assists and assists per game.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST

After struggling to find the back of the cage to open the season, the W&M offense has started to come around in recent weeks. After tallying only one goal and being shutout three times in the opening four games of the season, the Tribe has begun to score goals, averaging 2.7 per contest over the last three affairs. The Green and Gold broke out of its scoring slump in a 3-2 overtime win over Penn on Sept. 13. Through the first four games of the season, W&M had a total of one goal on 23 shots, including 11 on goal. Over the last three, the College is averaging 2.7 goals per game on 17.3 shots, including 10.7 on goal. W&M has also increased its production, generating an averaged of eight penalty corners per game over the last three contests. By contrast, the College averaged only 3.5 per game in the opening four games of the season.
