

Richmond April 10th 1808

Sir

In a letter received from Mr. John Hewskell of Winchester, who was entrusted with the arms for your Regiment upwards of twelve months ago, he states that they were sent as far as Red Stone old fort more than four months past, but that the Waggon breaking down there, a merchant by the name of Clarke was engaged to take them down by water - your late letter, however, proves that this ~~had~~ not then been done - The Executive consider Mr. Hewskell responsible for any damage the arms may have sustained - and I have therefore to request that you will be particular in stating, in the receipt which you may give for these arms, the order in which they may be at the time of receiving them -
