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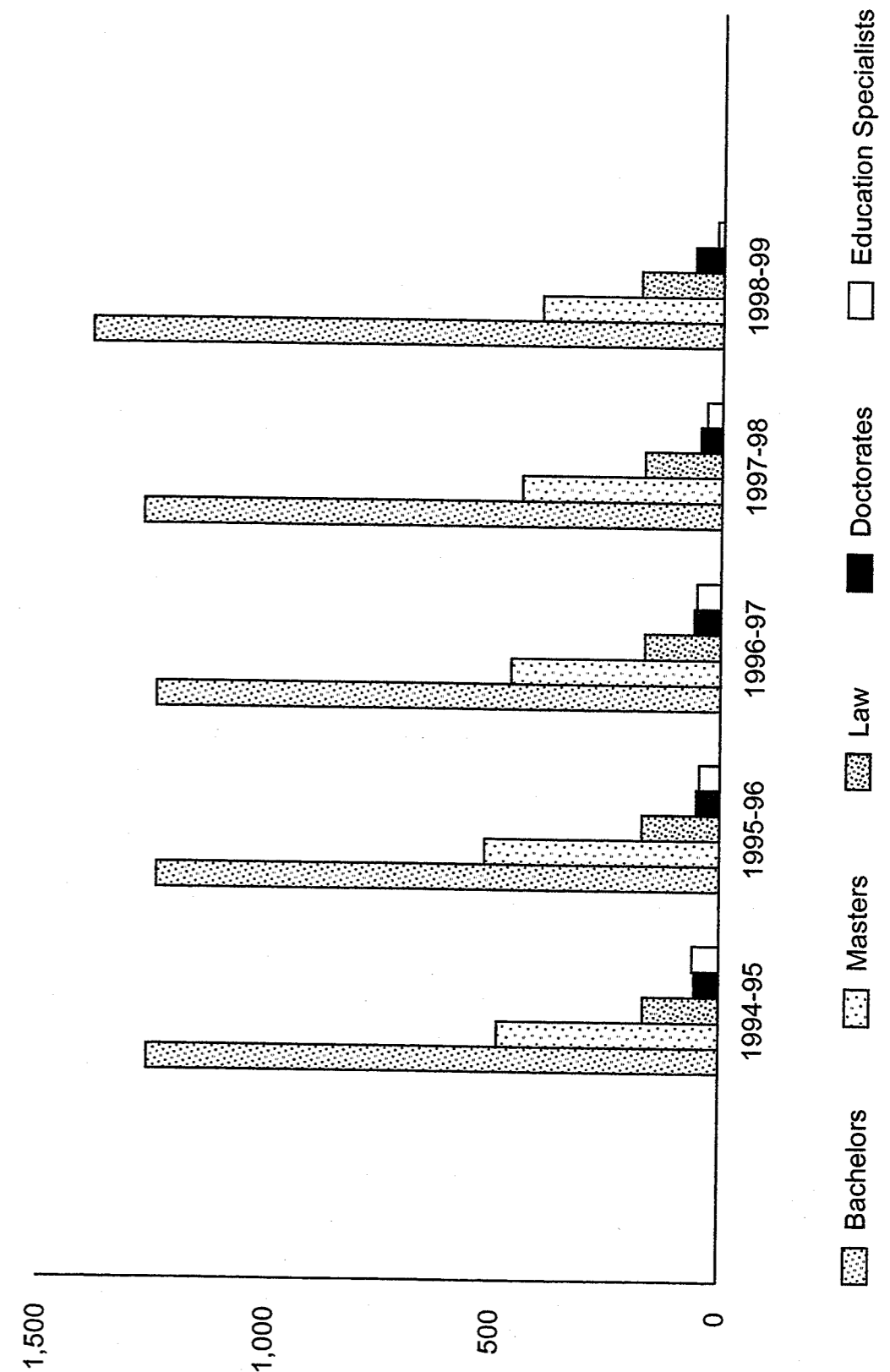

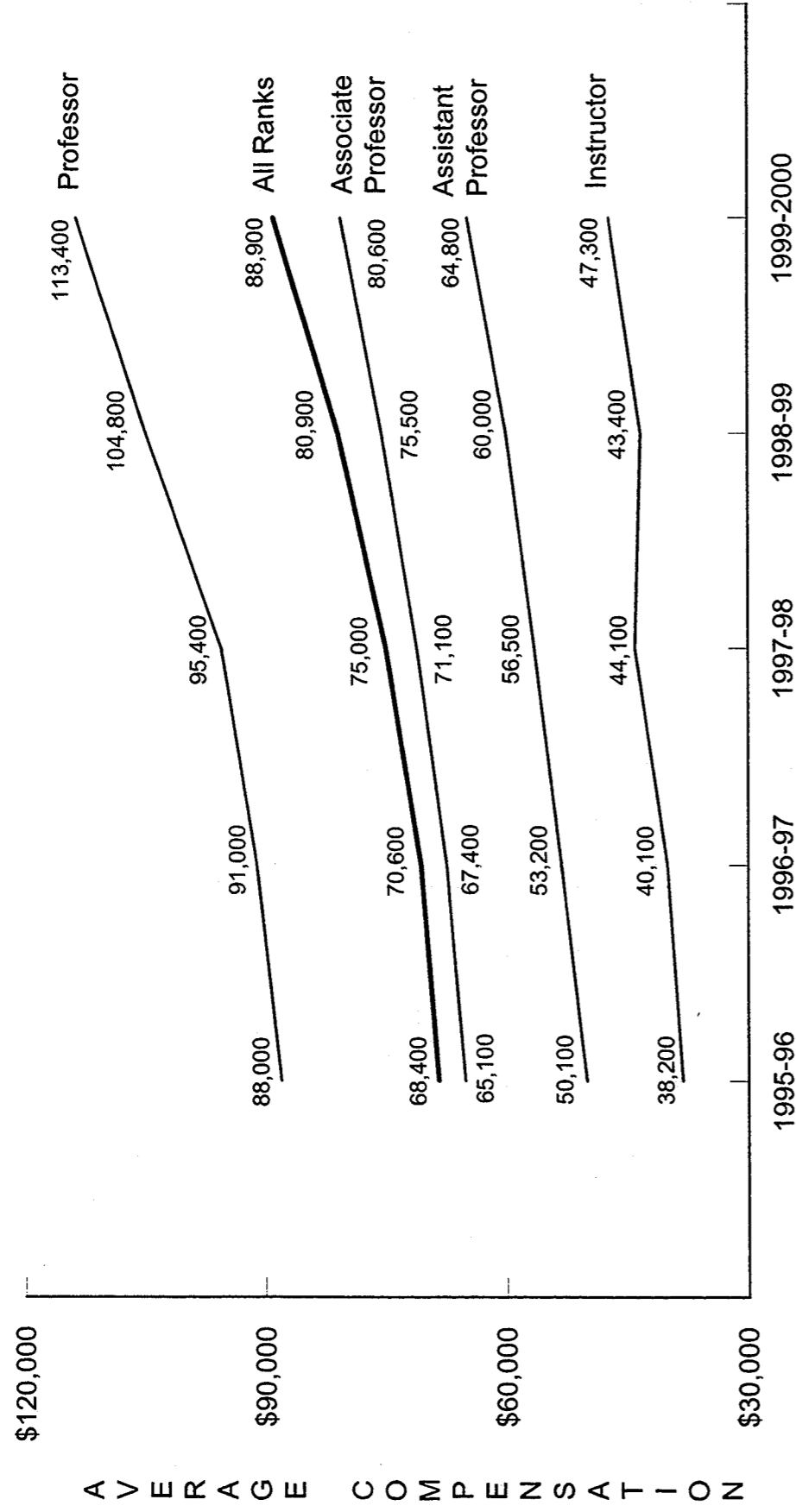
**Table 55: Average Salary of Full-Time Instructional and Research Faculty by Rank 1995-96 through 1999-2000**
