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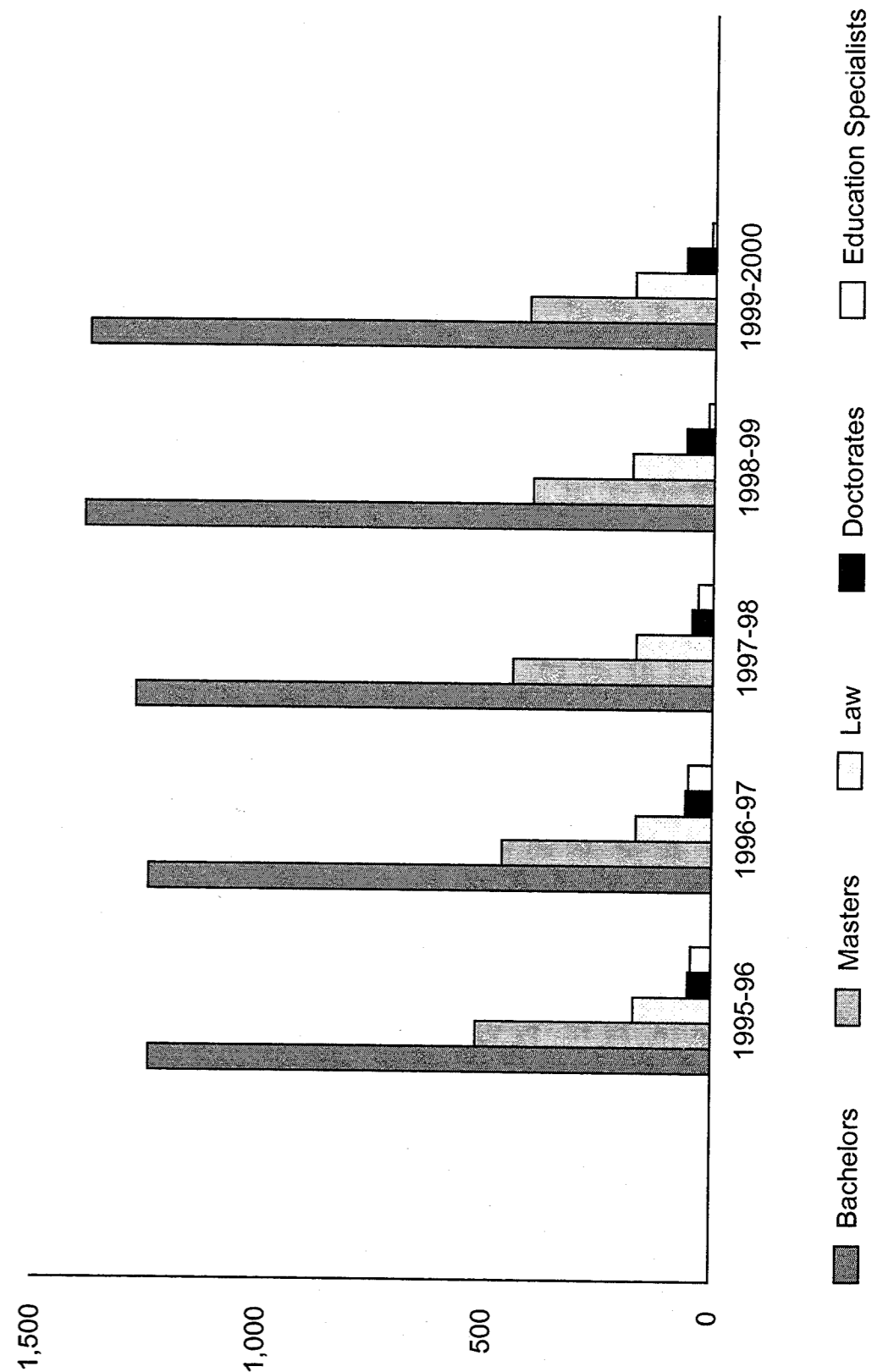

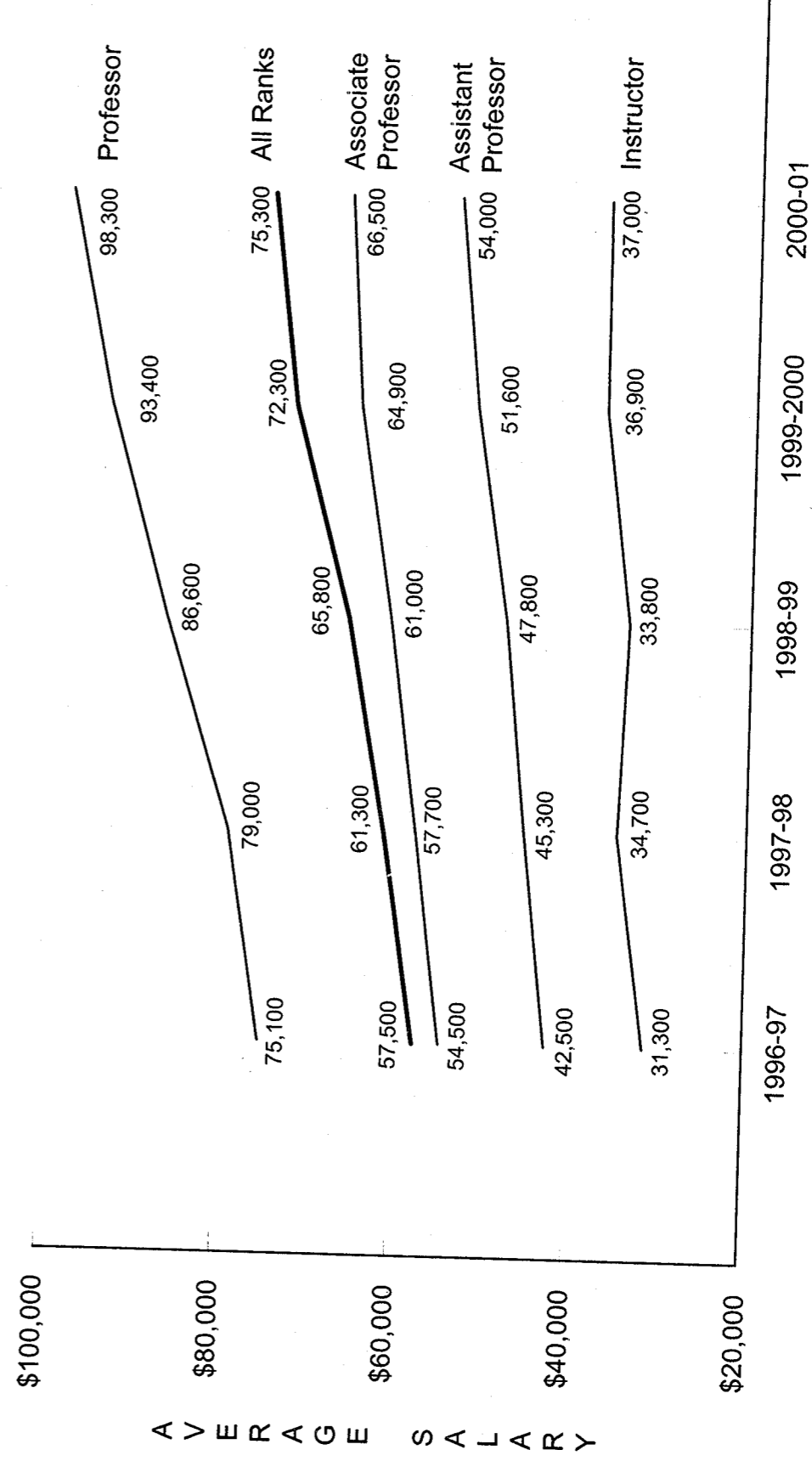

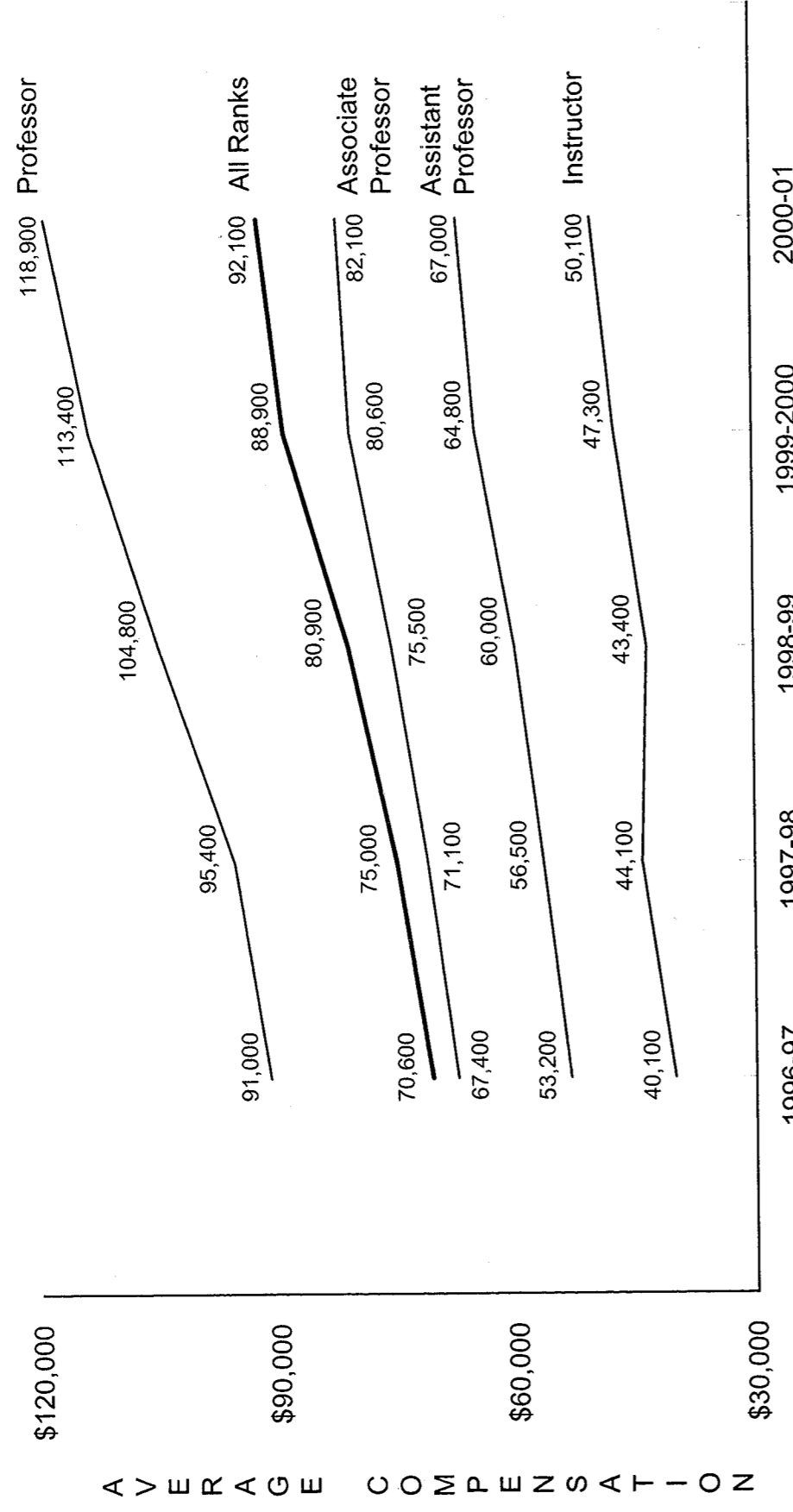
Table 55: Average Salary of Full-Time Instructional and Research Faculty by Rank 1996-97 through 2000-01
