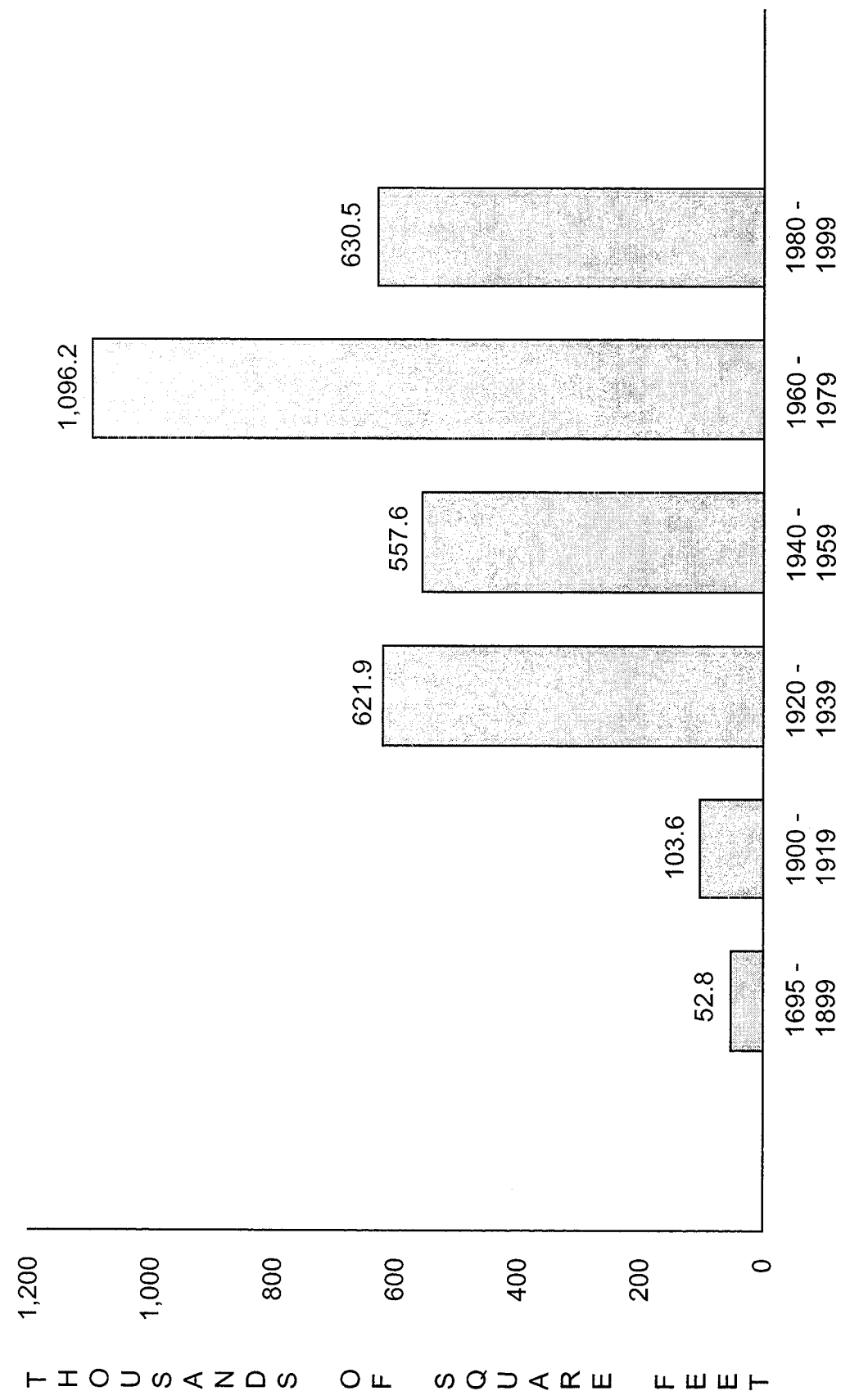

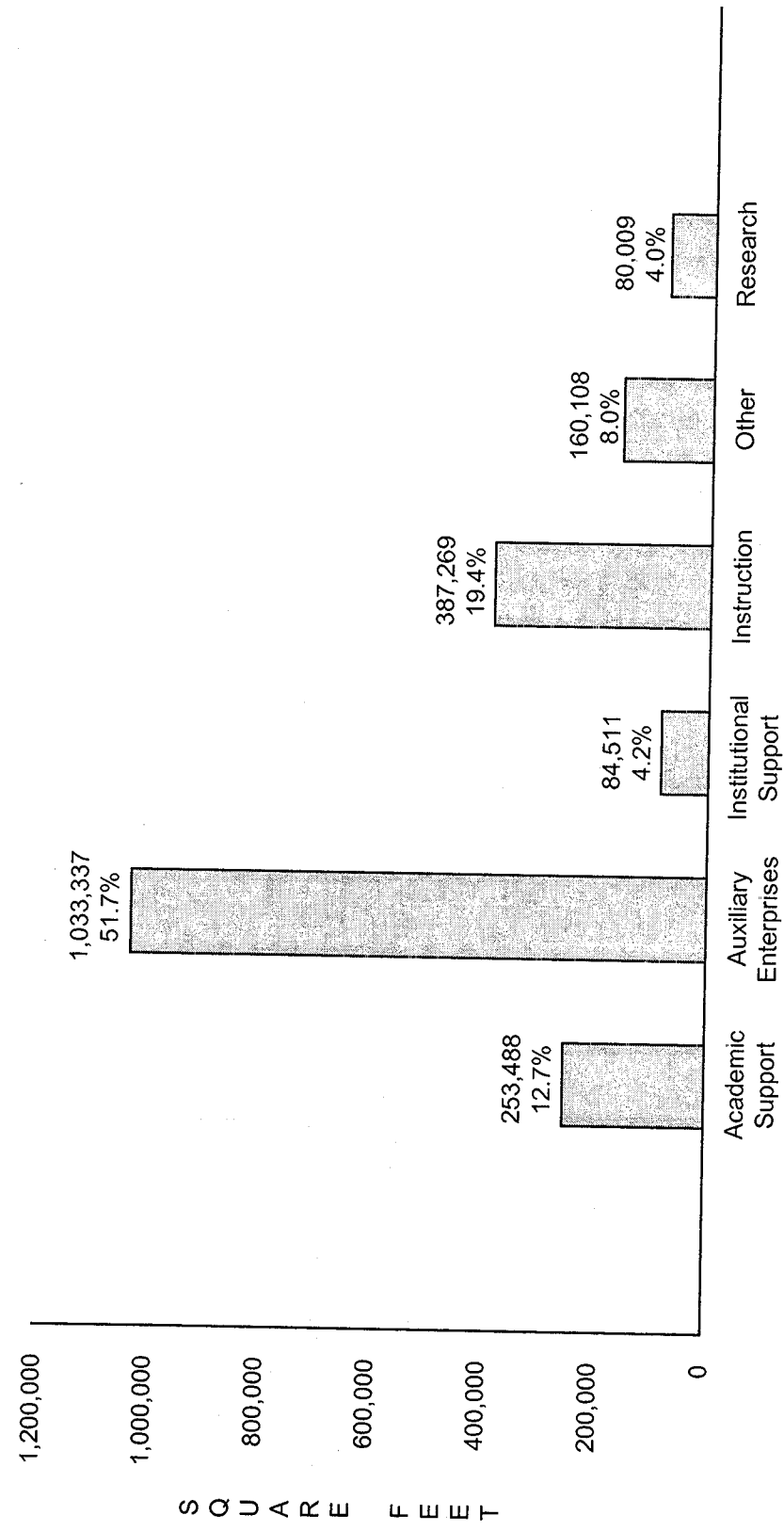
**Table 69: Gross Square Footage of Facilities by Completion Period**

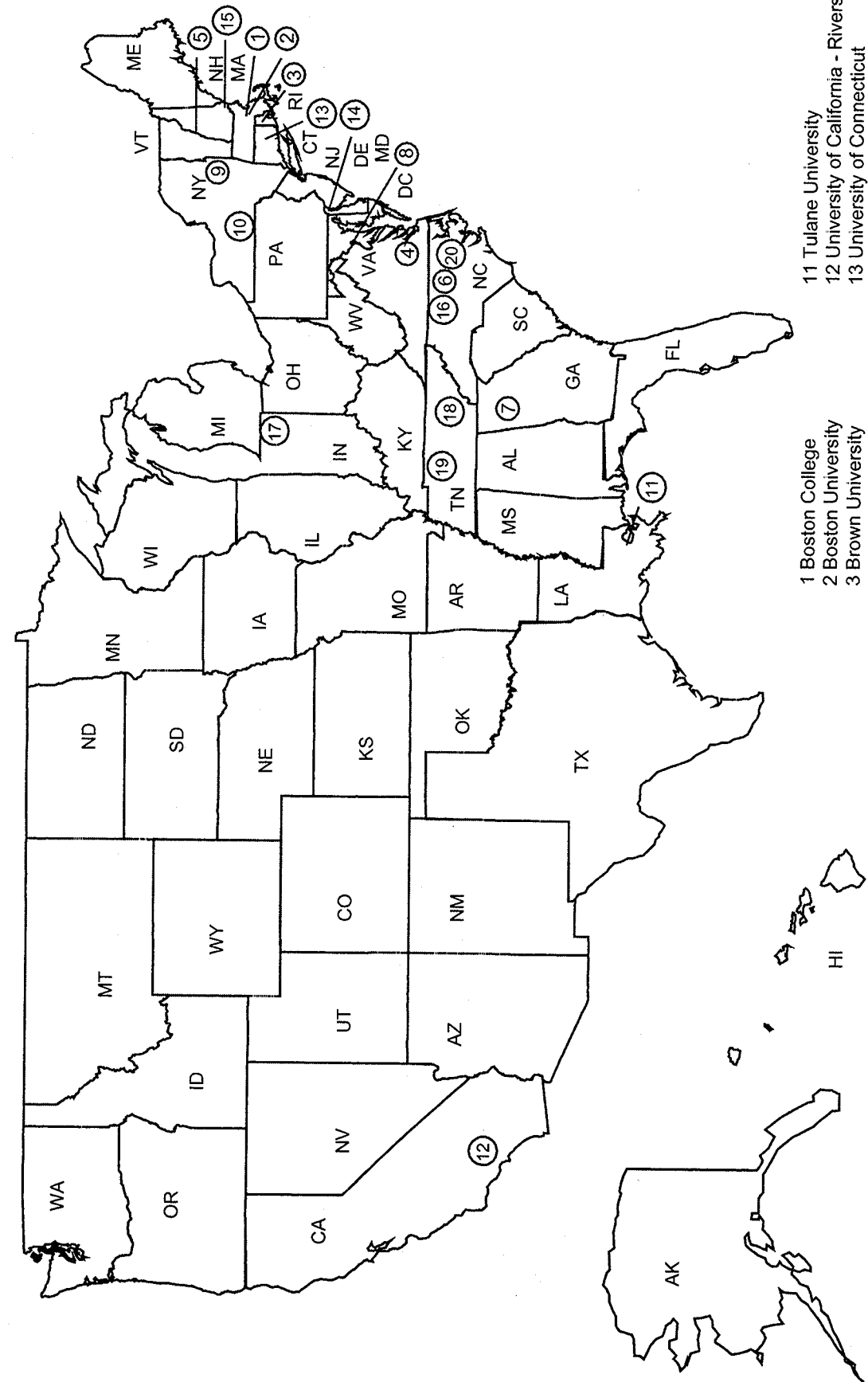
