FTE ENROLLMENT REPORTING

FTE Student and Faculty Formulas

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) STUDENT - A number derived by dividing the actual number of credit hours for which a student is registered by the normal course load for that classification of student. The normal loads for this procedure are:

- 15 semester credit hours = 1 FTE undergraduate student
- 15 semester credit hours = 1 FTE first professional student
- 12 semester credit hours = 1 FTE graduate student.

These calculations are used for either fall or spring semester. For regular session (fall and spring semesters combined) or for summer session, the semester credit hours are doubled, to 30, 30 and 24.

EXAMPLE: An undergraduate registered for 12 semester, or 24 regular session, credit hours would equal .80 of an FTE student, while an undergraduate student enrolled for 18 semester, or 36 regular session, credit hours would equal 1.2 FTE students.

22 lower division FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in non-specialized disciplines
16 lower division FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in specialized disciplines

14 upper division FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in non-specialized disciplines
11 upper division FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in specialized disciplines

20 1st professional FTE students = 1 FTE faculty

10 1st graduate FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in non-specialized disciplines
7 1st graduate FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in specialized disciplines

8 advanced graduate FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in non-specialized disciplines
7 advanced graduate FTE students = 1 FTE faculty in specialized disciplines

330 lower division, non-specialized disciplines	(22 X 15 = 330)
240 lower division, specialized disciplines	(16 X 15 = 240)
210 upper division, non-specialized disciplines	(14 X 15 = 210)
165 upper division, specialized disciplines	(11 X 15 = 165)
300 first professional	(20 X 15 = 300)
120 1st graduate, non-specialized disciplines	(10 X 12 = 120)
84 1st graduate, specialized disciplines	(7 X 12 = 84)
96 advanced graduate, non-specialized disciplines	(8 X 12 = 96)
84 advanced graduate, specialized disciplines	(7 X 12 = 84)

NOTE: Specialized disciplines are determined by the state for use in budget formulas. They identify disciplines that require individualized instruction and are thereby allocated a more favorable student/teacher ratio. Specialized disciplines at William and Mary are Fine Arts, Music, Modern Languages, Classical Studies and the Biological and Physical sciences.

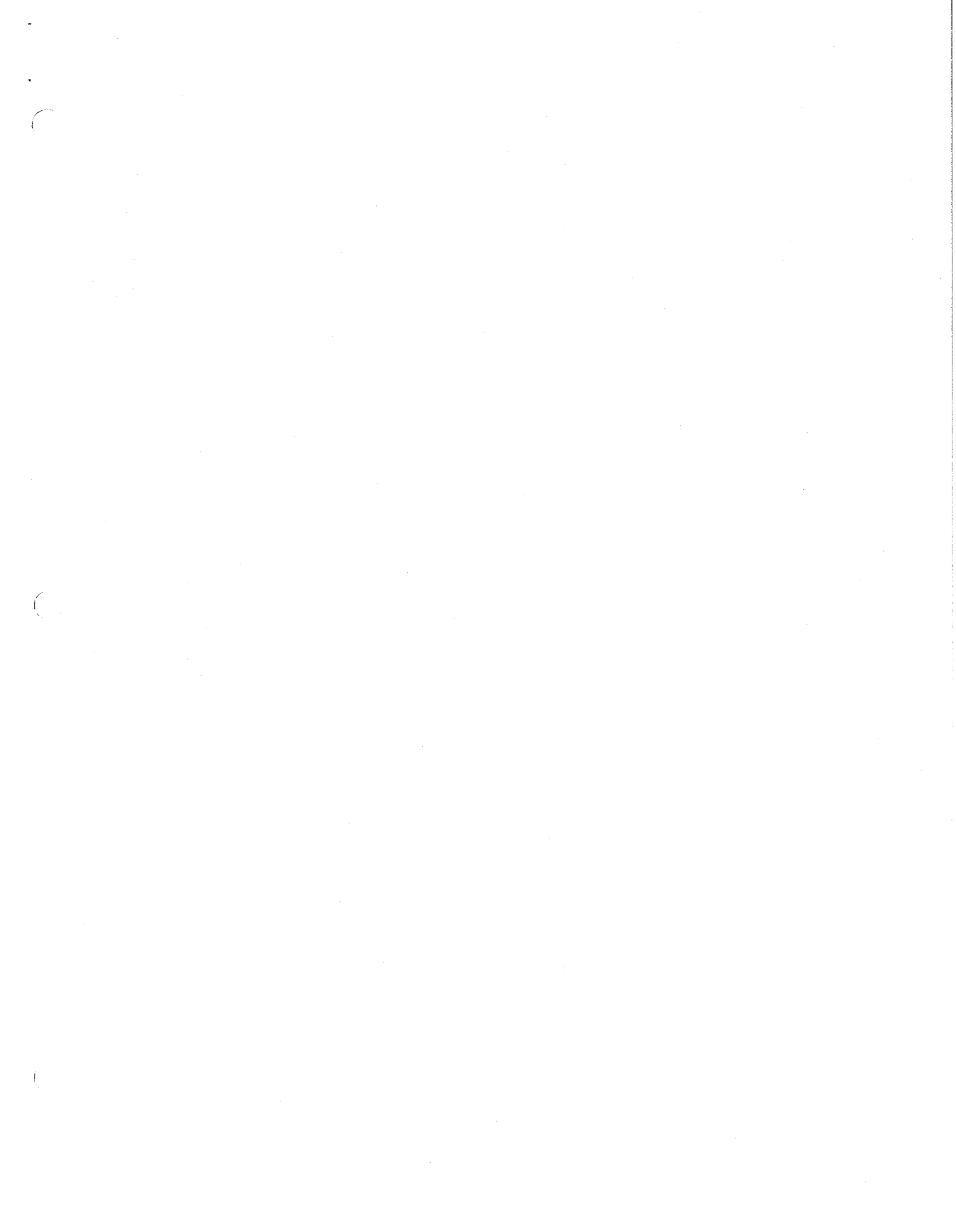
