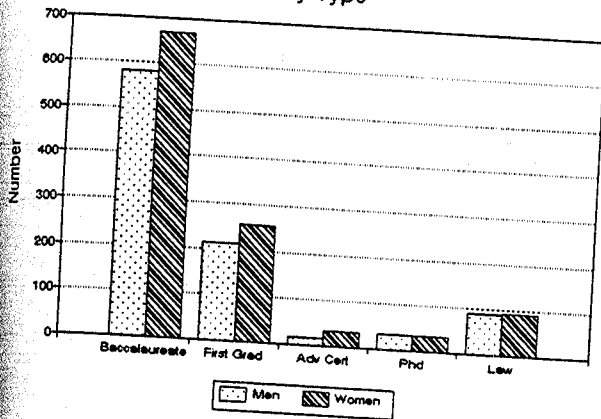

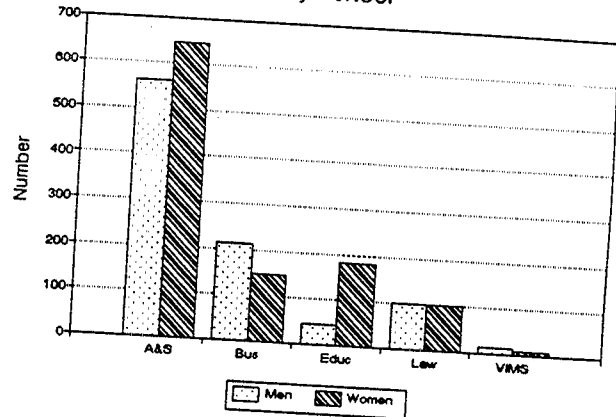

Degrees Conferred By Type

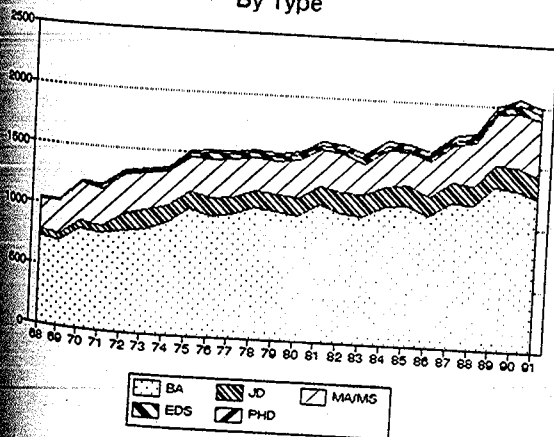


Degrees Conferred By School

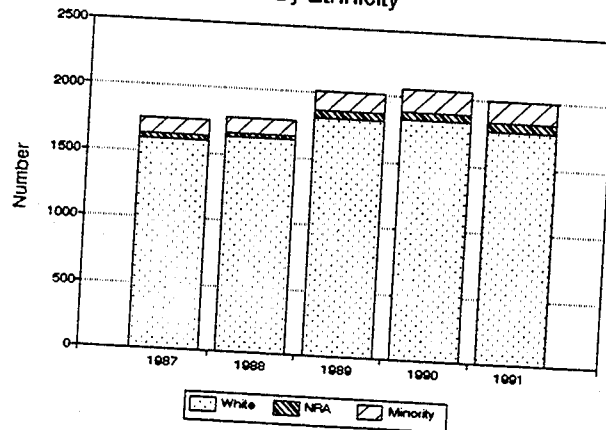

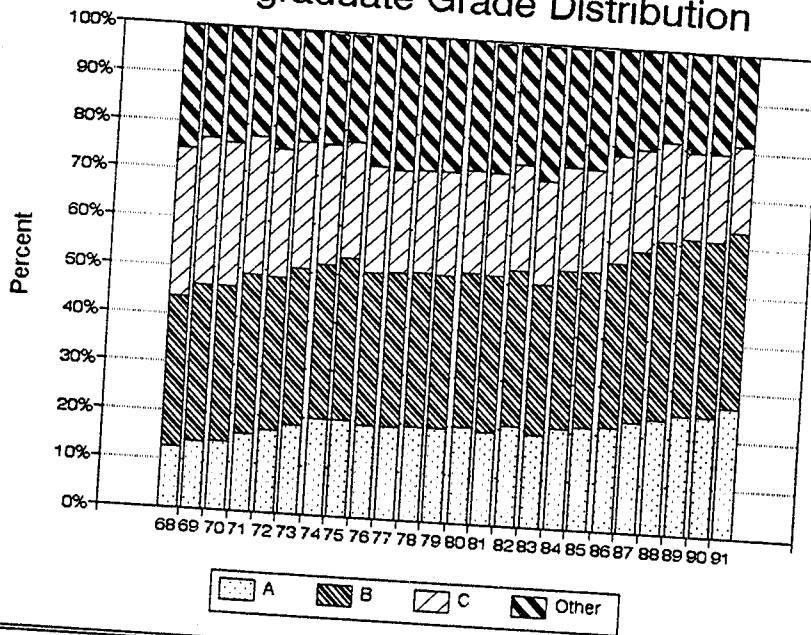

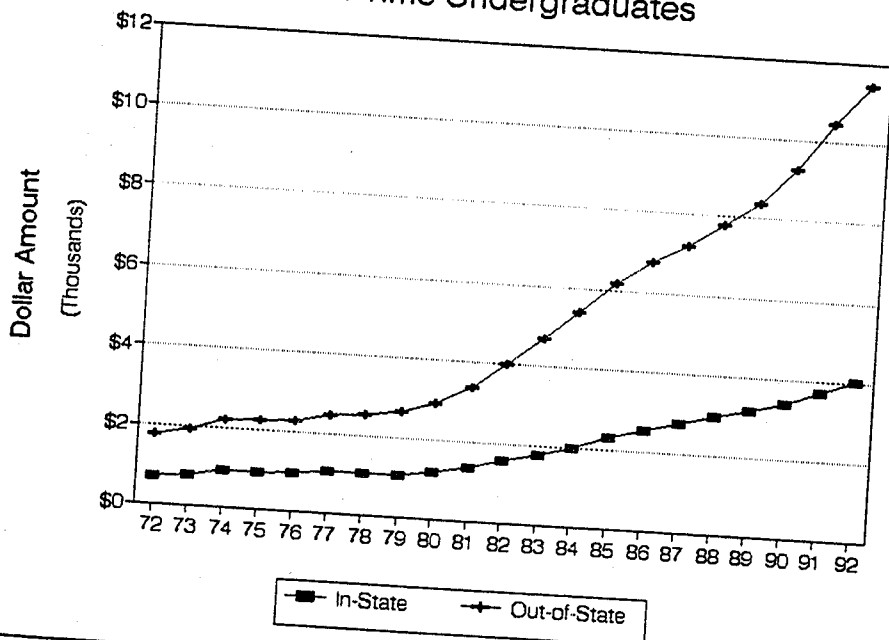

Terms and Definitions

(from SCHEV Reporting Guidelines)

- Accepted** - Formally offered admission for the reporting semester.
- Academic Year** - Summer, Fall and Spring semesters (ex. Summer 1990, Fall 1990, Spring 1991).
- Advanced Graduate Student** - A student enrolled in an advanced certificate or doctoral level program who has completed at least 30 semester credit hours of graduate level work. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.
- Annual FTE** - See FTE. For reporting purposes, SCHEV breaks down Annual FTE into three categories: Regular Session On Campus, Summer On Campus, and Annual Off Campus.
- Applicant** - Completed all requirements for application for admission. An individual who does not submit all of the necessary information required for admission is not considered an applicant.
- Census Date** - The date when the number of students enrolled in each class and section is counted. For semester terms, the census date shall be no sooner than the end of the 14th calendar day from the beginning of the semester.
- CIP Code** - (Classification of Instructional Program) Six digit code that classifies instructional program.
- Course Level** - The academic level of a course offered.
- Credit Hour** - A unit of measure that represent one hour of instruction that can be applied to the total number of hours needed for completing the requirements of a degree or other formal award.
- Degree** - An award conferred by a postsecondary educational institution as official recognition for the successful completion of a program of studies.
- Enrolled** - Registered for more than zero credit hours on the census date for a semester.
- First Professional Student** - A student enrolled in a program such as dentistry, medicine, veterinary medicine, theology or law. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.
- First Time Enrolled** - Enrolled in the institution for the first-time for the reporting semester.
- First Time Freshmen** - An entering freshman, who has never attended any college. Include for the fall term students enrolled who are attending for the first time or who attended for the first time in the prior summer term. Include also those students who entered with advanced standing due to college credits earned before graduation from a secondary institution.
- First Time Graduate Student** - A student who is enrolled at the graduate level for the first time. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.
- Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Student** - A statistic derived from the student credit hour productivity of an institution. The number of FTE students in the fall and spring terms are obtained by dividing the total number of undergraduate, first professional and graduate credit hours by 15, 15 and 12 respectively. The

number of FTE students in summer on campus, annual off campus, and regular session is obtained by dividing the total number of undergraduate, first professional and graduate credit hours by 30, 30 and 24.

Full-Time Student - an undergraduate or first professional enrolled for twelve or more credit hours in a semester; or a graduate student enrolled for nine or more credit hours in a semester.

Graduate First Student - A student enrolled in a masters degree program or a student enrolled in an advanced certificate or doctoral level program who has earned fewer than 30 semester credit hours of graduate level work. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.

Headcount Student - A student enrolled for one or more semester credit hours at census time. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.

Lower Level Student - A student usually classified as freshmen or sophomore. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.

Non-Resident Alien - A person who is not a citizen or national of the US and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Off Campus Student - A student enrolled for more than zero credit hours of off campus instruction and who is not enrolled in any credit hours on campus.

On Campus Student - A student enrolled for more than zero credit hours of on-campus instruction.

Part-Time Student - An undergraduate or first professional student enrolled for fewer than twelve credit hours in a semester; or a graduate student enrolled for less than nine credit hours in a semester.

Regular Session - Fall and Spring On campus semesters.

Student Level - The academic level of a student, institutionally determined, and typically based on the number of credit hours a student has completed.

Unclassified Student - A student enrolled for course work, but not in a program leading to a degree. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.

Upper Level Student - A student usually classified as junior or senior. Excluded are students whose entire semester credit hours are audits or tuition waived.

Census Dates

As set by SCHEV policy, there are two official census dates for Fall and Spring semesters and one census date for Summer semester.

For Fall and Spring, the first census date (which usually occurs two weeks after classes begin) is used for headcount reporting and is referred to as the Standard Census date. The second census date in the Fall and Spring semesters (referred to as the Standard Plus or Interim Census date) occurs at the end of the semester and is used for official FTE enrollment figures.

The Summer semester census date, referred to as the Standard, reports official headcount and FTE figures, and occurs at the start of the second session of Summer semester.
