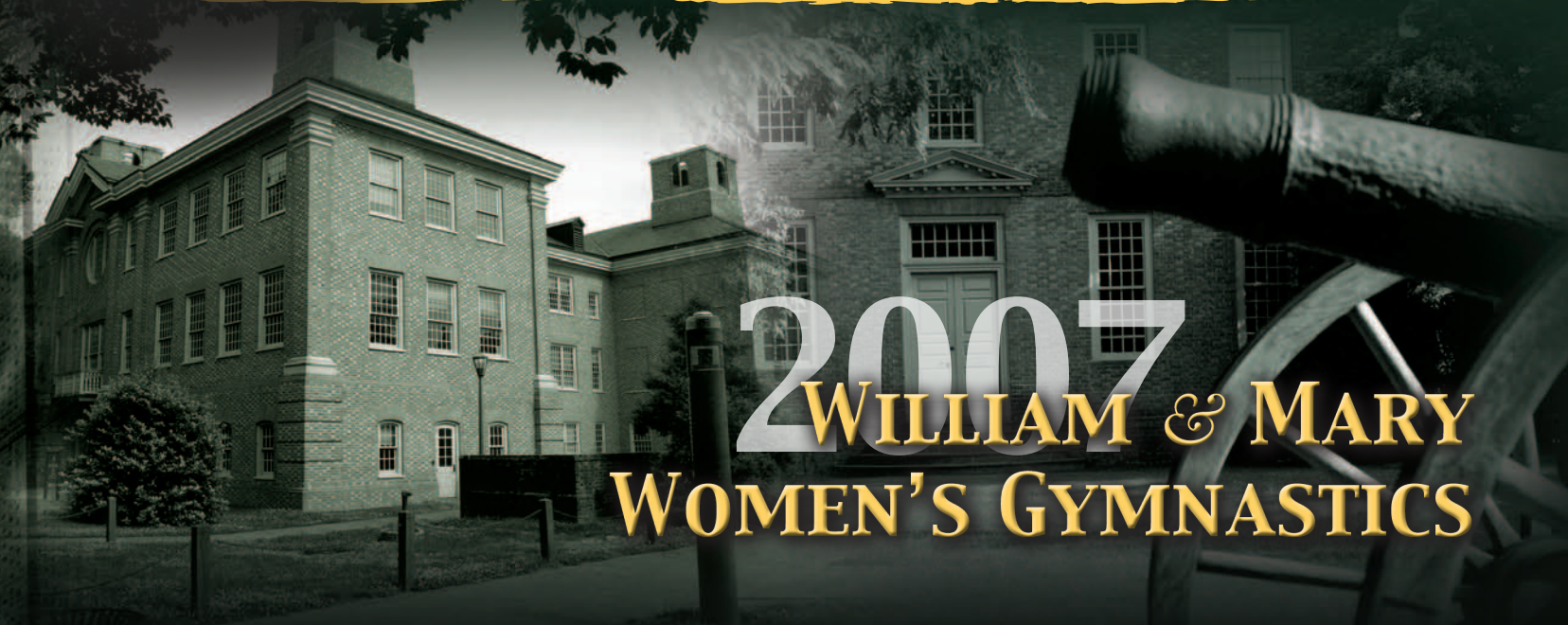

The first honorary degree from the College, a Master of Arts, was conferred upon Benjamin Franklin on April 2, 1756.

William & Mary

Four Presidents of the United States benefited from educational programs offered by the College: George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler.

Chartered in 1693, the College was founded nearly four decades before Georgia, the last of the original 13 American colonies, was chartered by King George II in 1732.

Facts About "The College"

- W&M was founded in 1693 and is the second-oldest educational institution in the United States.
- W&M was the highest ranked small public university in the country according to U.S. News and World Report.
- W&M ranked 16th in graduation rates for national universities.
- W&M was given the highest rating of academics, five stars, by the Fiske Guide to Colleges.
- W&M has a student/faculty ratio of 12/1.
- More W&M graduates go on to earn doctorates than any other university in Virginia.
- W&M students founded Phi Beta Kappa, the premier academic honor society in American, in 1776.
- In the inaugural NCAA Academic Progress Report, W&M boasted the fourth-best APR score (992) among 328 active and provisional institutions, and W&M leads all programs that offer performance-based grants and financial aid to scholar-athletes.

When the capitol of Virginia was moved from Jamestown to Williamsburg in 1699, the Wren Building served as temporary headquarters of the colonial government from 1700 until 1704.

The Sunken Gardens' design was based on the gardens behind Chelsea Hospital in London, England. During the Revolutionary War, Patrick Henry selected the site as a place for the encampment of militia destined to join Washington's Continental Army in the North and later served as a bivouac area for many soldiers preparing to fight the British at Yorktown.

The "F.H.C." society was formed at the College on November 11, 1750. This was the first student secret society in America and the forerunner of the American fraternity system.

The Crim Dell was a gift from the class of 1964 to preserve the natural beauty of the area and is a memorial to John W.H. Crim, a nationally known attorney who was a benefactor to the College of William and Mary.

Constructed between 1695 and 1699, the Wren Building is the oldest academic building in the United States. The building was originally designed to be the whole college, including a dining hall, dorm rooms and classrooms.

Along with four team titles, the Tribe program has produced 15 individual conference champions since 1994. With Brittany Gibbs' ECAC floor title in 2006, W&M has now had at least one individual conference champion for nine consecutive years.

HONORS

Head Coach Mary Lewis was named ECAC Coach of the Year for the second time in 2006, one of numerous honors the Tribe program added to a impressive list of accomplishments last season. Six Tribe gymnasts achieved USAG All-America status and Brittany Gibbs and Jess Randall were USAG Co-National Champions on floor. Additionally, nine different gymnasts earned All-ECAC honors in 2006, including Gibbs, who claimed her second career ECAC title (floor).

ACADEMICS

Complimenting the Tribe's list of athletic accomplishments are the program's impressive scholastic credentials, demonstrating the program's commitment to the College's standard of academic excellence. Last season, Christina Padilla became the fourth Tribe gymnast to receive an ECAC Scholar Athlete of the Year award since 2002 and was one of seven from W&M on the ECAC All-Academic Team. Padilla was also a First-Team Academic All-District selection and one of three Tribe gymnasts named a NACGC National Scholar Athlete. Since 2000, 29 student-athletes from W&M have been recognized by the NACGC.



Under Lewis, 12 Tribe gymnasts have qualified for NCAA Southeast Regionals, including three in the last three years.

garnered nine different USAG All-America honors, including Gibbs and current senior Jess Randall, who shared the USAG individual national championships in the floor exercise.

Under Lewis' tutelage, three gymnasts in the last three seasons have competed in NCAA Regionals, including 2005 ECAC Rookie of the Year Tricia Long, who competed as individual all-arounder that same year, while Suzanne Chaves ('04) and Emma Cross ('05) competed in a NCAA Regional in 2004. Since taking over the program in 1995, Lewis has coached 12 gymnasts to NCAA appearances.

In 2005, Padilla captured the ECAC individual vault title, while six other Tribe gymnasts received all-conference recognition under Lewis' guidance.

In total, Lewis' gymnasts have claimed 15 individual ECAC titles, while Lewis has led the squad to four ECAC titles. Lewis earned her first ECAC Coach of the Year honor in 2003, after W&M captured its third consecutive league title.

In addition to success in the gym, Lewis has stressed academics as well. That is evident each year when the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches honors student-athletes for superb academic performances. Last season, three Tribe gymnasts earned NACGC national scholar-athlete awards, including Padilla who posted a team-best 4.00 GPA. Seven Tribe gymnasts have earned the honor over the last two seasons.

Lewis has been coaching collegiate gymnastics since 1991, when she was the head coach at Longwood College for the 1991-92 season. She joined the staff at James Madison University in 1992 and served as a graduate assistant until 1994, before taking over the program at the College.

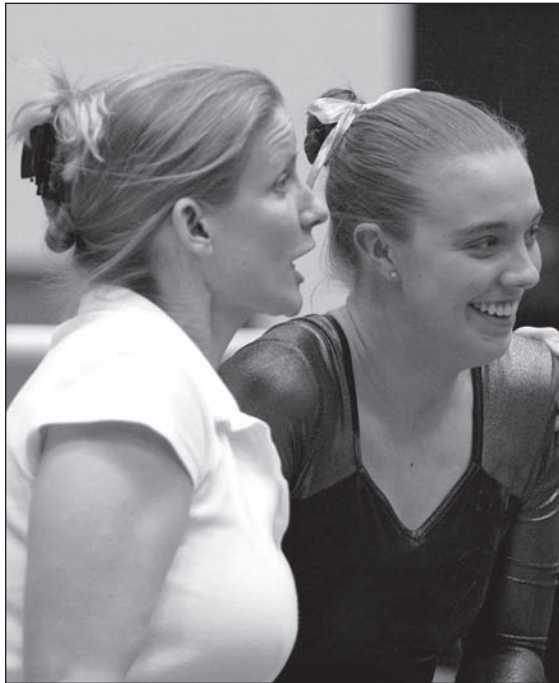
Lewis graduated Magna Cum Laude from CNU in 1985 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in governmental administration and public management. She completed her master's degree at JMU in kinesiology and adult fitness in May of 1994, graduating Summa Cum Laude.

Lewis spends her summers working at the Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pa., organizing weekly schedules for campers ranging in levels from beginner to elite. She resides in Newport News with her 11-year-old son, Zachary.

During Mary Lewis' 13-year tenure as the head women's gymnastics coach at William and Mary, the Tribe program has been distinguished for both its competitive success in the gym and academic excellence in the classroom. Distinctions have come in the form of four Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships and multiple national scholar-athlete citations year-in and year-out, validating the fact that, under Lewis' watch, Tribe gymnasts have epitomized the definition of student-athletes.

Last season, Lewis was recognized by her peers as the ECAC Coach of the Year for the second time, after the Tribe earned a second-place finish at the ECAC Championship, the team's best finish since winning three-straight league titles from 2001 to 2003. Lewis also saw Tribe gymnasts earn 11 all-conference awards, including an individual vault conference title by Brittany Gibbs. Additionally, current senior Christina Padilla was honored as the ECAC Scholar Athlete of the Year, while seven members of the team earned ECAC All-Academic Team honors.

W&M also made its first appearance in the USAG Collegiate Nationals in 2006, earning a fourth-place finish in the team competition. Under Lewis, Tribe gymnasts

KATIE MCFARLAND

Assistant Coach • First Season • Old Dominion, 2005

Katie McFarland is in her first season as an assistant coach at the College. McFarland brings a tremendous gymnastics background to the Tribe program, having competed both at the national and collegiate level while also holding an extensive coaching resume at the club level.

McFarland's main duties with the Tribe program include coaching both beam and floor and choreography. She will also serve as the lead recruiter and assist with fund-raising duties.

A former Senior International Elite U.S. National Team member, McFarland comes to W&M after most recently serving as the Level 9 and 10 women's team coach at the Gymstrada Gymnastics Club in Virginia Beach.

"I'm very excited about Katie joining the program," said head coach Mary Lewis. "Obviously, having been an international elite competitor, Katie brings an amazing technical background and will be a huge addition to the program."

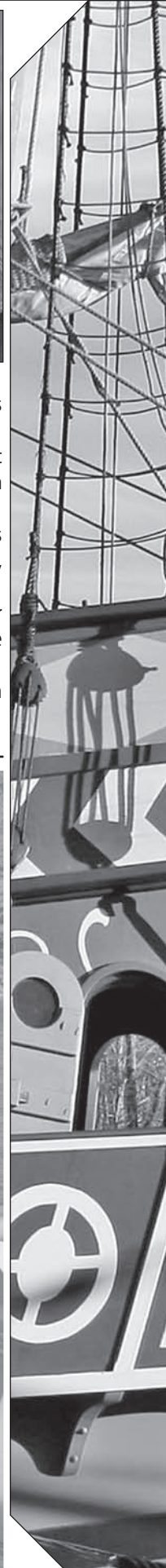
While at Gymstrada, McFarland was responsible for coaching all four events, including beam choreography and handled various administrative duties for meet entries and travel accommodations.

McFarland coached three Level 10 regional qualifiers and three Level 9 qualifiers in 2006 and guided the Gymstrada team to a third-place finish in the Cancun Classic in Mexico. Overall in three years at Gymstrada, McFarland coached four Level 10 regional qualifiers, over 20 Level 9 regional qualifiers, a Level 10 all-around state champion and six Level 9 Eastern National qualifiers, while guiding Gymstrada to the Level 9 state championship in 2004 and a runner-up finish in 2005.

Prior to her stint at Gymstrada, McFarland served as an interim coach for Levels 7 and 8 at Excalibur Gymnastics in Virginia Beach and was also the head women's coach at First Colonial High School in Virginia Beach, where she was responsible for all aspects of the program including choreography, apparel, home meet organization, fund-raising and eligibility reports.

As a competitor, McFarland was active on the national level from 1993 until joining the University of Florida's nationally-ranked program in 2000. McFarland's career highlights include the Senior National Floor Championship at the American Classic in 1997, U.S. National Championship qualifications from 1995 to 1998 and a stint on the Senior U.S. Women's National Team in 1998-99.

A native of Virginia Beach, McFarland graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Science in psychology and exercise science from Old Dominion University in 2005.



In 2006, the William and Mary women's gymnastics team turned in a number of notable achievements, including a second-place showing at the ECAC Championship and a fourth-place finish in the program's first trip to the USAG Collegiate Nationals. Individual accomplishments were also plentiful, as W&M boasted an individual conference champion, 11 different All-ECAC designations and six USAG Collegiate All-Americans.

But, despite what could easily be called an outstanding season, last year's success left the Tribe wanting more. At the top of the list is the program's first conference championship since 2003, but head coach Mary Lewis' squad also has its sights on a USAG title in the team's encore performance at the event. Lewis, who is entering her 13th season, knows, however, the keys to enhanced postseason success include a better start and a more consistent run to the finish.

"Our top goals for the season are to win the ECAC title and the USAG nationals, which I think are two very realistic goals," said Lewis, who received her second ECAC Coach of the Year award in 2006. "We have a very short early schedule, so it's very important to get off to a good start."

Despite the strong finish last season, it wasn't until almost mid-March that W&M truly found its stride, as the Tribe came together during a pivotal stretch of three-straight home meets. During the homestand, the Tribe defeated Bowling Green, scored a solid 190.950 against regional power North Carolina and notched a season-best 193.00, defeating rival James Madison and narrowly falling to eventual ECAC champion Towson (193.475) on March 15.

The Tigers were the only team to stand between W&M and the conference title at ECACs, again edging the Tribe for the crown. But, the College's second-place showing was its best since 2003, when the Tribe extended its streak of three consecutive ECAC Championships.

The 2006 season came to a close with the program's first appearance at the USAG Collegiate Nationals. W&M finished fourth overall and produced six individual USAG All-Americans, including co-national champions on floor in Brittany Gibbs and returning senior **Jess Randall**.

"Last year's performance at USAGs was encouraging in that it was our first trip to the event," Lewis said. "We didn't have a great preliminary meet, but we were still able to qualify for the finals. This year, I think it would be a disappointment if we weren't one of the top teams at the event."

Lewis is hopeful a good start and a better overall scoring average will lead to postseason triumph.

"We really didn't get off to a good start last year, based on our overall scores. I'm not necessarily looking for peak performances early in the year, but I expect the team to be much more consistent this season and show improvement from the start."

With increased expectations and optimism over the upcoming campaign, Lewis is still mindful of the significance that injuries and the health of her gymnasts can have on the overall outcome.

"Another one of our goals is to try and keep everyone healthy, as much as possible. We increased our strength training in the offseason, and I'm hopeful that will prevent a lot of the over-use type injuries. I think the team in general is much stronger this season."

So, fresh off a dedicated offseason workout regime, a stronger, experienced team, which was on the edge of a championship last year, is poised for the challenge ahead and ready to reach its ultimate postseason goals in 2007.

But, once again, the Tribe's customary slate of challenging opponents will stand in the way en route to the conference championship. As is the case annually under Lewis, W&M will face a stout mix of national and regional-level competition, as well traditional rivals from the ECAC.

"Overall, I think it's a very strong schedule. We'll see a lot of the same teams we normally see, like North Carolina, N.C. State and James Madison, and we're also going to face some top national-level competition like Nebraska and Missouri. When you go up against teams competing at NCAA Championships every year, I

think it really helps our girls raise their level of performance and step things up."

Leading the way for the unit in 2007 will be a strong corps of veteran performers, but the team will also feature a large contingent of young gymnasts ready to make an impact for the Tribe. Randall and fellow senior **Christina Padilla** were named captains for the upcoming season. Between them, the duo has one individual conference championship (Padilla, Vault 2005),

one USAG national championship (Randall, Floor 2006), five All-ECAC designations and four USAG All-America citations. The pair, along with the team's two other seniors Andrea Dochney and Janelle Greene, will again be counted on for scoring contributions, but Lewis knows the leadership of the captains and seniors will go a long way in the team's ability to reach its goals.

"I encourage and expect the senior class to lead this team," said Lewis. "Our two captains compliment each other very well, and they have the ability to push the girls in practice and get us where we want to be."

Lewis will welcome back seven all-conference gymnasts and five USAG Collegiate All-Americans, who will be joined by a talented four-member freshman class in 2007.

"I think it's going to be a good year, and I am excited about the potential we have. The team as a

whole is very tough and has a good work ethic."

The Senior Class

All four members of the 2007 senior class played a critical role in last season's success, as each earned both all-conference and USAG All-America honors. The group will once again be expected to perform at a high level, and Lewis will also count on the quartet to lead the team both in and out of the gym.

Padilla is perhaps the most decorated returning gymnast, both in and out of the gym, and will serve as a co-captain in 2007. A former ECAC vault champion and two-time all-conference performer, Padilla is also a three-time NACGC National Scholar Athlete, a three-time ECAC All-Academic Team selection and a reigning ECAC Scholar Athlete of the Year.

"Christina is such a good role model for our team, both in the classroom and in the gym, with what she has accomplished here," praised Lewis. "We're expecting the same solid scores and consistency she has shown in the past."

Padilla earned USAG Collegiate All-America recognition last season on both vault and bars, and she will again be one of the team's top competitors in each event.

Joining Padilla as a team captain in 2007 is Jess Randall, a talented competitor who is one of the team's top motivators in practice and a perfect compliment to her co-captain. Unfortunately, Randall underwent wrist surgery during preseason and will be limited to training beam and floor once she returns.

"Randall is the one who will get on you and let you know what she wants from you in the gym," said Lewis. "She has a very strong leadership role on this team, and we're also going to be counting on her for solid scores when she returns."

A two-time All-ECAC designee in the all-around, Randall was the 2006 USAG Collegiate Co-National Champion on floor last season (9.775), sharing the title with former teammate Brittany Gibbs. She also earned USAG All-America honors on beam and was a First-Team All-ECAC performer on bars last season. Randall held the sixth-highest all-around regional qualifying score (37.860) in the ECAC last season and had the team's top RQS on beam.

The third member of the senior class is **Andrea Dochney**, a proven veteran who will focus her training on beam this season. Dochney earned her first-career all-conference citation last season, taking second-team honors on beam, before ending the year with USAG Collegiate All-America honors in the event.

Dochney has been battling a shoulder injury that forced her to stop training bars, but the senior hopes to be healthy enough to make an impact in the beam lineup this season. She came on strong in the latter half of the 2006 season, winning an individual beam title in the win over Bowling Green and earning the ECAC Coaches Choice Award after scoring a 9.600 against North Carolina in the event.

Rounding out the senior class is **Janelle Greene**, who has continued to improve in each of her seasons with the Tribe. Greene took home her first all-conference designation last season, earning Second-Team All-ECAC honors on bars, and was also a USAG Collegiate All-American in the event after placing fourth in the individual finals.

Greene was one of the team's most consistent scorers on bars in the second half of the season, contributing marks to the team total in each of the last eight team competitions, including an impressive career-high 9.825 against JMU and Towson. She has trained hard in the offseason to upgrade her vault and will add depth to the line-up.

The Junior Class

The two members of the junior class, **Tricia Long** and **Stevie Waldman**, have each been among the team's most talented and consistent performers since the day they stepped on campus, and Lewis is looking for the duo to continue to shine with the Tribe.

"It's hard for me to believe Tricia and Stevie are already juniors, but at the same time it's remarkable they are just juniors based on what they have done in only two years," said Lewis. "The two are very confident and strong when performing, and I look for them to continue to improve."

Long, a former NCAA Regional qualifier and conference rookie of the year, was the team's only gymnast to compete in all four events in every competition last season and earned her second All-ECAC designation in the all-around. One of the team's most consistent performers the last two seasons, Long worked on implementing a high-level vault during the offseason will undoubtedly improve upon her all-around regional qualifying score (37.735) that ranked eighth in the ECAC in 2006.

Waldman was limited to competing on beam and bars in 2006, but her impact in the two events during the second-half of the season was immense. She earned First-Team All-ECAC and USAG Collegiate All-America honors on bars and placed first in the event in four different meets. In just her second competition last season on March 4th at Towson, Waldman matched the third-best bars score in school history with a career-high 9.875 and later notched a 9.850 against JMU and Towson. On beam, Waldman also earned USAG Collegiate All-America honors. With improved health in 2007, Waldman could make an impact return to the floor line-up and has the potential to be one of the top performers in the conference in any event.

The Sophomore Class

Health and injuries were major issues with the six gymnasts who entered the program as freshman in 2006, and while some were able to compete and contribute last season, Lewis is hopeful the group will have a bigger impact in 2007.

Becca Bacharach competed primarily on beam in limited action last season, but her hard work and training over the summer and during preseason practice could lead to an impact in any of the four events this year. Bacharach is a good tumbler on floor and has a nice presentation on beam.

Perhaps the biggest impression made from the group last year was that by **Monica Goldblatt**, who went on to earn Second-Team All-ECAC honors on bars. Goldblatt had an impressive list of season-high scores in three events, including bars (9.725), beam (9.725) and floor (9.750), but an illness during the offseason has limited her training. Depending on how her endurance and strength return, Goldblatt will likely make the biggest impact on bars and beam.

One of the hardest workers in the group, **Lauren Jackson** did not compete in any events last season due to injury, but after a dedicated training regime during the offseason she was ready to perform in 2007 until suffering an ankle injury during the Green and Gold exhibition in December. Lewis is hopeful Jackson will return mid-season and resume training on beam and possibly floor.

Sarah Jacobson turned in a solid rookie season in 2006, competing on floor

and vault in each of the team's meets last season. Though consistency was an issue at times, Jacobson showed tremendous potential in each event, recording season-high scores of 9.550 on vault and 9.500 on floor. However, a late season injury limited her offseason workouts, and Jacobson's contributions early this season will depend on how quickly her strength and endurance return. She has worked on upgrading her vault start value and will also add depth to the bars line-up.

Ashley Lugo continues to work back from an illness during her freshman season and has shown improvement through the preseason. Lugo has primarily trained vault and floor and could return to bars with increased strength. She competed several times last year on vault, scoring a season-high 9.400 at the team finals of the USAG Collegiate Nationals. Lugo's presentation and dancing ability stand out on floor, and the sophomore will once again provide depth to the vault line-up.

It has been a constant struggle with injuries for **Megan Vincent** before and since arriving at the College. Her training has been severely limited over the past two seasons and primarily focused on bars. Depending on her health, Vincent could see herself move into more of a peer coaching role during the season, as she already has strong leadership and motivational presence in the gym.

The Freshman Class

Lewis welcomes a talented four-member freshman class to the fold in 2007, a group she hopes will contribute right away.

"This is a good bunch. As a whole, I think the freshman class is going to have a tremendous impact on the team."

Stephanie Bevan is training in all four events and working towards earning a spot in both the beam and floor line-ups. She has a strong flight series on beam and is a good tumbler on floor. Bevan, a two-time Level 10 state champion in New Jersey, also has a chance to add depth to the vault and bars line-ups.

Marissa Kovary is a Level 10 national competitor working back from an illness and has the potential to impact all four events down the road. Kovary will begin strength and conditioning training when her health improves, eventually working back into gymnastics.

Alison Medeiros is an all-arounder with tremendous potential to impact all four events as a rookie. A four-time Level 10 national qualifier, Medeiros has beautiful lines on beam and could make her presence in the line-up felt immediately. She has a 10.0 start value on vault and continues to show improvement on beam. Medeiros has tremendous presentation on floor and will continue to improve as endurance level builds.

Rounding out the freshman class is **Jennifer Stack**, a skilled rookie who had trained hard during the preseason before undergoing season-ending surgery. Stack has a very strong bars routine and should make an impact when she returns to form next season. A former Massachusetts state champion, Stack is also a confident performer on beam with a strong routine.

Athletic Success

A charter member of the CAA 1986, W&M has been the CAA's most successful program over the past two decades. The 2005-06 year was another banner season for the College, as it added three more conference titles. The Tribe has now captured 84 total CAA Championships since 1986, over 30 more than the closest rival.

Individually, women's tennis standout Megan Moulton-Levy earned All-America honors after advancing to the "Final Four" of the NCAA Singles Tournament.

Academic Excellence

The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student's academic responsibilities, as W&M ranked fourth, the highest of any scholarship-granting school and of any public university, in the nation among institutions with two or more Division I teams when the NCAA released its inaugural Academic Progress Rate scores in March of 2005.

This year, the NCAA specifically listed 18 W&M athletic squads as recipients of its public recognition award for 2005-06.

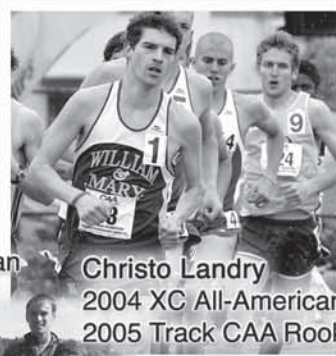
Since 1992, 36 Tribe athletes have been designated Academic All-Americans, including Keith Bechtol, who was a third team selection in the spring, and since 1996, 39 student-athletes have been members of Phi Beta Kappa.

In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its 21 sports, and not surprisingly, William and Mary has set the pace with 18.

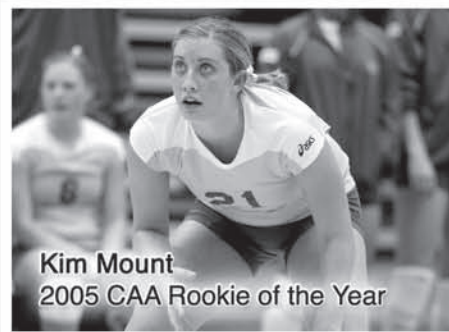

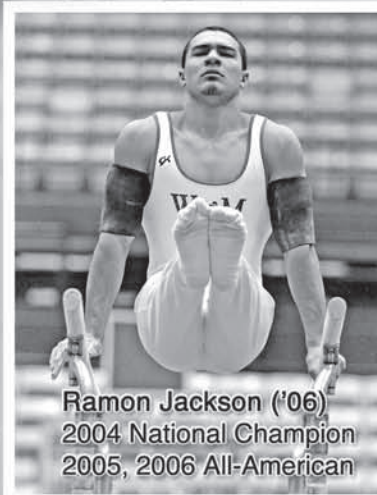

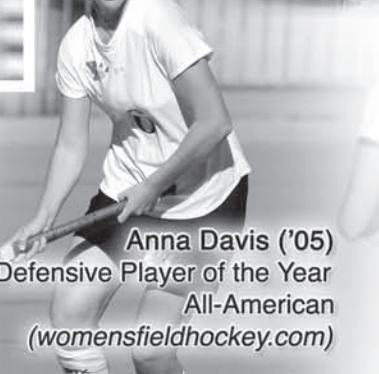

For more than 300 years, William and Mary has been a symbol of academic distinction in America. Now, in its fourth century, the College is prepared to educate the leaders of the 21st century.

The College of William and Mary was founded in 1693 by King William III and Queen Mary II of England. Four Presidents of the United States received their education at the College - George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler.

William and Mary was the first college to institute an honor code of conduct. The premier academic society, Phi Beta Kappa, was founded by William and Mary students in 1776. The Society of the Alumni, founded in 1842, is the sixth oldest alumni group in the nation. Now the College is designated as a "Public Ivy", and ranks sixth among all public universities (U.S. News and World Report).

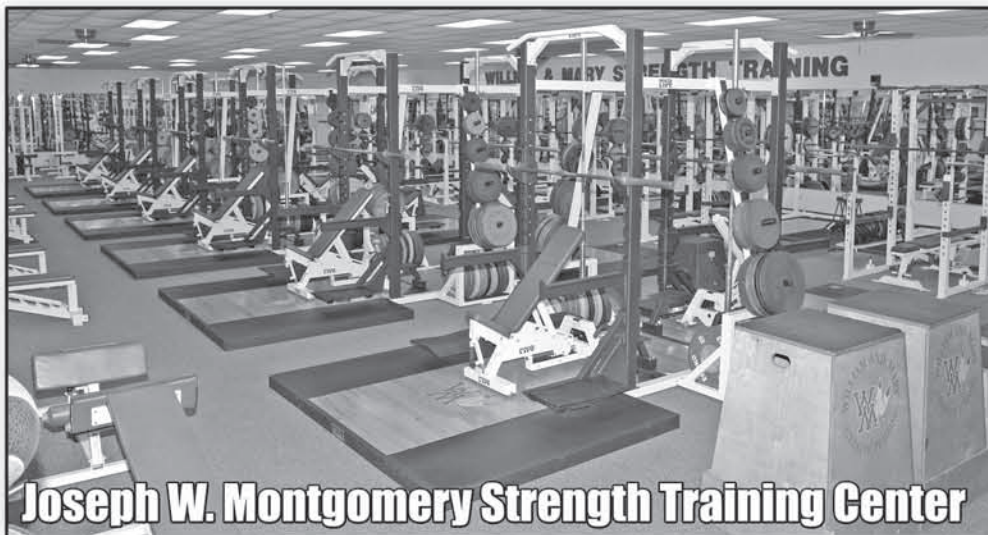

Sports Psychology

Deidre Connelly, Ph.D., is the College's full-time sports psychologist. All consultations are confidential and all student-athletes, teams or coaches are welcome regardless of the issues they wish to discuss. Consultation is available for sport psychology education, performance enhancement skills training, strategies for dealing with stress or injury, or for personal issues that may affect performance.

Compliance and Academic Support

As members of the Colonial Athletic Association and the NCAA, the College is committed to full compliance with all NCAA and conference regulations. The department has a full-time Director of Compliance, Pamela Mason, who is committed to assisting students, staff and coaches through education and monitoring of compliance issues.

All entering students are assigned to a faculty academic advisor by the director of Academic Advising. Students remain with this advisor until their sophomore year, at which time they select a faculty advisor in their chosen major.

The department offers a variety of study, life and career building skills programs, but holds firm to the concept of self-determination—each student must take responsibility for his or her collegiate experience. Our goal is to assure that there is a support system in place to assist students to make positive and informed decisions.

Speed, Strength and Conditioning

Tribe Athletics is very proud of the Joseph W. Montgomery Strength Training Center, a 5,000 square foot weight training facility. Under the guidance of the Head Speed, Strength and Conditioning Coach John Sauer, each sport is provided with a program designed to enhance individual strength and flexibility development specific to the skills and movements required for their sport. Individuals are educated on proper lifting techniques and workouts are monitored to ensure safety at all times.

The weight room was upgraded in the spring of 2006, primarily with new Power Lift and Sorinex equipment. The room now contains 16,000 pounds of free weights, over 7,000 pounds of dumbbells and 6,000 pounds of rubber bumper plates. In addition, it has 24 custom-built Olympic platforms, 18 multipurpose power racks and a fully-equipped plyometric area.

Sports Medicine

The Division of Sports Medicine provides a comprehensive health care program for the department of intercollegiate athletics. The staff consists of Assistant Athletics Director for Health Services, Steve Cole, a team physician, seven full-time certified athletic trainers, two graduate assistant athletic trainers and medical specialists from the local community. The team physician has overall responsibility for supervision of the sports medicine program. Tribe athletes have the luxury of rehabilitating and treating injuries in a state-of-the-art athletic training facility.

The priority for the athletic training staff is to enhance and ensure lines of communication and cooperation among its staff, student-athletes, parents, coaches, the Student Health Center and involved medical specialists.

The College of William and Mary and its student-athletes take a great deal of pride in the quality of its athletic facilities. Over the last several years, the College has bolstered its lineup of venues to match the success that the Tribe has shown in the athletic arena, which has been unmatched in the Colonial Athletic Association. William and Mary boasts some of the finest athletic arenas in the nation, from its newest venue, Albert-Daly Field, to the oldest, Walter J. Zable Stadium at Cary Field, a campus landmark since 1935. The College is committed to providing the student-athlete the most enjoyable and rewarding atmosphere possible.

- Home of the Tribe's basketball, gymnastics and volleyball teams and the ticket box office
- Seats over 8,500
- Three-level building includes 12 locker room areas, a spacious training room, 5,000 square foot weight room and gymnastics training center
- The concourse and lower levels house administrative and coaching staff offices

Zable Stadium

- Home of the Tribe's football and track and field teams
- Campus landmark since 1935
- Seating for more than 12,000
- Field Turf surface was installed in summer of 2006
- Permanent lighting was installed in 2005
- Brand new state-of-the-art track around the field scheduled for completion in spring 2006

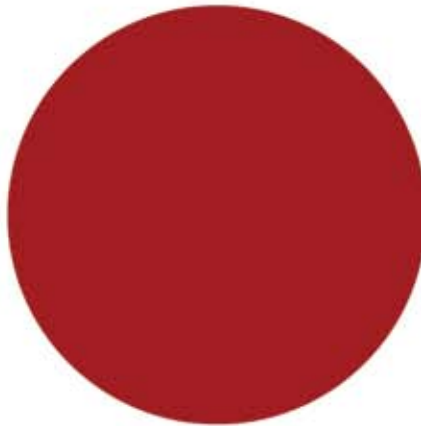
