During Mary Lewis' 14-year tenure as the head women's gymnastics coach at William and Mary, the Tribe program has been distinguished for both its competitive success in the gym and academic excellence in the classroom. Distinctions have come in the form of four Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships and multiple national scholar-athlete citations year-in and year-out, validating the fact that, under Lewis' watch, Tribe gymnasts have epitomized the definition of studentathletes.

Following the 2006 season, Lewis was recognized by her peers as the ECAC Coach of the Year for the second time in her career, after the Tribe earned a second-place finish at the ECAC Championship, the team's best finish since winning three-straight league titles from 2001 to 2003. Lewis also saw Tribe gymnasts earn 11 all-conference awards, including an individual vault conference title by Brittany Gibbs. Additionally, Christina Padilla was honored as the ECAC Scholar Athlete of the Year, while seven gymnasts earned ECAC All-Academic Team honors.

Last season, for the fourth time in her career, Lewis sent two gymnasts to the NCAA Southeast Regional, as current seniors Tricia Long and Stevie Waldman each qualified as individual participants for the competition. Long

made her second career appearance at Regionals as an all-arounder, while Waldman became the 10th different Tribe gymnast under Lewis to reach Regionals.

W&M also made its second-straight appearance in the USAG Collegiate Nationals in 2007, and the Tribe once again took home a number of individual honors. Waldman and Padilla earned USAG First-Team All-America honors with Waldman getting the distinction on floor and Padilla receiving the accolades on both vault and bars. Additionally, current senior Tricia Long (all-around) and current sophomore Ali Medeiros (bars) were named USAG Second-Team All-Americans. In 2006, the Tribe made its first trip to USAGs under Lewis, earning a fourth-place finish in the team competition. Tribe gymnasts garnered nine different USAG All-America honors, including Gibbs and Jess Randall, who shared the USAG individual national championships in the floor exercise.

Under Lewis' tutelage, five gymnasts in the last four seasons have competed in NCAA Regionals, including Long and Waldman last season. The 2005 ECAC Rookie of the Year, Long also competed as an individual all-arounder in the 2005 Regional. Suzanne Chaves ('04) and Emma Cross ('05) competed in a NCAA Regional in 2004. Since taking over the program in 1995, Lewis has coached 10 different gymnasts to 14 total NCAA appearances.

In 2005, Padilla captured the ECAC individual vault title, while six other Tribe gymnasts received all-conference recognition under Lewis' guidance. In total, Lewis' gymnasts have claimed 15 individual ECAC titles, while Lewis has led the squad to four ECAC titles. Lewis earned her first ECAC Coach of the Year honor in 2003, after W&M captured its third consecutive title.

In addition to success in the gym, Lewis has stressed academics. That is evident each year when the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches honors student-athletes for superb academic performances. Last season, three more Tribe gymnasts earned NACGC national scholar-athlete awards, including Padilla who posted a team-best 4.00 GPA, Waldman and Randall. Over the last three seasons, 10 Tribe gymnasts have earned the honor.

Lewis has been coaching collegiate gymnastics since 1991, when she was the head coach at Longwood College for the 1991-92 season. She joined the staff at James Madison University in 1992 and served as a graduate assistant until 1994, before taking over the program at the College.

Lewis graduated Magna Cum Laude from CNU in 1985 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in governmental administration and public management. She completed her master's degree at JMU in kinesiology and adult fitness in May of 1994, graduating Summa Cum Laude.

Lewis spends her summers working at the Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pa., organizing weekly schedules for campers ranging in levels from beginner to elite. She resides in Newport News with her 12-year-old son, Zachary.

Jamie Weinfeldt

- Assistant Coach

William and Mary graduate and former NCAA Regional performer Jamie Weinfeldt is in her first season as an assistant coach at her alma mater.

Weinfeldt brings an extensive background in training and administration and will primarily handle coaching the beam line-up, recruiting and strength and conditioning. Weinfeldt will also assist Lewis in coaching the floor exercise.

"I'm very excited to have Jamie rejoin the program," Lewis said upon Weinfeldt's hiring in September. "As a William and Mary graduate, she understands what it takes and what it truly means to be a student-athlete here. Her drive and passion for the program

are just as strong as when she was a William and Mary gymnast."

Weinfeldt returns to Williamsburg after completing graduate work at the George Washington University, where she earned a Master's of Science Degree in Exercise Science in May of 2007. While at GW, Weinfeldt was a graduate assistant for the Lerner Health and Wellness Center, while also serving as the Colonials women's gymnastics meet director the past two years.

As the program's meet director, she acted as a liaison between the coaching staff and officials and handled all aspects of meet organization. Weinfeldt held a similar position at Penn State during the 2005 competitive season.


Her primary responsibility as a graduate assistant at GW was personal training, designing and implementing individualized exercise programs for clients of all ages and physical abilities. Weinfeldt's duties also included many administrative responsibilities, including supervising the undergraduate fitness center at GW, scheduling activities and student workers and marketing programs that promoted health and fitness on campus.

Weinfeldt was also an adjunct faculty member of the Department of Exercise Science, teaching undergraduate courses in the basics of resistance training and aerobic conditioning.

During her time in Northern Virginia, Weinfeldt also taught gymnasts of all levels at the Chantilly Academy of Gymnastics. She has also spent time during her summers working at the Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Pennsylvania supervising staff members and instructing gymnasts.

A native of New Jersey, Weinfeldt graduated from the College with a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and helped lead the Tribe to three consecutive ECAC Championships from 2001-03. Weinfeldt was an ECAC Individual Champion on beam in 2001 and is the only Tribe gymnast ever to record two scores of 9.900 in the event. She qualified for the NCAA Southeast Regional as a freshman in 2001 and was a NACGC Scholastic All-American.







As the W&M women's gymnastics program heads into the 2008 season, an early look at the team reveals many similarities and encouraging signs that have been present during preseason workouts in recent years. The Tribe is deep in each line-up, has a solid senior leadership presence and a group of young gymnasts ready to compete. But, while injuries have devastated the team's depth and goals in the last few seasons, the expectations surrounding the program are still high as ever.

This season's components include the terrific senior duo of **Tricia Long** and **Stevie Waldman**, who are both returning NCAA Regional participants, a number of returning all-conference and USAG All-America performers and a talented quintet of freshman, all of which head coach Mary Lewis believes gives the 2008 Tribe the ability to succeed.

"Our expectations are to always finish in the topthree of the ECAC," said Lewis, who is now in her 14th season. "I think we not only have the talent to compete at the top level of the league, but I think we have the opportunity to push some records and gain some ground in the region this season."

As always though, the team's health will dictate how achievable those goals are. Lewis is hopeful a dedicated offseason workout regime and a spirited attitude will push the squad out of the slump it has been in.

"I think this particular team is very motivated and has the desire to accomplish the goals that have eluded us," Lewis remarked. "I think one of the big things driving this group is its wanting to gain respect, both in the league and in the region."

And a look at the Tribe's schedule shows plenty of opportunities to gain respect against its annual tough slate. Once again, the schedule features national and regional-level qualifiers. A new twist that certainly has the potential to hasten the Tribe's quest is a number of ECAC programs dotting the slate. But, perhaps the most significant aspect of the schedule that could allow the program to regain its standing among the conference's upper echelon is the fact W&M will be hosting the ECAC Championship at Kaplan Arena in March.

"We'll see some very strong teams this year and a number of teams we haven't typically faced during the regular season, in terms of conference opponents. I think we'll have an opportunity to really make a good impression in some of our early season competitions, and then it is truly exciting to know we'll be bringing those [ECAC] opponents back to our place for the ECAC meet."

Leading the squad down the path to the conference championship will be Long and Waldman, who will each serve as team captains. The pair are both strong leaders and each display a lead-by-example attitude.

Long is a two-time Regional all-around participant, having also competed in 2005, the same season she was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year. The team's most consistent and dependable scorer over the last three seasons, Long is a three-time all-conference all-arounder and will once again be counted on to deliver in each event. The floor exercise, in which Long earned First-Team All-ECAC honors last season, is her strongest event, but she will certainly have an impact in all four line-ups and could become the Tribe's first three-year Regional qualifier.

When healthy, Waldman has shown the ability and talent to be one of the conference's and region's elite gymnasts, particularly on bars. Waldman held the Southeast Region's 20th-best RQS on bars last season at 9.750, an average that also ranked second in the ECAC. She made her first trip to NCAA Regionals, earned her third USAG All-America citation and won three individual event titles, all after missing most of the first month of the season. Waldman has battled back and knee injuries



throughout her career, but with a strong offseason workout routine, she is back to training all four events. Her lines and presentation on beam and floor standout and her body of work on bars speaks for itself, so a return to the vault line-up could be a major boost for the squad.

The junior class is very deep and the continued progression of the group will be vital to the squad's success.

Becca Bacharach enjoyed a breakout season in 2007 and Lewis is hopefully the junior can pick up right where she left off. Bacharach concentrated on upgrading both her vault and beam series, though her biggest impact could be on floor. With consistency, Bacharach could be one of the Tribe's key contributors this season.

After missing the entire 2007 season, **Monica Goldblatt** continues to work back from wrist surgery and her training has been dependent upon her health. Goldblatt was an instant success for the Tribe as a freshman in 2006, earning Second-Team All-ECAC honors on bars. She has the dance skills to be a key factor in both the beam and floor line-ups.

Sarah Jacobson was another pleasant surprise last season, stepping into three line-ups and earning Second-Team All-ECAC on vault. Jacobson has worked on a stronger bars routine and a stronger vault for 2008, and she will also figure predominantly in the success of the floor group. Jacobson has been among the most impressive during preseason workouts, and the junior could be an all-conference candidate come March.

Now in her first full season with the Tribe, **Allison Leich** joined the program during last season as a walk-on and continues to work hard and bring her skills up to the collegiate level. Leich has shown a strong determination to improve and she has the opportunity to add depth to the beam line-up.

Ashley Lugo has continued to battle health issues and is coming back from ankle surgery as well. If she can hold up through the season, Lugo's skills on floor and vault could give both line-ups a significant boost.

Lauren Jackson is another who has been limited in training by injuries during her career. This season, however, Lewis is hopeful Jackson will be healthy enough to compete in three events after performing a limited number of exhibition routines late last season. Jackson

has a great presence on floor and beam and could also step into the vault line-up with increased training.

Rounding out the junior class is **Megan Vincent**, who has had perhaps the toughest luck of the group with injuries. After missing her entire freshman season in 2006, Vincent battled her way back from a number of accumulated injuries last season to contribute in both the vault and beam line-ups. If her health holds up, Vincent could impact both line-ups once again.

While small in numbers, the three-member sophomore class is big on talent and will be one of the keys to the Tribe's success.

Stephanie Bevan took full advantage of the opportunity to step into line-ups last season, as she put together a strong rookie campaign earning Second-Team All-ECAC honors on beam. Bevan was a pleasant surprise on vault last season and has concentrated preseason work on upgrading to a 10.0 start value. One of the team's hardest workers over the summer, Bevan has also looked strong on beam and has added some huge tumbling moves to her floor routine. Bevan could also add depth to the bars line-up this season, giving her the potential to compete as an all-arounder.

Alison Medeiros made an immediate impact as a freshman last season, earning Second-Team All-ECAC honors on beam and USAG Second-Team All-America status on bars. One of the team's most consistent scorers on vault, Medeiros also showed flashes of brilliance on both bars and beam. She shared the individual title on beam against JMU with a season-high 9.775, and then took second on bars later in the season against the Dukes with a season-best 9.775 in that event. Medeiros' progress during the preseason has been slow though after undergoing shoulder surgery in June. She could return to the beam line-up the quickest, but Medeiros' impact probably won't be felt until late in the season.

The third member of the trio, **Jen Stack**, is working back from her fourth knee surgery, which took place in May, but the sophomore is optimistic about a return to full strength. Stack has a high difficulty on a great bars routine, and once she is able to fully dismount she could make a big impact in the event line-up. Stack has also started to gradually work her way back on beam and could add depth to that line-up down the road.

Lewis brought in a dynamic group of freshman gymnasts who all have the potential to be outstanding competitors for the Tribe.

Karla Bercaw has the potential to be a great allarounder, but the rookie's training and progress have been hampered by injuries suffered late last winter and in the spring.


Melissa Cream could make an immediate impact in any of the four events and will be competing as an all-arounder. Cream has been particularly impressive on bars where she has a high difficulty routine. She has looked strong during preseason workouts.

Another of the freshman working back from injury is **Danielle DeBacker**, who has had a long road of rehab and recovery from knee surgery. DeBacker has had limited work on bars and basic skill training.

Dina McNaughton has been one of the most impressive youngsters through preseason. McNaughton has a very strong vault and has good skills on both beam and floor with the potential to crack either line-up.

Rounding out the impressive first-year class is **Taryn Saunders**, who continues to improve each day with training. Saunders has a similar bars routine to former standout Christina Padilla and is very solid on beam. She continues to work on vault and floor and has the potential to be another key all-arounder eventually.


2005 Season Highlights

Qualified for the 2005 NCAA Southeast Regional as an all-arounder, becoming just the second freshman to compete in a regional under Lewis ... ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Tribe

The 2006-07 season was another strong year for the College, as Tribe teams added four more CAA titles to bring the school's all-time league-leading total to 88.

The men's cross country squad won its seventh consecutive CAA crown in the fall, while the women's cross country team won its fourth straight. The women's swimming team won its first CAA Championship, while the women's tennis team added its 19th all-time CAA crown in the spring.

Individually, the women's tennis doubles team of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic reached the title match of the NCAA Doubles Championship, earning All-America honors. Katie Radloff became the first female swimmer to advance to the NCAA's since 1983. Additionally, Keith Bechtol raced to a 14th-place finish in the 10,000m, while Bonnie Meekins placed 16th in the heptathlon at the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student-athlete's academic responsibilities.

This year, the NCAA honored 13 W&M teams as recipients of its public recognition award. The Tribe teams recognized are baseball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's gymnastics, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field and volleyball.

and volleyball.

Additionally, in the latest NCAA graduation rate reports, three Tribe teams posted 100% graduation rates, including football, women's basketball and women's cross country/track.

Since 1992, 39 student-athletes have been designated Academic All-Americans, including three in the past academic year. Keith Bechtol (men's track) was a First-Team selection, Ryan Overdevest (men's soccer) was a Second-Team selection and Anna Young (women's soccer) was a Third-Team selection.

In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its sports, and not surprisingly, W&M has set the pace with 22 winners. Bechtol was the CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year in both cross country and track and field, bringing his career award total to five. Meghan Bishop (women's cross country) earned her fourth CAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in the fall in cross country.

In addition, four of W&M's five Rhodes scholars participated in varsity sports.

THE COLLEGE

For more than 300 years, William and Mary has been a symbol of academic distinction in America. Now, in its fourth century, the College is prepared to educate the leaders of the 21st century.

The College of William and Mary was founded in 1693 by King William III and Queen Mary II of England. Four Presidents of the United States received their education at the College - George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler.

William and Mary was the first college to institute an honor code of conduct. The premier academic society, Phi Beta Kappa, was founded by William and Mary students in 1776. The Society of the Alumni, founded in 1842, is the sixth oldest alumni group in the nation. Now the College is designated as a "Public luy", and ranks sixth among all public universities (U.S. News and World Report).






Athletics Department Goals

Sports Psychology

Deidre Connelly, Ph.D., is the College's full-time sport psychologist. All consultations are confidential and all studentathletes, teams or coaches are welcome regardless of the issues they wish to discuss. Consultation is available for sport psychology education, performance enhancement skills training, strategies for dealing with stress or injury, or for personal issues that may affect performance.

Compliance, Academic Support

As members of the Colonial Athletic Association and the NCAA, the College is committed to full compliance with all NCAA and conference regulations. The department has a full-time Director of Compliance, Pamela Mason, who is committed to assisting students, staff and coaches through education and monitoring of compliance issues.

The department offers a variety of study, life and career building skills programs, but holds firm to the concept of self-determination—each student must take responsibility for his or her collegiate experience. Our goal is to ensure that there is a support system in place to assist students to make positive and informed decisions.

Speed, Strength, Conditioning

Tribe Athletics is very proud of the Joseph W. Montgomery Strength Training Center, a 5,000 square foot weight training facility. Under the guidance of the Head Speed, Strength and Conditioning Coach John Sauer, each sport is provided with a program designed to enhance individual strength and flexibility development specific to the skills and movements required for their sport. Individuals are educated on proper lifting techniques and workouts are monitored to ensure safety at all times.

Sports Medicine

The Division of Sports Medicine provides a comprehensive health care program for the department of intercollegiate athletics. The staff consists of Assistant Athletics Director for Health Services, Steve Cole, a team physician, seven full-time certified athletic trainers, two graduate assistant athletic trainers and medical specialists from the local community. The team physician has overall responsibility for supervision of the sports medicine program. Tribe athletes have the luxury of rehabilitating and treating injuries in a state-of-the-art athletic training facility.




