Head Coach: Mary Lewis (Christopher Newport, 1985); 15th season **Assistant Coach:** Jamie Weinfeldt (William and Mary, 2004); Second season As the William and Mary women's gymnastics team enters the 2009 season, there is reason for great optimism that the program can once again rise to the top of the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference. This year's edition of the Tribe features an exciting blend of experienced veterans and talented newcomers, who possess both the ability and the work ethic to produce tremendous results. As is the case every season, **Head Coach Mary Lewis** has great expectations for this year's team and knows what it will take to achieve its goals.

"Our primary goals for this season are to win the ECAC Championship and to finish in the top two at the USAG finals," said Lewis, a two-time ECAC Coach of the Year. "In order to accomplish our goals, it is important that we start the season well, develop consistency early and then continue to build on it throughout the season. The conference has gotten very strong, and it won't be easy, but I think this team is ready for the challenge."

Although the College graduated its two top performers from last season — Stevie Waldman and Tricia Long — the squad boasts a seven-member senior class that will provide leadership to help guide the Tribe to success in '09. Highlighting the veteran group are co-captains **Becca Bacharach** and **Lauren Jackson**, a pair of seniors who have demonstrated strong leadership skills during their careers

"Our senior class is probably the largest I have had in my career at William and Mary," Lewis said. "They are a diverse group of student-athletes who all provide leadership in various ways, and I expect that they will demonstrate a good example in the gym and in the classroom. They will all be extremely important as we work towards our quest for a conference championship."

The veterans' leadership will be incredibly important in determining the Tribe's success this season, as the team will once again challenge itself against national-level programs and some of the top teams in the region. In addition to squaring off against its league foes, W&M will compete against 2008 NCAA Regional qualifiers North Carolina, North Carolina State, Penn State, Kentucky and Illinois.

Bacharach should play a key role in the Tribe's efforts against the challenging slate of opponents, as the cocaptain will compete on floor, vault and beam this year. After upgrading her tumbling during the off-season, she will likely make the move from leadoff to anchor on floor this season. The Lancaster, Pa., native is also working towards a 10.0 start value on vault and appears ready to make an impact on beam.

Like Bacharach, Jackson will serve as a co-captain and will train on vault, beam and floor. Although somewhat hampered by injuries during her career, she was a very solid performer on vault last year and also improved on beam as the season progressed. While she has not competed regularly on floor, she is a talented performer with wonderful presentation and could enhance the Tribe's lineup in the event.

While senior **Monica Goldblatt** has been unable to compete the past two seasons due to injury, she has modified her workouts and is hoping to earn a spot in the bars and beam lineup. A second-team all-conference selection

as a freshman on bars, she continues to have a very nice routine on the apparatus and will focus primarily on that event.

After earning second-team all-conference honors on vault during each of the past two seasons, senior **Sarah Jacobson** will look to continue her success in the event this year. The Brecksville, Ohio native has also been a member of the bars lineup since her sophomore season and should remain among the team's best in that event as well. A strong tumbler, she could also make an impact on floor as she continues to improve her consistency on landings.

After joining the team as a walk-on during the '07 season, senior **Allison Leich** has worked hard and improved tremendously during the past two seasons. While beam is her strongest event, she could also provide some depth on bars.

Although senior **Ashley Lugo** has battled injuries throughout much of her career and has competed in just a pair of meets during the past two seasons, she is hoping to remain healthy enough to make significant contributions during her final season at the College. While Lugo will primarily focus on vault, her strong tumbling and nice presentation should keep her in the mix to make the floor lineup.

Senior **Megan Vincent** has also battled injuries during her career, but she figures to be a key member of the vault lineup this year after upgrading her start value in the event during the off-season.

A two-time all-conference honoree on beam, junior **Stephanie Bevan** garnered first-team accolades last season with a sixth-place finish at the league championship and should continue to be one of the Tribe's top performers in the event this year. The Bridgewater, N.J., native should also be a valuable contributor to the floor lineup and could also add depth on vault.

One of the Tribe's top performers in '08, junior **Alison Medeiros** placed second at the conference championship
on bars last season before going on to earn first-team
All-America honors at the USAG Collegiate Nationals.

Medeiros will also focus her training on beam, an event she garnered second-team all-conference honors in as a freshman.

Junior **Jen Stack** has fought through a number of injuries during her career, but she has continued to excel at an elite level in the gym. The Enfield, Conn., native claimed first-team all-conference honors on bars and vault last year and then went on to earn first-team All-America distinction on bars at the USAG Collegiate Nationals. While she will continue to be one of W&M's top performers in both events again this season, she will also work on beam.

Although she was limited during her freshman season due to an injury, sophomore **Karla Bercaw** will train in all-around this year with an emphasis on beam. A focused and efficient worker, Bercaw will likely replace Long at the front of the beam lineup this season. Also a strong vaulter, she could add another 10.0 start value to the lineup.

Sophomore **Melissa Cream** posted an outstanding first season for the Tribe a year ago and will look to build on that success this season. A second-team all-conference honoree on beam, Cream was also selected as the ECAC Rookie of the Week twice. In addition to excelling on beam, she is a consistent performer on bars and has a solid floor routine.

After making an immediate impact on vault and floor as a freshman, sophomore **Dina McNaughton** will also train on beam this season. Her consistency on floor makes her a likely candidate for the leadoff spot in the event, while she is looking to upgrade her vault start value to a 9.9. McNaughton has also become more comfortable on beam and could vie for a spot in the lineup with increased consistency.

A member of the bars lineup last season, sophomore **Taryn Saunders** will also add depth on beam this year. With an upgraded bars routine, she will likely improve upon what was a solid freshman season in '08.


In addition to the solid nucleus of returning letterwinners, the Tribe adds a quartet of talented freshmen to the squad this season. **Kristin Milardo**, **Annie Mix** and **Ryann Tewell** will train in all-around, while **Allie Wheeler** will focus on beam.

Milardo has a 10.0 starting value on vault, while her dynamic routine on bars could help fill the void left by the graduation of Waldman and Long. She has also looked good on beam, and her tumbling is strong. A mature performer, she should make a successful transition to collegiate gymnastics.

Although Mix will train in all-around, she will likely make her most significant impact on bars. Because of her solid routine and strong handwork, she has the potential to step into the lineup early and will, at the very least, add important depth. She also could add valuable depth to the beam and floor lineups.

The expectations for Tewell on bars is high, as she boasts a solid routine and a big release move. She also shows great potential on beam and floor and should contribute to both lineups.

Wheeler is only a year removed from shoulder surgery and will focus the majority of her training on beam.



Competitive Success

During her 15-year career at William and Mary, head coach Mary Lewis has experienced tremendous success. A two-time ECAC Coach of the Year honoree, Lewis has led the Green and Gold to four conference championship titles, including three in a row from 2001-03. Additionally, she has coached 10 different gymnasts to 15 total NCAA Regional appearances, while 16 of her gymnasts have claimed ECAC individual titles.

Excellence in the Classroom

In addition to excelling against the competition in the arena, Lewis has stressed the importance of academic excellence in the classroom as well. Evidence of this has come in the numerous awards earned by Tribe student-athletes. During the last four seasons, 13 Tribe gymnasts have earned NACGC national scholar-athlete citations, while W&M has produced two ECAC Scholar Athletes of the Year in the past two seasons.

Impact in the Community

An important part of being a member of the William and Mary women's gymnastics program is giving back to the community. This fall, the Tribe participated in the 12th Annual Central Virginia Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF) Walk to Cure Diabetes in Richmond, Va. As a team, the Green and Gold raised nearly \$1,500 for the event, which helps fund research for the cure of type 1 (juvenile) diabetes.



During Mary Lewis' 15-year tenure as the head women's gymnastics coach at William and Mary, the Tribe program has been distinguished for both its competitive success in the gym and academic excellence in the classroom. Distinctions have come in the form of four Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships and multiple national scholar-athlete citations year-in and year-out, validating the fact that, under Lewis' watch, Tribe gymnasts have epitomized the definition of student-athletes.

A two-time ECAC Coach of the Year, Lewis has guided W&M to four conference championships, including three in a row from 2001-03. In addition to the collective success experienced by the team, a number of Tribe gymnasts have also garnered individual accolades under Lewis' tutelage. Since taking over the program in 1995, Lewis has coached 10 different gymnasts to 15 total NCAA Regional appearances. Additionally, Lewis' gymnasts have claimed 16 individual ECAC titles.

Under Lewis' guidance, four gymnasts on six occasions in the last five seasons have competed

in NCAA Regionals. Last season, Stevie Waldman competed at regionals for the second consecutive season, as she placed 24th in the all-around portion of the event. Tricia Long, the 2005 ECAC Rookie of the Year, also competed as an individual all-arounder twice as she represented the Tribe in 2005 and 2007. Suzanne Chaves ('04) and Emma Cross ('05) competed in a NCAA Regional in 2004.

In addition to Waldman's appearance at the 2008 NCAA Regionals, the Tribe garnered a number of other accolades last season. Waldman became the USAG Collegiate National All-Around Champion after earning first-team All-America honors on bars and beam, finishing second in both events. Jennifer Stack and Alison Medeiros also claimed first-team honors, finishing eighth and ninth, respectively, on bars.

W&M also experienced tremendous success at the 2008 ECAC Championship, which the College hosted in Williamsburg. Waldman garnered three first-team honors and was the champion on bars, while Stack earned first-team accolades on vault and bars. Stephanie Bevan and Medeiros claimed first-team certificates on beam and bars, respectively, while the squad also picked up four second-team honors.

During the '07 season, Lewis sent two gymnasts to the NCAA Southeast Regional, as Long and Waldman both qualified as individual participants for the competition. It marked the fourth time in her career that Lewis had two gymnasts qualify for regionals. Long made her second career appearance at regionals as an all-arounder, while Waldman became the 10th different Tribe gymnast under Lewis to reach regionals.

W&M also made its second-straight appearance in the USAG Collegiate Nationals in 2007, and the Tribe once again took home a number of individual honors. Waldman and Christina Padilla earned USAG First-Team All-America honors with Waldman getting the distinction on floor and Padilla receiving the accolades on both vault and bars. Additionally, Long (all-around) and Medeiros (bars) were named USAG Second-Team All-Americans. During the previous season, the Tribe made its first trip to USAGs under Lewis, earning a fourth-place finish in the team competition. Tribe gymnasts garnered nine different USAG All-America honors, including Brittany Gibbs and Jess Randall, who shared the USAG individual national championships in the floor exercise.

Following the 2006 season, Lewis was recognized by her peers as the ECAC Coach of the Year for the second time in her career. That season, the Tribe earned a second-place finish at the ECAC Championship, the program's best finish since winning three-straight league titles from 2001 to 2003. Lewis also saw Tribe gymnasts earn 11 all-

conference awards, including an individual vault conference title by Brittany Gibbs. Additionally, Christina Padilla was honored as the ECAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, while seven gymnasts earned ECAC All-Academic Team honors.

In addition to success in the gym, Lewis has stressed the importance of academics. This is evident each year when the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches honors student-athletes for superb academic performances. Last season, three more Tribe gymnasts earned NACGC national scholar-athlete awards, including Waldman, Lauren Jackson and Sarah Jacobson. During the last four seasons, 13 Tribe gymnasts have earned the honor. Waldman was also recognized for her excellence in the classroom by being selected as an ECAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in '08.

Lewis has been coaching collegiate gymnastics since 1991, when she was the head coach at Longwood College for the 1991-92 season. She joined the staff at James Madison University in 1992 and served as a graduate assistant until 1994, before taking over the program at the College.

Lewis graduated Magna Cum Laude from CNU in 1985 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in governmental administration and public management. She completed her master's degree at JMU in kinesiology and adult fitness in May of 1994, graduating Summa Cum Laude.

Lewis spends her summers working at the Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pa., organizing weekly schedules for campers ranging in levels from beginner to elite. She resides in Newport News with her 13-year-old son, Zachary.

After joining the William and Mary coaching staff in September 2007, former Tribe standout Jamie Weinfeldt enters her second season as an assistant coach at the College.

A 2004 graduate of W&M, Weinfeldt has an extensive background in training and administration. She works primarily with coaching the beam line-up, recruiting and strength and conditioning. Weinfeldt also assists Lewis in coaching the floor exercise.

During her first season as an assistant with the Tribe, Weinfeldt was instrumental in helping three W&M gymnasts earn all-conference honors on beam. Stevie Waldman and Stephanie Bevan both garnered first-team distinction, while Melissa Cream received second-team accolades. Additionally, she helped Tricia Long earn second-team honors in the floor exercise.

"I'm very excited to have Jamie join the program," head coach Mary Lewis said at the time of Weinfeldt's hiring. "As a William and Mary graduate, she understands what it takes and what it truly means to be a student-athlete here. Her drive and passion for the program are just as strong as when she was a William and Mary gymnast."

Weinfeldt returned to Williamsburg after completing graduate work at the George Washington University, where she earned a Master's of Science degree in exercise science in May 2007. While at GW, Weinfeldt was a graduate assistant for the Lerner Health and Wellness Center, while also serving as the Colonials women's gymnastics meet director for two seasons.

As the program's meet director, she acted as a liaison between the coaching staff and officials and handled all aspects of meet organization. Weinfeldt held a similar position at Penn State during the 2005 competitive season.

Her primary responsibility as a graduate assistant at GW was personal training, designing and implementing individualized exercise programs for clients of all ages and physical abilities. Weinfeldt's duties also included many administrative responsibilities, including supervising the undergraduate fitness center at GW, scheduling activities and student workers and marketing programs that promoted health and fitness on campus.

Weinfeldt was also an adjunct faculty member of the Department of Exercise Science, teaching undergraduate courses in the basics of resistance training and aerobic conditioning.

Last summer, Weinfeldt served as the assistant director at the North Carolina State camp. Additionally, she coached at the Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Pennsylvania, supervising staff members and instructing gymnasts.

A native of New Jersey, Weinfeldt graduated from the College with a Bachelor of Science degree in kinesiology and helped lead the Tribe to three consecutive ECAC Championships from 2001-03. Weinfeldt was an ECAC Individual Champion on beam in 2001 and is the only Tribe gymnast ever to record two scores of 9.900 in the event. She qualified for the NCAA Southeast Regional as a freshman in 2001 and was a NACGC Scholastic All-American.

HE COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY

The College of William and Mary is a public university located in Williamsburg, Va. Founded in 1693 by Royal Charter issued by King William III and Queen Mary ll of England, William and Mary is the second oldest college in the country after Harvard. William and Mary has a long history of liberal arts education and a growing research and science curriculum that demonstrates a strong commitment to undergraduate research. The College, which became a state university in 1906, has been designated a "Public Ivy," and for nine straight years has been ranked by U.S. News & World Report as sixth-best public university in the country – and the nation's top small public university.

Also referred to as "the alma mater of a nation," the College has educated four U.S. Presidents -- George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler, which is the third most of any college in the country. William and Mary also claims several firsts, including the 1776 creation of Phi Beta Kappa -the country's first academic honor society -- the first honor code of conduct for college students, and the first collegiate law school, established in 1779. William and Mary is also home to the Sir Christopher Wren Building — the country's oldest academic building still in use — and the President's House, the oldest home of a university president still in use.

- William and Mary Facts:
 In addition to four U.S. Presidents, William and Mary has educated a number of this country's key historical figures, including U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice John Marshall and 16 signers of the Declaration of Independence.
- More recent famous alumni from William and Mary include U.S. Secretary of Defense Robert Gates ('65), the late David Brown ('78) (astronaut on the Columbia Shuttle), actress Glenn Close ('74), comedian John Stewart ('84), fashion designer Perry Ellis ('61), actor Patton Oswalt ('91), the late Mark McCormack ('51) (founder of sports and celebrity agency IMG), actress Linda Lavin ('59), NASCAR and Gibbs Racing's J.D. Gibbs ('91), Minnesota Vikings star Darren Sharper ('97), and Pittsburgh Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin ('95).
- In 2008, William and Mary recognized as 5th-highest producer of Peace Corps volunteers among mid-sized schools (5,000-15,000 students). As of January 2008, 51 W&M alumni are serving. Since the Peace Corps' inception, 499 W&M alumni have volunteered with the Corps, making the university the 82nd-highest producer of volunteers of all time.
- For 2007-2008, the College had more Fulbright Scholars than any other college of university in Virginia, and it had the highest application-to-award rate among nation's top research institutions. In 2006-2007, 12 William and Mary students were named Fulbright Scholars. Eleven received the honor in 2007-08 and scholars are studying in countries such as Argentina, Hungary, Uganda, Sweden, Senegal, and Ecuador.
- In 2008, U.S. News ranked William and Mary sixth among all public colleges and universities and 33rd out of all universities — both public and private. The William & Mary Law School ranked tied for 30th in 2008 by U.S. News. The Mason School Business ranked 40th in nation (2008) by Financial Times and 71st in the world. William and Mary ranked 4th-best bargain in higher education by Kiplinger's in 2008. Newsweek magazine named W&M "hottest small state university" in 2006.
- In 2008, W&M received a record number of applications for undergraduate admission for the 3rd year in a row. More than 11,500 undergraduate applications were received.
- According to a recent survey, William and Mary students contribute 323,000 hours of community service per year. Seventy-five percent of undergraduates and 50 percent of graduate students report they volunteered during their time at the College. Ninety percent of undergraduates report they will volunteer in the community they reside in following graduation.

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

- The 2007-08 season was another strong year for the College, as Tribe teams added four more CAA titles to bring the school's all-time league-leading total to 92. W&M also had eight different program's represented at the NCAA Championship level in some capacity.
- The men's cross country squad won its eighth consecutive CAA crown in the fall, while the women's cross country team won its fifth straight. The women's track and field team won its seventh CAA Championship in the last eight years, while the women's tennis team added its 20th all-time CAA crown in the 23-year history of the league during the spring
- In total, W&M had five conference players of the year, five conference scholar-athletes of the year, 18 All-Americans and 100 athletes earned all-conference honors in their respective sports during the 2007-08 season.
- Individually, the women's tennis doubles team of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic garnered All-America honors by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Moulton-Levy also became the first Tribe athlete and only the fourth in CAA history to win conference player of the year honors for a fourth time. Katie Radloff, who garnered CAA Swimmer of the Year and Swimmer of the Championships honors for the second straight season, earned a spot in the NCAA Swimming Championships for the second time in as many years. Christo Laundry earned All-America honors for the third time in cross country and also won the CAA Individual Championship. Women's soccer player Claire Zimmeck garnered CAA Player of the Year honors for the second straight season and was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy. Additionally, Emily Anderson earned All-America honors with a fifth-place finish in the 1,500m, marking the best Tribe finish in 14 years.

- The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student-athlete's academic responsibilities, as W&M ranked fourth, the highest of any athletic scholarship-granting school and of any public school, among the Division I teams when the NCAA released its inaugural Academic Progress Rate scores in 2005.
- In a recent NCAA survey on graduation rates, William and Mary athletic teams set the standard for academic excellence 13 teams graduated 100 percent of their players. The overall graduation rate for our athletes is 96 percent (higher than 86 percent for the entire student body).
- There have been 45 student athletes elected to Phi Beta Kappa in the past ten years. Four Rhodes Scholars were W&M student-athletes.
- The William and Mary men's gymnastics program won named as the 2008 College Gymnastics Coaches Association National Academic Team Championship by virtue of having the highest team cumulative GPA of any men's program in the nation. Longtime Tribe head coach Cliff Gauthier has mentored the program to four National Academic Team titles.
- W&M topped the CAA and all Division I Virginia schools in the Graduation Succes Rate (GSR) released by the NCAA in 2007.
- In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its sports, and not surprisingly, W&M has set the pace with 25 winners in the six-year history of the award.

TRIBE FACILITIES

William and Mary is committed to building and maintaining outstanding facilities for all 21 of its varsity athletic teams. The College has demonstrated this commitment by investing approximately \$16 million toward the construction and upgrade of its athletics facilities during just the last five years. Among W&M's recent projects was the construction of the \$11 million, 30,000-square foot Jimmye Laycock Football Center, which was dedicated this past June. In recent years, the College has hosted NCAA tournament events for football and women's tennis, while a number of other W&M programs have hosted conference championships at Tribe venues.
