# TRIBE TRAVELS

Being part of the Tribe lacrosse program means having the opportunity to travel to exciting destinations around the country -- and the world.

During the 2008 winter break, the team traveled to Australia for a 10-day visit. During the trip, W&M competed in four exhibition games against the Victoria club team during a six-day stay in Melbourne. The squad also spent four days in Sydney.

Under NCAA Bylaws, a team may participate in a foreign tour once every four years, and the Tribe has already begun its fundraising drive for the 2012 international trip.

Another of the Tribe's recent journeys was a five-day stay in the San Francisco Bay area, which included games at Cal-Berkley and St. Mary's. While there the team enjoyed a scenic yacht cruise of San Francisco Bay, a visit to the famous Golden Gate Bridge, dinner at the popular Fisherman's Wharf of San Francisco and free time in downtown San Francisco.

The team will return to California again this season with games slated against Stanford and California.

# POSTSEASON HISTORY



Throughout the past three decades, the William and Mary lacrosse program has established itself as one of the top teams in the region and earned a number of postseason berths.

During a recent eight-year stretch, the Tribe garnered five NCAA Tournament bids. W&M nearly returned to the national tournament again last season with an automatic bid when it hosted the Colonial Athletic Association Championship as the league's top-seeded team. Although the College came up short in the CAA title game, it concluded the highly successful '08 campaign with wins in eight of its final 11 contests and a ranking of 20th in the final IWLCA/Under Armour national poll.

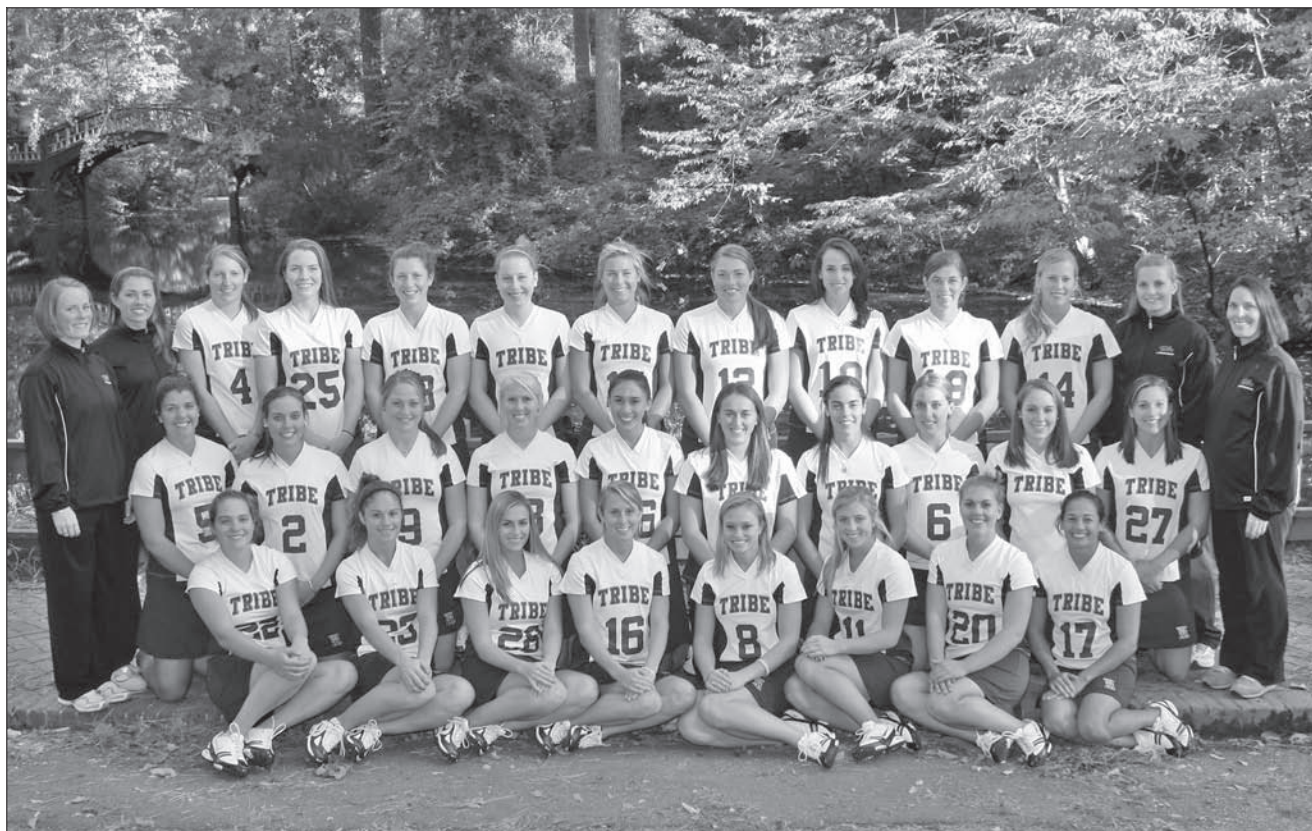

Although Head Coach Christine Halfpenny and the William and Mary lacrosse team entered the 2008 season with a relatively young and unproven roster, the Tribe posted an outstanding campaign that included a number of notable achievements. In addition to winning eight of its final 11 games, W&M finished atop the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season standings and ranked 20th nationally in the final IWLCA poll. With 10 starters returning to the fold this season, as well as an influx of eight talented freshmen, the Tribe appears poised to achieve even greater success during the upcoming '09 season as it begins its quest for a league championship and an NCAA Tournament berth.

While the graduation of all-conference performers Jaime Sellers and Ashley Bolton is worth noting, the Green and Gold will have the benefit of a talented quartet of captains leading this season's edition of the Tribe. A co-captain last season, senior Kate Lawlor will be joined by classmates Julia Martin and Kari Fasick, as well as sophomore Emily Geary, as leaders of this year's squad. The veteran group will be instrumental in the College's success this season, both on and off the field, as it helps the team achieve its goals.

"We are excited to begin the 2009 journey," Halfpenny said. "The 2008 season allowed our players to get a taste of success. This year, with the leadership of our captains and senior class we are poised and ready to take the season even further into May. The captains and senior class as a whole have already shown their commitment to this year's team in the off-season. They are unselfish, focused and hard working. They understand the importance of the details, and they have done a tremendous job of building the new culture of Tribe Lacrosse."

## Attack

Although the Tribe's offensive unit will need to replace its leading goal scorer from a season ago, the talented group still boasts significant firepower. Leading the attack will be Martin, who has started for much of the past two seasons and will once again play a prominent role. The Woodside, Calif., native possesses tremendous vision and has the ability to set up teammates with high-percentage goal-scoring opportunities.

Also helping key the attack will be a pair of exceptional sophomores in Ashley Holofcener and Maggie Anderson, both of whom started all 19 games during their rookie campaigns. Holofcener was one of the CAA's top freshmen in '08 as she earned All-Rookie Team honors after ranking third on the team in points (42) and sixth in the conference in assists per game (0.95). In addition to controlling the tempo on attack, she also has the ability to re-defend well. Anderson returns after a stellar rookie season in which she ranked third on the team in goals (35) and earned All-CAA Tournament Team honors during the postseason. An assertive, confident player, she provides the Tribe with a talented scoring threat and will likely be a go-to option.

Three other key components of the offensive unit this season will be senior Dolly Williams, junior Katherine Delaney and freshman Sally Roberts. One of the College's best ball handlers, Williams earned six starts in '08 and has the potential to make a significant impact with a breakout season. A strong leader, Delaney continued to improve her game during the fall season and should see an increased

role during the spring. Roberts made huge strides during her first fall on campus and should make an immediate impact. A strong player with good vision, the Portland, Ore., native will likely vie for a starting spot.

Fasick is yet another player who figures to earn significant minutes with the attack corps. However, the senior co-captain is incredibly versatile and could see significant playing time at multiple positions.

Having battled injuries during her first two seasons, redshirt sophomore Kristin Anderson should be healthy this spring and will also add depth to the Tribe attack.

## Midfield

After establishing herself as one of the top freshmen in the nation last season, sophomore Grace Golden returns as W&M's top midfielder this year. Honored as the CAA Rookie of the Year and a first-team all-conference selection in '08, Golden ranked fifth in the league in goals per game (2.37) and led the College with 49 ground balls and 19 caused turnovers. A dynamic, game-changing player, the Manhasset, N.Y., native is exceptionally fast and has continued to develop her stickwork.

One of the Tribe's top players in the midfield last season, senior Clare Dennis appears poised for even greater success in '09. The Baltimore, Md., native tied for the team lead with 19 caused turnovers a year ago and was third in draw controls (37) and assists (8). A strong, fast player, Dennis is a leader with exceptional vision who has one of the team's best work ethics.

A starter in all 19 games on defense last year, sophomore Sarah Jonson will make the move from defense to midfield this season. An amazing athlete and all-around player, Jonson is a proven performer who has the ability to dominate the game at times. She finished her rookie season on a high note when she garnered a spot on the CAA All-Tournament team.

Juniors Mary Zulty and Katherine Rees, as well as sophomore Molly Wannan, will also vie for starting spots in the midfield. Zulty earned starts in the final 10 games of last season and finished the year ranked sixth on the team with 18 goals. An emerging leader, she played well during the fall and will be an integral part of the transition game. Rees appeared in all 19 games last year, garnering four starts, and ranked fourth on the team with 25 draw controls. An attack-minded midfielder, she has gained confidence during the off-season and will have the opportunity to make a big impact in '09. Wannan will also see an

increased role this spring and has developed into a more complete midfielder after primarily playing a defensive role last year.

Adding depth to the midfield will be junior Annie Macomber, sophomore Kaitlyn Gambrell and a trio of freshmen in Jenny Michael, Stephanie Steinweg and Sam Bos. A two-sport athlete, Macomber spent the fall with the W&M soccer team but is expected to make significant contributions this spring. One of the team's most aggressive players, she has the ability to get the ball back and often provides a spark. A talented defensive midfielder, Gambrell is a forceful player who has the ability to control the opposition. Michael quickly adjusted to the college game during the fall and should earn significant playing time as a freshman.

An attacking-minded midfielder, she also has the ability to re-defend well and possesses a nice touch on the draw. Steinweg is a smart, versatile player who anticipates plays well and has a good understanding of the game, while Bos boasts good size and will also provide depth to the position.

## Defense

A fixture on the Tribe defensive unit for the past two seasons, Lawlor will anchor the talented group once again. The all-conference candidate is a vocal leader and one of the team's hardest workers. She also has a knack for getting to loose balls and will play a key role initiating the transition.

Senior Lauren Coll, also an all-conference candidate, will serve as an important leader and help direct the defensive unit. An intimidating, physical presence, Coll is a very committed hard worker who had a very strong fall. Like Lawlor, she will also play a vital role in helping initiate the transition.

After earning starts in all 19 games during her rookie season, sophomore Emma Starnes is yet another all-conference caliber player on the W&M defensive side. A physical player with a huge presence, the Richmond, Va., native is quick and has great footwork.

Providing depth to the defensive unit will be a trio of talented freshmen in Sarah Mulvey, Denise Lenihan and Lauren Canning. Mulvey had a great fall and is a vocal player who has a great understanding of the team's defensive philosophy. Lenihan is an intense defender who improved dramatically during the fall and has great potential to contribute in the spring, while Canning is a hard worker who can help spark the transition.

## Goalkeepers

Geary will once again start in the cage for the Tribe after a stellar rookie season that saw her earn second-team all-conference honors and garner a selection to the CAA All-Rookie Team. The Wayne, Pa., native ranked fifth nationally with 193 saves a year ago, while she also ranked among the country's top 20 in saves per game and save percentage. Geary is excellent at reading attackers and anticipates exceptionally well. An incredibly confident player, the second-year standout has already emerged as one of the team's leaders and will serve as a co-captain.

Backing up Geary this season will be talented freshman Lauren Binzer. The Herndon, Va., native developed quickly during the fall and displayed her incredible athleticism and fast hands.

**2008 VaSID Coach of the Year**

After leading the William and Mary lacrosse team to one of its most successful and exciting campaigns in the program's history last spring, Head Coach Christine Halfpenny enters her third year at the helm of the Tribe Lacrosse program.

Honored as the 2008 Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year, Halfpenny guided the College to a No. 1 seed in the conference tournament and a final national ranking of 20th. Halfpenny was also chosen as the 2008 Virginia Sports Information Directors (VaSID) University Division Coach of the Year after leading W&M to victories in eight of its final 11 games and an appearance in the CAA championship game. The Tribe registered four triumphs against ranked teams, including wins versus top-10 opponents Stanford and George Mason.

In addition to the team's success in '08, Halfpenny helped a number of Tribe players earn individual accolades. Five players garnered all-conference honors, highlighted by first-team selections Grace Golden and Jaime Sellers. Golden was also chosen as the CAA Rookie of the Year and the VaSID Rookie of the Year, while Sellers was named to the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) All-South Region Second Team.

W&M student-athletes also excelled in the classroom, as 15 players earned the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award in 2008, bringing the College's total to 26 during the last two years.

Halfpenny took over the Tribe program during the summer of 2006 after a successful three-year stint as the top assistant at Duke University. During her first season in Williamsburg, Halfpenny began building the foundation for the success that would ensue in '08. In addition to the memorable upset victory against ninth-ranked James Madison at Albert-Daly Field, Kristen Wong and Sellers earned all-conference honors. Wong was also selected to the IWLCA All-South Region Second Team and later earned a spot on the U.S. National Elite Team during the summer of 2007.

Prior to coming to W&M, Halfpenny was part of a Duke staff that guided the Blue Devils to the 2005 Atlantic Coast Conference Championship and three-straight NCAA Tournament

appearances, including national semifinal appearances in 2005 and 2006. While in Durham, Halfpenny's duties included serving as the head recruiting coordinator, team academic coordinator, strength and conditioning liaison, travel coordinator and compliance coordinator. Halfpenny also served as the goalkeeper coach, mentoring current Tribe volunteer assistant Megan Huether to First Team All-America honors in 2005, the same year the standout net-minder was named the IWLCA/US Lacrosse Goalie of the Year.

In each of her three seasons at Duke, Halfpenny's recruiting classes were ranked among the nation's top four, according to Inside Lacrosse, and included the nation's top class in 2005. She showed an equal commitment to work in the classroom, as the Blue Devils posted the nation's top team GPA (3.46) in 2004 and the nation's second-best team GPA (3.42) in 2005. Additionally, Halfpenny saw over 50 Blue Devils named to the ACC Honor Roll between 2004 and 2005.

Prior to her stint at Duke, Halfpenny was an assistant coach at her alma mater, Virginia Tech, during the 2002-03 academic year. In Blacksburg, Halfpenny served as the Hokies' head recruiting coordinator, travel coordinator and offensive coordinator. Halfpenny began her collegiate coaching career at Brown University as an assistant during the 2001 and 2002 seasons.

An active camp coach and counselor since 2000, Halfpenny directed the Duke Winter Lacrosse Camp in 2004-05 and has served as an assistant director at a variety of camps across the country. She is also an active member of both US Lacrosse and the IWLCA, serving on the coaches association growth committee in 2002-03.

Under Halfpenny's guidance, the College has hosted a number of clinics as well as a junior day event last spring.

A 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Halfpenny was a four-year letterwinner in lacrosse and a starter on the 1999 Hokies team that captured the Atlantic 10 Championship. She received the team's Coaches Award that year and was a member of the Athletic Directors Honor Roll in 1998 and 1999.

After graduating from Virginia Tech, Halfpenny worked at Cave Spring High School in Roanoke, where she was the head coach of the boys and girls varsity swimming team and assistant varsity tennis coach. She guided the boys swim team to Valley District, Northwest Region and AAA State titles in 2000.

A native of Latham, N.Y., Halfpenny and her husband, Matt, have two sons: Jackson, 3, and Cole, born on Jan. 9, 2009. Matt Halfpenny is Tennis Facility Coordinator at the Folkes-Stevens Indoor Tennis Center at Old Dominion University.

After an incredibly successful first season as William and Mary's top assistant coach, Allison Evans returns for her second year with the Tribe.

A former all-conference midfielder at W&M and a member of the U.S. National team, Evans was instrumental in leading the College to a No. 1 seed in the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament and a final national ranking of 20th. Additionally, the Tribe registered victories in eight of its final 11 contests and made an appearance in the CAA championship game. Among the College's four wins against ranked teams, two of them came against top-10 opponents (Stanford and George Mason).

In addition to the squad's success, Evans helped a number of W&M players earn individual honors. Five players were selected to all-conference teams, while Jaime Sellers garnered Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) All-South Region Second Team honors.

Evans' primary responsibilities include working with the Tribe's attack, as well as practice planning and overseeing the team's fitness program. Additionally, Evans serves as the program's recruiting coordinator and travel coordinator, as well as assisting with administrative duties for camps and clinics.

"I am excited to welcome Allison back to W&M to begin her coaching career," said Head Coach Christine Halfpenny upon the hiring in the fall of 2007. "Allison is a very bright, energetic, and hard-working coach. With Allison's playing experience at W&M and with the U.S. Elite team, she knows what it takes to compete at the highest level."

This January, Evans served as a presenter at the 2009 US Lacrosse National Convention in Baltimore, Md. Evans discussed effective coaching techniques of successful dodging. Her presentation covered various dodges, points of emphasis when teaching them, catch words and phrases to use and drills to help refine and teach skills necessary to execute a dodge.

In the summer of 2006, Evans was named to the United States Elite Team. The 24-player Elite team is comprised of individuals who demonstrate their exceptional abilities as lacrosse players with regard to skill, but also through leadership and sportsmanship.

At the College, Evans was a two-time All-CAA selection (2002, 2003) and a team captain during her senior season. Evans recorded 116 career points on 85 goals and 31 assists for the Tribe.

As a junior in 2002, Evans was a second-team all-conference selection after sharing the team-lead with a career-best 52 points on 33 goals and 19 assists. At the time, Evans' total of 19 assists was the 10th-best single-season mark in school history. She added a team-best 41 draw controls, which ranked fourth in the CAA, and also finished among the league's top-10 with 22 caused turnovers.

During her senior campaign, Evans once again shared the team lead with 43 points on a career-best 34 goals and nine assists. Evans also recorded career marks in ground balls (41) and caused turnovers (28) as a senior to once again earn second-team all-league honors. In the final game of her career, Evans scored six goals and added two assists for eight points in an 18-10 victory against Towson.

Prior to joining the Tribe program in 2007, Evans worked as a financial analyst for JPI, a real estate developer in McLean, Va., and an asset analyst for the Mills Corporation in Chevy Chase, Md. After graduating from W&M in 2003, Evans served as the lacrosse coach at St. Mary's School in England for a year and later at Annandale High School, her alma mater.

A native of Annandale, Va., Evans graduated from W&M with a degree in psychology.

Duke also claimed the Atlantic Coast Conference championship in 2005. During her final three seasons Coll was coached by Halfpenny, who was an assistant with the program from 2004-06.

A member of one of the nation's top defensive teams, Coll earned the squad's Most Improved Player Award in 2004 and was selected to the ACC Honor Roll three times. She also served on the Student Athletic Advisory Committee (SAAC) and was Duke's representative at ACC meetings.

While at Duke, Coll worked as a counselor at numerous summer and winter lacrosse camps. She has also served as a camp director at Archbishop John Carroll High School (Wayne, Pa.).

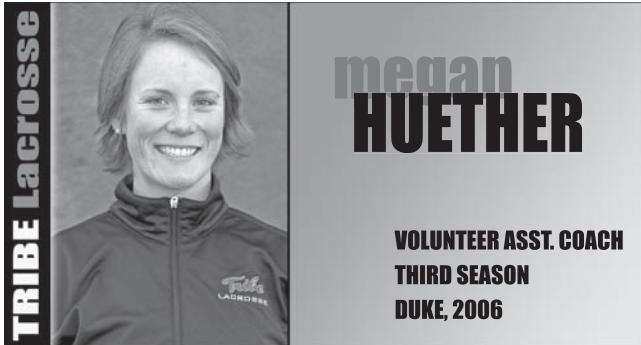

After serving as a full-time assistant coach with the Tribe during the past two seasons, Megan Huether will remain on the staff as a volunteer assistant this year.

A former All-American goalkeeper at Duke University and recently selected to the 2008-09 U.S. national teams, Huether played an important role in William and Mary's success last season. In addition to helping W&M secure the top seed in the Colonial Athletic Association tournament, the College registered victories in eight of its final 11 games, advanced to the conference championship game and earned a final national ranking of 20th. Among the Tribe's victories were four triumphs against ranked teams, including wins versus top-10 opponents Stanford and George Mason.

Primarily assisting with the team's defense and goalkeepers, she was instrumental in the development and success of freshman all-conference goalkeeper Emily Geary. In addition to leading the CAA and ranking 12th nationally with 10.16 saves per game, Geary was fifth in the country with 193 saves. She also ranked second in the league with a .483 save percentage, a figure that ranked 17th nationally.

Geary's all-conference selection marked the second consecutive year in which Huether helped a Tribe player garner all-league honors. In 2007, freshman goalkeeper Sara Beckstead earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie Team as the first-year netminder ranked third in the CAA with 9.88 saves per game.

Huether began her collegiate coaching career at W&M in the summer of 2006 under her former position coach after completing a standout four-year career at Duke. A two-time All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection, Huether was named a First-Team All-American and the National Goalkeeper of the Year by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) in 2005 after helping lead the Blue Devils to an ACC title and the semifinals of the NCAA Lacrosse Championship.

With Huether, a four-year starter in goal, Duke recorded three consecutive trips to the NCAA Championship (2004, 2005, 2006), including another semifinal appearance in 2006. Additionally, the Blue Devils posted an overall record of 61-18 during her career, which included a school-record 18 victories in 2006.

A native of Lutherville, Md., Huether graduated in May of 2006 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and was a three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll selection as well as a three-time Dean's List member.

Active off the field as well, Huether served as the program's summer office assistant in 2005 and was the team's council representative from 2004-06. She also spent time as a student intern with the KidScope Early Intervention Program in Hillsborough, N.C., served as a classroom assistant with the Duke School for Children and was a student assistant with Duke's Children's Campus.

A member of the U.S. National Developmental team from 2004 to 2006, Huether also has experience coaching high school goalkeepers and working at a number of lacrosse camps, including Stanford Lacrosse Camp, the Bryn Mawr School Lacrosse Camp in Baltimore and the Between the Pipes Goalie Camp in Reisterstown, Md.

Huether is also currently pursuing a master's degree in counseling at W&M.

# THE COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY

The College of William and Mary is a public university located in Williamsburg, Va. Founded in 1693 by Royal Charter issued by King William III and Queen Mary II of England, William and Mary is the second oldest college in the country after Harvard. William and Mary has a long history of liberal arts education and a growing research and science curriculum that demonstrates a strong commitment to undergraduate research. The College, which became a state university in 1906, has been designated a "Public Ivy," and for nine straight years has been ranked by U.S. News & World Report as sixth-best public university in the country – and the nation's top small public university.

Also referred to as "the alma mater of a nation," the College has educated four U.S. Presidents -- George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler, which is the third most of any college in the country. William and Mary also claims several firsts, including the 1776 creation of Phi Beta Kappa -- the country's first academic honor society -- the first honor code of conduct for college students, and the first collegiate law school, established in 1779. William and Mary is also home to the Sir Christopher Wren Building – the country's oldest academic building still in use – and the President's House, the oldest home of a university president still in use.

## William and Mary Facts:

- In addition to four U.S. Presidents, William and Mary has educated a number of this country's key historical figures, including U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice John Marshall and 16 signers of the Declaration of Independence.
- More recent famous alumni from William and Mary include U.S. Secretary of Defense Robert Gates ('65), the late David Brown ('78) (astronaut on the Columbia Shuttle), actress Glenn Close ('74), comedian John Stewart ('84), fashion designer Perry Ellis ('61), actor Patton Oswalt ('91), the late Mark McCormack ('51) (founder of sports and celebrity agency IMG), actress Linda Lavin ('59), NASCAR and Gibbs Racing's J.D. Gibbs ('91), Minnesota Vikings star Darren Sharper ('97), and Pittsburgh Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin ('95).
- In 2008, William and Mary recognized as 5th-highest producer of Peace Corps volunteers among mid-sized schools (5,000-15,000 students). As of January 2008, 51 W&M alumni are serving. Since the Peace Corps' inception, 499 W&M alumni have volunteered with the Corps, making the university the 82nd-highest producer of volunteers of all time.
- For 2007-2008, the College had more Fulbright Scholars than any other college of university in Virginia, and it had the highest application-to-award rate among nation's top research institutions. In 2006-2007, 12 William and Mary students were named Fulbright Scholars. Eleven received the honor in 2007-08 and scholars are studying in countries such as Argentina, Hungary, Uganda, Sweden, Senegal, and Ecuador.
- In 2008, U.S. News ranked William and Mary sixth among all public colleges and universities and 33rd out of all universities – both public and private. The William & Mary Law School ranked tied for 30th in 2008 by U.S. News. The Mason School Business ranked 40th in nation (2008) by Financial Times and 71st in the world. William and Mary ranked 4th-best bargain in higher education by Kiplinger's in 2008. Newsweek magazine named W&M "hottest small state university" in 2006.
- In 2008, W&M received a record number of applications for undergraduate admission for the 3rd year in a row. More than 11,500 undergraduate applications were received.
- According to a recent survey, William and Mary students contribute 323,000 hours of community service per year. Seventy-five percent of undergraduates and 50 percent of graduate students report they volunteered during their time at the College. Ninety percent of undergraduates report they will volunteer in the community they reside in following graduation.

# TRIBE ATHLETICS

## A SUCCESSFUL BALANCE

### ATHLETIC SUCCESS

• The 2007-08 season was another strong year for the College, as Tribe teams added four more CAA titles to bring the school's all-time league-leading total to 92. W&M also had eight different program's represented at the NCAA Championship level in some capacity.

• The men's cross country squad won its eighth consecutive CAA crown in the fall, while the women's cross country team won its fifth straight. The women's track and field team won its seventh CAA Championship in the last eight years, while the women's tennis team added its 20th all-time CAA crown in the 23-year history of the league during the spring.

• In total, W&M had five conference players of the year, five conference scholar-athletes of the year, 18 All-Americans and 100 athletes earned all-conference honors in their respective sports during the 2007-08 season.

• Individually, the women's tennis doubles team of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic garnered All-America honors by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Moulton-Levy also became the first Tribe athlete and only the fourth in CAA history to win conference player of the year honors for a fourth time. Katie Radloff, who garnered CAA Swimmer of the Year and Swimmer of the Championships honors for the second straight season, earned a spot in the NCAA Swimming Championships for the second time in as many years. Christo Laundry earned All-America honors for the third time in cross country and also won the CAA Individual Championship. Women's soccer player Claire Zimmeck garnered CAA Player of the Year honors for the second straight season and was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy. Additionally, Emily Anderson earned All-America honors with a fifth-place finish in the 1,500m, marking the best Tribe finish in 14 years.

**ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

• The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student-athlete's academic responsibilities, as W&M ranked fourth, the highest of any athletic scholarship-granting school and of any public school, among the Division I teams when the NCAA released its inaugural Academic Progress Rate scores in 2005.

• In a recent NCAA survey on graduation rates, William and Mary athletic teams set the standard for academic excellence – 13 teams graduated 100 percent of their players. The overall graduation rate for our athletes is 96 percent (higher than 86 percent for the entire student body).

• There have been 45 student athletes elected to Phi Beta Kappa in the past ten years. Four Rhodes Scholars were W&M student-athletes.

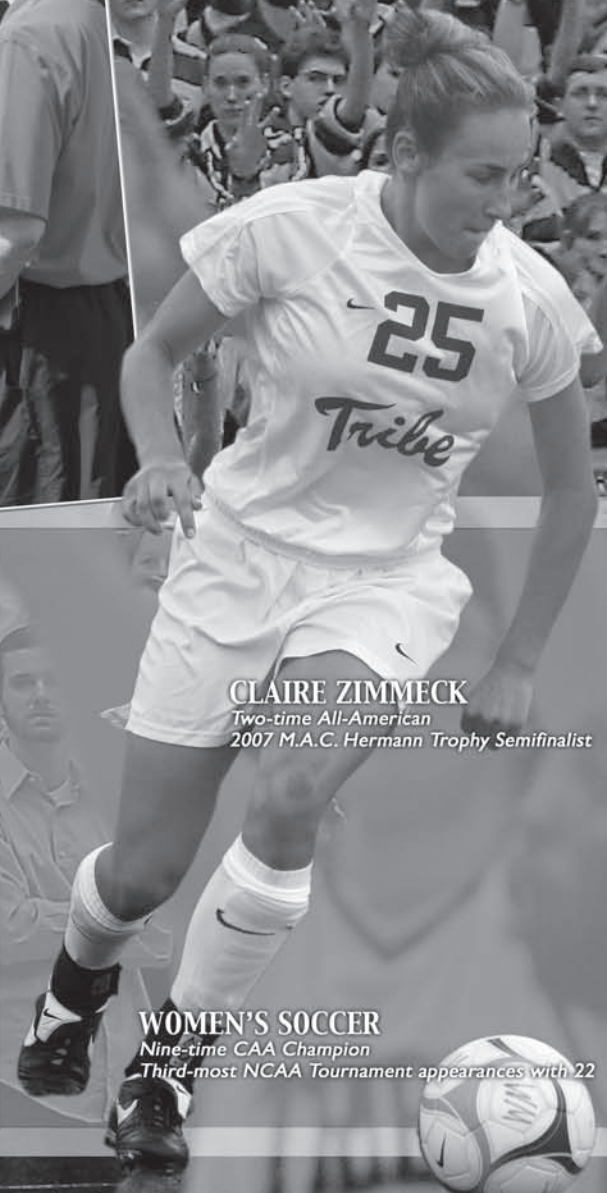
• The William and Mary men's gymnastics program won named as the 2008 College Gymnastics Coaches Association National Academic Team Championship by virtue of having the highest team cumulative GPA of any men's program in the nation. Longtime Tribe head coach Cliff Gauthier has mentored the program to four National Academic Team titles.

• In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its sports, and not surprisingly, W&M has set the pace with 25 winners in the six-year history of the award.

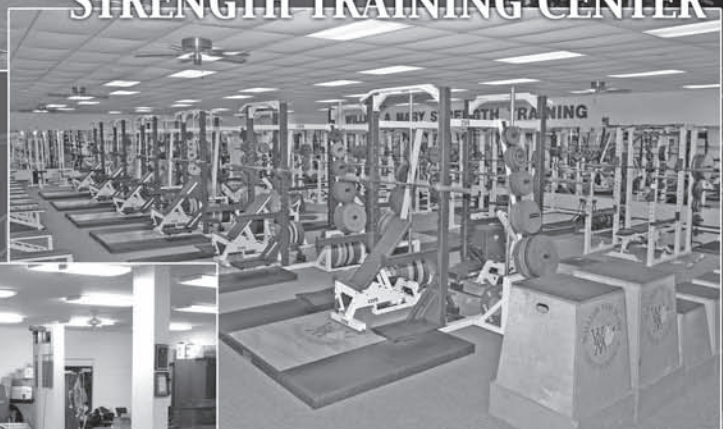
# TRIBE FACILITIES
