Under Endowment Association Jurisdiction

- FAYETTE F. CLINE SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1968) - "scholarship to a worthy athlete" - no action, except discussion with Athletic Department
- WILLIAM F. GEORGE & JEAN GEORGE SYKES SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1970) - annual award to young ladies in need, with preference given to ladies from New York or New Jersey. Request James S. Kelly to talk with Mr. & Mrs. Macrae Sykes about sex restrictions
- IRVIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1943) - early correspondence indicates it was for both men and women, but always given to men - "to be used to assist a scholar" - no action, except discussion with Athletic Department
- GLENN D. MANN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1966) - no restrictions other than past practice - no action
- ROBERT MCNAMARA SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1964) - annual assistance for athletic scholarship in football; consider part of the pooling and discuss with Athletic Department
- NORFOLK COLLEGE ALUMNAE ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1958) - for young women from Norfolk, Tidewater area - no action; but considered part of the pooling concept.
- REX W. D. SMITH, JR. SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1960) - to student entering field of journalism - no action
- JOHN B. LIGHTFOOT SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1931) - scholarship known as John B. Lightfoot Scholarship for deserving young men - no action; considered part of the pooling concept.
- MARY MINOR LIGHTFOOT SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1931) - scholarship known as Mary Minor Lightfoot Scholarship for deserving young women - no action, considered part of the pooling concept
- JOSEPH SCHOOLFIELD POTTS, JR. SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1960) - annual financial aid to white male or female (Southern). Letter by Thomas A. Graves, Jr. to Mrs. Joseph Schoolfield Potts requesting deletion of restrictions
- MRS. EDITH NORMENT LUMBYE SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1966) - annual financial aid to white male or female from Virginia. Letter by Thomas A. Graves, Jr. to Mrs. Joseph Schoolfield Potts requesting deletion of restrictions

CARTER WHITE SCHOLARSHIP FUND (1964) - to male/female relative to donor then, if none, to worthy or needy male student from Fluvanna or Culpepper County; if none, then to worthy or needy Virginia male student, preferably an athlete.
