First All the yearly rents and profits of the s ai d Manner of Brofferton as well as those incurred due since the purchase thereof or which shall hereafter grow due (after the deduction there out of 90 1 a year to the Colledg for propagateing the Gospel in New Engl and and other necessary or insidental charges) shall be by the present and future Receiver of the rents thereof paid into the hands of Agent in London for the President and Masters of the Colledg of William and Mary in Virginia and to all future Agent or Agents in England for the said Colledge in order to transmitt the same to Virginia to the President and Master of the said Colledg for the time being for the purposes hereafter mentioned, and such Agent or Agents receipts or accquittances shall be suffitient discharge to such Receiver or Receivers for (Colembia) which shall be see paid

Secondly All Summe and Summes of mony already and that shall be hereafter rec[eive]d out of the s[ai]d mannor (subject to the deducons afors[ai]d) shall be hereafter remitted to the President and Masters of the said Colledg for the time being 3. The said President and masters and his and their successors shall thereout expend soe much as shall be necessary toward fitting and furnishing lodgings and Rooms for such Indian children as shall be hereafter brought unto the s[ai]d Colledg as also for buying or procureing such children
- 4. The said President and Masters and his and their successors shall keep at the s[ai]d colledg soe many Indian children in sickness and healthe, in meat drink washing lodging Cloathes Medicines books and Educacion from the first begining of letters till they are ready to receive orders and be thought sufficient to *preache* be sent abroad to preach and convert the Indians at the rate of the per Annum for every such child as the yearly income of the premisses (subject to the deductions afores[ai]d) shall amount winto.
- 5. That the care Instruction and education of such children as shall be hereafter placed in the said colledg shall be left to the President and master thereof for the time being but yet subject therein (as they are for Xall their othere trusts) to the visitation or Inspection of the Rector and Governor of the said colledg for the time being
- 6. That the saild President and master and his

and their successors shall once every year transmitt to the Earle of Burlington and the Lord Bishop of London for the time being a particular accompt of what summe or summes of mony they shall hereafter receive by vertue of these presents or also lay out or expend on all or any the matters afores [ai]d and the occasion or accasions thereof as also the Number and Names of the Indian children that shall be hereafter brought into the sail d colledg together with their progress or proficiency in their studys and of all otherematters relateing thereto of That 7. That thethe laying out the mony from time to time hereafter to be remitted as also the Manner and Method of educateing and instructing such children and all other matters relateing to the Charity or the Execucion of it shall be subject to such other Rules and Methods as shall from time to time hereafter be transmitted to the sail d President and Master and his and their successors by the Earle of Burlington and Lord Bishop of London for the time being and in defalt thereof to such Rules and Methods as the Rector and Governours of the s[ai]d Colledg for the time being shall make or appoint but until such ® other and further Rules be made the Rules and directions hereby given are to take place.

8. And that the name of the benefactor may not be forgotten wee the saild Earle of Burlington and Lord Bishop of London doe direct and appoint that the saild Charity shall be hereafter called (The Charity of the Honble Robert Boyle of the City of London deceased).
