OUTLOOK

The William and Mary volleyball team returns every starter and all but one player from the 2007 squad that advanced to the Colonial Athletic Association tournament, which gives first-year head coach **Melissa Aldrich Shelton '91** a great feeling as she returns to her alma mater as the seventh coach in the program's 37 year history.

"We're expecting a lot of great things this year," Shelton said. "Having everybody back that saw court time last fall puts us in the driver's seat in terms of experience right out of the gate. We're playing some nice competition in the early part of the season that should get us ready for CAA play. If we can stay healthy and be consistent, we're going to have a really nice year."

Setters

One of many positions that should be rock-solid for the Tribe this year is the setter's spot.

"I believe our setting duo has to be one of the most talented in the CAA," Shelton said. "We return both, and each have a great deal of playing experience. [Senior] Kim [Mount] is the frontrunner going into the season for the starting spot, but [sophomore] Cassie [Crumal] is a little bit taller and has terrific hands as well. I have confidence that both could go in and run our offense well. I'm very confident in our setters and I know we're going to get great production from the position."

Kim Mount enters her final campaign with many of the program's career records in reach, but more importantly, ready to lead the Tribe to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2001. Currently the program's career leader in assists per set with 11.82, Mount exhibited her usual outstanding play in 2007, earning second-team All-CAA and all-state honors despite missing most of the early-season schedule.

Sophomore **Cassie Crumal** gives Shelton a skilled second option behind Mount. As a freshman, Crumal shouldered the load of being the team's starter while Mount was out and acquitted herself very well. Crumal earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors in each of the first two weeks of the season, and recorded the team's season-best effort with 66 assists against Liberty.

Hitters

The team's six outside hitters have an incredible amount of talent, and the bulk of the playing time will go to the players who can best channel that talent on the court each and every day.

"Outsides are our gray area right now," Shelton said. "We have a lot of them, but we have some that are better at passing than hitting and some that are better at hitting than passing. We're going to use the preseason to see which ones step up and perform consistently in all aspects of the game."

Senior **Abbi Owens** is the dean of the hitting corps, and looks to recapture the form she displayed in 2006 when she led the Tribe with 315 kills and ranked eighth in the conference with 3.71 kills per set. A highly motivated and competitive player, Owens has the ability to be one of the most effective hitters in the conference.

Erin Skipper will be counted on to continue her development and challenge as one of best hitters on the team after a solid freshman effort in 2007. Last year, she led the Tribe and ranked ninth in the CAA with 3.36 kills per set, earning Rookie of the Week honors twice.

Lauren Powell grew tremendously as a player last year and has the ability to continue that same pace this fall in her third season with the Tribe. She ranked second on the team with 232 kills (2.97 per set) in 2007.

Classmate **Bryana Carey** is one of the most talented servers in the entire conference, pounding in 68 aces over the past two seasons. She is also able to effectively hit from both sides of the court, allowing the Tribe to vary its attack.

Junior **Jillian Brown** is a tircless worker who will look to see her playing time further increase this year after ranking among the team's top three attackers in 2007. She was selected to the Tribe Classic all-tournament team last fall, and totaled 10 double-digit kill performances.

Shelton adds one freshman to the hitting group this year in **Brooke Bauernfeind**. A powerful hitter out of Broad Run high school in Ashburn, Virginia, Bauernfeind earned first-team all-state and all-region honors as a senior and was a three-time all-district player.

"We have a lot of strength and potential in the hitters, but it's just a matter of who can bring it every single day."

Middles

A strong spring and an excellent pick-up in recruiting has Shelton excited about the potential in the middle position this fall.


"Our middle core, the three returning middles, made huge strides, each one of them, in their game last spring," said Shelton. "With the addition of [freshman] Anne [Dorff], I feel we have four middles who are all going to be fighting it out for starting spots. With a little luck and a little health we'll be really deep in the middle position all year providing us with a lot of different looks. I'm excited about our middles and what they can do. I know it's going to be a really strong position for us."

Senior **Molly Bohman** led the middle blockers last year and will be counted on to do so again in her final campaign. A versatile player, she is able to play at any spot along the front line. Bohman led the team and ranked among the top 10 players in the conference with 123 blocks (1.1 per game), and also ranked fifth on the team with 177 kills.

Katie McCarney missed much of last season with injuries, but is now fully healed and will be counted on to quickly resume her playing form of 2006. As a freshman, she was one of the top contributors on the team, and closed her year averaging 2.47 kills per set over the final five contests.

Sophomore **Ginny Bray** earned CAA All-Rookie accolades in 2007, and will be one of the top players to watch in the conference this season. One of the team's tallest players at 6' 1", Bray ranked first on the team with 1.17 blocks per set and her total of 115 put-backs was second.

The Tribe's other newcomer to complement Bauernfeind is **Anne Dorff**, an area-Player of the Year according to several media outlets as a senior at Walsh Jesuit in Kent, Ohio. Named second-team All-Ohio, Dorff captained the squad her senior year and led the team in attack percentage and total blocks.

Defensive Specialists/Liberos

Shelton will be able to count on a trio of veterans in the role of defensive stopper this season, while also utilizing the talent of the outside hitters to bolster the defenses when needed.

"Not only do we have the three people who are specializing in defense who have an amazing amount of experience (with two seniors and one junior), but most of our outsides are pretty confident in the back row as well," said Shelton. "I believe we'll be the best defensive team in the conference; going by the stats from last year, who's returning, and how good our defense was in the spring."

"It's going to be hard to put a ball down on us, especially if we can train our blockers to just touch a few more balls and close a little bit faster. We're going make a lot of plays that impress the crowd and keep the rallies going."

Jill Nowadly led the team in receiving percentage, only missing on 26 of 782 reception attempts (.967). She was also the team's top digger, averaging 4.36 digs per set (488 total).

Jo Sotto was in on roughly one-quarter of the season's points while splitting time with Nowadly last year, and after a productive off-season will challenge for a greater share of playing time this campaign. She had a .940 receiving percentage on 348 attempts and claimed 293 digs in 112 sets in 2007, while also chipping in 19 aces on the offensive end.

Junior **Lindsey Pflugner** makes the switch this season to defensive specialist after serving as an outside hitter for the past two years. A terrific all-around player, Pflugner was second on the team last year with 331 digs (2.98 per set).

Head Coach First Season B.A. History William and Mary '91 M.S. Exercise Science Arkansas State '93

William and Mary alumna Melissa Aldrich Shelton '91 returns home for the 2008 season as the seventh head coach in the history of Tribe volleyball after spending 13 years patrolling the court for the University of Virginia. She is the first Tribe graduate to helm the volleyball program, taking over the reins upon the retirement of Debbie Hill in January after 30 years of coaching.

During her time at the helm of UVA's program, Shelton compiled a 235-179 overall record and guided the Cavaliers to pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. The at-large berths, coming in consecutive seasons (1998, 1999), were the program's initial appearances in the national tournament. Additionally, Shelton led Virginia to five 20-win seasons, highlighted by a 26-win campaign in 1998 that marked the second-most victories in school history.

Named as the State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Association of Sports Information Directors three times, Shelton was by far the longest-tenured and most successful coach in

UVA's history. She coached the Cavaliers in 43% of the programs matches and wins under her direction account for 48% of the school's total. All six of Virginia's All-Americans excelled under her tutelage, and her players also won all but three of the program's all-region and 26 out of 45 All-ACC honors.

Her student-athletes also excelled in the classroom, earning a 100% graduation rate since 1996.

Prior to taking over the reigns as head coach at Virginia, Shelton served as an assistant at Clemson University from 1993-95. During her tenure with the Tigers, she helped the team win 55 matches and achieve its first ever NCAA Tournament bids, as the squad earned back-to-back berths in 1993 and 1994.

Shelton's first coaching position was at Arkansas State University, where she served as an assistant from 1991-93. She helped the Indians to a pair of Sun Belt Conference championships, as the program garnered its first-ever NCAA Tournament bid in 1992.

A three-year starter for the Tribe, Shelton was elected as a team captain during her junior and senior seasons. She helped W&M claim four consecutive CAA titles and earn two National Invitational Volleyball Championship appearances. An All-CAA selection as a junior, she was chosen to the CAA All-Tournament Team during her senior season.

Shelton graduated from the College in 1991 with a B.A. in history, and earned a Master's in exercise science while at Arkansas State. A native of Long Beach, California, Shelton and her husband, Gordon, reside in Williamsburg with their three-year-old son, Andrew.

RACHEL WAGENER

Assistant Coach Second Season B.S. Kinesiology Maryland '06

After completing an outstanding playing career as a middle blocker at the University of Maryland, Rachel Wagener begins her second season as an assistant coach with William and Mary.

Wagener is instrumental in all aspects of the Tribe program, including technical training, scouting, video analysis, inmatch strategy, and recruiting. In practice, she works primarily with the middle blockers.

One of the most prolific blockers in Terrapin history, Wagener helped lead the team to three ACC championships and was selected as a honorable mention All-American by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) following her junior and senior seasons. She finished her career as the school record holder for total blocks (649), block assists (565) and career hitting percentage (.341). Additionally, she established the program's single-season block assists record (177) as a sophomore.

Following her collegiate career, she was one of 16 athletes selected to participate in the First Annual AVP Beach Tryout. Additionally, she was one of eight players chosen for the first-time beach volleyball Collegiate Nationals.

An All-America selection at Maryland, Wagener was also named to the 2005 Collegiate Volleyball Update Stellar Spikers Second Team. One of the ACC's top players throughout her career, she was chosen to the All-ACC First Team as a senior after being tabbed with second-team honors the previous two seasons. During her rookie season with the Terrapins, she was selected to the ACC All-Freshman Team. She also garnered AVCA All-East Region accolades in 2004 and 2005.

During her senior season, Wagener ranked 11th nationally with 1.61 blocks per game, while her .380 hitting percentage ranked 20th in the country. She also experienced great success as a sophomore when she set UM's single-season block assists record. That year, she led the ACC in blocks per game (1.50) and became the first Maryland player to register 200 total blocks. Additionally, she ranked first nationally in blocking three times during the season.

Prior to attending Maryland, Wagener had a heralded prep career at Oscar Smith High School in Chesapeake, Va. Highly recruited by a number of Division-I programs, she was selected to attend the USA Volleyball Camp in Louisville, Ky., during the summer of 2000. She was also a first-team all-district and all-region honoree her final three seasons.

During each of her years at Maryland, Wagener assisted with the Janice Kruger Volleyball Camp.

She earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Maryland in 2006, and currently resides in Williamsburg.

Marlowe graduated as the all-time career leader for assists per game with 11.43, and second all-time in total assists (5,475).

When a student-athlete commits to play volleyball at William and Mary, she becomes part of a very special program. First of all, the College is rich in tradition. For more than 300 years, W&M has been in the business of education and is the second-oldest institution of higher learning in the nation. W&M's noble roots go back to its charter from England in 1693.

The volleyball program also boasts a proud past. Debbie Hill guided its fortunes over the past 30 years before retiring at the end of the 2007 season with a record of 566 wins and 407 losses. Hill's greatest achievement, however, was not her winning percentage on the court but her impeccable graduation rate among her student-athletes. Volleyball players who progress through the William and Mary program not only compete in a Division I setting but also receive one of the finest educations in the country. Each of the last two years, the volleyball team was honored with the Public Recognition Award by the NCAA for achieving a perfect graduation rate. Additionally, W&M has also been a recipient of the Team Academic Award from the AVCA.

The William and Mary family came full circle on January 18, 2008, when Athletics Director Terry Driscoll announced the hiring of Melissa Aldrich Shelton '91 to become the College's seventh head volleyball coach. She is the first alumna to take the reins in the 37-year history of the program.

W&M graduates span the continuum of professions. A glimpse at the roster of volleyball alumnae on the following pages confirms this diversity. Physicians and archeologists, computer analysts and corporate bankers, lawyers

and teachers, veterinarians and business executives, biologists and chemists, coaches and researchers — the list is varied, yet they all share a common bond: W&M volleyball.

W&M volleyball players represent an eclectic blend of talents. Some athletes could have played in top 20 programs but opted to focus on their academic goals. Other players are walk-ons who have passed up scholarship opportunities to attend W&M. Although W&M may not be a top 10 program, that does not eclipse the experience of playing in the "big time."

Life at William and Mary is more than balancing academics and athletics. Tribe athletes also take advantage of numerous volunteer activities, and they have the opportunity to join sororities and participate in intramurals. Many have been active in Housing Partnership projects. Others have helped with the campus day care program, the Muscarelle Museum, or Big Brother/Big Sister programs. Whatever the inclination, the athlete is encouraged to expand her horizons and develop individually. At William and Mary, volleyball is time-consuming and requires dedication — but not at the expense of educating the whole person.

In addition, the Tribe has been tremendously successful at the conference level as evidenced by eight Colonial Athletic Association championships. The team has also seen time in the national spotlight with its first appearance in the NCAA Volleyball Tournament in 2001.

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

- The 2007-08 season was another strong year for the College, as Tribe teams added four more CAA titles to bring the school's all-time league-leading total to 92. W&M also had eight different program's represented at the NCAA Championship level in some capacity.
- · The men's cross country squad won its eighth consecutive CAA crown in the fall, while the women's cross country team won its fifth straight. The women's track and field team won its seventh CAA Championship in the last eight years, while the women's tennis team added its 20th all-time CAA crown in the 23-year history of the league during the spring
- In total, W&M had five conference players of the year, five conference scholar-athletes of the year, 18 All-Americans and 100 athletes earned all-conference honors in their respective sports during the 2007-08 season.
- Individually, the women's tennis doubles team of Megan Moulton-Levy and Katarina Zoricic garnered All-America honors by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Moulton-Levy also became the first Tribe athlete and only the fourth in CAA history to win conference player of the year honors for a fourth time. Katie Radloff, who garnered CAA Swimmer of the Year and Swimmer of the Championships honors for the second straight season, earned a spot in the NCAA Swimming Championships for the second time in as many years. Christo Laundry earned All-America honors for the third time in cross country and also won the CAA Individual Championship. Women's soccer player Claire Zimmeck garnered CAA Player of the Year honors for the second straight season and was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy. Additionally, Emily Anderson earned All-America honors with a fifthplace finish in the 1,500m, marking the best Tribe finish in 14 years.

- The Tribe's athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of its student-athlete's academic responsibilities, as W&M ranked fourth, the highest of any athletic scholarship-granting school and of any public school, among the Division I teams when the NCAA released its inaugural Academic Progress Rate scores in 2005.
- In a recent NCAA survey on graduation rates, William and Mary athletic teams set the standard for academic excellence - 13 teams graduated 100 percent of their players. The overall graduation rate for our athletes is 96 percent (higher than 86 percent for the entire student body).
- There have been 45 student athletes elected to Phi Beta Kappa in the past ten years. Four Rhodes Scholars were W&M student-athletes
- The College's Athletics Department showed a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 86 percent among its student-athletes who entered school on athletics scholarships in the 2000-01 athletics year in data released by the NCAA in 2007.
- The national average among all Division I schools was 63 percent. W&M is tops in both the CAA and among all Division I Virginia schools.
- In 2002-03, the CAA created a Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in each of its sports, and not surprisingly, W&M has set the pace with 25 winners in the six-year history of the award.

THE COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY

The College of William and Mary is a public university located in Williamsburg, Va. Founded in 1693 by Royal Charter issued by King William III and Queen Mary II of England, William and Mary is the second oldest college in the country after Harvard. William and Mary has a long history of liberal arts education and a growing research and science curriculum that demonstrates a strong commitment to undergraduate research. The College, which became a state university in 1906, has been designated a "Public Ivy," and for nine straight years has been ranked by U.S. News & World Report as sixth-best public university in the country – and the nation's top small public university.

Also referred to as "the alma mater of a nation," the College has educated four U.S. Presidents - George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler, which is the third most of any college in the country. William and Mary also claims several firsts, including the 1776 creation of Phi Beta Kappa -- the country's first academic honor society -- the first honor code of conduct for college students, and the first collegiate law school, established in 1779. William and Mary is also home to the Sir Christopher Wren Building - the country's oldest academic building still in use - and the President's House, the oldest home of a university president still in use.

WILLIAM AND MARY FACTS:

- In addition to four U.S. Presidents, William and Mary has educated a number of this country's key historical figures, including U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice John Marshall and 16 signers of the Declaration of Independence.
- More recent famous alumni from William and Mary include U.S. Secretary of Defense Robert Gates ('65), the late David Brown ('78) (astronaut on the Columbia Shuttle), actress Glenn Close ('74), comedian John Stewart ('84), fashion designer Perry Ellis ('61), actor Patton Oswalt ('91), the late Mark McCormack ('51) (founder of sports and celebrity agency IMG), actress Linda Lavin ('59), NASCAR and Gibbs Racing's J.D. Gibbs ('91), Minnesota Vikings star Darren Sharper ('97), and Pittsburgh Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin ('95).
- In 2008, William and Mary recognized as 5th-highest producer of Peace Corps volunteers among midsized schools (5,000-15,000 students). As of January 2008, 51 W&M alumni are serving. Since the Peace Corps' inception, 499 W&M alumni have volunteered with the Corps, making the university the 82nd-highest producer of volunteers of all time.
- For 2007-2008, the College had more Fulbright Scholars than any other college of university in Virginia, and it had the highest application-to-award rate among nation's top research institutions. In 2006-2007, 12 William and Mary students were named Fulbright Scholars. Eleven received the honor in 2007-08 and scholars are studying in countries such as Argentina, Hungary, Uganda, Sweden, Senegal, and Ecuador
- In 2008, U.S. News ranked William and Mary sixth among all public colleges and universities and 33rd out of all universities both public and private. The William & Mary Law School ranked tied for 30th in 2008 by U.S. News. The Mason School Business ranked 40th in nation (2008) by Financial Times and 71st in the world. William and Mary ranked 4th-best bargain in higher education by Kiplinger's in 2008. Newsweek magazine named W&M "hottest small state university" in 2006.
- In 2008, W&M received a record number of applications for undergraduate admission for the 3rd year in a row. More than 11,500 undergraduate applications were received.
- According to a recent survey, William and Mary students contribute 323,000 hours of community service per year. Seventy-five percent of undergraduates and 50 percent of graduate students report they volunteered during their time at the College. Ninety percent of undergraduates report they will volunteer in the community they reside in following graduation.

TRIBE FACILITIES

William and Mary is committed to building and maintaining outstanding facilities for all 21 of its varsity athletic teams. The College has demonstrated this commitment by investing approximately \$16 million toward the construction and upgrade of its athletics facilities during just the last five years. Among W&M's recent projects was the construction of the \$11 million, 30,000-square foot Jimmye Laycock Football Center, which was dedicated this past June. In recent years, the College has hosted NCAA tournament events for football and women's tennis, while a number of other W&M programs have hosted conference championships at Tribe venues.






