

Gov't To Spend Many **Billions Next 5 Years**

practically over, defense effort might be cut to a great extent.

They also stated that more defense work was also coming thru, and that more and more factories have been using more of their time and equipment for this sort of work.

Ops who believed that new equipment production would continue unstated should now change their entire line of reasoning, according to leaders here.

They should, as has been urged on them in weeks past, attempt to anticipate their needs, and order as far in advance as possible, to assure them-selves having whatever new equip-ment will be necessary to profitably conduct their businesses in the future.







"The Confidential Price Lists" reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depends on the subscriber to make average price adjustments to fit the peculiarities of his territory.

METHOD: "The Confidential Price Lists" should be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week; Second price listed is highest price. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.


