

# Canadian Music Op Clicks With 10c Juke Box Play

## Suggests Idea For 10¢ Pinballs

OTTAWA, ONT., CANADA—E. A. (Ernie) Dowsett of Atlas Music Company, this city, has changed over to 10c play on his old and new juke boxes and finds that his earnings have increased.

Ernie is using a method which was in practice by some ops sometime ago. That of blocking the 5c coin chute and thereby forcing the public to use either dimes or quarters.

In short, Dowsett is not giving the public 1 play for 10c, he is, instead, forcing dimes and quarters to be used in his machines. By such action he finds that his earnings have increased all down the line.

He writes, "Our phonograph returns have been surprisingly increased by eliminating the five cent play.

"On our older machines we just block the 5c chute, and on our newer machines we place a sign saying, 'Play only dimes and quarters.'

"We adjust the coin chute to return all nickels."

Dowsett also offers a suggestion to the amusement manufacturers which, in its very simplicity, may bring about 10c pinball play, he believes.

He writes, "Why not leave the pin

games the same size and put in 7 or 8 balls, instead of five, and charge ten cents?

"I believe this set up, if used, should be introduced by the manufacturers on all their new machines.

"Possibly this arrangement could also be used to adapt the public to the idea of 10c pinball play. Later on we could gradually cut back to five balls."

In both cases, that of juke boxes and pinball games, Dowsett, like all other Canadian ops, is thinking ahead to higher costs, and believes that 10c pinball play as well as more dimes and quarters in juke boxes is the answer to increased overhead.

# TIME RUNNING OUT

## Industry Faces More Acute Shortages. Possible Cut In Most Production After Elections. Ops Again Urged To Stock Up For Long Pull.

CHICAGO—Word is being quietly passed along to noted leaders in the field that time may be running out a lot faster than many in the field now believe.

The reasons for this are the statements which are emanating from Washington regarding the very stringent controls which may be placed into effect on all types of industries immediately after the elections.

It is an already known fact that the labor shortages which are developing, have many of the experts in Washington worried as big industry calls upon them to obtain more help for production lines.

Production of almost every industry is severely cut at this time, but, after elections, the belief is that present cuts will seem very mild in comparison to what is bound to happen.

The ops are again urged to stock up for a long pull. In fact, as some here believe, ops should stock up for the greater part of '51 and, possibly, all of 1952.

The average manufactory does not see itself producing very much current merchandise by the middle of '51. And, in '52, few believe that they will be producing any, but a very, very small number of machines, of any type, especially which will then be allowed.

The very critical materials, such as steel, copper, rubber, zinc, etc., will practically be taken up in the months to come, and little of this will be allocated towards coin machine production. This is the general consensus of leaders here.

Those ops who have taken care of themselves, and have practically revamped their routes with new equipment, will be in a position to offset the more aggressive competitor, who is buying ahead to be able to get into the best spots in every territory.

## Wurlitzer Profits Up

CHICAGO—Consolidated operations of The Rudolph Wurlitzer Company for the second quarter (July, August and September) resulted in a net profit of \$302,838.97, or 36c per share, after all reserves and provision for taxes at the new rate, as compared with a loss of \$208,942.68 for the same period last year. Sales for the second quarter were \$7,067,496.40 as compared with \$3,759,484.21 for the same period last year.

For the first six months (April to September inclusive), net profit was \$583,759.30, or 70c per share, after all reserves and provision for taxes at the new rate, as compared with a loss of \$250,036.08 for the same period last year. Sales for the first six months were \$12,858,731.68, as compared with \$7,254,018.81 for the same period a year ago.

At a meeting of the Board of Directors held October 25, a dividend of 25c per share was ordered paid on December 1, 1950, to stockholders of record, at the close of business November 15.

All divisions of the business are operating at a high level and have a substantial backlog of orders.

"The Confidential Price Lists" reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depends on the subscriber to make average price adjustments to fit the peculiarities of his territory. **METHOD:** "The Confidential Price Lists" should be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week; Second price listed is highest price. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.
