

Report Biz Spotty

Many Areas Report Pick-Up. Some Where Summer Biz Big Slips Somewhat. Look For Big Jump As New Products Introduced And Employment High. More Manufacturers Take Defense Work.

CHICAGO—A compilation of reports received from various territories throught the country indicate that those areas, where business boomed to new high records this past summer, are now enduring a slideoff, while those territories where biz slowed down as per usual in torrid weather, are now enjoying a general pickup, with sales and collections continuing to rise.

This is indicative of a big jump in business, leaders believe, for the average coinman has held down these past weeks, and must take hold of new equipment quickly, they say, to insure himself continuing ahead.

More manufacturers have entered into defense work and will be producing much less equipment than they ever did before.

This alone, coupled with the newer and more stringent controls which are coming into being, is sure to cripple many a coinfirm, unless instant means are used to offset whatever the near future may bring.

This again means, one leader here explains, that those operators who can, should immediately get into buying action and anticipate their needs for the months to come, so that they will be well prepared for any eventuality.

O. D. Jennings & Co., reported this past week that they are "tapering off" on production of slots and are gradually taking on more and more defense work. This firm believes that within 30 to 60 days, it will be completely in defense production.

In the meantime, other firms still producing machines, are seeking contracts favorable to their type of production facilities and, should these come into being, are frank to admit that they will be forced to cut the major portion of their present production.

If materials become any tougher to obtain than they are at present, some of the leading manufacturers have already stated to friends, they will simply call a halt to production of machines, and take on whatever defense work comes along.

With this situation in view, the average coinman is urged to protect himself.

Those territories where the business slideoff is noticeable should take this opportunity of placing orders ahead of time so that they will be ready for whatever may arise.

At present, tho the amusement games market is rather slow, the fact remains that business this past summer set new high sales records for most of the manufacturers. Once this slideoff is out of the way, even bigger records are sure to come about.

Many leading phono distributers report that many of their calls for new

equipment at this time is based on the use of the small 45 rpm disks.

These men, as well as leading phono ops, believe that the 45 rpm records will be a most important factor in sales within a very short period of time.

In fact, one leading operator said, "If we can continue on ahead the way we have been these past months there is no doubt that the 45s will be the big sellers within the next 18 months to 2 years."

In the meantime, music business continues to be the fastest moving of all divisions of the industry.

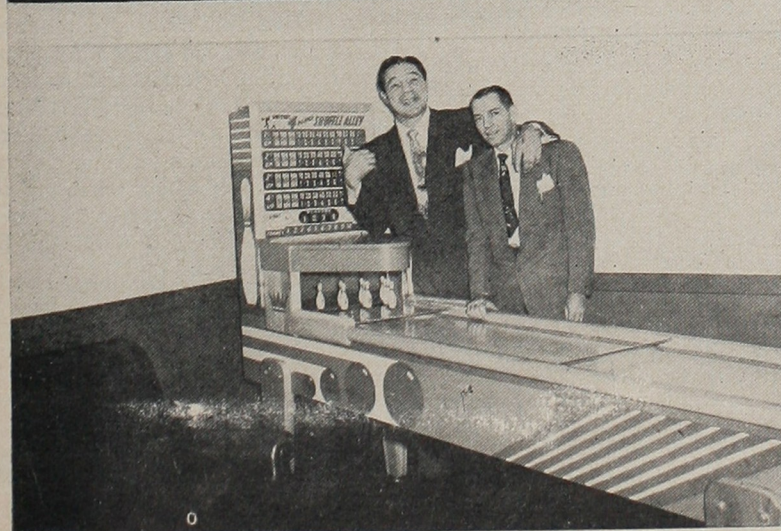
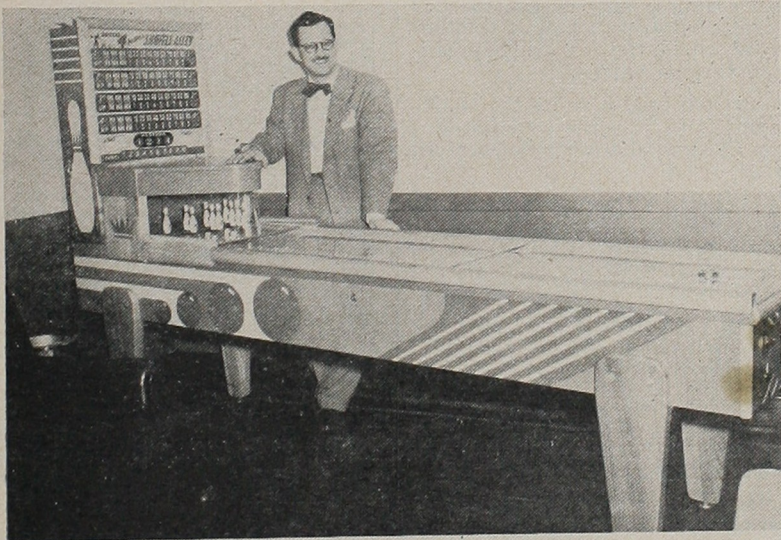
United Entertains Visitors

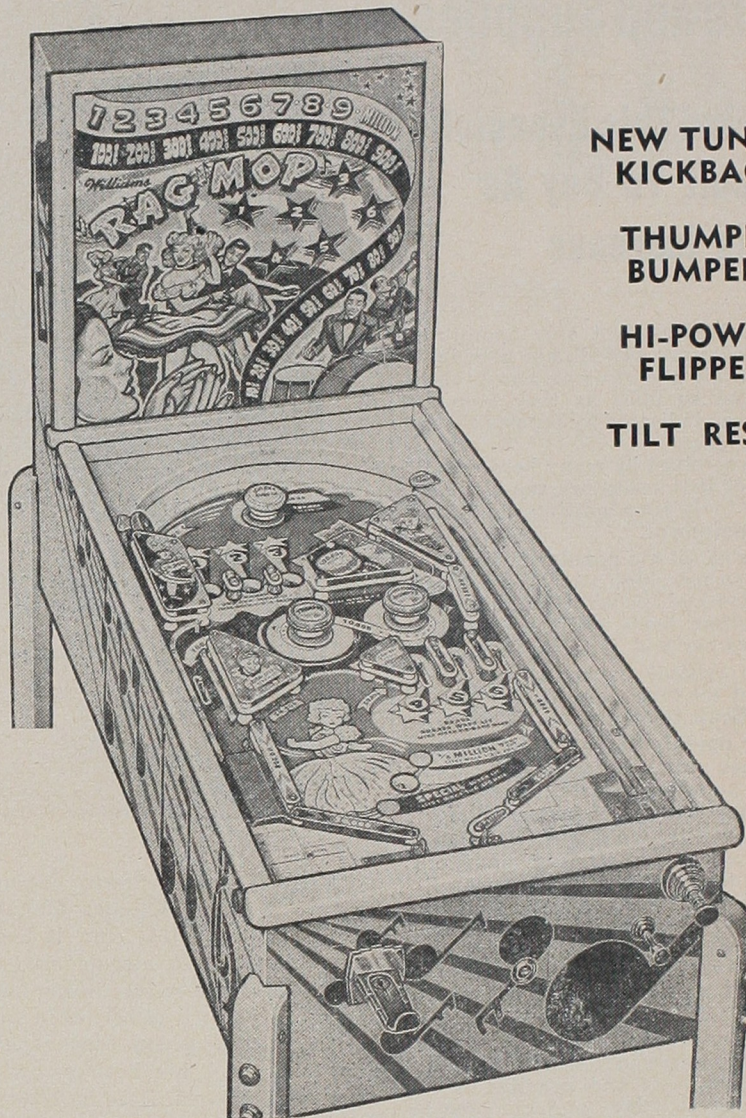

Ops Find This Especially Difficult To Buy As Prices Increase

NEW YORK—Not only operators, but distributors as well, are now driving to obtain and stock as many tubes, parts and supplies as they possibly can, it was indicated by reports reaching this office.

News received by many here was to the effect that operators are having a very difficult time getting tubes for music equipment.

Prices of all the popular tubes have zoomed to new high marks, according to reports and in addition, these are scarcer than hen's teeth, as some of the operators and distributors report.

Other critical parts, used in machines of all types are also becoming very difficult to obtain.

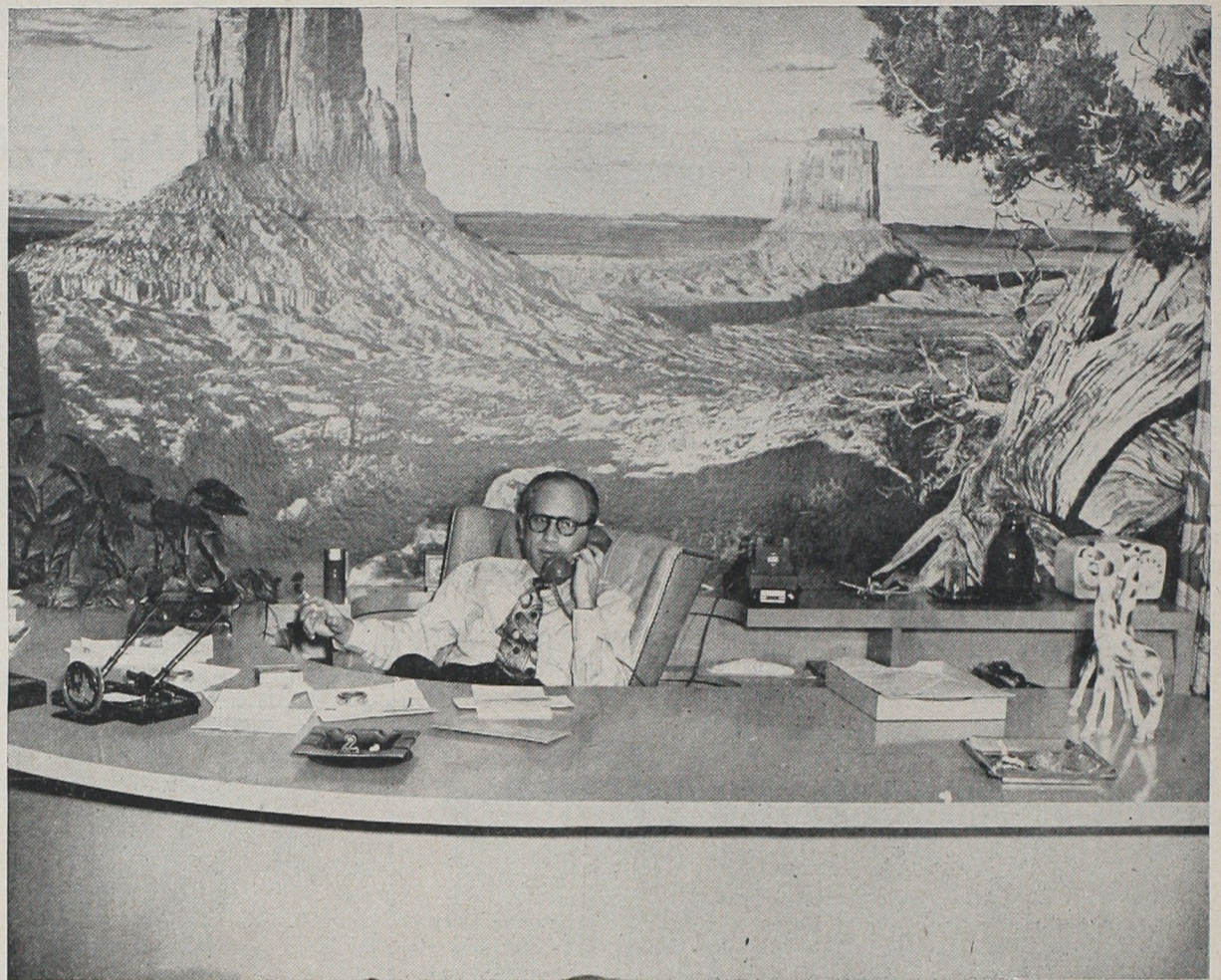
Many operators are calling on distributors they never before did business with in an effort to obtain a quantity of this merchandise for stockpiling.

Whatever the results of these sudden drives on the part of many ops around the country, it is generally believed that tubes, part and supplies, will continue to grow more scarce, and with the Federal Government now cutting sharply back on critical materials, many important parts will prove extremely difficult to obtain.

Operators have been warned for some time to prepare themselves with a stock of parts and supplies. Some heeded the warnings and are now in position where they are loaning or selling tubes, parts and supplies to distributors in their territories.

Those ops who didn't pay much attention to these first warnings are now desperately driving to obtain and stock these necessities.

Milwaukee Goes Big For Shuffle Premium Play

MILWAUKEE, WIS.:—This city's shuffle game operators have gone all out for premium play action, to such an extent, that every location, whether large or small, is featuring premiums of various values.

The system used here by the shuffle game ops is exactly the same as that used in Chicago and other midwestern cities.

The player must reach a certain high score, or above that score, and he is given a roll ticket, which duplicate he retains, and drops one part in the drawing box.

Drawings are usually once per week and the one holding the lucky serialized ticket gets the premium.

It is reported here that the law is lifting its eyebrows somewhat on the theory that the method of award may be likened to that of a lottery.

The state has closed such radio and TV programs as "Stop The Music". These were pronounced a lottery by the Governor, it is reported.

As yet, tho, there is no action in this regard anywhere in this city, or surrounding areas.

The belief is that due to the fact it requires skill to reach the high score set for obtaining one ticket, and the further fact that players can obtain more than one ticket, and insert these into the box for the drawing, that there is no lottery attached to the use of premium play action where shuffle games are concerned.

It is only an extra award to the players for their continued playing of the game and is not part nor parcel of the actual play of the game, as one leading shuffle game op explains.

In the meantime, premium play has tremendously helped hold collections up and is continuing to do so.

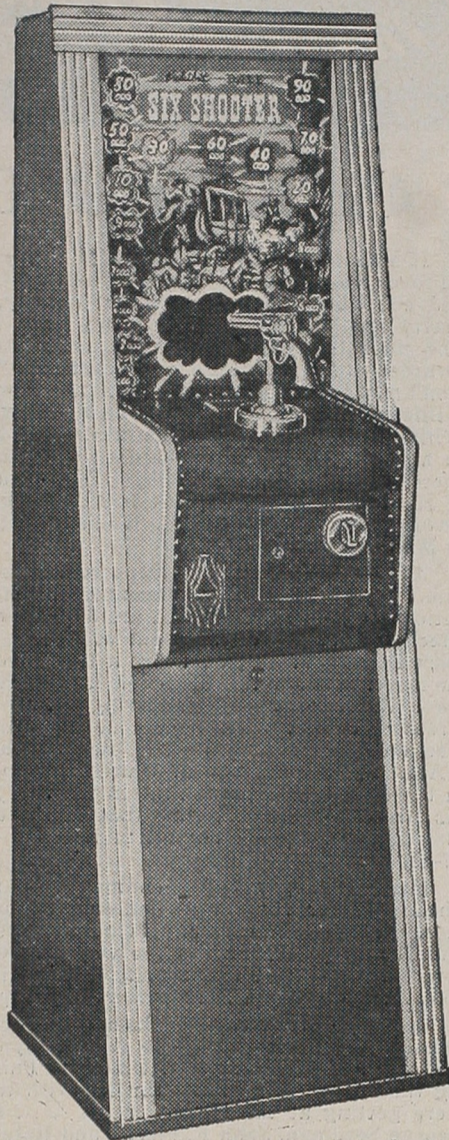

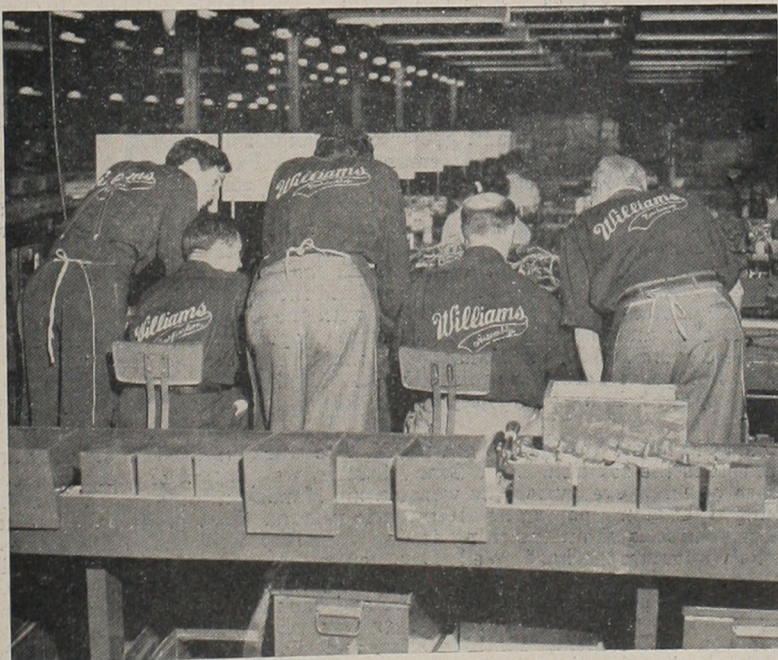

**Irving Orenstein, New Jersey
Coinman, Dies Suddenly**

NEWARK, N. J. - The many friends and business associates of Irving (Irv) Orenstein, popular coin figure in this city and New York, were shocked by his sudden death on Tuesday, November 14. His death was attributed to a cerebral hemorrhage. Burial took place from the Apter Funeral Parlors in Newark. He was 47 years old.

Many local coinmen attended the funeral, and if the word had been circulated more quickly, a great many more would have been on hand.

Orenstein had been connected with the coin machine business for a number of years, having been one of the pioneer men in the field since the modern phase. He, at one time or another, was an operator, distributor and jobber, covering the New Jersey territory. During his wholesaling days, he had been connected with Dave Stern and Milton Green. Lately his activities were devoted to buying and selling used music machines.

He leaves a wife, and two children, a boy and a girl.
