# **Continental Vending Continues To Improve Position, Announces New** \$1.5 Million Loan, Line Of Credit

#### 75 Employees Rehired To Move \$1 Million Sales

WESTBURY, N. Y. - Added to the impetus which normally comes with \$1 million in orders, the Continental Vending Machine Company trustees have advised that arrangements have been completed for a \$750,000 long term loan, and a \$750,000 line of credit for short-term funds, at 6% interest. Last month, Mel Rapp, Continental head and guiding light behind the manufacturer's return to normal following a \$4 million reported fraud charge last year which rocked the firm to its foundations, reported on the firm's good health (CB Dec. 28)

John P. Campbell and Irving L. Wharton, the trustees, said another line of credit has been arranged to allow the company to finance customer purchases of its vending machines.

Last July Continental Vending was placed under Chapter 10 in reorganization under the Federal Bankruptcy Act. The SEC contended that \$4 million had been transferred from Continental's books to the books of an affiliated finance company, headed by Harold Roth, who was then also Chairman of Continental. The Government is still investigating this accusation by SEC.

The trustees are at the moment reorganizing the firm and doing a good job evidently. Continental went to the NAMA show last September, and in an interview with Cash Box last month, Mel Rapp advised that the firm was shipping machines to fill \$1 million in orders. This was confirmed by the trustees in an interview with the financial press last week.

The trustees said that the loans were obtained from the company's previous management and that the lenders have agreed to defer payments for at least one year.

Continental sold seven of its eight routes earlier to concentrate on manufacturing and to secure funds. The proceeds have been used to reduce Continental's total debt of \$24 million to \$20 million.

At the outset last July, many Continental employees were removed from the employment rolls but the trustees last week stated that at least 75 men have been rehired to handle the new orders

# AMA Will Hold **Another Seminar On Vending**


#### Set For Jan. 29-31





Irving Kaye, Howard, and Arnold, busy as bees all week long shipping the 1964 Deluxe Eldorado pool table line. Kaye does a big job nationally and sales will be even better that last year. Irving said up until now he didn't think the  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ' x 9' model was an operator piece, but now that the large table has been on location he is satisfied that the three-piece slate table is "the simplest to install in the industry." The firm makes five models (see separate story).

Mike Munves is distributor for the American Shuffleboard pool table line in the metro NYC area. The factory makes the "Electra II" 6-pkt. table and after just two weeks of displaying the table, Munves reported excellent sales. Sol Lipkin, American's sales chief, talked with Lou Dunis up in the northwest, and he echoed top tourney collection reports from other "Imperial" shuffleboard distribs and ops around the country. "The tourneys are great, and the two-player, four-player action is amazing, ever since the pool tables hit," says Lipkin, who credits 6-pkt. pool with boosting interest in the shuffleboard business. Dunis does a big job with it in Alaska, and R.C. Gilchrist, Canadian distrib, sells large lots in the Montreal area.

Irving Holzman and his wife joined United's Lyn Durant for a holiday cruise down south and even though the weather was chilly everyone returned with a tan. Holzman called United's Bill DeSelm while we were in his office and ordered a trailerload of 'Bank Pools'. "So don't ask how the game is going," stated Holzman, "just count the games I've sold so far—it's our first hit of the year." The cruise was a 10-day affair and covered Palm Beach, Ft. Lauderdale and Miami Beach.

Operator Hy Jaffe claims that the fall-off in operator collections is due to the smaller number of patrons going into neighborhood bars, plus the fact that there aren't as many bars around town anymore.

Barney Sugerman flying to Chicago periodically to watch progress out at the Bally plant where the announcement was made last week that the firm will premiere a new Slot Machine for London's A.T.E. show.



Coleman said that the company could foresee no additional financing requirements in the near future be-cause under the terms of the notes no payments other than interest are due for the first five years. White, Weld & Co., investment bankers for Seeburg, participated in the placement of the notes.
