

NJ Ops Council **Gathers Steam**

HADDONFIELD, N. J .- Discussions between the New Jersey Council of Coin Machine Operators and state Coin Machine Operators and state and local government agencies, concerning the conditions under which billiard tournaments may be legally conducted in the state of New Jersey, have been underway in recent weeks, and the results to-date will be revealed to the Council membership at their next meeting, May 27, William Cannon, Council president, announced last week. last week
