
out the U. S. and are seeing good ac tion on their LP "Aardvaark".





Si Redd Cites Coinbiz Philosophy To Press

"Gaming devices account for about 98 per cent of Bally's business in Nevada . . . but we have a steady eye on the other 2 per cent." Redd was quoted. "If we can give younger people a wholesome place to amuse themselves at coin-operated games, it'll free their parents to enjoy them-selves more during their visit to Nevada.
