Ward Spalding Feb 20th 1819

To Sir when Boston recd your letter dated
 Jan^{ry} 14th which that informant me
 it was your wish to have me make
 out another bill of that work which
 if I saw that work I had repeat to you
 that work in a manner that will know
 in question or will be done in a workman
 like manner but if I am a proper quantity
 of work this is more than in this place
 but if you think my bill is too high the
 you can get some alterations cost
 to make join the hours - - - - - \$12.00
 to build the chimney and the foundation 37.50
 to buying half ton squire of stone - - - - - 35.00
 to cutting out ~~the~~ two sets of windows
 and fixish them the teaming the ice - - - - - 18.00
 to making two partition doors with frames 10.00
 to putting up two partitions - - - - - 19.00
 to making eight window frames - - - - - 20.00
 to making one hundred and eight lights of sash 10 50
 to making two flights of stairs - - - - - 13 50
 to putting up the windows - - - - - 5
 to one stair door - - - - - 3 25
 to work on the roof - - - - - 5 25
 to making two window pieces - - - - - 16 50
 to Base and six leads - - - - - 28 50
 to water down the rooms and mud in
 and skinning the bees upon the lines 14 25
 to casing the walls - - - - - 3 50
 to set the glass - - - - - 3
 to glass for the hours - - - - - 11 25
