Woolfield Sept. 6 1832

With love - I am reluctantly offering them to you, for  
you and I have had nothing - I am extremely anxious to know upon what footing  
you and I have to stand and to know whether we can to be upon friendly terms  
or otherwise, before I go there. The open frankness and kind of your answer  
will give me the power finding future action, & I choose the better course to  
wholly and made you every friend you offer I can and such offers as most  
a phoned. Convinced you that there nothing to do very thing else is right. This  
offer that we in concert with a determination to offend you on your part  
but this letter to bring William who may interfere in other people's business  
and send you a packet of letters on his - I shall be much you at Captain &  
the Brown and if you would rather I should mail you at Captain &  
buy some both, we shall be two of the time you will find me there  
like it to be as soon as possible for our boat to come on just don't wish to have  
you stay till second - It is of you have come to Woodstock now  
the wind when she'd always be as soon stem as him as possible &  
our first is off the coast - as informs you when up the  
front is a period of the season in which it is usually stormy  
and I don't wish you to have it. If we come back once more of  
my not having time to call to our affairs 'short all our  
affairs' going property under roof & almost you to be command  
that will close you further. I wish you to find me home  
including - you offer to be in here the last of October  
a room for it suppose it except a guest's passage, otherwise I  
frequently repeat to you that did not think you would be  
very well with me if this not come up to the very time  
when we were trading but you came more to the sea the very  
moment a contract is up when I have paid the freight  
of all that was due, - and if a room is to be found by  
which I am to be friends from Kelly any time I shall no  
longer think it can from friends motives you bid to me or ask  
last I shall have a right to think your friendship is strongly charged  
and I know I have not deserved it enough, - But reflecting upon  
come down as soon as possible etc as many our affairs among  
and be as frank as you can in the unfortunate to me and kind  
feel think this a friendly feeling dictated your offer  
"Please me in answer by the hand of the postmaster
