Yorks. farm, April 5th 1848.

Dear George,

Enclosed you will find a letter from the Doctor, received yesterday afternoon by Henry Diggel, just as we were about starting for home from the farm, where we had spent a very pleasant day. Mrs. Ashburn, Perry Field, George and myself, accompanied by Mr. Black, Wash. and Maria, formed the party, and we all admired the wheat exceedingly, upon the beautiful green of which it was most pleasant for the eye to look. Maria had to thank to only for the farm this morning, that she requested me to write and tell you that Papa will ~~be~~^{be} leave do. morning for the Eastern Shore, which will make it impossible for him to leave home for some time to come. The word. objects also will be contrasted arriving at the farm. one came yesterday, the same which came with but with a different captain, and another is expected there today. He wishes to know if you can make it convenient to go upon the Doctor's family, and requests you will inform him as readily as possible, by way of the Grove, whether you can do so or not, that he may be able to reply to the Doctor on the subject immediately. Our Norfolk friends depart to day. I cannot express how much I shall miss them. Their determination to go was very sudden. Wash. stood there. I wish this before arriving. It is time to get up to look out for breakfast for the travellers, so needs say adieu. Give my love to all, and send believe me truly
