

Women, Gender, and Television Regional Conference Call for Papers

Women, Gender and Television Regional Conference will be held at The College of William and Mary April 16-17, 2004.

The Women's Studies Program and the Literary and Cultural Studies Program invite proposals from the region's faculty and students for scholarly papers on "Women, Gender, and Television." We are interested in considerations of sexuality, violence, and/or race and ethnicity (among other subjects) in cable as well as network television—dramas, sitcoms, reality television, talk shows, soap operas, news shows, television advertising, music videos, etc.

The conference, which will take place on April 16th and 17th at the College of William and Mary, will feature a keynote address by Jane Espenson. Espenson is currently a writer and Co-Executive Producer for the WB's *The Gilmore Girls*. She has written for a number of sitcoms, including *Ellen*, but is best known for her work on *Buffy the Vampire Slayer*.

SELF DEFENSE

When is a rape not a rape? When the victim is a prostitute. a stripper, a non-English speaker from a poor family, or otherwise flying beneath the radar of middle-class respectability, assaults on her body are often shrugged off in the popular imagination and sometimes by the law. Carson Kreitzer's play *Self Defense, or Death of Some Salesmen* takes up this injustice with a vengeance. Based on the life of Aileen Wuornos, a prostitute executed in Florida last year for the murder of seven johns, the play is smart, in-your-face, poignant, violent, angry, funny, and tender. Eight actors play thirty plus strippers, coroners, policemen, psychiatrists, feminist scholars, Hollywood producers, evangelists, lawyers, and reporters. William and Mary Theatre's Second Season presents *Self Defense* October 22-25 (Thurs.-Sat.), with a special preview on October 22 (Wed.). The production is directed by faculty member Dorothy Chansky and features Michelle Urcuyo '04.

Performances are at 8:00 W-F and at 5 and 9 on Saturday. Tickets are \$1. Performances are in the Studio Theatre, Phi Beta Kappa Hall. Tickets at the door.
