The Day of Silence

Wednesday, April 9, 1997

What is the Day of Silence?

It is a day first initiated by UVA students in 1996 to symbolize oppression of gays, lesbians, bisexuals and other sexual minorities throughout history and today.

What do I do on the Day?

Participants in the Day of Silence are asked to take a 9-hour vow (8 a.m. to 5 p.m.) during which they will not speak. As a participant, you will be given an armband by which others on campus can identify you, and you will be supplied with cards of explanation to distribute to those with whom you would usually talk.

Why are we doing this?

Throughout history, sexual minorities have been suppressed and denied a voice. Through your participation, you show your peers and teachers that you care about human rights and want to give everyone the chance to be heard. Just wearing your armband spreads a public message of tolerance and support. The message is subtle, but the impressions you leave on your peers will last. Also, we hope that the day will leave a lasting impression on you. We often take for granted our ability to publicly take pride in who we are. This day is an acute reminder that we cannot take our ability to express ourselves for granted.

I'm not gay; Can I still participate?

Absolutely. UVA reported that last year, the majority of participants were in fact heterosexual. The only thing all participants shared was a concern for human rights, and a pride for their peers, family and friends.

How do I get more information?
