

Campbell County Kentucky January 2 1837

Mr William Davis esq

Dear Sir respecting  
the note that your Clerk sent on by  
me on James C. Peacher for collection for \$98  
and some cents is still in my hands and not  
collected although i have duned him for it  
repeatedly and tried to prevail on him to pay  
it but never could get him to pay it although  
he has promised from time to time that he  
would pay it or send it to you, i do believe that  
he is now verry able to pay it without any  
inconvenience I wrote to you some two or  
three years ago whether or not i should put  
it in the hands of an offiser and force it out  
of him by law. but received no answer or  
instructions from you what to do about it  
it is my imprescion that that he neve  
intends to pay it unless compelled by law  
finally i have concluded to send you the note  
and you can either keep the note and send me  
my receipt or ascain the note over to me and  
send it back by Mr Spencer Faulconer  
and i will collect the money and send  
it you by mail
