Some money before long there is 4 months

Pay I see to me now and if I get it I
will send all of it home if I cant
send it by some person it will express
it and I hope it wont be long till
I get it I hope Richard will be able
to send you some money before
long I have done the very best I
could for ^{you} considering the chance I
have had

I think ^{it} will be a good plan
for you to get the liston farms or
rent it for repairs providing you can
get the whole improvement
which I hope you can if you rent it

What do you think of going with
the haine place

I heard from the Regiment
yesterday they are still at Falmouth
oposite Fredericksburgh but they are
looking every day for orders to come to
Washington or some place to recruit if
I should not be surprised when the
Regiment will be Dishanded and

sent home awhile to recruit I heard
that Lieut. Thomas Elliot was Dead
I should like to know if it is the
Case or not I hope not
I am warmly Dressed this winter
I have a good overcoat and a warm vest
3 pair of Drawers 3 pants and 3 shirts
a good place to sleep and plenty to
eat

I hope it must be
long till I will be to see you
all again there is 3. of Hegens company
here Namely Amy miller holy
Kade heaver son of John Kade

and Jacob histon from Pennsylvania
