## To Officers and Troops Going Abroad.

- 1. Mail bags or boxes are placed near the head of each gang-plank, where all mail must be deposited and should be left unsealed. This mail will be censored at once and such as is intended for immediate delivery, will be sealed and sent out.
- 2. The object of the censorship is to prevent any information reaching the enemy which would endanger your lives while enroute, and, therefore, nothing should be said as to where you are sailing from, or when or where to. Say nothing as to the boat you are on, whether transport or commercial liner, nor whether or not other boats, transports, or warships, are leaving at the same time. Remember particularly that post cards pass through a number of hands, and protect your own life by being careful to give no news to the enemy. If you will write as if every letter or postal were going to be read by a spy, you will have notrouble as to censoring. You can write your loved ones as fully and freely on personal matters as if your mail were sealed; the Censor pays no attention to names or addresses but simply cuts out any prohibited matter as mentioned above.
- 3. It is urged that you write letters or cards stating that you have arrived safely overseas; put these in the mail bag on the ship and they will be held at this office until your ship has arrived safely abroad and then mailed. Your safe arrival, will, therefore, be announced to your relatives some three weeks earlier than you can advise them by writing from the other side. The cable is much congested with official business and the Government urges this method of announcing your arrival.
- 4. No stamps are required on letters or cards and no postage due will be collected, if you put your name and organization in the upper left hand corner like a return address. This applies after you once pass the gang-plank of the ship and holds until the end of the war.
- 5. Your address is simply "American Expeditionary Forces;" give your full name, rank and corps or the unit to which you belong and then the words "American Expeditionary Forces."
- 6. It is against Army Regulations to attempt, by any means, to evade the censorship, which has only been established for the protection of our troops abroad.



- 1. The Surgeon General directs me to inform you that you have been assigned to active service in the military establishment, and will enter upon your duties after taking the oath of office, blank therefor inclosed herewith.
- 2. The oath should be executed not earlier than November 17, 1917, but if possible on the morning of that day before a notary public or other official authorized to administer oaths, and should thereupon be mailed at once to this office in the inclosed envelope. It is important that this oath be properly executed in all respects, otherwise complications may hereafter arise respecting your right to pay and travel allowances.
- Complying with the former you will PROCEED WITHOUT DELAY, AFTER HAVING TAKEN THE OATH, to

  U. S. Army Base Hospital, Camp McClellan, Anniston, Alabama, and present the order to the Commanding Officer who will assign you to duty. Tickets and Pullmen car accommodations will be furnished on presentation of the transportation requests at make your reservation for Pullmen car pecommodation as soon as possified, but under no directed should you exchange the transportation until AFTER YOU HAVE PROCEED THE OATH. If not used, the rearrival at the hospital.
- 4. Upon receipt of the eath by this office, the letter assigning you to active service will be mailed to you at Camp McClellan.


































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
